As we approach the start of the National Eisteddfod (4th to 11th August), it is time to reflect on the extraordinary efforts made by the Nercwys Eisteddfod Fundraising Committee. Each town and village was requested to raise a certain amount of money and as Nercwys was one of the closest villages, our target was £5,000, which for a parish of about 400 people was a very formidable total. But in less than 10 months, Nercwys has not only raised the £5,000, it has gone way above that target and at the moment, the figure stands at well over £8,000. Osian, Mair, Bill and the rest of the committee are to be congratulated on their outstanding efforts. In the wider context, only Cilcain have raised more on the 'Village category', but as Rhydymwyn is also included in their area, it is clear that Nercwys has done remarkably well.

There were many highlights of the fundraising, but who could forget seeing Horace in his pink romper suit being pushed all that way in a pram by Mair and Tom!!

As so much fun was had by everyone who organised, took part in or helped in any way, the intention is to continue fund raising, not for the Eisteddfod, but for the village and the next big event is the **Village Show** which will be held on **Saturday, the 25th of August**. It promises to be bigger and even better than last year, so make sure that you keep that date free. It is a Bank Holiday Saturday, but who wants to be stuck in a traffic jam, anyway?

In this issue, there is a report from the Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch in which they explain how the scheme has expanded since the idea was first set up. Included is a survey (as a loose insert) which the FACT team would be very grateful if the forms could be completed and returned either to PC Gary Aldous or Mold Police Station. On an entirely different subject, although it does involve fundraising, an extended NADRA News has been included, giving the background of the Association and ending with uncertainties over the future of the Nercwys News. NADRA NEWS

At a recent meeting it was pointed out that NADRA has been in existence for longer than most people realise. Being a relative newcomer to the village, I thought that it would be interesting to find out about the origins of NADRA, or the Nercwys And District Rural Association, to give it its full title.

In the late 1970s, Burley Hill quarry was owned, we think, by Welsh Aggregates. Those who, like me, regularly commuted to Manchester will remember that the M56 was only open from Elton to Preston Brook and from the Lymm interchange with the A556 into Manchester. Welsh Aggregates had a contract to supply limestone during the construction of the middle section of the motorway.

Long term residents will remember that the road from the village up to the quarry and on to Eryrys wasn't a proper two lane road and if two lorries met, then they just went over the grass verges. Coupled with the suspicion that some drivers were being paid by the lorry load, speeds up and down the local lanes were excessive and things were getting dangerous. An action group was formed by people living along the road to try to improve road safety and NADRA (a non-profit making, voluntary group) was subsequently formed. Since then, despite criticism from some quarters that NADRA was a 'quarry bashing' group, the Association has campaigned to keep the activities of the quarry to within the agreed planning constraints, especially in terms of operating hours and extraction rates. However, our activities have become more varied since the early days. When the C107 towards Mold was reconstructed in the 1990s, it was NADRA that persuaded Clwyd County Council to provide a footpath all the way into Mold.

More recently, NADRA has funded the construction of the village website (<u>www.nercwys.org.uk</u>) and then organised the first two litter bins within the village.

At the moment, our main activities are split between the village electricity supply problems, road safety in conjunction with the Community Council and the Nercwys News. The latest news from Scottish Power is that the maintenance section is slow to release information about their schedule but we will keep on asking until we get a satisfactory answer.

The Nercwys News is distributed, free of charge, to every household within the Parish (and beyond, where we have NADRA members). Our main income comes from membership subs and, so far, the Nercwys News has been financed partly from NADRA, donations and also from the FLVC. Funding has been found for this year, but with general cut backs, future help is not guaranteed so NADRA would like to boost its membership to provide a more secure future for our newsletter.

So, are you interested in joining us? NADRA has shown over the years that it is a capable, respected and flexible association, ready to work with other organisations, but also prepared to battle for the wellbeing of the village and surrounding areas.

Enclosed is a membership application form and we thank those who have already renewed their membership. The subs have remained the same since the beginning (how many organisations can match that?) of £1 each per annum, or 50p for Senior Citizens. Most people in the parish will be aware that the National Eisteddfod of Wales is going to be held in our local area during August 2007. It is our country's largest annual, cultural event which visits North and South Wales alternatively, and stages traditional ceremonies and competitions for music, recitation, literature, dance, arts, craft, science, etc for a whole range of ages. Many of the events are staged in a pavilion, which will soon be erected on one of the fields on the Mold / Pontblyddyn road, but other concerts and events will be staged in various venues throughout the area during the days and evenings.

Thousands of people will attend the events during that week: **August 4th to August 11th**. Those living locally will be pleased to have the festival on their doorsteps, but the teams of volunteers, working to help the main band of experts, will have organised car-parking and caravan parking for thousands of visitors. Others choose to spend a week's holiday in the area of the Eisteddfod in order to get a taste of the locality and to take in places of interest.

. <u>NERCWYS HIGHWAYS</u>

Recent information from the Highways Department of Flintshire County Council is that there is a large programme in the Nercwys area in the immediate future. Some of the roads affected are:

Ffordd Bryngwyn, Ffordd Glyndwr, Ffordd Cae-newydd, Henffordd, Ffordd Llewelyn, Ffordd Plas Urcha, Ffordd Talwrn, some of the lanes towards Treuddyn and some of the lanes in the Black Mountain area. In addition, sections of the C107 (Mold – Nercwys – Eryrys) will also be treated.

All of these roads will have a surface dressing laid (the dreaded tarmac and stone chippings) in an attempt to seal the road surface. The County Council anticipate that most of the work should be completed by the time you read this but the information is included in case they are running late.

My contact in the Highways Department is David James (01244 550213) and he noted my comments about potholes forming at the entrance to the village (outside The Crossing House) and down the edges of the lane past Ty-newydd Cottages and Ty-newydd Farm going towards the Leeswood Hall gates. Having many cyclists and motorcyclists living in the village, they are particularly vulnerable to road defects (anyone who watched the very recent ITV programme on the state of Britain's roads will have been shocked by the overall deplorable condition) so if you see damage to the road surface, please report it to the County Council (number above); someone's life may be at risk, otherwise.

This year's Owain Glyndwr Festival will be held on Sunday, 16th of September. The profits will go towards 'Miles for Smiles'.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL NOTES

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PUBLIC MEETING 21st March, 2007.

The meeting was chaired by Cath Houghton. She offered condolences to the families of Beryl Elliott, and Blodwen Jones [our Chair's mother], two well known and loved members of our community who have sadly passed away.

There has been an issue over the precept – Nercwys Community Council Precept has risen by 160.32%. This is due to an administrative error caused by the budget figure having been inadvertently taken as the precept figure. While this is a large percentage it is in fact a small sum in money – a difference of 43p per week on a Band D property- making a total of £36.50.

Of the thirty four community councils in Flintshire, eight have a precept higher than this, and five have a precept higher than $\pounds 40.00$. Seventeen have a precept higher than $\pounds 30.00$. The average precept for Flintshire Community Councils is in fact $\pounds 31.42$ on a Band D property.

The view from Flintshire County Council is that it is not possible to 're- precept', as this would be an expensive and overly bureaucratic task. The advice received from its Financial, Legal and Democratic Services Directorate is that although there is a large percentage increase, that indeed the actual sums involved are small –the advice is let the precept stand, and to rectify it next year.

The Chair of Nercwys Community Council has sincerely apologized for this situation.

The website has been set up, <u>www.Nercwys.net</u> and is developing. Our thanks to Richard Thorogood.

The Youth Council has been established and had its third meeting. It looks like developing into a very useful forum for young people in the village, and we hope that it prospers.

We have also secured a bid from the Welsh Assembly Active Lifestyles fund for $\pounds 5,500$ for bicycles for the village. The purpose of this fund is to encourage mature persons to take part in physical activity, thus improving their health. We will be discussing that next week at our meeting. [Note: this is progressing.]

<u>Bus Shelter</u>. County Councillor Nancy Matthews indicated that Flintshire County Council [FCC] would match fund with the Community Council [\pounds 2,500 each] to replace the existing shelter with one with sides, and move the existing one to another location within the village.

Mrs Lisa Fearn asked whether it was not the responsibility of FCC anyway.

There was also an issue over where to place the moved shelter. The view was expressed that the village had actually got one shelter provided by FCC, the sides of which had been removed as the result of a public request. It was felt that a more substantial shelter would be beneficial. [Note: Bill Brereton has conducted a

survey which resulted in a disappointing level of response; however the overwhelming view was that the re-deployed bus shelter be located opposite the Old Smithy.]

Stones by Church Gate. These have been removed but the area is now muddy. [Note FCC has now made good the area, and put some posts up there!]

<u>Christmas Tree</u>. Mr. Paul Roberts raised this issue. It was agreed that he and the Clerk would have a site meeting and then report to the Community Council as how to proceed. [Note – To take power to a site for the Christmas tree would cost several thousand pounds so this is not being progressed.]

Mrs. Mair Roberts raised the issue of the bench at the north end of the village repeatedly crossing the road. The Clerk undertook to speak to those who may be involved should it stray again. [Note – the bench has been spoken to and has promised to stay in place!]

Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch

Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch are about crime prevention but also work to build better communities.

Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch is a 5 times award winning organisation. Their office is based at Mold Police Station and its staff work very closely with its partner agencies, ie Police, Fire service, Flintshire County Council and many others.

A number of Neighbourhood Watch staff are funded by the Welsh Assembly until March 2008. Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch is unique in that it has a 'FACT' Team (Flintshire Active Communities Team). Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch and the FACT Team are constantly working to reduce crime and create a safer environment for all residents, old and young.

The FACT team

- Identify youth and community projects in their areas
- Network with partner agencies, ie police, fire service, council etc
- Work together with members of the community
- Encourage the formation for neighbourhood watch schemes
- Attend Community meetings and Neighbourhood Policing Panel meetings

In an effort to increase awareness and develop more Watches in areas throughout Flintshire, Neighbourhood Watch have devised a survey (enclosed) which explains the concept of Neighbourhood Watch and, amongst other questions, enquires as to whether people would like to become a coordinator, or a watch member. The results so far have been astounding. The interest and enthusiasm generated by the survey forms has been extraordinary, to say the least.

Did you know that, on average 83% of residential crime that is committed in Flintshire is in areas that do not have Neighbourhood Watch Schemes?

Neighbourhood Watch want to increase the Watches in all areas to try and improve this figure yet again!

If you would like to become a Watch coordinator you can contact your local Police Station or us on 01352 707545. Alternatively, speak to your Community Beat Manager PC 1700 Aldous. Community Beat Managers value Neighbourhood Watches in their areas as residents are the 'eyes and ears' of the community. In April 2007 Chief Constable Richard

Brunstrom stated that `Flintshire Neighbourhood Watch is `one of the very best in the UK'.
