There will be further updates in the future to explain the functionality of the Board on how we support our members going forward.







MABEL FINNIGAN MBE



Messages of congratulations have flooded in from all over the crown green world after Shropshire's Mabel Finnigan was awarded the British Empire Medal for services to bowls.

The proud pensioner from Madeley in Telford admits to being overwhelmed by the number of phone calls, cards and messages received following the announcement in the King's New Year Honours list.

Widely saluted as the rock of women's bowling in Shropshire, Mabel has devoted much of her adult life to promoting and organising the sport she still loves to this day.

She was the founder and sole secretary of the Telford Ladies Afternoon League for 30 years; treasurer of the Shrewsbury Ladies League for 27 years; and county team captain and official of the Shropshire Ladies association, including the figurehead role of president.

Her daughter, Deena Woodhall, said: "So proud of Mom – 88 and still going strong.

"She is so thankful for all the hard work certain folks have done for her – and so grateful for all the phone calls and messages."

Her nephew and God son, St Georges star Tony Rhodes, added: "To be recognised, at this stage in life for what, at the end of the day, has been a passion of hers, is truly humbling for her."

Shropshire Ladies president and County Development Officer Pauline Wilson led the tributes, saying: "I know many will want to join me in offering our heartfelt congratulations to Mabel for this once in a lifetime award – what a fantastic achievement."

Before taking on such high profile off-green roles, Mabs was a high class bowler in her own right and has treasured memories of her time at Dun Cow Bowling Club in Dawley with her late husband Jim.

She bowled for Madeley Court and, when that green closed, she moved to nearby Madeley Cricket Club BC and also to Broseley – and she is still an active and dedicated member of both those bowls clubs today.

A Mid Shropshire League spokesman Fletcher said: "Mabel was the first female recipient of a life membership from the league in January 2020 – for if anyone deserved such an honour for all she has done for the sport then it was her.

"Her desire to promote the game and all that is good about it is infectious.

"And her determination to do things in the right and proper way is admirable.

"I am sure all the bowls clubs, leagues and bodies she has served over the years would whole heartedly agree."

Bagillt Bowling Club - An Inspiration

The popular Bagillt club will be given a new lease of life after months of lying derelict. The Leader reported that Bagillt Bowling Club, on Highfield Road, was in dire need of 'new blood' to keep the green and the committee going after a sharp decline in members.



Since its launch in 1989, the club was deemed 'very popular and attractive' in years gone by. However Linda Williams said the club has been closed for several years but after signing a 27-year lease, says it is time to breathe new life into it for the community. She said: "It was closed down due to ill health but I've now started to get the ball rolling to get it re-opened. "It will be a Bagillt community bowling club. I've had the keys from the council and everything is moving forward.

"I've been bowling all my life, I'm a Welsh and British champion and I just thought what better than to get the community hub back up and running. We will take it over as a community. "It was such a shame to see it shut but hopefully we will see the re-opening in about six months."

"It is in really bad condition and needs a lot of work." Linda said she hopes to hold entertainment nights and re-engage the youth into the sport. She added:

"There's nothing to do in Bagillt. I bowl everywhere but there was nowhere in my community that could be used. "Even if you don't play, we want people to come down and watch and have a chat and a cake. It's about getting the community together as a social gathering, that's what bowls is.

"I want to boost the community spirit. I did it in Ruthin a couple of years ago, that was derelict and I asked for a chance and now they have a team up and running and a gardening club. We can do that in Bagillt."
