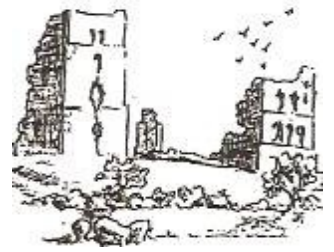

The Parish Council Meeting was held on Friday 7th January 2011. It was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman), Mrs P Bean (Vice Chairman), D Weston, I Read, B Parkinson and N Anfield .

Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

The Meeting started with a Minute of Silence in respect for the Memory of Parish Councillor Judith Calvert who died on 20th November 2010.

Precept:

After considering the Budget for 2011/12 it was agreed that the Precept would be increased by 2.5% to £14,545. It was noted that an increasing number of repairs to street lights are involving extra costs for rewiring and replacement of lanterns and columns.

Grass Cutting:

It was agreed to select Ian Wood to cut the grass for the coming season as his work last year had been appreciated by so many residents.

Grit Bins:

NYCC have been asked to refill the grit bins.

Bus Shelter – bottom of Coble Lane:

The handyman will carry out additional work to the window and paint the notice board.

Village News:

It was agreed to make a contribution of £125 to the running costs of the Village News after receiving a letter from the editorial section.

Sheriff Hutton Youth Club:

It was agreed to make a contribution of £200 to Sheriff Hutton Youth Club having received a very informative letter from the Treasurer laying out the expenses and projects on which the money would be spent.

Extra donations:

In addition extra payments of £100 each to Ryedale CAB and The Church of St Helen and the Holy Cross were agreed as promised in April 2010 when donations were made to them for 2010/2011.

Historical References to Sheriff Hutton

During a recent BBC TV programme about World War II, it explained that every painting in the National Gallery was removed to safe storage then replaced by pieces of art from around the country that depicted life in Britain. The example of art they showed was a watercolour of Sheriff Hutton Castle viewed from the crossroads of Coble Lane and Back Lane.

I have been in correspondence with the "Recording Britain" archive of the V&A and they tell me that there are in fact two watercolours by Kenneth Rowntree (Museum numbers E2589-1949 and E2588-1949).

The second water colour depicts a view of the Vale of York with York Minster in the distance. Both these paintings can be seen in the V&A Prints and Drawing Study Room from 10.00 to 17.00 Tuesday to Saturday. It takes about 10 to 15 minutes to retrieve these pictures. We can have electronic copies for Sheriff Hutton Village web site but we have to apply for a licence and there are strict rules concerning the use of an image. There are no prints available. New photography of paintings is subject to curatorial permission and a studio fee of £120 for two photographs.

Dear Friends,

I am a son, a husband and a dad. I am also a brother, a cousin and an uncle. I am a cyclist and a hill walker. This is something which is similar for all of us. We all have different roles and we are often different in those roles. I am different towards my son Sam from the way I am towards people in my role as a minister. But who are we? What is the specific thing that defines us? Are we a mixture of all of our characteristic traits, or are we defined by anything specific?

Jesus was a brother a son and a friend. He was also a great teacher and story teller. He was a miracle worker and a faith healer. He was Mary's son, but there was one relationship which defined him more than all of the others and that is he was the Son of God. That relationship was the defining relationship and made him who he was.

So what is our defining relationship? What is the one thing that points to who we are more than any other? Is it the relationship that we have to members of our family? Is it the relationship that we have towards our work and our neighbours? Or are we defined by our relationship to God? Luke in his two books of the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles writes his books to his dear friend, "Theophilus". This could be a person's name, and it certainly was used as a name in the time when Luke wrote. But the name is translated as "Lover of God", or "One who loves God". Could that be applied to us? Could we be defined by one relationship which makes all the other relationships lose significance? Can we be defined by how much or how little we love God?
