A word from the Head...

Dear Parent/Carer

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of my staff to thank you for the continued support that you give the school. This academic year has flown by and our students have excelled in so many different ways that it would not do them justice to mention just one or two examples. Within an ever changing educational landscape, we constantly strive to make sure that we provide the best possible learning experience for our students.

Improving the learning environment

The school has an extensive building programme taking place over the summer holidays:

- Phase one of our £1million window replacement project.
- Enlarging and redesigning of the PE changing rooms in the sports hall.
- Improving PE and extra-curricular provision by building of our new climbing wall.
- Expanding our design & technology provision by remodelling areas of the design & technology block.
- Remodelling areas of the Café to increase the speed of serving our new student approved menus.

Future School expansion

The new Y7 intake will be 7 forms of 210 students and this expansion will be followed for the next two years. Currently we are in discussion with the Local Authority regarding new facilities to cater for the current and future increase in student numbers. A number of scenarios are being discussed regarding how many students the school could feasibly take. The school will not know the outcome of the preferred Local Authority expansion model until January 2016 at the earliest.

As a Community School the Local Authority controls our admissions and can direct the school to take on additional students regardless of the school's view. Foundation or Academy status will allow the school to directly control admissions and over the next few months we will be exploring both these categories.

School finance

On 1st July the three Hitchin Secondary Heads joined a large group of Headteachers from Hertfordshire who went to Westminster to meet local MPs to discuss school funding. Our current school budget has not increased in real terms and so does not take into consideration a 7% increase in staffing on-costs. It is estimated that nationally, school funding will be reduced by 12% over the next 5 years.

The Priory School has a very well managed budget but we are going to have to make challenging decisions in the next twelve months to ensure that we can maintain our educational standards. We have already identified areas of expenditure that can be reduced which we will be implemented from September 2015.

Postal cost

Postal costs have doubled in the last two years and in an era of electronic communication we have looked at reducing postage both as a cost cutting and an environmental exercise. From September the following changes will be taking place:

1. All newsletters will be sent out on ParentMail only. Those not registered for ParentMail can access the newsletter via the school website.

2. Student reward postcards will be replaced by praise emails to student accounts.
3. Whole school attendance letters will no longer be sent, attendance details will be recorded on progress reports

Student photocopying allowance

Currently students are allocated a generous photocopying allowance. Having reviewed what other local schools are doing, auditing the printing patterns of students and reflecting on curriculum needs, we have decided to limit the amount of money we place on a student's card. If students run out of printing credits then they will be able to purchase more using the current system in place. Over the next 12 months we aim to reduce the need for printing and reduce our environmental impact.

It is estimated that by implementing these two actions, the school will save the equivalent cost of one member of teaching staff.

Expectations for September

The success of every child is at the core of our school ethos. As a parent you should have high expectations regarding the standard of learning your child receives at school. If you feel that your child's work is not being marked, homework not being set or lessons are not challenging enough, please contact the school so that we can resolve your concerns.

As you are well aware we have very high standards regarding attendance (96%+), uniform and behaviour. Our policies and systems are very clear and can be found on our website. Please support your child to start the next academic year successfully by ensuring that they:

- Have spent time doing background reading or reading for pleasure.
- Have identified which clubs and activities they are going to get involved with.
- Have the correct uniform, hair cut & colour.
- Have all the correct learning resources for the start of term.

We wish you all a safe summer and look forward to welcoming your child back to School on Wednesday 2nd September 2015.

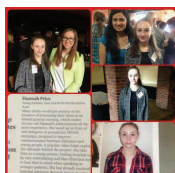


Congratulations to Hannah! We are exceptionally proud and pleased to announce that

This is an event which allows students from schools in the region to showcase their science and engineering projects and also to compete against each other for a number of awards.



Megan and Daisy's project, "A Pi App for Tim Peake", is a prototype for an electronic game which tests memory and could be developed further to test the reflexes of astronauts. They were assisted in this project by Miss Greig of the mathematics department.

The standard this year was particularly high and all entrants were questioned closely about their projects by a number of judges. Daisy and Megan were asked particularly about the programming which they had to make the project work. Clearly the judges were very impressed by the girls and their project as they were awarded both the Junior Engineering prize and the prize for the Best Use of Mathematics in a Project. This is an outstanding achievement and both Megan and Daisy are to be greatly congratulated on this success which has come as a result of their skill, hard work and tremendous enthusiasm.

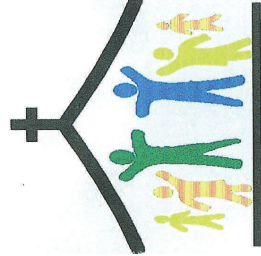
