icture the scene: you have details of your great grandparents through various censuses, their names were John and Ann and you know where and roughly when they were born. You have details of their deaths and have even visited their graves and taken pictures of their headstones. However, the one thing that you do not have is their marriage certificate, which you badly need so as to confirm Ann's maiden name as well as the name and occupation of her father. Okay, so you already have the name from the birth certificate of one of their children, your grandfather, but the marriage certificate will confirm it - plus provide further details of their respective fathers. The ordered certificate duly arrives and... John is married to Jane?

You are now thrown into a tailspin! Are all of your years of research incorrect? Did you order the right certificate? Was Jane a second name or nickname? Was your great grandfather married to someone else as

well? You go back to your notes and double check. The answer to all of these questions is "no". So how can it happen? It is possible that the person recording the information at the wedding misheard. It is also possible that when it was transcribed into the registers held by the GRO that attention was not being paid and a slip of the eve helped the hand to record the name above. On one of my certificates, the bride's father is recorded as George instead of Henry. George was the name of the minister who wed them! If all of the other information is correct – the maiden name of 'Jane' is the same as the records that you are holding for 'Ann' - then the chances are that a transcription error of some description has been made. It still turns the tummy over though!

Editor's notes

irst, our usual reminder to adjust your clocks this weekend, putting them forward one hour (unless they have an automatic adjustment). This year in the northern hemisphere the Spring or Vernal Equinox occurred on Tuesday 20th March, so spring has officially already begun, though the weather told us otherwise. We can look forward to our days getting longer and the promise of warmer weather.

It seems that our County Council's failings have been laid bare by central Government's investigation into their handling of our money. Government inspector Max Caller's report on NCC's activities was published last week. The 50-page report points to a series of financial failures and claims these started when the Authority's children's services were graded inadequate in 2013.

In a statement to Parliament on 15th March, Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government Sajid Javid said: "The inspector has identified that the Council has failed to properly comply with its Best Value duty for some time. This is not because of lack of funds: as the report states, the Council's 'Mind the Gap' analysis does not demonstrate that NCC has been particularly badly treated by the funding formula."

Mr Javid pointed to a line in Mr Caller's report, where he states: 'Living within budget constraints is not part of the culture

of NCC'. The statement continues: "These findings appear very serious indeed both for the Council and its residents, the inspector has made recommendations for how improvement can be secured. He rules out the option of an internally led strategy and suggests that Commissioners should be appointed in the short term to ensure the proper running of the Council and delivery of services for its taxpayers, whilst proposals for restructuring are developed as a longer-term solution. I will now consider in detail their report's findings and proposals for the future. I will make another statement to the House setting out my proposals for next steps, including whether or not to exercise my powers of intervention under section 15 of the 1999 Act, in due course."

Councillor Heather Smith has resigned, describing herself as a "scapegoat" for criticism, and Cabinet Member for Finance, Councillor Robin Brown, was subsequently dismissed by the Council's acting leader. One can only wonder how much of the Caller Report was pre-ordained within Westminster but the fact remains that the outcome will be higher financial contributions from local residents. While the Report's suggestion that the existing District Councils should be scrapped and replaced with two Unitary bodies should lead to financial savings, it's hardly likely to result in improved local services.





Welcome to my monthly business column. Each month I will be visiting one of the many diverse businesses across the district, with a view to promoting and giving a boost to our local hard-working industries. This month I am reporting on a wellknown shoe manufacturer with a difference in Rushden.



was invited to visit DB Shoes Ltd by Charles Denton, who is the joint Managing Director with his brother David.

DB Wider Fit Shoes is a long established UK manufacturer whose family's footwear roots can be traced back to 1841. DB Shoes has been making footwear since 1920. The business will be celebrating its 100th anniversary on 11th February 2020

The actual roots of the business originate in leather tanning and the present Directors' grandfather set up DB Shoes Ltd after returning home from the First World War

Finding a new footing

The Denton family is synonymous with footwear manufacturing as different members of the family revolutionised footwear manufacturing technology and patented steel toe caps for safety footwear.

DB Shoes made welted footwear like everyone else but in the 1960s-1970s the

former Directors John and Hugh Denton changed the business fundamentally and developed new innovations in footwear manufacturing with PVC and PU direct moulding processes.

Direct moulding is a recognised process in 21st century footwear production, the history of its development started some 169 years ago. Factoid: The first manmade commercial plastic was invented by British metallurgist Alexander Parkes in 1856.

DB Shoes Ltd is the oldest established PU Injection footwear manufacturer in the world.

In the late 1990s the present Directors on first entering the family business found the need to take the business in a new direction as Northamptonshire's footwear industry was severely impacted by increased trade from China and saw many factories close down. DB was also affected and had to close some of its factories and 220 employees were made

redundant in 1997.

The brothers bought out the other shareholders and put forward a rescue plan to save their family business. They sourced an experienced nonexecutive Chairman, John Hawkesfield, who had extensive experience in turning businesses around and who guided the young brothers in saving their business.

Charles, who had qualified with a business degree, used his business studies skills to analyse the strengths and weaknesses of the business and surveyed people for their footwear needs.

A niche market was found and wide fitting shoes were developed, which are now a specialist product of DB Shoes Ltd. The company is a leading supplier of wide fitting shoes and now distributes to customers all over the

Avocados, oats and cocoa: for breakfast?

for you but you need to be careful. If you use a lot of fruit, whizzed up, it's a lot of free sugar. Look at the amount of fruit you are using and ask yourself, 'Would I eat that much fruit in one sitting?' If the answer is no, then it's probably too much.

You can add other things to smoothies though – wheatgrass, spinach, nuts, kale; but often these smoothies taste a bit too 'healthy'. How about a delicious smoothie that combines avocado, oats, milk, dates and cocoa. It tastes decadent over healthy, but is actually really good for you.

For two people, blitz about 30g of porridge oats to a powder in a smoothie maker or blender. Add a few cubes of ice, the flesh of a baby avocado, about 6-8 dried dates, about 200ml semi-skimmed milk (or milk alternative) and a tablespoon of cocoa. Blend for several minutes so the smoothie is free of lumps, and serve. With around 275 calories, it's a great start to the day. Freeze any leftover smoothie in lolly moulds

for a chocolate lolly kids will love.

Avocado, a so-called 'superfood', contains nutrients like the omega 9 fatty acid oleic acid, lutein, folate, vitamin E, monounsaturated fats and glutathione. which help prevent heart disease, cancer, some degenerative eve conditions and brain diseases. Oats are thought to give health benefits such as reducing cholesterol and helping prevent cancers.

Dates are high in fibre and contain calcium,


iron, phosphorus, sodium, potassium, magnesium, and zinc, and the vitamins A, K, thiamin, riboflavin, niacin, and folate. They are also high in sugar and calories, though, so don't eat too many!

Milk is a good source of protein, calcium and vitamins A and D.

Finally cocoa has many health benefits, without the calories in chocolate, and is a good source of iron, magnesium, manganese, phosphorous and zinc and also antioxidants.





Northamptonshire Police is urging the public to help the police tackle terrorism and save lives by reporting suspicious behaviour and activity.

ommunities defeat terrorism. With the enduring terrorist threat, it is now more important than ever that everyone plays their part in tackling terrorism. Your actions could save lives

Don't worry about wasting police time. No call or click will be ignored. What you tell the police is treated in the strictest confidence and is thoroughly researched by experienced officers before, and if, any police action is taken.

Any piece of information could be important, it is better to be safe and report. Remember, trust your instincts and ACT. Action Counters Terrorism.

Head of Local Policing, Chris Hillery, said: "Northamptonshire Police is committed to protecting people from harm and while the threat of terrorism is relatively low in this county, we are not complacent. It's imperative that our communities work with us and our partners to report anything they think is suspicious. Communities really are the key to defeating terrorism."

How can I report?

Reporting is quick and easy. You can report in confidence online via the secure form: www.gov.uk/ACT. Alternatively, you can call the police confidentially on 0800 789 321.

All reports are kept confidential and you can report anonymously. In an emergency always call 999.

What should I report?

Like other criminals, terrorists need to plan. You can report suspicious activity or behaviour – anything that seems out of place, unusual or just doesn't seem to fit in with everyday life.


What could potentially be terrorist-related suspicious activity or behaviour?

Research

- Meetings, training and planning can take place anywhere. Do you know someone who travels but is vague about where they're going?
- Do you know someone with passports or other documents in different names, for no obvious reason?
- Do you know someone who looks at extremist material, including on the so-called Dark Web, or shares and creates content that promotes or glorifies terrorism?
- Have you noticed someone embracing or actively promoting hateful ideas or an extremist ideology?

Gathering materials

- Suspicious materials can be ordered online as well as in store.
 Have you noticed someone receiving deliveries for unusual items bought online?
- If you work in commercial vehicle hire or sales, has a sale or rental seemed unusual?
- Have you noticed someone buying large or unusual quantities of chemicals, fertilisers or gas



 Have you noticed someone acquiring illegal firearms or other weapons or showing an interest in obtaining them?

Storing materials

 Terrorists need to store equipment while preparing for an attack. Have you noticed anyone storing large amounts of chemicals, fertilisers or gas cylinders?

Have you noticed anyone storing illegal firearms or objects that could potentially be weapons?

Hostile Reconnaissance

 Observation and surveillance help terrorists plan attacks. Have you witnessed anyone taking pictures or notes of security arrangements or CCTV?

Financing

 Cheque and credit card fraud are ways of generating cash. Have you noticed any suspicious or unusual bank transactions?




