2022 West Haven City – State of the City Report Q1 (January-March)

As promised, I wanted to report the wonderful accomplishments completed in the first 90 days in office as your Mayor and Council.

- 1. Mayor and 2 new City Council members were sworn into office.
- 2. City Council, Planning Commission and WHSSD all came together for the first time to build the Vision, Mission Statement, and Strategy Goals for 2022. Completed by February 28, 2022. First time in the past 12 years.
- 3. City Capital Project Fund discussed and we now have some direction on future city projects.
- 4. We have improved greatly on our goal of 90 Minute City Council meetings.
- 5. Eight Community Committees were implemented and the request for volunteers continues.
- 6. Implemented ethics and rules of procedure for the council which has improved procedures and respect to all.
- 7. Following our Professional Policing Study. WCSO was re-signed as our current contracted provider.
- 8. Approved a new system for a resident complaint-based text for code enforcement. (April 2022 release)
- 9. Recognized many of our residents and staff:
 - a. "Years of Service" Awards presented to 11 employees (plaque and gift)
 - b. "Employee of the Year" Award Public Works employee
 - c. "Community Service" Awards presented to 4 of our wonderful residents
 - d. "Community Award" to RMJH's NAL team for their participation in State Championship.
- 10. Staff (Community Development Director) found underestimated building permit scheduled fee updates. 550K loss from 2021 Corrected and resolution completed by City Council.
- 11. SWPPP Fees reviewed in 2021. Recovery will resume in September 2022 following a study and fee update.
- 12. Senior Luncheon Renamed the "Senior Lunch Bunch" had record attendance and we were able to enjoy some sponsored and affordable meals.
- 13. Mayor's Howdy Hall and Friends Great success with 2 City Council members and the Mayor available to speak individually with residents.
- 14. Ribbon Cutting Ceremonies and Business Appreciation Certificates presented to new businesses in 2022, also business appreciation of our existing businesses is underway.
- 15. Implemented West Haven Special Services "Swearing-in Ceremony" for all board members.
- 16. West Haven applied for and became a part of Get Healthy Utah.
- 17. Held Congressman Blake Moore town hall for residents to ask questions.
- 18. Have been able to meet many new West Haven residents and I appreciate your support.
- 19. Although not promised, some of our ordinances have been updated for better clarification and compatibility with our Vision and Mission Statement.
- 20. Website Upgrade Waiting for budget discussions for funding approvals (but recognize the need)

Overall Review- Under new leadership and direction, the City Council, Mayor, City Manager, and Staff have accomplished our goals and directives requested from the residents and set out to be completed within the first 90 days of our taking office. There were some major adjustments in process, as well as some personnel changes that have helped us make huge strides. As we enter our next quarter, we will be very focused on a few major items. We will be working on our budget and our project completion list, with dates. This should be completed by June 2022 for our July 2022-23 budget season. We will also be working on our city's celebration, with West Haven Days getting a few new upgrades. The City Council is working hard to provide city improvements and show—financial responsibility. In my opinion the City Council that you elected is doing a great job and working very hard to represent the interests of the residents while upholding the laws of our city and state. Thank you for the opportunity to serve as we look forward to a wonderful spring season.


GET HEALTHY UTAH - COMMUNITY AWARD




