The 'Icing on the Cake' for Purbrook Netball Club

When Purbrook Netball Club attended the Havant Borough Council Sports Awards at the end of February 2015, they had no idea what was to come. The Club was presented with 'Club of the Year' 2014. Jacqui Hussey, chairperson could not believe it but was so pleased and proud that the players, parents and committee had received such a wonderful recognition for all their hard work. It comes just at the right time as the club is about to celebrate its third anniversary in April 2015.

The club has always promoted themselves as a community club and has well over fifty members with an age range of eight to fifty three. The club originally had fifteen members. With the club's rapid expansion, they needed additional coaches to handle the capacity, as its popularity and reputation grew fast. The club advertised and recruited additional coaches to support the clubs growth.

The club has also encouraged some of the girls to become qualified umpires and is currently helping to support a number of the junior members who have done the umpire beginners course. They are currently umpiring in the adult league to become fully qualified, with mentoring sessions being completed by Portsmouth Netball Association.



Chairperson and Coach, Jacqui Hussey, was also presented with the Havant Borough Council Sports Awards 'Coach of the Year Runner Up' 2014. "I found this overwhelming and emotional due to a very difficult period in my life. Unfortunately in September 2014, I suffered a stroke which brought my life to a complete standstill, but after six months of rehabilitation and by doing as I am told (which is difficult for me); I am well on the road to recovery. I have so many people to thank for the support over this difficult period that I cannot name you, you know who you are!" She says that the club has given her something to focus on and is adamant that her stroke will not interfere or jeopardise the success of the club in any way.

Charlotte Belcher, Young Ambassador of the club had this to say about Jacqui:-

"Jacqui is one of the most inspirational people I have ever met. She cares for every member's individual needs and treats all the girls like her own daughters (even though she has none of her own). She is a kind, generous and loving person who at Christmas every year buys a selection box for every member of the club! Jacqui is always honest and gives constructive criticism but always follows this with kind words of encouragement. I know I speak for all the members of the club when I say without Jacqui, none of what we have achieved would have been possible!"

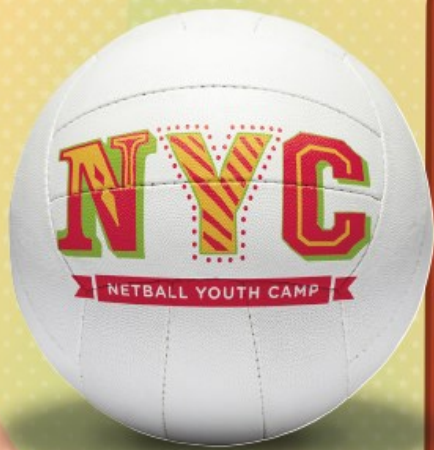

The CAPS Process

Steps to achieving CAPS

What help is available?

Step 1

Registration

Register your club for CAPS by completing the registration form and returning it to England Netball. You must have junior members (U19) and be affiliated to England netball

Download the form from www.EnglandNetball.co.uk/make-the-game/caps or contact your regional office

Step 2

Working towards CAPS

Actively work towards CAPS. You may want to form a working group to assist with completing the assessment file and collecting evidence.

Your Netball Development Officer (NDO) will contact you to arrange a meeting to go through the assessment file.

Step 3

Submission of file

Once you have completed the assessment file you need to submit this to your regional office by one of the assessment dates.

Find the assessment dates at www.EnglandNetball.co.uk/make-the-game/caps or contact your regional office.



Achieve Bronze CAPS

Step 4

Annual Health Check

Once you have achieved CAPS you must complete an Annual Health Check each year of accreditation. This is a self-declaration process to ensure that clubs are maintaining CAPS status.

Your regional office will contact you when you need to complete your Annual Health Check and your NDO will assist you if you need help.

Step 5

Silver and Gold CAPS

Once you have achieved Bronze CAPS you have the option for going for Silver or Gold.

If you wish to submit for Silver or Gold CAPS contact your regional office who will advise and support your club.

Step 6

External Verification

Clubs are randomly selected each year to be externally verified by an independent organisation to ensure that they are meeting Clubmark standards.

If your club is selected you will be informed by England Netball and you will be contacted by ClubMark), the organisation responsible, to arrange a date and time that is convenient.

Step 7

CAPS Re-accreditation

Every four years CAPS clubs must re-accredit. This will involve re-submitting the assessment file.

Your regional office will contact you to tell you when you need to re-accredit and your NDO will be available to assist you with updating your assessment file.

THIS GIRL CAN

This Girl Can is a national campaign developed by Sport England and a wide range of partnership organisations.

It's a celebration of active women up and down the country who are doing their thing no matter how well they do it, how they look or even how red their face gets!

Fear of judgement is stopping many of us from taking part in exercise—this is an important point for clubs to remember when new players arrive, fear of judgement may skew a participants views of a session.

Netball In The City

Solent University dominate at Netball in the City Event

Staff from Southampton Solent University dominated at the first ever Netball in the City event organised by England Netball, taking both the Winners' and Runners' Up medals after an action packed day.

Over 100 participants and supporters turned up at the Outdoor Sports Centre, Bassett for the corporate tournament aimed at local businesses to enter teams of both male and female players. Teams from Associated British Ports, Grant Thornton and Southampton City Council joined the sides from Solent University.

Debbie Laycock, England Netball's Netball Development Community Coach for South East Hampshire, who organised the tournament explained: "This is our first corporate event in Southampton and only the second ever in the country, other Netball in the City tournaments are taking place in London, Bristol, Birmingham, Manchester and Newcastle later this month – we have had a phenomenal response!"

She added: "Solent Sparks, the eventual Southampton winners, recorded some great results on the day and beat nearest rivals Solent Lightning and ABP MER by some margin to get their hands on the winners' trophy and £100 restaurant voucher.

"The male participants more than held their own against their female counterparts, there were some interesting interpretations of the rules at times but the whole tournament was played in great spirit and a lot of the males were asking when the next one was!"

Laycock was keen to point out that the tournament couldn't have gone ahead without the efforts of local businesses and umpires giving up their free time over Easter weekend. She said: "Huge thanks to HC Tournaments and Angelic Beauty who provided our top three teams with prizes, as well as Hoodlum Fang, Gosport Leisure Centre and David Lloyd for providing raffle prizes. We made £101 for Cancer Research thanks to participant's generosity"

Laycock also revealed that she'd had emails and calls from ladies who hadn't played for a while but wanted to get started again thanks to the Netball in the City event.

She explained: "I'd like next years' Netball in the City event to be at least twice as big and I think the initial feedback means we can achieve that. In the meantime we have had lots of interest from ladies wanting to get back in to the sport many of them haven't played since school. I am delighted to point them in the direction of Back to Netball, as we have sessions taking place all over Southampton, Eastleigh and Fareham at the moment. These are gentle, re-introduction sessions with the emphasis on fun, friends and improving fitness and we welcome new ladies along."

Laycock added: "For the males, such was the success of Netball in the City, I am aiming to organise a mixed Back to Netball festival as part of England Netball's 'Big Summer of Netball'. If there's enough interest there is no reason we can't get some friendly mixed fixtures up and running after this and of course there will always be Netball in the City 2016."

Back to Netball has attracted 60,000 participants since it started in 2010 Sessions, aimed at ladies aged 16+, are led by experienced Back to Netball coaches and cover the basics from chest passes to shooting. With sessions in schools and leisure centres across the area, giggles are guaranteed!

Netball South Satellite Academies Festival 2015

Always looking to enhance the Festival experience, the SA Festival took place as a stand-alone event this year: 111 young Performance Pathway athletes made up the 12 Satellite Academy squads participated in the non-stop netball festival on Saturday 18th April at the University of Chichester.

The aim of the Satellite Academies Festival 2015 was to bring the best Satellite Academy athletes together, allowing benchmarking by athletes and coaches. The athletes, chosen by their academy coaches, formed representative squads. To facilitate benchmarking for the coaches and role-modelling for the athletes, 28 of the SA athletes were picked out and put into four different teams to play against a squad of Regional Academy athletes (all 9 are in their first year at Regional level and some played out of position). The exhibition match took place during a break from the Festival play: a different team of SA athletes played in each quarter. The SA girls soon overcame their nerves and settled in to enjoy their time on the court against the RA side.

Whilst it was a competitive tournament, the emphasis was not on winning, but on the athletes displaying their netball skills in match-play. Nevertheless, everyone likes to know the results ... the first 3 places in Section B were decided by goal average and even that was a close thing (1.34, 1.28, 1.25):

What happens next?

Scouts and selectors were present to look at all the athletes but, in particular, those who were highlighted by their Academy Coach(es).

The Satellite Academy Coaches now have some feedback for the highlighted athletes.

We intend to invite some athletes to a Regional 1-day camp and/or a Regional Academy session or two in the near future – dates will be confirmed with the individual athletes. Satellite Academy Coaches can also nominate any athletes who were ill or injured and therefore not able to participate in the Satellite Academies Festival.

Decisions about graduating athletes into the Regional Academy are not made on a single showing: we will observe the nominated or invited athletes over several coached sessions and additional match-play before any RA places are confirmed for 2015-2016.

Additionally, the counties will have taken opportunity to view their own athletes in match-play, which will undoubtedly help when making decisions about their 2015-2016 Academies.

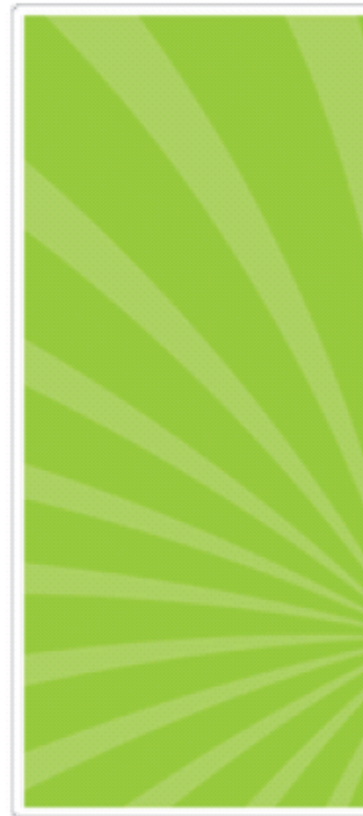

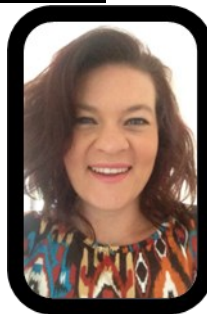

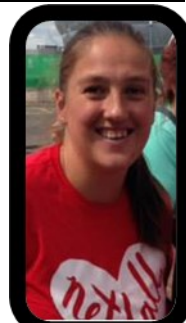
