i Northumberland- John Wright, chairman of the PC, organised a meeting which was attended by more than 30 people. John Cooper, iNorthumberland's digital engagement manager, gave an overview and update of the initiative. Residents should be aware that superfast broadband does not necessarily mean that your current system will be faster but that you will be able to access faster broadband from your ISP. Alnmouth and Lesbury may benefit with early access to superfast broadband but support for the programme to gain extra funding for more outlying areas is needed so please register your interest at www.inorthumberland.org.uk.

Stepping stones at Greenrigg- Work is in progress to renew the stepping stones at Greenrigg that have been damaged during various flood events. This is an ideal time as the river is low but unfortunately the contractors have encountered significant problems leading to a redesign of the scheme. As a consequence we have no date for completion.



Proposed development, Lesbury Main Road-The application, by Northumberland Estates, to build 8 houses behind the cottages in Lesbury was not approved by NCC Planning Committee by 6 votes to 2 votes following an objection by the conservation group on the committee. It is not known if N E intends to appeal this decision.



National Rail- Now you may wonder what the "new road" is for, in the field alongside the High Path? Apparently there are some drainage issues north of the railway station. New drains need to be laid and the road, made of 4000 tons of recycled hard-core, is to facilitate access to the site for the heavy plant needed to do the work. This is expected to take 10 -12 weeks.

Northumbria in Bloom- The final result for NIB will be out on the 17th September. It is hoped that our "special case" areas, the Coach, Foxton Golf Club and Alnmouth Railway Station will do well but the rest of the Parish will be of a moderate standard. If we wish to improve in 2014 it really is necessary to raise our game in the Parish outside the special case entries. The Parish Council already uses local tradesmen to maintain the Pond Field Playground. This basic work is to be extended to other green areas and the car park near the Post Office. In order to improve and enhance our NIB result, we need to



have a NIB local group for 2014, independent from but liaising with, the Parish Council. If you would like to lead or be part of this volunteer NIB group, look in the next newsletter for details of how to proceed.

It should be said that our good neighbour in Steppey Lane was cutting back the verges by the road when he made this discovery! Clearly someone was not similarly community minded.





Footpaths - This has been the summer to get out and about in the Parish made all the easier by Northumberland Estates who have kept many of the paths clear. Our special thanks go to the staff at Percy Farms who have made an excellent job of clearing the path along the north side of the river from Steppey Lane Bridge towards Alnmouth.

Stephen Carey fund- In August Alnmouth F $\mathcal C$ organised a Family Fun Day held on the football pitch at Hipsburn.




Visitors to the area- Yes we have a lot of holidaymakers in the area this year but probably the rarest visitor was a Spotted Sandpiper which turned up on 27th July and stayed for several days at Foxton. The Spotted Sandpiper is the North American equivalent of our Common Sandpiper which breeds fairly commonly on the upland streams of Britain. It was seen with 16 Common Sandpipers and "may" have been migrating with them, having crossed the Atlantic. It is only the 3rd record of

this bird in Northumberland. Other unusual wildlife around the river this summer includes an egret (small white heron) near Foxton and numerous sightings of otters.

Heritage Open Days- Residents and visitors to Northumberland will be given a rare opportunity to see some of the county's hidden architectural treasures when the doors to many of its most historic buildings will open to the public, free of charge. The event is taking place between 12 - 15th September. NCC is coordinating the event in the county.
