Our club is also celebrating 2 other shortlistings for the Farnham Sports Awards:

Lucy Cochrane, aged 15, who is playing for our Ladies 1s, U16 and U18 teams, and has progressed through the England Hockey performance pathway, is shortlisted for Farnham Young Sports Person of the year.

And our Mens Is are up for Farnham Team of the Year. With a COVID curtailed season the team was on course for their 4th promotion in 5 seasons. This season they are sat at the top of this new league, chasing that 4th promotion to take the senior men's side higher than they have ever been (again) in the club's history.

So whilst we all continue to play and train, week in, week out, it's fantastic to see our clubs achievements being recognised both nationally & locally.


In my head I'm thinking another 5 points will see us safely retain our league status but with the uncertainty of how many go down we won't rely on that and will continue to push through to the very end!





#### Aldershot and Farnham 4 - 0 Oxted 2s

After a disappointing result, but good performance, last week against Sunbury the Shots knew that they had to respond to keep title aspirations alive. Following some constructive self-reflection in the week, the squad were fully aware of the requirements over the forthcoming weeks starting with third place Oxted at home.

Despite the positivity in the warmup, the opening 20 minutes were all Oxted. Solid work by the back three of Herring, Giltrow and Weston accompanied by some expert goalkeeping by Hall managed to maintain parity in these exchanges. However, against the run of play Boot managed to find Morhall down the right who surged along the baseline before expertly flicking the ball over the stranded goalkeeper from a tight angle. 1-0. Two minutes later Scott Perry managed to convert one of several corners won in the first half, firing high past the goalkeeper's right hand side. 2-0.

Treadgold, Wheland, Rushmere and Boot would continue to influence the game through the middle, wearing down the increasingly strained Oxted midfield. This work paid dividends with Smith firing neatly into the bottom left following a well worked turnover in the middle of the park. 3-0 going into halftime for AFHC.

The second half was a more subdued affair, with the majority of the game being spent in midfield battles. Oxted came out with renewed vigour, but the pressing from the frontline of Weston, Smith, Groves and Coombe reduced the opportunity for meaningful chances to be created. With the game becoming increasingly stretched, the Shots looked for openings







on the counterattack. One such opening resulted in Stuart Morhall driving in from the right-hand side, firing in a fierce strike on the half volley from the top of the D into the bottom left hand corner. 4-0. Yet more pressure came as a response from the away side, but the Shots stood strong to keep the clean sheet leaving the final score at 4-0. A great result that reinstates 1st place position before travelling down to Brighton next weekend.

# **U14 GIRLS**



Despite the challenges of the pandemic and the geographic re-org by England hockey, which results in us now fielding teams in fixtures as far flung and exotic as Brighton, the U14Gs section have tried this season to maximise pitch time experience, push on with hockey development and above all have fun.

Staffing, coaching, organising fixtures in the new set up, and getting umpires, has been very challenging. Juggling covid squad absences and resultant game cancellations has also led us into choppy waters. I want to take this opportunity to say a special thank you to Gillian Lamb who has battled the system commendably to get all our fixtures into the calendar! Big thanks also to Jo Bushell, in age group admin and to Stuart and Mark in assisting me pitch side, without whom our squads would simply not get the grounding and direction in game craft and skills development needed.

Ul4s is an interesting age to coach; it is exciting to see key qualities starting to emerge within our squad. The ability to listen, comprehend, then a willingness to apply and try what they have just heard (and keep practicing and retrying!), is really flourishing. Having the confidence to then give it a go in match play and demonstrate what they are now capable of, so their progression is clear, is also brilliant. As coaches we get a real buzz when we see the fundamentals of the game being played out and starting to blossom. This year we have tried to focus on:

- Match tempo: Thinking ahead What's my next move before I get the ball and the importance of bringing the ball back into play quickly to maintain momentum.
- 2. Positioning and engagement: 95% of the game for each player is played without the ball! Knowing where you need to be is key, moving as a team unit so you are better placed to either be a clean outlet for a pass, provide an overload in attack or cover in defensive situations.
- 3. Decision making: Making the right pass -Not passing into areas of risk (across goal!) and knowing when and how to maintain possession and pivot to switch the point of attack and how to pressure the opposition into mistakes.

When you next watch the team see if they are achieving these objectives and ask about them! You can now talk tactics like a pro! Whilst results earlier in the season were not great from a score line perspective, the squads have stuck at it and there has been demonstrable progress as the season has progressed. Last week the U14G Tier 2 team produced an excellent 9-0 win over Old Georgians in a cohesive team performance where all members of the team played their part. Our Tier 3 team are strengthening too. We have been able to watch their progress against a strong Guildford age group through a couple of repeat fixtures against them. Despite losing last week's fixture 2-0, we had made enough chances of our own to get at least a draw and continued to keep doing the right things up to the final whistle. This was much stronger than the previous 4-0 loss and we hope for better to come.

In terms of training, in addition to the Sunday sessions we continue to run extra free training on a Tuesday night 6.30pm to 7.30pm, as a joint U12G U14G session. I know lots of the squad are also taking advantage of Jenno's academy sessions. But for those that want extra pitch time, come and join us on a Tuesday. All U12Gs and U14Gs are welcome.

Team sport builds friendships and bonds, and the enjoyment of doing and achieving something together, along with the fitness it brings, is so valuable to our children's wellbeing right now. I encourage parents to not be strangers either. Get involved and enjoy the same kind of collective experiences from being part of our club community. You are never too old to learn to play hockey, or return after a playing break, or help with training, or learn the rules of the game to help officiate fixtures and umpire for our children's teams. Your help and involvement will be warmly appreciated.

Good luck to the girls in the rest of the season and I look forward to seeing you all on or next to a hockey pitch soon. Let's see if our teams can earn a 10-0 chicken nugget winning score!
