We hope to be back in the late autumn, look out for a notice in Around Pattishall and on Facebook. Have a great summer everyone.

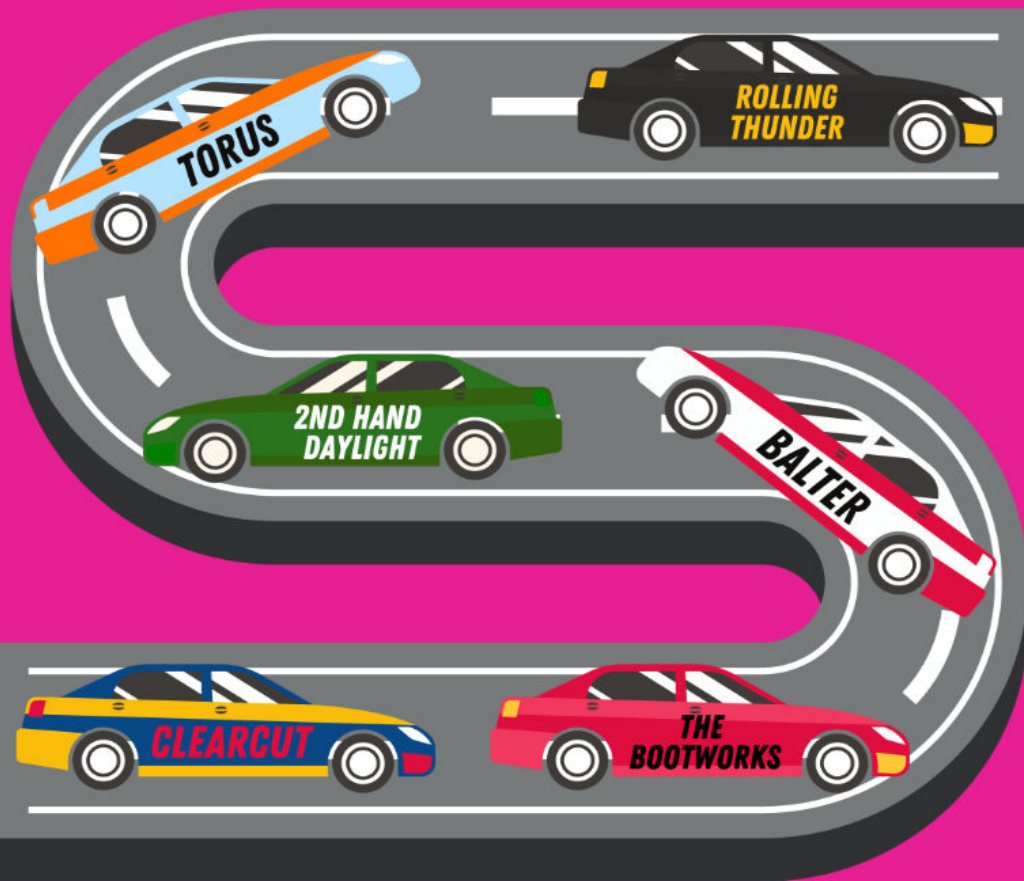

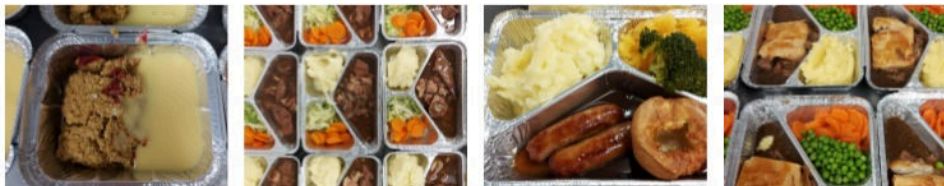

Samples

The practice is unable to accept samples if they have not been requested by a clinician. If a clinician has requested for you to do a sample, please collect the appropriate sample pot from reception. Once you have collected your sample and ensured your name and date of birth are on the sample pot, please return to the receptionists in the bag provided, who will ensure your sample is given to the correct clinician.

Prescription Charges

Most adults in England must pay prescription charges. Some items are always free, including contraceptives and medicines prescribed for hospital inpatients. As of April 2023, the current prescription charge is £9.65 per item. A prescription prepayment certificate (PPC) could save you money on NHS prescription costs:

- A 3-month PPC costs £31.25
- A 12-month PPC costs £111.60
- A 12-month PPC for hormone replacement therapy (HRT) only is £19.30

Please speak to our dispensary to enquire about getting a PPC.

Home Visits

If you are housebound and unable to attend the practice, you can call reception before 10:30am each day to book a home visit. You will be visited by either a GP or a paramedic.

Extended Access

We are now offering extended access appointments at the practice again. These clinics are held every Tuesday 18:30-20:00 at Greens Norton Medical Centre AND every other Saturday 08:30-13:00 at Weedon

Surgery. These are for pre-booked appointments only. Our phone lines will not be open during this time, if you wish to cancel your appointment, please call within our usual opening hours.

Roads & Safety

The Parish Council met with another representative from Highways to discuss the deterioration of the road surface along Festival & Leys Roads and have formally written to our MP, Andrea Leadsom, about the situation. The council is investigating the acquisition of another VAS sign for Astcote High Street and is hoping that there may be funding available. Ten 30mph signs have been purchased and will be distributed at strategic points throughout the parish to remind drivers not to speed. The council continues to be mindful of the speeding traffic along Butchers Lane and is in the process of reviewing options that may help towards making it a safer route for pedestrians & motorists.

Dog Bins

It has got to the stage where it would not be a Parish Council report if there was not a mention of dog poo! The Parish Council is looking to install another dog waste bin at the entrance to the Old Burial Ground at Blacksmith Close. West Northants have taken it upon themselves to replace the black bin that was there with another black bin with a brown lid with a label 'For Compost Only.' Residents are still throwing their dog poo bags into this bin, which the council is now refusing to empty. So, the bin is going to be replaced by a dedicated dog waste one. It has been noted that a few residents are putting dog poo from their gardens into the bins. Please refrain from doing so as it only helps to fill bins more quickly. It is entirely permissible to put your best friend's waste in your black bin rather than discard it elsewhere.

Hedges, Trees & Footpaths

It has been noted that there are hedges encroaching onto footpaths. If you are the owner of a property whose hedge impedes pedestrians or vehicles, then please do trim but be mindful of any nesting birds. We have had concerns about trees growing out of control. If you contact 'Fix My Street' then the offending tree will be looked at. Most of the trees in question are located on verges and therefore fall under the jurisdiction of Highways and not the Parish Council. Many thanks to Steve Fitchett for doing a great job in the Garden of Remembrance, which will now be kept in a neater & tidier manner.

Burial Plots

For many years the council has been aware of the lack of burial plots in the graveyard. We are trying to increase the area and are in communication with the church in the hope of moving things along. The Old Burial Ground is looking better kept and we hope to continue to keep it in good order.

Lighting

Another fourteen lights are earmarked for being converted to LEDs with part night cell lights. This should happen over the next eight weeks. We are also installing solar lights to illuminate the church steps making it safer for those entering the churchyard by this means.

Maintenance

Our thanks to John Russell who has been busy regenerating the benches at the Butchers Lane Playing Fields. The handrail at the church steps has been mended and made secure. We are waiting for all our play equipment to be inspected which should happen within a few weeks. Each month a member of the Parish Council visits each playground and reports back to council. No doubt there will be some maintenance of equipment to be dealt with, but it is hoped that there will be funds for additional play equipment to be installed.

It is still hoped that the Gayton & Tiffeld minibus service will soon be operative in the parish. We await the green light from the Traffic Commissioner for Great Britain to give their approval.

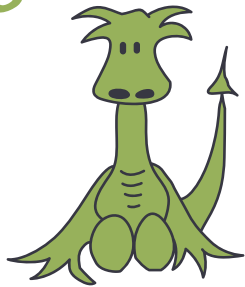
