
Starting the process...

- Local Authority led C-SPAN identified need (Badminton a priority sport within borough)
- Governing Body / Local Authority led CIF Application to Sport England
- Project steering group established
- Quality planning, engagement and coordination from group
- Club volunteers at the heart of the project
- Focus upon pathways and quality

Harrow Pilot





Overall figures (per year)

- 1330 new participants
- 426 high quality coaching hours
- 364 new members (retained participants)
- 1704 courts required
- Cost to deliver = £38,722
- Approximately £14,000 income generated initially and this set to rise











Divided up into 8 Regional Plans

- Regional Plans will commit to delivering agreed number of CBN's / PC's up to 2013
- CBN / PC locations agreed and mapped
- Resource and capacity allocation for region detailed
- Targets confirmed
- Monitoring & evaluation system established

Delivery within select priority areas commences	October 2009






Working with Local Authorities









- Local Authorities are CRITICAL to the successful delivery of these programmes
- Engagement with the Delivery System a priority for us
- WSP Programmes are flexible and can easily be adapted to meet the needs of local partners



What we ask at a Local Authority level

- Is there strategic cross-over between plans (NI8 targets, etc)?
- Do you prioritise sports? How?
- What is the facility capacity within the borough?
- Who and where are the hard-to-reach target groups?
- What activity / projects are currently being delivered?
- Do you have sport-specific steering groups and clear development plans
