Venue: The Melton Mowbray Baptist Church is located on Bowling Green, Leicester Road, Melton Mowbray LE13 0FA, opposite the English Indoor Bowling Association Limited Headquarters and the Melton & District Indoor Bowling Club.

Attendance at AGM: Every playing member shall be entitled to attend and speak but they may not Vote at the meeting (Article 28).

A "playing member" is defined as any member of a Club and who is entitled to use the playing facilities of the Club, or has ceased to play indoor bowls by reason of age or disability (Article 1.1.15)

Registration: Please register with the Scrutineers, who will be located near to the entrance door for the Main Hall.

Voting: "<u>Members</u>" of the Association are defined as "Clubs or County Associations that are corporate bodies and Nominee Members" (Article 2.2).

<u>Members who are "corporate bodies"</u> (in Bowls this usually means that the Club is a Limited Company by Guarantee with Club Members performing the role of Directors), may authorise one of its playing members to be its "Representative" at the Annual General Meeting (Article 3.2).

<u>Members who are "*unincorporated associations*"</u> (in Bowls this usually means that the Club/County is administered by a Committee elected in accordance with a standard form of Club Constitution), may authorise one of its committee to be a "Nominee Member" to hold the rights of membership on trust for the Club or County Association and to exercise the rights of membership on behalf of the Club/County (Article 3.1).

Each "Representative" or "Nominee Member" will receive the appropriate Voting Forms and Voting Cards upon production of the properly authorised "Voting Authorisation Form" to the Scrutineers before the commencement of the meeting.

If a previously notified "Representative" or "Nominee Member" is unable to attend the AGM, an alternative person may attend and vote on behalf of the Club/County, upon production of the correctly completed "Voting Authorisation Form" to the Scrutineer.

A member of the Executive Council shall not have a Vote otherwise than as a Proxy for or an authorised Representative/Nominee Member (Article 18).

<u>Election of Officers or members of the Executive Council</u> – Ballot Paper(s) will be issued by the Scrutineers at the time of registering.

No County Association or Nominee member for a County Association may cast a Vote in these elections (Article 29.2).

Proxy Voting: a Member may appoint a Proxy in respect of Resolutions tabled at the AGM, upon completion of the appropriate Proxy Form.

If a Member Club/County cannot attend the AGM, they may either appoint the Chairman of the meeting as their proxy, or a named person who can attend the AGM on their behalf. The appointed proxy can be instructed as to how to vote or they can be allowed to vote as they think fit.

All Proxy Forms must be received at the Registered Office of the Association by 1.59 pm on Thursday 4th June 2009.

Notes - (forming part of the financial statements)

1 Principal Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with the items which are considered, to be material in relation to the Association's Financial Statements:

Basis of accounting

The income and expenditure account and balance sheet have been prepared under the historical cost convention. Provision is made in the Financial Statements for liabilities of the Association which have not been paid by the balance sheet date. Competitors' entrance fees, membership levies and subscriptions are brought into the Financial Statements in the Period in which they are received.

Depreciation

Freehold buildings - depreciation is calculated at rate of 2 per cent per annum so as to write off the cost in equal annual instalments over a 50 year period.

With the new Association created there began a massive amount of administrative changes, which included the recruitment of new staff and for the first time a Chief Operating Executive. Added to this concentrated effort was the very steep learning curve that had to be taken on board by staff and Directors.

The Association chose to base its Headquarters at Melton, and are currently considering options on the property in Northampton, and duly set about the task of running the sport of Indoor Bowls in England.

On the operational side the Association staged three successful Joint National Finals Weeks at Northampton & District, Lawson Park and Nottingham and sent International Teams to the British Isles Series. At these England came away winners at the Senior Ladies and U25 men.

During all the changes the Association was heavily involved with all the other codes of bowls in working with Sport England and successfully saw the sport become one of the 46 sports which was to receive funding from Sport England over the next four years. Despite receiving confirmation that the Sport of Bowls will receive £756,000 during this period there is still a lot of work to be done to ensure that this money can be downloaded and initiatives started.

On the commercial front the Association is delighted to have received continued sponsorship from Lucas Fettes, Dales Sports Surfaces and Warners Leisure Hotels and welcomed new partners in the form of Kombat Sportswear, Canter Leven & Berg, Fiscale and TLH.

However, like many other businesses we have been affected by the current economic climate and established relationships have had to end. The Association is grateful for the support given by these companies and hope their fortune changes.

The first 6 months in the life of the Association has to say the least not been without there challenges but with the combined effort of the Staff and Volunteer Directors these have been met head on and in the main resolved.

THE YEAR AHEAD

The Association has set itself the mission statement of 'Becoming the leading National Governing Body for the sport of Bowls in England by 2011'.

To achieve this it has identified that it needs to become more commercially active to bring in new income streams into the sport which will allow current services to Clubs and Counties to be expanded and also assist them to reduce their overheads.

The areas to be focused upon will include: -

Sponsorship

A structure will be developed which will see a principal sponsor complimented by up to 5 'Official Partners', supported by a number of 'Official Suppliers'.

Rights

Income will be negotiated for television / website rights for tournaments that fall under the auspices of the Association.

Advertising

Commercial Advertising will be expanded, with the focus directed to venue boards and regular tournament publications.

Ticketing / Hospitality

Tournament promotion will be marketed strongly to encourage advance sales for tournaments and create the expectation that tickets will not be available on the day.

Merchandise

Current activity centring on traditional items (ties, diaries) will be expanded to include replica and leisure clothing, while e-commerce via the Association's website will be developed.

Other Initiatives

A calendar of annual events which become 'must attend' occasions will be introduced. Combined with the commercial activity the Association will implement a comprehensive communications plan: -

Newsletter

The development of a monthly, full colour, publication which will be mailed to the Club's and press. Whilst being available on the Association's website. A small quantity to be supplied in the first instance, but with the opportunity for Clubs to order larger quantities for future issues.

Website

A re-branded website will be launched which will be fully interactive and dynamic. A specific Members only section will be available with the opportunity to receive the latest news from the Association.

Media

Regular meetings will be held with print and broadcast partners to ensure they are informed of developments and to encourage regular exposure for the sport of Indoor Bowls.

General Public

The Association will work with its Clubs and Counties to produce marketing and advertising material, to encourage participation and usage of Indoor Facilities.

The year ahead will once again be a challenging one but please be assured that the Directors and staff are ready for this and to take the Association onto new levels of Business.
