3. Minutes of Previous Meeting

4. Treasurer's Report

- Financials discussed today are from last year. As 31 March is year-end it is impossible to get this year's accounts ready ahead of the AGM.



- I can tell you we have made a small loss this season. The money spent for our 50th celebration was one reason.
- We are just over £1200 deficit.
 - Not a huge concern as we have cash in the bank.
 - Made £600 deficit last season.
 - Club is meant to run either breakeven or minor profit.
 - Income and expenditure fell.
- Sponsorship fell £1400 no contribution from simply sports.
 - Sale group put in £2500 originally in to fund men's coach, this season it's been spread across the club this. Thanks to Martin for Sales Group sponsorship. Peter Sales has confirmed he'll do the same for next season
- Membership income fell £700. This is generally due to lack of numbers in the men's side.
- There was an increase in match fees by £200. Emma Rodrigues is most efficient in putting in match fees, she does it every week. Thank you to all captains but please bank it more frequently.
- In 2017/2018 we spent £5000 on the club dinner, however this funded by all people attending. Last year the money we collected for the raffle tickets went to Children's trust charity. We raised £627.
- Pitch hire is our biggest expenditure.
- Last season Lydia orchestrated indoor hockey. It runs at a slight loss, but it's a huge contribution to the club it's hugely valuable so am happy for this to continue.
- We pay £500 per month to the Sports Club. It was increased to £550 for this season and has now been increased to £600 per month for next season.
- Ground fees are £2,400 per season, only vets use it at the moment. Previously people are happy for us to use it as vets used it regularly therefore the clubhouse was open. This season, the vets are now playing on astro more so are down the clubhouse less regularly. To be discussed in AOB.
- Kit/equipment expenditure has fallen over this season
- Advertising, magazine adverts saw positive coverage, got us quite a few new members, so the money spent was very successful.
- Loss of men's 4th will make an impact this season.
- Subscriptions for this season are set today at the AGM. The match fees are set before the season by the committee.



- It was raised if we could reduce the cost of colts for 3rd or 4th child? After some discussion the floor was told not to offer it on mass, but the option of a discount is there if needed. To be discussed with Chairman / Treasurer.
- It was raised if there is hardship with the adults can you discuss fees. The floor was told yes, to be discussed with the Chairman / Treasurer.
- It was raised about whether or not we would consider a discount on membership fees for new joiners. The floor was told no.
- Members agreed they were happy for membership fees to stay as they are.

5. Sports Club Report

- Sports club made a surplus this year which was spent on clubhouse maintenance.
 £2000 was spent on key essential electric work to satisfy the insurance company.
 We have a new till and card reader so it will be easier to take money from the bar.
 We've upgraded the internet, so we have free wifi in the clubhouse.
- We plan to paint and decorate the outside of the clubhouse. Other projects are under review depended on budget.
 - It was raised that the lady's loos could be done, especially the plumbing as they are really smelly.
 - Claire Johnson said she was happy to organise people to help do the painting etc of clubhouse to help save money. Robin will pass CJ's details to Gary.

- Had a good year. Halloween was good.
- Main issue is getting people to commit and turn up when they say they would. In order for the events to happen we need to know numbers.
- Next year we'll be using Facebook events so we have a better indication of numbers.
