Directions to Bucks grounds

Burnham (Postcode SL1 8LP) (tel: 01628-602296)

Leave M4 at J7, towards A4. Turn left onto A4 (Bath Road) towards Maidenhead. Go through lights and turn right at Sainsbury's roundabout, into Lent Rise Road. Continue under railway bridge, over two mini roundabouts, past the Brickmakers and Pheasant PHs and two further mini roundabouts. Carry straight on into Taplow Common Road and continue for 1/2 mile past Grovefield Hotel on left. The entrance to the ground is a further 200 yards on the right.

Chesham (Postcode HP5 1NE) (tel 01494 783635)

The Meadow, Amy Lane, Chesham. Ground is situated on southern outskirts of town, on the A416 from Amersham and adjoins Chesham United FC. At the roundabout at the edge of the Amersham end of the town (at the foot of the hill from Amersham), take the first exit if coming from Amersham.

Gerrards Cross (Postcode SL9 7JZ)

From M40: exit M40 at J1, head for Beaconsfield on the A40. Go past the French Horn PH on the left, after 200yards take the 2nd left into Dukes Wood Avenue. When the road bears left, carry straight on into Dukes Lane and the ground.

From Slough: take B473 for Wexham and Stoke Poges, turn onto B416 for Gerrards Cross, turn right at traffic lights onto A40. Dukes Wood Avenue is on the right after half a mile.

From the station: turn right on leaving the station, walk along the main road past the shops. At the start of the common, turn left into the road called East Common (there is no sign on the far side of the road, but there is one on the near side). Follow this road around the common until you come to the main road (which is the A40); the Apple Tree pub is on the left-hand corner. Turn right onto the A40, after around 100 yards take the 2nd left into Dukes Wood Avenue. When the road bears left, carry straight on into Dukes Lane and the ground.

BUCKS C.C.C. SECRETARY'S REPORT



In 2017, although we won but a single match in the Unicorns Knockout Competition, we were much more competitive than in recent years; we should have won two other matches and might well have won the fourth, but lost control, albeit briefly, at crucial points. Indeed, our net run rate was such that had we won a second match, we would probably have progressed to the

Knockout stage. Sadly, our Championship form was much more erratic. We performed well in two of our drawn matches – against Staffordshire at High Wycombe and Cambridgeshire at Chesham – but in the other two we were saved from defeat by heavy rain, which prevented any play on the final day in both instances. Perhaps the most encouraging performance was in the match against Cambridgeshire, where we were in a perilous position at the end of the first day, having been required to bat in conditions which it seemed that everyone but the umpires, regardless of allegiance, thought unfit. Thereafter, our batting in both innings showed application and determination, which was sadly lacking for much of the season.

One of the two matches abandoned due to the aforementioned rain was our 1,000th Championship match against Suffolk at Bury St. Edmunds. We were fortunate indeed that this was not in evidence at the following match against Norfolk at Burnham, where we celebrated the milestone with well-attended lunches on the first two days. Many past players travelled long distances to be with us on the Sunday, where we were well entertained by exEngland, Surrey – and Bucks! – player Keith Medlycott, and on the following day we were joined by guests from many areas of cricket as well as the Lord-Lieutenant of the County, Sir Henry Aubrey Fletcher; on this occasion we heard an excellent speech from Ian Peck, Vice Chairman of Northamptonshire CCC. On both days the weather was hot and sunny and the cricket entertaining – just reward for the magnificent effort put into organising the occasion by Frank Russell and the host club.

The Academy XI again performed well, winning the Beynon Cup; unfortunately, their Tom Orford campaign was somewhat hampered by rain allowing only twelve overs in one of their only two three-day matches!

In Seniors cricket, the Over 60s go from strength to strength, with the 1st XI again progressing to the knockout stage of the national competition. The Over 50s 1st XI is competitive, but availability for their 2^{nd} XI is a continuing cause for concern.

As ever, our thanks are due to all the scorers and umpires who give so much time to officiating in our matches and in particular to Paul Dean, for his continued diligence in providing the statistics for our 1st and Academy XIs; also to the BACO Umpires Appointments Officer, Tony Greenham, who puts a great deal of effort into meeting the needs of the Seniors teams. (He will have even more to do in the coming summer, as the Over 60s will be fielding a regular 3^d

XI!) And, of course, we continue to be very grateful to all the clubs around the County, who allow us to use their facilities to stage our home matches and are unfailingly hospitable and cooperative.

I am saddened to have to record the passing of two great cricket lovers, both of whom I had known for many years and counted as friends. Many Members will already be aware that Richard Merricks, who travelled all over the country with his wife Jill to support us, died on the morning of the third day of our match at Burnham; it was some small consolation that we had enjoyed their company on the previous two days. And very recently came the sad news of the death of David Armstrong, for many years Secretary of Norfolk and then of the Minor Counties Cricket Association and, more recently, President of his county club. They were both great servants of the game and widely known and liked; it will be strange not to see them at matches.

Turning to the future: there is rather more to write than usual. At all levels, our fixture list looks rather different. Members will remember that the Minor Counties experimented with a Twenty/20 competition three years ago and this now becomes a permanent feature. In the Group stage, we shall play four other counties, two at home and two away, with two matches on each day; the Semi Finals and Final will be played at Wormsley in August. To accommodate these additional days, the Knockout Competition becomes a straight knockout, with no Group stage, and the Championship programme will start three weeks later than previously – which we hope will improve availability, as university cricket will be largely over by then. The Tom Orford Competition has been enlarged by the inclusion of Lincolnshire, which gives our Academy a third threeday match. Naturally, this entails additional expenditure, but your Committee places great value on developing the multi-day skills of our young players and we are confident that this will be money well spent. Finally, as mentioned above, our Over 60s will be fielding a 3^{rd} XI for the first time.

We shall embark on these waters with a new Captain, Tom Hampton. Mike Payne has fulfilled his duties with diligence and enthusiasm during the last three years and I and the rest of our Committee are very grateful to him for all his efforts; we are also truly delighted that he is keen to continue playing for us. Last year, Tom returned as a regular 1st XI player after two years with Gloucestershire and I am confident that his First Class experience will be of great value to the team.

The ECB has been conducting a major review of the future direction of all cricket in this country; there has been much publicity about the first Class game, but recreational cricket is also in a state of flux. A working group has held meetings with all County Boards and Minor Counties and the views of Premier League and Minor County players were widely canvassed. The results of the latter survey were very encouraging for Minor Counties cricket; the vast majority of players regarded the 3-day Championship as the pinnacle of recreational cricket and as offering a good pathway to the First Class game. They also wanted the Knockout competition to continue and a Twenty/20 competition to

be introduced, both being played with white balls and in coloured clothing; the Minor Counties Committee was delighted that it had already decided to go in this direction, a few weeks before the survey was completed.

The ECB's review will not be completed until later this year and is likely to lead to changes for all Minor Counties; and, of course, there will be financial implications which we cannot predict with any confidence. The fiveyear Memorandum of Understanding which governs the funding of recreational cricket expired last September and has been extended pending completion of the review. A consequence of this is that, for the current year at least, there will be no inflation-related increase in the funding that we receive from the ECB, which of course increases the financial pressures upon us. One is reminded of the Chinese curse: "may you live in interesting times".

In closing, I must express my sincere thanks to my fellow Officers and to all of the Committee, both for all the work that they do for your Club and for the support and assistance that they give to me; they not only facilitate my job, they also make it very enjoyable.

I wish all our teams and Members a very enjoyable and successful summer's cricket.

LAURIE CHAMPNISS, a leg-spin and googly bowler, who played for Bucks from 1971 to 1977, died at the age of 78. A larger than life character, he took 106 wickets at 20.53 in 43 Minor Counties Championship matches for Bucks. Bowling predominantly googlies, he had best innings figures of 5-14. He also took 30 catches.

Laurie, an Old Harrovian who played most of his club cricket for Northwood in Middlesex, played in two Gillette Cup ties against first-class counties. In the famous match against Glamorgan at Amersham in 1972, which Bucks lost by just four runs, he claimed the wicket of Eifion Jones and two years later dismissed David Nicholls against Kent at Canterbury. His only first-class match was for MCC against East Africa in 1973/4. He was also a keen golfer.

RICHARD MERRICKS, one of the keenest and best-known followers of Minor Counties cricket (and cricket in general), died aged 77 on June 20th while attending Bucks's match against Norfolk at Burnham, which celebrated our 1000th in the Minor Counties Championship. Richard, who suffered a from cerebral palsy, made light of his disability and was the life and soul of any cricket gathering. His encyclopaedic



knowledge of the game, plus his great sense of humour made him most entertaining company.

A fruit farmer from Rye, East Sussex, he had been a member of Bucks for more than 20 years and once joined up with the county on a tour of South Africa, while on was on a separate cricket tour of that country. He was a life member of the MCC, Sussex and Kent and a member of several Minor Counties including Bucks and Norfolk, whose match he attended with his second wife Jill.

DAVID ARMSTRONG, who was the Minor Counties Cricket Association's first full-time secretary, died in February 2017 at the age of 81.

He held the post from 1984-2002, during which time there were many changes to both the professional and recreational games, but David's understanding, attention to detail and seemingly endless list of friends and contacts across the game, was just what the Minor Counties needed to survive those turbulent times. Before he took on this role, he had been secretary of his cherished Norfolk CCC from 1967 to 1984.

He was Norfolk president from 2003 to 2006 (a position currently held by his widow Gail) and subsequently became an Honorary Life Member.

DAVID KEMPSTER, erstwhile 1st XI captain, long-serving committee member and trustee of Tring Park CC, died on 11 February 11. His son, Ben, played a number of Championship games for Bucks.

We are also sad to report the deaths of BRIAN ATKINS, father of former Bucks captain and life member Paul Atkins, ROBIN HARWOOD, father of Bucks opener Andy Harwood, PAT SHARPE, a former Bucks Young Amateur, who played many years for Beaconsfield and PAULA JOHNS, widow of prolific runs scorer David Johns, who died aged 89.

STUART YORK, on being appointed a Life Member of the County. Stuart played for Bucks in the 1970s while a player at High Wycombe. He was Chairman from 1997-2010 and has been President since 2013. ALEX HALES for his record breaking innings of 187 not out for Nottinghamshire against Surrey in the Royal London One-Day Cup final at Lord's. The



innings, which came off just 167 balls and contained four sixes and 20 fours, was the highest one-day score made on the ground.

The former Gerrards Cross batsman, who played for Bucks in the Championship at 17, is a regular member of England's successful ODI and T20 squads, but has been unable to regain his place in the Test side after pulling out of their tour to Bangladesh for security reasons.

PATRICK CASTLEDEN on winning the Horace Perrin Cup for his magnificent innings of 166 not out which helped Bucks draw their match against Cambridgeshire at Chesham.

JON BURDEN on winning the Paul Slatter Cup for a true all-round display throughout the Bucks Academy games, contributing matchchanging bowling spells and much needed lower-order runs, along with good captaincy.

MIKE STAFFORD and DENZIL OWEN - both Beaconsfield - on being selected to play for England Over 60s in an Ashes Test against Australia.

CHRIS LOWE has been selected for England Over 70s' tour to Australia.

Tom Hampton started playing cricket at Marlow CC in Bucks. He met some amazing people and coaches there who were brilliant, doing all they could for him. He joined Middlesex Academy and moved to Gerrards Cross to play at a higher level. He had two years with the MCC Young Cricketers. The programme was fantastic. It gave him the opportunity to train at Lord's and continue developing his cricket full-time, playing county 2^{nd} XI cricket. During that time, he had the opportunity to be 12^{th} man for England during the four test matches at

Lord's, which was a brilliant opportunity to meet and play with players at the top level.

In 2013, Tom returned to Gerrards Cross where he started coaching, whilst trialling for a couple of counties.

The following year, Tom made his debut for Bucks CCC against Cumberland in Barrow. He recalls it was a remarkable game, with the pitch offering the bowler some pleasing assistance. He took a few wickets: 6 - 48 an encouraging start. Tom continued to have a good first season with Bucks CCC and was brought to the attention of Gloucestershire CCC by Bucks head coach Jason Harrison. Tom was offered a two-year contract, after some good performances. Tom loved being a professional sportsman: in his opinion, the best way to earn a living. There were some ups and downs, and one or two things didn't quite go his way, but it was a great time. He particularly recalls how special it was for him to have his family supporting him as he made his debut.

High Wycombe CC were quick to make contact. Tom had always admired the club for the success they had achieved over the years. He desperately wanted to return to professional cricket, and so grabbed the opportunity to play at HWCC at the top of the HCPCL, on one of the best wickets in the country. A new contract with a professional county has not materialised yet, although the hope is still there.

Tom has continued to develop his coaching experience and HWCC were keen to support his aspirations in this area, by offering him the role of Head Coach. This has coincided with Tom being made Bucks first team captain and Bucks academy coach. These new roles work brilliantly together, and still provide the opportunity for him to play some really good cricket. Tom is keen to do all he can to bring success to both HWCC and Bucks. BUCKS ACADEMY REPORT

It proved successful season for the Bucks Academy as we won all but one of the matches and lifted the T20 Beynon Cup. Only the poor weather prevented us having a chance to add the three-day Tom Orford Trophy.

In one-day cricket, the Academy won twice, lost once and had one rained off. The opening victory came against the Darren Lehmann Academy. Batting first, Bucks reached 266 with two overs left, thanks to half centuries from Teddy Casterton (53), Yash Rastogi (51), Pat Castleden (59) and Dan Ogden (51), with Jordan McLeod adding a quick 27. The Australian tourists were 76-0 before the introduction of spin changed the game, with Dan Ogden (3-25) and Pip France (3-46) reducing them to 99-5. Ashley Turney joined in and took the final wicket, finishing with 3-11 as the visitors were dismissed for 183, giving Bucks victory by 83 runs.

Against Berkshire Academy, our batsmen found runs hard to come by on a helpful bowling pitch. Pat Castleden (83) held it together before a late flourish from Dan Ogden (33no) helped Bucks reach 220-8 off 50 overs. Berkshire looked like cruising home after Sam Burgess's 123, but a couple of late wickets, eventually saw them get home won by six wickets with just two balls to spare. In the final one-day game, Club Cricket Conference Under 25 made 240-7 from their 50 overs, with The pick of the bowlers being Ziya Mohamed (3-43), but a total of 33 wides took the gloss off of our bowling display. The Bucks reply started solidly thanks to Poojan Vyas (34), Henry Moore (50), Yash Rastogi (26) and Dhavel Norotam (30). But a flurry of wickets left Bucks on 172-7, needing 69 at a rate of eight an over. Aggressive innings from Aashi Zaib (43) and Jon Burden(27no) saw Bucks home by two wickets in the last over.

The Beynon Cup T20 competition, Bucks were drawn against Hertfordshire Stags in the semi-final on the second ground at Radlett. Heavy rain in the previous few days delayed the start while areas of the outfield were cordoned off due to holes and puddles. Bucks fielded first and produced superb all round performance restricting Herts to 85 all out from 19.1 overs, albeit on a very difficult pitch and slow outfield. Thanks to Uzair Amjaid (2-12), Jon Burden (3-16), Ashley Turney (3-17) and Mo Choudhry (2-16). Batting was not easy, but, Yash Rastogi and Jon Burden saw the team home with three balls and three wickets to spare. In the final against Free Foresters, Bucks rattled up 186-4, with Teddy Casterton producing a sparkling 102 not out. Dan Ogden (3-36) and Lawrence Snookes (2-19) were the pick of the bowlers, while a fine display in the field saw Bucks win by nine runs.

Only 45 minutes was possible in the first Tom Orford Trophy three-day match against Hertfordshire Stags, which was abandoned. In the second match against Free Foresters, we were bowled out in the first innings for 113 in 38 overs, left-arm spinner E Smiley taking 8-25 on a non-turning pitch -

Teddy Casterton top-scored with 44. Free Forresters declared on 142 for 8 from 49 overs, tactical declaration to ensure Bucks could not win the Trophy. The Bucks second innings was dominated by a superb 178 from AJ Woodland, who batted for 117 overs. Excellent contributions were made by Teddy Casterton (45), Pat Castleden (41), Dhavel Norotam (61) and a rapid 66, at a run a ball, by Dan Ogden, helped us to declare at 484-7, ten overs into the final day. Another excellent bowling and fielding display saw Foresters dismissed for 211 in 70 overs, the pick of the bowlers being Pip France (4-58) and Jon Burden (4-37 as Bucks gained a 244-run victory with 20 overs left. In summary, I thought, on the whole, the attitude, quality and energy shown throughout most of our fielding sessions was excellent. There were short periods during sessions when a lack of concentration crept in which produced errors during the fielding and batting disciplines. However, there was a notable improvement over last season, and if this continues, the players will reap long-term rewards.

I would like to thank all of the umpires who officiated during the season, the ever-present Paul Dean our scorer, Academy coach Mike Payne, and Kevin Beaumont for all of his 'out of season' help in organising the grounds, umpires and scorer. I would also like to thank all the clubs who have supported the Academy with the use of their grounds. The hospitality they provide is greatly appreciated.

BUCKS BOARD REPORT A year of change

A successful year with many changes within both the Board and ECB. Early in the year, three full-time staff moved on. James Savory joined us from Cumbria as CDO for Chance To Shine and a reshuffle of other duties became our full complement. ECB continued with implementation of "Cricket Unleashed" strategy, with their priority of Women and Girls All Stars Cricket, U19T20 and Disability.



All Stars Cricket (ASC) – all Bucks clubs were invited to take part in the project. 45 clubs initially showed interest and 24 clubs got under way and some 640 children had a great time with their kit, bats and balls etc. Great Kingshill, Amersham Hill and Winchmore Hill were very successful ASCs and their children and parents were invited

to Lord's for the "Money Can't Buy" experiences, hosted at England international fixtures. 2018 will see a full time ASC champion appointed to the BCB staff with a target of 35 clubs and 1000 participants.

Chance to Shine – The programme was successfully delivered into 50 primary schools and 16 secondary schools. The spin-off from the project was 8 Kwik cricket festivals held throughout the county. Aston Clinton Combined School girls and Bedgrove Junior School boys school went on to represent the county at regional finals day held in Bristol. Additionally, 82 teachers received either formal or informal training, 70 young student received activator/leadership training. The 2018 programme will be very different in that it is aimed solely at Primary schools, with no provision for Secondary schools.

Women and Girls Cricket continues to grow within the county. ECB introduced Women's Soft Ball Cricket festivals and supported the BCB to employ Women Cricket Maker's. Four festivals took place at Beaconsfield, Chesham, High Wycombe and Cublington. The events were well supported with pleasing participation numbers (29 teams, 220 participants) and great fun for all. Bucks now has eight clubs who have women teams playing regular hard ball

and/or soft ball cricket. Throughout the county there are now 18 clubs with designated girls cricket teams.

Bucks Youth Cricket Trust continued their generous support of Girls Cricket, Junior Club Cricket, Disability and hardship cases.

Under 19 T20 - 7 Clubs joined the 2017 competition. Amersham





(pictured) won the Bucks festival and Stony Stratford were county representatives at the

MK/Beds/Herts area inter-county finals day. Throughout the year

21 clubs across the county were successful in securing grants and loans from various

sources which added up to $\pm 175,000$. A great effort.

Junior club competitions had fewer teams 215 than previous years but with the reasonable weather they managed to play over 1000 matches in the season. The winner of the league play-offs were U10 Stony Stratford, U11 Cookham Dean, U12 Buckingham, U13 Stony Stratford, U14 Stony Stratford, U15 Stony Stratford. The knockout cup competitions were won by U11 Cookham Dean, U13 Cublington, U15 Gerrards Cross.

Coach Education support was given to our club network run in collaboration, with Berks and Oxon (BBO). 120 candidates completed Child Support Worker, Coaching Children or Coaching Young Person & Adults certificate courses. A similar programme will be available in 2018 but under ECB South Central regional banner not BBO.

The BCB not only gives support to clubs but receives great support from our club network. Clubs offer their grounds to our 16 age group teams for county games and practice. Some 70 plus games are home games and played within the county – Thank you clubs. To this end, the Bucks Association Cricket Officials appointed 153 umpires to our matches last year. Thanks to those in white coats.

In the background we have our County Welfare Officers working away, be it formal or informal training for our Club Welfare officers and dealing with any issues.

BUCKS PATHWAY REPORTS 2017

UNDER 17 BOYS

The side started slowly, suffering defeats to Shropshire, in both the two-day and one-day competitions, but gathered momentum and only missed out on reaching the ECB Cup one-day semi-finals on net-run-rate. The team also recorded convincing first-innings victories over Oxfordshire and Herefordshire in the two-dayers. Spinners Nouman Aslam and Sulaiman Akhtar tied up opponents with effective, tidy spells, and both also contributed with the bat and in the field. Seamers Sami Sajid, Harvind Dhillon, Dom Goodman, Lawrence Snookes and Tom Taylor all produced good spells at times to back them up.

Dominic Goodman made a maiden Bucks century against Oxfordshire in a season that culminated in him signing for Gloucestershire's Academy.

Openers Henry Moore and Josh Drage both made two fifties, whilst Harvind Dhillon made a maiden half-century when given the chance to open the batting in the one-dayer against Bedfordshire.

UNDER 15 BOYS

The side produced some consistently strong team performances, but the batting unit failed to fire regularly enough to win more games. They did the double over Herefordshire and Bedfordshire and also recorded victories against England Women's Academy and Shropshire. James Dalby was the stand-out performer, taking 21 wickets at 13 with his leg-spin, and a further ten for the Under 16 EPP team. Individual highlights included Theo Weatherall blistering 76 against Wales, Jack Mercer's 68 against Bedfordshire and Ethan Turner, who scored nearly 400 runs including 70 against Middlesex in the Taunton Festival. The bowling struggled for control, but Rahul Randev's emerging leg-spin was promising.

UNDER 13 BOYS

The side had a successful season. We consistently scored more than 200 which at this level is a fine effort in 40 overs. It was great to see our batters going out there with a positive mind-set. Jai Angel scored back-to-back 100s against Bedfordshire and Cambridgeshire, while Tom Whittington made 100 against Hampshire. Sheridan Gumbs and Charlie Doe both hits 70s. Another highlight was the ability to score 300 in 30 overs on tour. Among the scorers, there was superb 100 from the tournament's leading runs-scorer Kahil Jariwala. There were also fifties for Charlie Carter and Harry Taylor, whilst Eisah Saba claimed 4-27 v Lincolnshire and Archie Dodds took 3-21 v Northants.

UNDER 11 BOYS

Bucks had a tremendous season, including wins against Cambridgeshire, Ireland, Bedfordshire and Northamptonshire. The Development side had an unbeaten season, winning all six games. Notable performances came from Alex Marsh (66* v Oxfordshire Dev), Tilak Patel (4-16 v Cambridgeshire), while Sam Strauss took a hat-trick in the victory over Ireland at the Taunton Festival. The U11 county and development sides were blessed with consistent displays from all the players. Captain George Evans gave every player the opportunity to shine. One of the best knocks came from Aadi Sharma who scored 83 not out v Northamptonshire.

UNDER 10 BOYS

At this age group, it is about providing a grounding and opportunity for a wide group of players, in a variety of different formats, plus two tours to the Malvern Festival. Jack Groves took five wickets and Anay Jariwala scored 62 not out in a five-wicket win v Northants, while Byron Medina (4-15), Daniel Chapman (38) and Billy Dodds (51) shone in the one-wicket success over Bedfordshire. Tommy Treadwell (6-14), Anay Jariwala (38) and James Batchelor (38) starred in a five-wicket win over Worcestershire.

BUCKS WOMEN

It was a progressive season for the Bucks Women's team. We do not have many players but we have a talented young team, mostly age-group, who exceeded expectations. We have the youngest team in both 50-over and T20 divisions we play in, and beat teams with far more experience. In the 50 overs games, we had victories against Cambridgeshire and Hertfordshire and finished third in our group. In the T20 format, again we had good wins against Suffolk and Cambridgeshire and finished a respectable fourth in the group.

There were some excellent performances. The batting of Hannah Bates, Ella Claridge and Izzy Gurney was impressive, while the attack of Martha Manktelow, Tilly Mason, Holly Wilson, Hannah Bates and Cara Duggan did very well. We are a good fielding side, with Martha Manktelow and Emily Hunt outstanding. The best player was Hannah Bates who made a significant contribution with both bat and ball. A special mention must go to the captain Louise Verroken-Jones for once again being a firstclass captain, developing our young talent and maintaining an excellent team spirit.

UNDER 17 GIRLS

The highlight was a away success two-day double-header against Dorset and Worcestershire. Hannah Bates made 91 vs Hertfordshire at the start of the season, while Tilly Mason recorded 51 in a T20 vs Leicestershire. Younger girls made vital contributions across the season, with five Under 15s and one Under 13 making scores over 20. Holly Wilson took 12 wickets and Hannah Bates 18, as the Under 17s showcased the strength and depth of girls cricketers coming through.

UNDER 15 GIRLS

The highlights were undoubtedly recording victories against a strong Warwickshire team in both 40-over and 20-over ECB fixtures. Hannah Bates, with 51 and 2-12, was instrumental in the first victory. She enjoyed a splendid season, in which we made over 650 runs and took 45 wickets across Under15, Under 17 and Women's teams.

Results fluctuated for the team in a strong A Division. Ella Claridge made 660 runs from Under 15 to women's level, Alexa Wilson crashed 55 not out off 38 balls in an eight-wicket win over Oxfordshire, while eight players recorded scores of over 20. Hannah Francis, Cara Duggan, Gina Kellock, Charlotte Adams and Hannah Bates all took ten wickets.

UNDER 13 GIRLS

The best performance from the Development team was, came after having lost to Essex by five runs on the first day at Malvern, beating the same team by 18 runs on the final day of the Festival. Individual highlights included Isabella Kench bowling a double wicket maiden to tie the match against Hampshire, while Rosie Burton-Pye hit a run-a-ball 36 v Hertfordshire and Daisy Jackson took 2-4 off three overs v Essex.

UNDER 11 GIRLS

It was an encouraging season for the County squad. Stand-out individual performances were Amber Drewe's 47 not out, and a massive improvement of Gabby Evans, who finished as top wicket-taker with nine. There were many great team displays, including triumphing in our eight-a-side tournament and winning the four games against Essex, Sussex, Northants and Staffordshire. This included managing to restrict Northants to scoring only 12 runs off their last seven overs, to win by two runs. There were also memorable wins against Middlesex, Oxfordshire and Berkshire.

Although a very young side, the Development squad equipped themselves very well. Caitlin Walker and Sophia Davis led by example with both the bat and ball. There were competitive games against Essex and Hampshire, while there victories over Northants and Oxfordshire. Many of the younger players are now likely to form the backbone of 2018 Under 11 County squad.

TREASURER'S REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS OF BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY CRICKET CLUB

Financial Review

Financially, 2017 has continued to be a successful season for the club. The club made a surplus of £3,499 (2016 a surplus of £11,023). The committee has worked very hard on income generating events and continuing this with reducing costs where possible.

The main changes for the year can be summarised as follows:

The Club for 2018 has agreed on a budget that delivers a small deficit, this has taken into account what is necessary to deliver the quality of cricket in the Minor Counties. The budget deficit agreed by the F&GP for 2018 is $\pounds(2,342)$ and there remains a clear requirement for increased revenue for the Club as this deficit is reflective of the challenges of the reallocation of home games to other venues and the need to obtain new sponsors at these venues.

The committee continues to support all fund raising activities (see below).

The value of the Clubs Investments increased by £11,402 (2016 increased by £1,218).

Cricket

The committee has continued to work extremely hard to deliver the quality cricket that it is responsible for, using distributions from the ECB. The cricket committee's continued focus is on the costs to deliver a team that would be best placed to improve the quality of cricket played. The total distributions from the ECB did not cover the costs of cricket by £3,154 (2016 costs were covered). Our match manager, Tim Russell (Senior/Academy), continues to be consious of costs without compromising the quality of cricket, however match costs are down to the many variables associated with venues, travelling and player availability.

Roger Garrini and Ron Hedley, the over 50/60s Cricket Managers continue to control the costs of senior cricket and they actively encourage the Seniors to attend fund raising events which is appreciated by the Club as it goes towards ensuring the senior cricket costs of the club result in a breakeven financial situation.

TREASURER'S REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS OF BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY CRICKET CLUB

Sponsorship

The Club continues via our fundraising officer, Bill Scholes, to identify new sponsors and our gratitude goes to our main sponsor John Tuberville who continues to be a fantastic supporter of the Club. A few more sponsors would make a significant difference in balancing our budget and securing the Club's future. I am pleased to report for 2018 we have retained our shirt and match sponsor arranged by our President, Stuart York, who are Risk Management Services and I hope they enjoy the coming season.

Fundraising

This remains the Club's largest challenge that the committee needs to identify solutions for. I would comment as follows:-

Golf Day

The event this year was enjoyed by those attending. Overall the Club made a surplus of £510 (2016 £707).

Sportsman's Dinner

The 2017 event was supported and enjoyed with Club members and guests attending. The Club made an overall profit of $\pounds 2,134$ (2016 - $\pounds 2,014$). The committee congratulates Bob Lane for his continuing efforts in dealing with this and the Golf day.

Summer Lunch

The summer lunch was held at High Wycombe Cricket Club for the championship's match, which has continued to be successfully and reasonably attended. The Club made a profit of £891 in 2017 (2016 - £610). This is organised by Bill Scholes and John Turberville and the Committee thank them for their continued efforts in dealing with this and other fundraising events.

Raffles

These are held at our home matches and I am pleased to report on an increased surplus this year of £1,344 (2016 £560) a great effort on behalf of all that assisted in arranging this at the various home matches

Other Income - Players Sponsorship / Gazebo Tent Hire

We commenced this during the season and expect to continue this going forward.

Bucks 100

My thanks go to John Philips who has proactively managed the Bucks 100 Club which contributed £2,400 (2016 - £2,300) to Club funds.We are hopeful that this will raise increased funds in the future as more members join.

Year Book

This year being our 1000th Match, the Committee took the decision to upgrade our handbook which I can report has received a lot of welcome comments from members, this investment was a increase to costs of £1,180. The committee would like to thank both Frank Russell and Michael Knox for all of their hard work in co-ordinating the various aspects of the handbook.

Advertising included in the year book contributed £5,730 for 2017 (2016 £3,600). We would encourage new advertisers so please let Frank/Mike know if you can suggest a contact.

Membership

RULES OF THE BUCKS COUNTY CRICKET CLUB

1. The Club shall be called the BUCKS COUNTY CRICKET CLUB and shall play and promote Minor Counties and other cricket in Buckinghamshire, including the area covered by the Milton Keynes Unitary Authority (hereinafter called "the County").

2. The Club shall be managed by a Committee comprising The President, Chairman, Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, Director of Cricket, Assistant Secretary, Membership Secretary and not more than nine other members all of whom shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. Nominations for the above offices must be submitted in writing so as to reach the Honorary Secretary by February 1st in each year and circulated to members with notice of the Annual General Meeting. Such nominations must be supported by a seconder and consent of the nomine must first be obtained. If the nominations exceed the number of vacancies a ballot shall take place. The Committee shall have power to co-opt additional members at its discretion. The Committee shall meet at least four times per annum. Five shall form a quorum.

3. The Management Committee shall have power to:

(a) fill vacancies in any offices of the Club until the next Annual General Meeting;

(b) appoint from among the members of the Club such sub-committees as it shall think fit and delegate to them such functions and duties as it shall from time to time determine, but such sub-committees shall be responsible to the Management Committee. The Chairman shall be a member of all sub-committees.

4 (a) The Senior Team shall be selected by the Selection Sub-Committee, which shall be appointed annually by the Committee at its first meeting after the Annual General Meeting.

(b) To qualify for the County a player must either have been registered to play for the County for at least the preceding five years or meet one of the following conditions:-

(i) be currently playing regularly for a club within the county.

(ii) have been born in the county.

(iii) have been a bona-fide resident in the county for at least 12 months.

There shall be allowed a maximum of two players in the team outside these criteria. If two such players are selected, at least one of these two must be actively involved in coaching youth cricket within the County. No player shall play Minor Counties Cricket Association matches unless he is a member of the County Club and has paid his subscription.

5 (a) An Academy Team Manager shall be appointed annually by the Committee at its first meeting after the Annual General Meeting.

(b) A Seniors Manager shall be appointed annually by the Committee at its first meeting after the Annual General Meeting, to be responsible for the organisation of and team selection for Over 50 and Over 60s matches.

(c) A Cricket Administrator shall be appointed annually by the Committee at its first meeting after the Annual General meeting, to be responsible for communication with First XI and Academy players and for players and match expenses for the first XI and Academy.

6 (a) The Club will be a member of the Buckinghamshire Cricket Board (hereinafter called "the BCB").

(b) The Committee shall ensure that such functions as shall from to time be delegated to the Club by mutual agreement with the BCB are properly and adequately discharged.

7 (a) The annual subscription shall be not less than the amount specified hereunder as applicable to the class of membership indicated and shall be due and payable on the first day of January in each year-

(b) The financial year of the Club shall commence on the first day of November.

8 (a) An individual member shall be entitled to Life Membership upon payment of the relevant subscription hereunder specified:-

(b) Members who have rendered the Club outstanding service may be elected Honorary Life Members. Nominations must be recommended by a unanimous vote of the Committee and approved by a majority vote at the Annual General Meeting. Such members shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club.

(c) Vice Presidents may be elected at a General Meeting of the Club upon such terms as the Committee shall decide.

9. Membership shall be open to all, irrespective of age, gender, disability, race, ethnic origin, creed, colour, social status and sexual orientation. Subject to the foregoing, the election of members shall be vested in the Committee and shall take place at any Committee meeting. The election shall be by show of hands or, if the Chairman so decides, by ballot. If a ballot is taken one dissenting vote in five shall exclude.

10. The names and addresses of all proposed new members shall be sent to the Membership Secretary at least three days before the meeting at which it is proposed to elect them together with the names of the proposer and seconder.

11. A copy of the rules of the Club, with a notice of election, shall be sent to each new member on his/her election.

12. Every member on payment of his/her subscription shall receive a Member's Pass.

13. No member whose subscription for the current, or any past season is unpaid on 1st June shall be allowed to exercise any of the rights or privileges of membership until such subscription is paid, except by leave of the Committee. The name of any member leaving his/her subscription unpaid for one year may, at the option of the Committee, be erased from the books of the Club, and only be replaced with the consent of the Committee and on payment of all arrears.

14. Any member wishing to withdraw from the Club shall give notice in writing to the Secretary and shall pay all arrears at the date of such notice. Any former member (other than one to whom Rule 14 applies) wishing to rejoin the Club shall be eligible for re-election subject to Rule 6.

15. If the conduct of any member, either in or out of the Club, shall, in the opinion of the Committee, or any ten members of the Club, who shall certify the same in writing to the Secretary, be injurious to the character and interests of the Club, the Committee shall be empowered (if they deem it expedient), after enquiry, to recommend in writing, such member to resign; and if the member so recommended shall not comply within fourteen days from the date of such recommendation, the Committee shall then call a special general meeting, and if such meeting agrees by ballot, by a majority of two thirds of the members present, to the expulsion of such member, he shall cease to be a member, his name shall be erased from the list, and he shall forfeit all right and claim upon the property of the Club; but his subscription for the current year shall be returned to him, and he shall be forever after ineligible.

16. The Treasurer shall at each Annual General Meeting of the Club submit a statement of his accounts for the relevant year, which shall have been reviewed by an independent firm of accountants. This review need not constitute an audit. The firm of independent accountants shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting.

17. The property of the Club shall be vested in the Committee and they shall have entire management of the property, funds and affairs of the Club.

18. All complaints should be made in writing to the Secretary who shall submit them to the Committee if he is unable to satisfy the complaint.

19. The Annual General Meeting, of which fourteen days clear notice shall be given to each member, will be held no later than the end of March. Unless proposed by the Committee, resolutions must be proposed and seconded and submitted to the Secretary by the 1st February.

20. The Committee or a group of not less than thirty members may upon notification to the Honorary Secretary call an Extraordinary General Meeting stating the purpose. The Honorary Secretary shall then notify each member giving them fourteen days notice of the date and venue of the meeting and stating the purpose.

21. General Meetings shall be chaired by the President or, in his absence, the Chairman or, in the absence of both, by such member of the Committee as shall be elected by those present. Fifteen shall form a quorum. The notice of the meeting shall be accompanied by the Agenda. The chairman shall have discretion to allow emergency resolutions and amendments to resolutions to be moved.

22. The Club Rules may only be altered at the Annual General Meeting. Any member with a seconder or the Committee may propose an alteration of the Rules. Such proposal must be delivered to the Honorary Secretary by January 1st of the year of the meeting.

23. The county cap shall be awarded by the Captain of the County Eleven to any player who, in his opinion, is worthy of distinction, subject to the agreement of the chairman of the Selection Sub-Committee.

24. Club colours are available as follows:

(a) Ties

Players' Ties may only be worn by those who have represented the County at Senior level. Members' Ties may be worn by all those who have paid a subscription for the year.

These may be worn by players representing the County at any level. Capped players will also have the County Badge embroidered on their sweaters.

(c) Blazers

(b) Sweaters

These may be worn by all those who have represented the County at Senior or Academy level and by members of the Committee.
