Additional Note

The club had originally submitted costs for a reconditioned lawnmower at £1250 and a new wall at £ 1340. The total project cost was £2590. The quote for the lawn mower was out of date and the assessing department directly contacted the company who supplied the quote to check whether the quote was still valid. It was confirmed that the quote was for a specific lawnmower and this has since been sold on. The company informed the assessing officer that they were under the impression that the Bowling Club was intending to purchase a new lawnmower on hire purchase for £3800.00 . The bowling club informed the assessing department that they were no longer considering this option and have since supplied a quote for a lawnmower for £2900 inclusive of vat. The Council's Outdoor Services have stated that this is a reasonable quote.

The club on its own admission is surviving month by month. The assessing department has been informed by the Minerals Trust that the bowling club has submitted a substantial application to them for other items of work.

The recommendation is therefore to support the lawnmower element of the application only – this being essential for the club to continue due to the poor condition of their existing lawnmower. It is also suggested that the condition is that the exact lawnmower which has been quoted for is purchased and is insured.
