U15 Team Challenge - Regional Round

On Saturday November 22, Herts played against five other counties – Essex, Bedfordshire, Norfolk, Suffolk and Northamptonshire – to try and qualify for the Team Challenge Final. Herts put out the strongest possible team: Conor Bambrick, Dan Hatt, Howard Stobo, Alex English, Hannah McLaren, Georgia Pittson and Kirsty Southey. (Unfortunately, Mark Sadler had to pull out due to injury). Throughout the day, the team were very supportive of each other and it was very successful.

The format was three mixed doubles, one boys singles, one boys doubles, one girls singles and one girls doubles. Our first match was against Northants, and we won 5-2. We won all three mixed, (1st pair Dan Hatt/Georgia Pittson, 2nd pair Conor Bambrick/Alex English, 3rd pair Howard Stobo/Hannah McLaren) and also the girls singles (Alex English) and the boys doubles (Dan Hatt/Conor Bambrick). Unfortunately, Howard lost his singles, but it was a very close game, and Howard played so well. In the middle of the game, he threw up on court, and still carried on playing afterwards!! He narrowly lost 21-17.

Our second match was against Suffolk which we won comfortably 6-1. Their number 1 boy was George Isherwood, who is a very good player. Conor lost 21-15, which was a very good result and he played really well.

The next match, against Beds, was one of the hardest and if we lost, we probably wouldn't go through, so there was quite a lot of pressure. Dan/Georgia lost very narrowly to their number one mixed pair, 21-20, which was a very good result as their number one boy is really good. Conor & I won ours, but unfortunately, Howard/Kirsty lost theirs. This made the score 2-1 to Beds. We then played the doubles. Dan/Howard won quite comfortably, which took the score to 2-2. The girls doubles was a very close game, but Kirsty/Georgia finally won, taking the score to 3-2 in Herts favour. Conor was most probably not going to win his singles against one of the top players in the country, so it was down to me to win the girls singles so that we could win the match. In the Shires League Match against Beds, I lost to this girl in three sets, so I really hoped I could win this for the county. The final score in our game was 21-8 to me, and I was really pleased with the result, and the rest of the team were very supportive while I was playing. The final score in the match was 4-3 to Herts, which was a great result.

Our fourth match was against Norfolk, and we won 6-1. Hannah played in the girls singles, and played really well, but the Norfolk girl was too good. The final score was 21-10.

Our last match was against Essex. Herts and Essex had won all their games, so this match would decide between first and second place. We played the mixed first, and we won two out of the three, Howard/Kirsty losing in a very

International Badminton Tournament - Biarritz

The tournament was staged at the Haitz Sports Centre in the Anglet area of Biarritz. Altogether there were 78 players from 15 different clubs and more than 62 hours of play over two long days.

Despite the small representation, a handful of trophies were won in both the singles and doubles matches by the HSBA team: singles and doubles triumphs for John in the U17 event, singles for Laura and doubles for her and Ying, again in U17's. One match was particularly tough and lasted 59 minutes, thanks to Howard and Enrique

This is the first time that HSBA has been invited to play in this tournament and members of the opposing teams made us all very welcome. A Saturday night out at a local Pizzeria was enjoyed by 35 people from the different nationalities and was followed by a tour of the area, including the lighthouse

A special thank you to John Stobo and his counterpart, Denis Marqué, for getting together and making this happen – well done.

Hopefully this could become a regular event on the HSBA calendar.

Hatfield Bronze Badminton Festival

Held at Birchwood Leisure Centre in Hatfield from Monday 18 to Friday 20 February and part of the Badminton England bronze junior calendar, this pilot event attracted 230 competitors over the week from all over England, including ninety players from Hertfordshire.

"We were highly delighted with the support for this new event and the quality of players it attracted with over six hundred matches being played over the week," said Tournament Secretary Alison Widdicombe.

Herts players contested in the later stages of several of the events but only one local player, Cayleigh Bambrick, won her event. Cayleigh, from Stevenage, won the under 13 girls singles defeating Frances Penney from Berkshire in the final. Cayleigh also reached the girls doubles final with Ellie Makewell, also from Stevenage, but went down 21-16 in a fiercely contested match against Harriett Brecknock/Laura Pickard from Cambridgeshire.

In the under 17 boys singles event Conor Bambrick, brother of Cayleigh, came through his group and right through to the semi-finals before going out 21-17 to eventual winner Alex Munns from Northamptonshire. Only one other Herts player made it to the knockout stages - Matthew Widdicombe (age 12) from Great Amwell. In the doubles event, Ross Barnes, Watford, and partner lan Robinson, Bayford, progressed to the semi-finals.

The largest of all the events was the under 15 boys singles, with a quality entry of 48 boys. Under 15 county squad player Steven Barnes from Stevenage showed just how much he has improved in the last year making it all the way through to the final. With six tough matches under his belt the final was, perhaps, one game too far. Nevertheless, he must be very proud of his achievement going down to Ronak Shah from Middlesex. a very talented player.

The under 13 boys singles saw Hatfield's Thomas Latter come through his group before losing to eventual winner, Henry Skinner from Kent, in the knock-out stages.

The under 11 boys and girls events attracted a quality entry from all corners of the country, giving the local players a real feel of what to expect in future years on the badminton circuit. Holly Garret from Bucks took the girls singles and Adam Lam, Sussex, the boys' event.

The under 15 and under 17 girls events were also dominated by players from outside the county. Although they all battled well, no player came through to the knock-out stages in either the singles of doubles.

Center Parks National Schools Championships

The first round of this competition was played early in December, with 94 teams from 33 different schools competing in 6 areas of Hertfordshire. The area winners went on to play in the county round in Stevenage in January, where Hitchin Boys and Chancellor's girls won the younger age group competition. The older age group was won by Chancellor's boys and Queenswood girls. These teams went on to play in the regional round in Cambridge in February.

The Chancellor's Year 10/11 team of Nick Barnett, Ben Lau, Ryan McCarthy and Daniel Regan, played teams from Bedford Modern (Beds), Taverham (Norfolk), Thomas Deacon (Cambridgeshire) and Colchester (Essex). They finished in 2nd place behind Colchester, just missing out on a place in the final. Hitchin Boys finished 3rd in their group and Queenswood finished 4th in theirs.

Chancellor's Year 9 girls team of Chloe Bungey, Olivia van der Maat, Jessie Northen and Georgia Pittson played against Davenant (Essex), Thorpe (Norfolk), Van Dyke Upper (Beds), Thomas Deacon (Cambridgeshire) and Lothingland (Suffolk). The Year 9 girls finished in first place and go through to the finals for the second year in succession. Last year they finished equal 3rd - this year, who knows?!

Hertfordshire win U12 Eastern Region Team Tournament

Herts team successfully defended the Eastern Region U12 team challenge which they won a year ago at Manningtree in Essex.

This year's tournament was held in Herts, at Wodson Park (Ware). There were only 4 teams – Bedfordshire had failed to field a team, as, uncharacteristically, so had Essex.

Consequently the tournament was extended to 2 games to 21 in each rubber. Whilst this may seem odd, (it can produce a drawn rubber) it does have the benefit of encouraging players to concentrate on starting well – losing the first game means the best they can get is a draw. Everyone plays a singles to make 6 rubbers, and then there is a boys doubles, a girls doubles and a mixed – 9 rubbers in total.

The established pairing of Jack Goode and William Pickworth played doubles together all day, whilst the mixed and girls pairs were rotated through the event to evaluate partnerships for next season

Hertfordshire won easily against Cambridgeshire in the first match, 8-0 plus a walkover. Norfolk were a stronger side, drawing a couple of rubbers, but the result 8 – 1 never really looked in doubt

Suffolk therefore was effectively the final – this was quite a tight match with 2 draws. However, Herts had strength in depth and came through to win 7 - 2 overall, and thus the championship.

Everybody played well to win the event, and notable performances included:

Mohammed Khaku and Ellie Makewell played consistently well all day and won all their games

Isabel Hatt's cool head throughout, demolishing all but one singles opponents and adapting to various doubles partners to deliver a near 100% record.

Silver Medals at National Team Challenge Final

Hertfordshire U13s achieved their strongest Team Challenge result for many years when they came 2nd in the National finals, held at Herts Sports Village this year.

The story went like this:

The team had qualified with a clean sweep of the eastern section at Mildenhall in November, which gives a small advantage as one of the 6 regional winners.

Herts won the first match 6-0 against Durham. Derbyshire were tougher, and used their best players tactically to take two rubbers, but Herts won the others in straight sets.

Leicestershire were next - a tough opponent recently in the Shires League, but this time Herts were on top, with only a closely fought boys doubles going against us.

At this point, Herts had won all 3 matches. So too had Dorset - now it was crunch time – Herts v Dorset. All 4 singles were epic contests with Anna Collis taking the first girls, beating Lynlette Aung 15-14, 15-14-. Matthew Widdicombe had three long and noisily supported sets against John Spawton, eventually winning the third 15-14. Philippa English won a close first game, and very nearly closed it out in the second against Ciara Lindsay, an opponent well above her in the national rankings. In the third game, however, experience and more economical footwork gave Ciara an edge, but she had to work for every single point all the same. Meanwhile, David Maughan recovered from a disastrous first game, and determinedly fought through the next two to win the rubber 15-13 in the third. So 2-2 after the singles... Herts then prevailed in straight sets in both the boys and girls doubles, to seal the victory. Phew! The neutral spectators enjoyed that Dorset match, but for parents, players and coaches alike, it was exhausting!

In the final group match against Sussex, four of the six rubbers also went to three sets. Despite advice to conserve energy for matches in the next round, our players' pride and determination over-rode this, and the team won out 6-0!

Herts had thus won their first stage group (with Dorset second), so went through to play off for places 1 to 4 in the second stage. Ulster and Yorkshire qualified from the other half.

There was a hiccup at this point – Ulster had booked a flight home which was too early, and so had to leave without completing their matches. This gave Herts a walkover victory, but it was a shame not to play that match. Hertfordshire's result against Dorset was carried forward from the first stage, making that win even more significant.

Meanwhile Yorkshire beat Dorset, leaving Herts and Yorkshire unbeaten all day, and now facing each other for the first place play-off.

The girls went first, led by Anna Collis, unbeaten so far, who took on England number 1 Natalie Chan-Lam. Unfortunately Natalie proved too strong and won that rubber. Philippa English again played a girl way above her in the rankings, and lost, but with unrelenting determination. At the far end of the hall there was another epic match – Izzy Hatt and Cayleigh Bambrick played the best doubles of the day, taking a tight first game 15-14, and then rebounding from Yorkshire's fightback in the second to win the third by a big margin and take what turned out to be Hertfordshire's only rubber.

Matt Widdicombe took his opponent to 3 games, all of them close, but couldn't quite clinch the third. Yorkshire boys then proved too strong for us in the last two matches, finally winning the tie 5-1, and thoroughly deserving their gold medals.

There was great support from mums, dads and others throughout – many thanks from the team and the coaches.
