




Purpose

The Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame has been created to provide a medium whereby it is possible to honor participants for their outstanding achievements and contributions in the field of athletics.

Criteria for Nomination

- 1. All nominees (individuals) and teams must have outstanding achievements and contributions in the field of athletics from the Greater Flint Area.
- 2. Excellence far above the ordinary field of endeavor is required.
- Individuals should have a minimum of five years involvement with the sport or sports.
- 4. Professional athletics in a team sport shall not be eligible for election to the Greater Flint Hall of Fame unless they have retired from participation for at least three years.

Rules

- Any individual or team who meets the aforementioned criteria may be nominated.
- Nominations must be made on an official Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame form which is available from the reception desk at the Genesys Athletic Club or from Bob Root, Athletic Director at Carman-Ainsworth High School. Once the form is completed in full, it must be returned to Mr. Root with all other available information regarding the individual or team included.
- No individual living inductee will be formally inducted without his/her approval.

Deadline for Nomination is April 1st each year



This year the Board of Directors has voted to accord **EMERITUS** status to **FRED BRIGGS**. His extraordinary leadership, over a twenty-five year period, in a variety of capacities, has enabled the organization to successfully

BASKETBALL LEGEND GREENE ENTERS SECOND HALL OF FAME THIS YEAR

It takes most athletes a lifetime to enter just one hall of fame. But basketball star Terence Greene is entering his second hall of fame this year.

Greene went into the DePaul Athletics Hall of Fame in January, but now the two-time All-American for football and basketball at Flint Central is going into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame as an individual.

"I went into a hall of fame in January, but nothing compares to being back home to the community that I'm from," Greene said. "The programs we had then, everybody around the country now emulates what we did and takes our motto from what we started here and the great athletes to come out of this area. That's phenomenal and can't be touched."

Two hall of fame nods in one year may shock some people, but it doesn't come as a surprise for those who watched Greene go to work on the hardwood through the years. He was a football player on a basketball court and possessed an all-around skill set mixed with force and finesse. Greene could overpower you or pull up in a defender's face.

"You almost expect certain players to end up in the hall of fame, and I expected T. Greene to end up in the hall of fame," said Marty Embry, Greene's fellow Flintstone and former teammate at DePaul. "It was never a question of when he would become a hall of famer but when, because he's one of the best to ever come out of Flint."

Greene's 1983 Flint Central basketball team coached by Stan Gooch was also inducted into the GFASHOF in 2005. He helped the Indians win their third consecutive Class A state title as a sophomore, after Central's previous stars like Mark Harris, Eric Turner and Embry graduated from high school. His era was one of the strongest in Flint history, but entering the local hall of fame has opened Greene's eyes to all of the overall talent the city has had to offer before and after him. It's almost been a history lesson to learn about all the other hall of fame inductees in various sports.

"You get older and you just want to know more knowledge about the Greater Flint area," Greene said.



"That's the biggest thing to me is the history of Flint. It's an honor. I'm very humbled to be elected."

After high school, Greene was recruited by legendary DePaul coach Ray Meyer and helped lead the Blue Demons to four NCAA Tournament appearances from 1985-89. He was voted captain of the 1988-89 team that finished 21-12 overall and two of his squads made it to the Sweet 16.

Greene scored 1,334 points during his college career and averaged 10.7 points in 125 games. He averaged 14.9 points as a senior and played professional basketball overseas in Mexico and France after college. He even participated in NFL and NBA tryouts. Greene later served as an assistant coach for men's basketball at the University of Michigan, Eastern Michigan University and Mott Community College.

Basketball has always been good to him and the latest hall of fame induction is just another testament to his body of work.

"You come here and you look at everything going on and I want to thank the committee for being nominated," Greene said. "Then to be selected amongst the great athletes to come out of Flint is an honor. I'm humbled."

HANSON BLAZED HIS OWN TRAIL TO VOLLEYBALL FAME

FLINT – Restrictions didn't deter Pete Hanson's dream of becoming a success in volleyball.

Instead of staying with the limited opportunities and resources of the sport in his hometown, Hanson created better circumstances for himself by remaining proactive and committed to his vision. His strong will and drive has now elevated him to legendary status as a sideline leader and a player.

The Ohio State University head volleyball coach is being rewarded for his long list of accomplishments as an inductee into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame on Dec. 7 at the Genesys Athletic Club.

"I hope that there will be enough information getting out from this thing that will maybe make some folks think that this is doable, is a possible dream. It's just a matter of finding your niche, a sport you love and sticking with it," Hanson said. "If some kid from Johnson Elementary, Lowell (Jr. High) and Flint Northwestern High School can fall in love with it and stay involved with it, then certainly somebody else can. It can be whatever sport, but that's the message that I hope gets out to these kids."

Hanson became passionate about volleyball as a seventh-grader at the now-closed Lowell Junior High School. None of Hanson's goals would have been possible without programs like the Flint Olympian and CANUSA Games, the Flint Community Schools' AA men's recreational volleyball league, in addition to competitive games in local churches and at the Salvation Army's gym. With the absence of high school volleyball in Flint, Hanson still managed



to grow and learned to love the game in the face of the slim opportunities to compete.

"Had those programs not have been in place, I might have walked away from the sport after two or three years of playing in that junior high school league because I would have had nothing else to go on to," Hanson said. "I think that's cool for a community the size of Flint to have had people and folks think that far ahead to create a situation like the CANUSA games, which is literally like a mini version of the Olympic competition."

An early graduate of Flint Northwestern High School in 1975, Hanson was introduced to volleyball by his father, Paul Hanson. Former Flint Community Schools director Dick Daly and other supporters also encouraged Hanson to embrace the game and the sport lured him to thrive as an effective middle hitter over the years.

"It didn't just start when Pete left Flint, it started when Pete was at Northwestern," said Daly, who organized the city's AA men's volleyball league for many years. "He practiced volleyball like people practice basketball because it was that good of a sport back then and he reached the highest level."


Taking with him what he learned as a youngster in Flint, Hanson enjoyed an All-American career and won back-to-back national junior college titles in 1976 and 1977 at Kellogg Community College. He later became a team captain, all-conference player and MVP at Ball State University from 1977-79.

"He was a notch above everybody," said Rick Daly, Hanson's childhood friend and former AA volleyball teammate. "He was a real smart and solid player that was real physical. He was really quick and had a good jump and dynamite arm that could just pound the ball."

Once Hanson's college career ended, he shifted over to the coaching realm where he has guided OSU's program for the past 28 years. In 2011, Hanson led the Buckeyes to the school's first NCAA volleyball championship and he was named the American Volleyball Coaches Association's Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. OSU became only the third non-California team to capture a national championship and with new recruits he plans on keeping the program running strong. Hanson has taken OSU to 10 NCAA Final Fours with a career record of 562-297.

Growing up a fan of the Maize and Blue, Hanson initially had to adjust to being on the other side of the Michigan-Ohio State rivalry but living in Columbus, Ohio he finds it neat to remain attached.

"I really appreciate the fact that they're letting a Buckeye into this place," Hanson said. "It's fun."

The 1961 Flint Junior College cross country team finished its undefeated season by winning the National Junior College Cross Country Championship.

And now, 52 years later, the team will be recognized for its accomplishments with an induction into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame on Dec. 7 at the Genesys Athletic Club in Grand Blanc.

"It was kind of a surprise," said Don Sleeman, a team captain, about the induction. "It kind of came out of nowhere. My immediate thought was that hopefully we can all get together and see each other again."

Sleeman said he's excited to see teammates Larry Wiltse and Jim Austin again, and hopes the other five runners on the team will attend as well.

"I haven't talked with Jim Austin in decades, but we've been emailing back and forth a little bit, and it has been like no time has gone by," Sleeman said. "And it would be the same way with any of the other guys. Even though we haven't seen each other in a very long time, we could just sit down and carry on a conversation and pick up where we left."

The 1961 team, led by coach Fred Schuette, breezed through regular-season competition winning conference and regional championships, but was hit with its first shot of adversity heading into the national championship.

Sleeman, who had been the team's No. 1 runner all season, was declared ineligible to compete because he didn't take enough credits the previous semester. Wiltse, who had been the No. 3 runner, was bumped up to No. 1, and it paid off greatly.

Wiltse placed ninth overall and first on the team.

"I don't remember why I ended up being the No. 1 runner, but I remember the things coach told me before we ran," Wiltse said. "He said, 'If you don't get out quick, you'll never catch up.' He also said, 'No matter how tired you are, the people that are next to you have run just as far as you have, and they're not any less tired than you, so it comes down to mental toughness — how bad you want to win.'

"I kept thinking about that the whole time I was running, and before I knew it, the finish line was ahead of me. The race was kind of a blur; I just remember I had to keep going."

Wiltse said it took him a while to realize how special that season was.

"The fact that we were national champs didn't register," Wiltse said. "I remember the trip really well, but it was like it wasn't really real. I wasn't a great athlete by any stretch of the imagination; I was just a guy on the team who happened to put it together that day.

"I don't think I realized the significance of what we were able to do until a long time afterwards."

Both Wiltse and Sleeman went on to successful coaching careers; Wiltse at Flint Kearsley and Sleeman at Ann Arbor Pioneer, and both of them attributed much of their success to what they learned from Schuette.

"As a former military person, he trained us with a great deal of military demand," said Wiltse, who asked Schuette to be a godfather to his first son Joseph. "He was a very demanding coach, and in turn, I became a very demanding coach. But at the same time I knew he cared a great deal about us, and I knew my runners knew I cared a great deal about them.

"When my kids trained, they ran major workouts. We were really good because we worked really hard, and I got that from Fred."

GENERALS STAR REYNOLDS PROUD OF HOMETOWN ROOTS

FLINT — Bobby Reynolds is the definition of a journeyman when it comes to his professional hockey career. The Flint native laced up his skates with multiple minor league teams throughout the U.S., played several seasons in Europe, briefly with the Toronto Maple Leafs and then eventually — finally — back home with the Flint Generals.

Reynolds came to the Generals in 2001, at the tail end of his hockey career, and played five seasons before becoming the team's head coach for two more. He led the International Hockey League in scoring three seasons and finished top five in scoring in the Generals' franchise history.

"Growing up with a pro sports team in your town like that, to me the Generals were professional hockey," Reynolds said. "I saw them more than I saw the Wings and as a kid you kind of always dream about playing for your hometown team. That was the Generals for me, so when I got the chance to come back, that was the perfect ending to my career."

Before going pro, Reynolds starred at Flint Powers Catholic and later Michigan State -- where he won a national championship in 1986, led the NCAA in goals in 1988 and in total scoring in 1989. He was a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award in 1989.

He is one of seven individual athletes being inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame's Class of 2013.

"To me, it's a huge deal and a tremendous honor," Reynolds said. "If you look back at the athletes that have come through the Flint area over the years, how successful so many of them have been, that's a good group to be included in. Some of the big-name guys are easy to remember, but you almost forget how rich in tradition the Flint area is in athletics."

Reynolds, 46, lives in Houston, Texas, but still commutes back to Flint often where he runs a business, Quantum Difference. It's a company that specializes in mouth quards for athletes.



Like many athletes from the area, Reynolds takes pride in calling Flint his home.

"It's a strange thing almost, but you get a little bit of a chip on your shoulder being an athlete from Flint," Reynolds said. "Especially at the pro level, you'll tell people where you're from and they kind of look at you strange because they think Flint is just about the factories and cars. The fact is there is a ton of great athletes still coming out of the area. Some of the names that are already in (the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame) say a lot about the tradition Flint has and that's a great conversation to have your name be a part of."

To the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame:

The University of Michigan is proud to be part of today's Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame ceremonies with the posthumous induction of Al Sigman. His given name was Lionel Albert Sigman. As a student-athlete at the University of Michigan, they called him Big Al. After graduating from U-M, and for the remainder of his life, he was Coach Sigman. He was more than a coach; Sigman was a teacher, father figure, educator and more to so many young men and women throughout his life.

He coached football, track, basketball and baseball at the high school level one year after graduating from the U-M. Starting at South Lyon High School and then moving to Escanaba H.S. one year later. Sigman eventually settled the Flint area in 1968 becoming one of the top area coaches in the history of Genesee County.

Four different schools utilized the talents of this fine coach--Flint Central, Northern, Grand Blanc and Carman-Ainsworth. At Flint Northern, Sigman won a state championship with the girls track team and named State Women's Track Coach of the Year in 1977. Sigman is also member of both the Michigan High School Coaches Hall of Fame and the Michigan Football Coaches Hall of Fame.

After serving our country as a member of the United States Marine Corps, Sigman played football and baseball at Michigan in 1955 and 1956. As a student-athlete at U-M, Sigman was an All-Big Ten offensive tackle in 1956 and an Honorable Mention All-American that same year, playing in the Blue-Gray All-Star Game.

As a baseball player for the Wolverines, he was one of Coach Ray Fisher's best outfielders. In fact, one of his varsity home runs was considered to be the longest homer ever hit at what is now called Ray Fisher Stadium at the Wilpon Baseball and Softball Complex.

SIGMAN HONORED FOR DISTINGUISHED COACHING CAREER


FLINT, MI -- Mike Vance knew Al Sigman as a neighbor, co-worker and friend.

He also thinks Sigman is one of the best and most underrated coaches to ever work in the Flint area, which is why he nominated Sigman for the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame. Sigman got the nod, and will join seven other individuals and three teams when the Class of 2013 is inducted Dec. 7.

Sigman, who died at age 75 in 2008, was a highly successful coach in multiple sports at Flint Central, Flint Northern, Carman-Ainsworth and Grand Blanc. He was also a two-year starter for the University of Michigan football team and played baseball for the Wolverines as well.

"I think because he was mostly an assistant coach he kind of flew under the radar, but Al fit the mold of what you want a coach to be and I think this is long overdue," Vance said. "One of the things that made him so successful was that he took a personal interest in the kids. If the kid was in the school play, he went to go watch him in the school play. He built up relationships with his student athletes and any coach knows that those are very, very important."

Those relationships are what Sigman is remembered most fondly for.



"He was just one of those rare people in life you come across and never forget them," said Sean Poole, who was a shot put and discus thrower under Sigman at Flint Central -- graduating in 2000 -- and later went on to play football at Michigan State. "He had a wealth of knowledge in anything he coached. He had just a wealth of knowledge on life as well. He was a father figure to a lot of us. I know he was to me and I'm sure he was to other athletes as well."

Poole is an example of the bond Sigman had with his players. After going to Michigan State, Poole said Sigman -- a Michigan man who bled blue -- attended all his home games on Saturdays the years he played at Spartan Stadium.

"There are a lot of coaches who are good guys and care about student athletes, but Al really embodied that," Vance said. "Al went to all of Sean's games and he's a U-M guy to the bone. That's not easy to do."

Sigman is already a member of the Michigan High School Coaches Hall of Fame and the Michigan Football Coaches Hall of Fame. His coaching credentials include being on a Flint Northern staff that won Class A state girls track and field championships in 1979, 1980 and 1981 as well as helping build up Grand Blanc's track and field program to the state contender it is today.

"We were Al's last coaching job and he spent four seasons with us and just did an outstanding job," Grand Blanc head boys track and field coach Ed Stanbury said. "I credit Al with helping our track program greatly with the field events. Our program had been decent but we hadn't gotten any All-State type kids in the shot put and discus. Then when he came here he spent a lot of time with the kids and our program kind of took off.

"Our program is very successful and I don't know if we'd be where we are right now without some of my assistant coaches and AI was one of them. The kids loved AI."

BORDEN'S DRUGS SOFTBALL TEAM DOMINATED CLIO, THEN FLINT

CLIO — In the mid-'70s, a group of fast-pitch softball players cut their teeth at a field called "The Hole" in Clio. The collection of 20-something guys changed only slightly over the next several years and nightly put on a show at the field in what was formally called McCormick Park.

They eventually became too dominant for the small-town Clio softball scene and headed south to Flint at Whaley Park, where they dominated the area and eventually the state as the Borden's Drugs Men's Fast-Pitch Softball Team.

Made up mostly of guys from Clio and a few from nearby Mt. Morris, the team settled on a roster for the 1980 and 1981 seasons and won state championships both years. That team is one of three new teams heading into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame later this year.

"These guys were incredible and they just dominated," said Tom Skinner, a Clio resident who nominated the team for its Hall of Fame induction. "I used to ride my bike from the high school after school over to the The Hole, which was really a cool field, kind of sunken down in the ground, and just watch them play. These were pretty much all Clio guys who had grown up playing together and stuck together for a long time. That made them incredibly good."

"The Hole" is now a skate park. But the Borden's team left its legacy in Flint and won a Class C state title in 1980 and Class B state title in 1981. In a total of nine seasons together, the team finished with a record of 360-120.

"The neat thing about our team was that we stuck together for as long as

we did," said Randy Jones, a catcher for the Borden's squad. "We had so many good guys that other teams from all over the state would call and try to get a guy to go join their team, but for the most part, we kept the exact, same roster. We were friends, so we didn't really argue about playing time or this and that. We just loved playing the game."

At the time the team moved to the Whaley Park league in Flint, it was one of the younger squads. Flint had a much more competitive softball scene than Clio or other areas in northern Genesee County. The Borden players felt they needed a tougher challenge.

"We pretty much didn't lose (in Clio) and we wanted to go to Flint because that's where the big boys were. There were a lot of experienced teams in Flint and we wanted a part of that action," Jones said. "We went down there, just a group of young guys from Clio, and

we took it by storm."

The team roster was: Denny Cole, Cliff Bemus, Ed Pendred, Scott Pearce, Chuck Stratman, Bob Skornika, Randy Jones, Fred Hill, Leo Funsch, Lyle Landon, Dave Skornika, Mark Myers, Ken Jackson, Steve Myers, Tim Sanborn, Ron Goode, Jack Sumner, Ben Hobson, Gene Ballard, Jim Goodwin, Tim Agle and Terry Goode.

Both teams were managed by Frank Glynn.

Several of the guys from the team still live in the Flint area and Jones said he's been able to track down almost the entire team for the Hall of Fame induction ceremony Dec. 7.

"Oh man, I've talked to most of the guys and they're all excited," Jones said. "After we stopped playing, most of us haven't seen each other for 25 years or so. Seeing each other again will be great. That was a great time in our life."

COACHING LEGEND FOWLER 'KEPT TENNIS ALIVE IN FLINT AREA'

It's easy to look at Jim Fowler's 40 years of athletic experience in the Flint area and think of his experience coaching basketball and football.

Ask others and Fowler will be referred to as the man who helped tennis thrive in the city and the surrounding suburbs.

It is that passion for the game, and for athletics in general, that has Fowler accepting a Special Service Award for contributions to Flint-area tennis programs and to four decades of athletics and education in Flint.

Fowler will accept his award on Dec. 7 at the Genesys Athletic Club in Grand Blanc as part of the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

Fowler coached football and tennis when Flint Northwestern was a new school in 1964. In 1969, Fowler moved to Flint Northern as athletic director and coached the same sports until the advent of Title IX.

"Girls athletics came in and I had nine sports thrown at me all at once," Fowler said. "I did a bit of coaching, but I was busy with athletic director duties so I had to stop coaching for the most part."

When Fowler retired in 1983, he bought Genesee Valley Tennis Club and went into business with Nick Logan, who still teaches tennis at the facility in addition to his duties as director of tennis at Warwick Hills Golf and Country Club in Grand Blanc.

"When Jim came to the area in the 1960s, it wasn't like tennis needed to be saved," Logan said. "Tennis was working out very well in Flint. He did a lot of lessons with the Flint Tennis Commission and when he was a tennis pro at the Flint Swim and Racquet Club, all sorts of adults and kids played.



"I had kind of an idea that tennis was a wimpy game. Then I saw Jim play it and I didn't think it was wimpy anymore. I wanted to play, and Jim helped me along the way."

Logan served as co-owner with Fowler in 1983 and Logan purchased Fowler's interest in 1995. The two no longer own the facility or the real estate.

"Jim was a real ambassador for tennis," Logan said. "He's run regionals and all sorts of tournaments at the Flint Swim and Racquet Club. A lot of people who were successful in Flint sports can trace their roots back to Jim. He gives it everything he has."

As the driving force behind Flint tennis through the 1960s and '70s and into the '80s, Fowler served as the Michigan High School Athletic Association tennis regional director for 37 years, and he was inducted into the Michigan Tennis Coaches Hall of Fame in 1998.

"We did a lot to promote tennis in the Flint area," Fowler said. "We brought schools in that never really had a chance to do stuff with the game. All the kids in the Flint area needed a chance to learn tennis, and it's really kept up in surrounding districts like Grand Blanc and Clio."

Jim and his wife Barbara retired to the Glen Arbor area in the early part of the 2000s. The Fowlers have a daughter who lives in Troy, so he makes occasional visits to the area, but admits a lot of his friends have retired and moved away.

Fowler also hired three top-notch basketball coaches at Flint Northern, including legendary Michigan coach Bill Frieder, who won two Class A state titles in 1971 and 1972. When Frieder stepped down, Bill Troesken took over and won the 1978 Class A state championship.

"Jim isn't being inducted for simply being an athletic director," Troesken said. "He single-handedly kept tennis alive in the Flint area. He went over and above the call of duty to give lessons and run tournaments for every age group from 8 years old on up. His involvement went over and above the normal coaching and athletic directorship.

"Flint was a basketball and football community and he was very involved with keeping tennis alive at the area venues. For Jim, personally I'm happy. Jim's accomplishments stand by itself."

Troesken's replacement, Bob Root, took over the Northern program in 1978. He moved to Carman-Ainsworth in 1984 and just retired following 35 years of coaching.

"Jim was a great athletic director," Root said. "He took a chance on me and he did so much for kids during my time. Jim was very much hands-on and very protective of his coaches. He had some suggestions and things that might help you.

"If you were down and needed some support, he would just lift you up."

Fowler is still working on his acceptance speech, which is about three minutes long.

"I've written down some things, but not a lot," Fowler said. "But you can say quite a lot in just three minutes."

HACKETT HONORED AS ATHLETE, EDUCATOR OF FLINT'S PAST

FLINT, MI -- Larry Hackett was ahead of his time and dominated his era as a basketball player in Flint in the 1950s and '60s.

Hackett was a team captain and leading scorer for Flint St. Matthews before going on to star at Flint Junior College -- now Mott Community College -- with two All-Conference seasons in 1951 and 1952. He earned the nickname "the dead man in the corner" for his ability to shoot from the baseline, far enough away from the basket that defenses were hesitant to venture out and guard him.

"The jump shot wasn't really invented then, so more often than not, I'd be the only one who'd go out there and shoot it," Hackett, 81, recalled. "Some guys around town started calling me that and it just kind of stuck."

Hackett is one of seven individuals being inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame's Class of 2013 Dec. 7 at Genesys Athletic Club in Grand Blanc. He's most known for his basketball skills but he was also a standout baseball player at St. Matthews and FJC as well as a force in the Flint summer softball and blooper ball leagues.

"I came up the old way," Hackett said. "I grew up in the city when it had the recreational programs and those were really vibrant. Every kid was a ballplayer of some sort back then, which made things a lot of fun."

After his college playing days were over, Hackett dominated the Flint City Basketball League, including setting a single game scoring record with 67 points in 1961. He scored 55 points in a game at FJC.

"He could shoot the ball better than anybody in town at that time and he could take you inside as well," said Duane Brown, who played multiple sports at Beecher and competed against Hackett throughout high school.

"Larry was just so dependable. He was the guy you wanted to be involved with the game when it was on the line, no matter what the sport was. Later on, I got to play with him in the summer leagues.

"The guy was the ideal teammate."



Brown and Hackett developed a close bond after high school and later as co-workers within the Flint Community School system. Hackett worked for Flint Community Schools for 31 years as a physical education teacher, coach, social worker and community school director.

"He was a great educator and great role model for young people in Flint," Brown said. "He ran baseball centers in the summer, would show up to make sure the gyms were open for kids to play in the winter. He had a lot of influence on young people in Flint."

Hackett said he's most proud of his role as an educator and his emphasis on being a team player, a lesson he later tried to emphasize with his students.

"I scored a lot of points but that's not what I was about," Hackett said. "I felt like I was a pretty good defensive player and always played team ball, so those were the things I prided myself on and what I always tried to teach the youngsters. I also taught about how to win with dignity, how to lose with dignity and of having respect for the game. All things that I think are still really important."

Hackett also served 20 years as the co-director of the Michigan Open Basketball Tournament, a now defunct tournament in Flint that brought elite talent such as University of Michigan star Cazzie Russell, Michigan State star Greg Kelser and former Detroit Piston Ray Scott to the city for games.

CLEAVES HUMBLED TO JOIN FLINT'S LEGENDARY PANTHEON OF ATHLETES

To the world, Mateen Cleaves is a college basketball icon. He's a living legend at Michigan State University for leading the Spartans to their last national championship in 2000.


Many people in Flint even view the baller-turned-sports-analyst as a local hero for his time invested in the community.

But in Cleaves' heart he's a Flintstone – and always will be. So for Cleaves, already a member of the MSU Athletics and Michigan Sports halls of fame, it's extra special for him to be inducted into this year's Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame with the Class of 2013.

"I stand in front of you as a kid from the north side of Flint from 512 Grace Street," said Cleaves, a retired NBA player. "I'm super excited and I'm a proud (Flint Northern) Viking. I'm very grateful and very humble."

Cleaves grew up studying the great athletes from his hometown like Eric Turner, Glen Rice and Jeff Grayer, then developed his own kind of leadership from their direction. Although he's clearly earned the right to be mentioned with the all-time greats of his city, MSU's only three-time All-American feels it's disrespectful to put himself in front of any of the guys before him. He won't ever do it and doesn't agree with anyone who does.

"I don't think you can say who



is the top player to ever come from here because there are so many great eras with the players that have come through here," Cleaves reflected. "Just to be in that conversation, that's what it's all about, so I'm just happy to be in that conversation because it's been some phenomenal players that have come from here."

Not only in basketball, either. Flint has produced Olympians, NFL pros, Super Bowl champions, heavyweight boxing champs, MLB stars, NHL players and standouts in many other sports, so to be acknowledged with that group is a great tribute to Cleaves' hoops career.

He led the Spartans to a national title in 2000 alongside his group of neighborhood friends from the area known as "The Flintstones." He was the heart and soul of MSU's championship team, known for his toughness at the point guard position. He also

spent six seasons in the National Basketball Association with the Detroit Pistons, Sacramento Kings, Cleveland Cavaliers and Seattle Supersonics.

Spartans coach Tom Izzo, one of the NCAA's most recognizable coaches, visited Flint over the summer for Cleaves' basketball camp and called Flint "Basketball USA." Cleaves and the "Flintstones" took his program to the next level, and Izzo is forever thankful.

"It's been a while since I've come back up here, and while driving up I thought about the great memories of coming up and watching so many kids in Flint," Izzo said. "I probably wouldn't be here if it wasn't for those Flint guys. There's so many players that have come out of this city and (Flint Northern), so it's almost scary when I think about it because it's a little different now than it was but hopefully those days are coming back."

These days Cleaves isn't busy training for basketball anymore. Instead, he examines basketball games closely with a critical eye to offer insight analysis for CBS Sports Network's "Inside College Basketball" and for Fox Sports Detroit's coverage of the Detroit Pistons. He has also done oncamera work for Big Ten Network, NBA TV, and ESPN and has hosted sports talk shows for SiriusXM Radio. He's transitioning into the second phase of his life which also includes helping others in need. The hall of fame nod is like icing on the cake for all that's been going on in his life lately.

'IT ALL FELL IN PLACE' FOR 1984-1985 MT. MORRIS SOFTBALL TEAMS

After hearing they would be inducted into the 2013 Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame, Connie Rolison and a few members of the 1984 and '85 Mt. Morris softball teams had a little nostalgic get-together.

"It was like we never missed a beat," said the former Mt. Morris pitcher after seeing her teammates for the first time in almost 30 years.

The '84 and '85 teams will be inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame on Dec. 7 at the Genesys Athletic Club in Grand Blanc.

During the '84 and '85 seasons, the teams won 76 games, two Flint Metro League titles, and the '84 team won a Class B state title, the only team in Mt. Morris history to win a state championship. The Panthers were 34-8 in '84 and used a 17-game winning streak to secure the state title.

In '84, Cathy Lewis led the team in batting average at .459 and also had 37 RBIs. Freshman Christy Blake had five home runs and 38 RBIs, while Rolison batted .431 with 36 RBIs

After seeing some of her old teammates, Rolison said she wants to continue meeting on a regular basis.

"We said, 'This is crazy, we don't stay in touch,'" Rolison explained. "We need to do this more often."

Rolison, who was a pitcher all four years for the Panthers, said team chemistry and playing together for many years before high school were vital parts of the success the teams had.

"I think the way we played together, the bond that we had," Rolison said. "Just pulling together and playing together. (Coach) Tom Stasik, he was the biggest part of it all, he just had so much confidence in us.

"The majority of the girls on the team were in my grade ... we had been playing together since sixth grade. That really helped, too, when you have that bond for so many years."

Stasik coached Mt. Morris from 1977-2003, and also coached at Flint Powers Catholic for eight

years after his tenure at Mt. Morris. Rolison was an assistant coach with Stasik from 2005-07 at Powers as the two won a district title in 2005.

Stasik retired from coaching in 2011, and Rolison currently serves as Linden's community pitching coach helping out with the middle school and varsity teams.

"Our pitcher never gave up any walks," Stasik said of Rolison, who was 41-1 in '85. "She seldom walked anyone, and we played good defense behind her. She held us in the games.

"We had a good hitting team, too. Everything just jelled together for us."

Despite falling 8-4 to Richmond in the regional final in 1985, the Panthers became the first team in the Flint Metro League to finish 18-0 in conference play. The '85 team also featured three first-team All-Staters (Rolison, Lewis, second base and Diane Fulcher, center field)

and one second-team All-Stater (Rhonda Hull, left field). Mt. Morris was 42-2 in '85.

"A lot of it goes back to the pitching," Stasik said. "The kids played well together; we had a good family-type atmosphere. Everything just fell into place. We got key hits when we needed them."

Rolison said there were never preseason aspirations of a state title, but, "everything just seemed to happen."

She also credited Stasik's work ethic.

"Through the winter, (he was) always working, always putting in that extra minute to help us get better," Rolison said. "(He) always came to the gym to help me get better pitching. He had so much confidence in us; always pushed us hard. It was all just one game at a time, and it all just happened.

"It all fell in place."

Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame Creates Initiative with County Athletic Community

In 2011, the GFASHOF Board and the Genesys Athletic Club reached out to area high schools with a collaboration that offered topics important to high school student athletes. The first two programs in 2010-2011 featured proper training techniques and substance abuse, respectively. Eighty students from ten high schools were in attendance. In 2011-2012, 130 students from fifteen schools attended a program on the topic of sportsmanship. The recently concluded program (October 23) focused on student



leadership. Three coaches who have won state championships in the past three years (Mike Williams, Beecher; Bob Buckel, Powers; and Jason Gray, Goodrich) joined three current Hall of Fame members (Kathy McGee, Powers; Steve Schmidt, MCC; and Courtney Hawkins, Beecher) in a presentation on the role student athletes play in team leadership. A total of 155 students from 17 schools participated. It is expected that the athletes will carry the program message back to their peers.
