Bart's Bash 17th & 18th August...



As per the last 2 years SBS & WSC are again hosting Bart's Bash this year. Some will know but to recap this event was set up in 2014 by the Andrew Simpson Sailing Foundation in memorial of Andrew Simpson, a British Olympic gold medal sailor who

was killed in a capsize of his 72ft catamaran in San Francisco Bay whilst training for the America's Cup.

The memorial event was established as a mass participation sailing race with over 50,000 people from 70 sailing clubs all over the world taking part in the race since it began.

Last year we had 7 sailors complete the race and would like to think we could improve on that, now that we have an added interest in sailing from some of our skiing Members, this year!

RACE INFORMATION

The race weekend is $17^{th} - 18^{th}$ September but we are planning to race on the Sunday (18^{th}) There is a planned race start time of 11.00 in the morning with a least one race - dependent on the weather we may try and fit more races in back to back or with a short break for lunch. However this will be decided by the race organisers on the day, so if you are planning on taking part please keep the day free!

The results will then be entered on the Bart's Bash website and each sailor will get ranked globally – see how high you can get!

Additionally, the results will be calculated on the day at the club (after discussion we will be using our established handicaps for this event) by hand so we can announce the winner(s).

The race entry fee is £6 and will be payable on the day in cash – donations are also welcome by sailors and non-sailors as this is a charity event (last year we raised over £200). The proceeds from this event go towards getting more young people involved in sailing.
