CITY'S APPROACH ON IRRIGATING IN A DROUGHT



We've all heard the preaching about watering restrictions in the drought. Here are a few particular initiatives that the City is planning to follow.

- City Hall Irrigation will be limited to areas immediately adjacent to the City Hall. The extended areas on the far side of the oval drive way away from City Hall will be allowed to go dormant with intermittent watering.
- City Parks With new landscape installations on hold and other areas dry, the City is working to wisely manage public greenspaces for continued enjoyment. Staff will work to irrigate areas around playgrounds and on the recreational play fields. Other areas will be allowed to go dormant. A new irrigation system is being installed this spring at the R. Kenneth Baldwin Country Park to improve water distribution and reduce waste. Staker Park was seeded last fall but efforts to establish the grass this spring have been put on hold until water restrictions can be reconsidered.
- Cemetery This property has a challenging sandy soil mix. Staff has made adjustments to watering but will need to monitor watering closely to maintain the deep root integrity.

Last summer's drought was a learning experience for the City. As a general rule, most users put too much water on our lawns. City staff has weaned our grass areas off the previous massive flow and hope to maintain usable green open space through wise management of resources. West Haven City is dedicated to being an example for residents and businesses in our City. We hope that you will join us in those efforts.

- 3. Yard sale signs that have their own stand are allowed with permission of the property owner.


