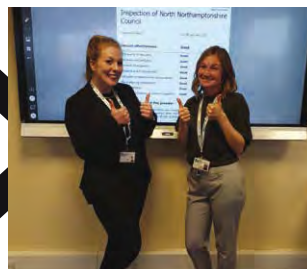

Queen's Baton Relay to visit Corby in July

The Birmingham 2022 Queen's Baton Relay is confirmed to visit Corby during its final journey through England this summer, as the full route is revealed.

Birmingham 2022 is hosting the 16th official Queen's Baton Relay – a journey which brings together and celebrates communities across the Commonwealth during the build-up to the Games.

In England, the Queen's Baton Relay will provide the opportunity for communities to experience the excitement of Birmingham 2022, as the 11 days of showstopping sport nears ever closer.

On Sunday 10th July, Corby will officially welcome the Baton.

During its time in Corby, the Queen's Baton Relay will visit Corby East Midlands International Pool and will experience exciting poolside displays from local divers and cheerleaders.

Schedule of activity for the Baton's time in Corby: the Baton will arrive at Corby Cube at 9.26am, will visit Corby East Midlands International Pool and then will leave from the pool car park at 9.36am.

Businesses urged to apply for Covid additional relief funding

Business rate relief is available for businesses impacted by Covid-19 but not eligible for existing relief schemes.

The Government has provided funds for the Covid Additional Relief Fund which is being administered by North Northamptonshire Council.

Applications can be made online. The deadline for making an application is Monday 13th June.

Funds from Government are limited and only businesses occupied and liable for business rates in the financial year 2021/22 are eligible to apply for funding (other eligibility criteria also applies).

The amounts awarded will be determined once the application window has closed.

Cllr Lloyd Bunday, the council's Executive Member for Finance and Transformation said: "Whilst there has been a great deal of support for those adversely affected by the Covid-19 pandemic we're also aware that some businesses have not been able to access the funding available.

"We would encourage these firms to get in contact if they think they are eligible to see if they can get this support.

"It's important that we support the economy as it

recovers from what has been one of the most acutely difficult periods in decades.

"A prosperous economy is the lynchpin for increased prosperity and wellbeing and we're committed to doing what we can to offer help."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "I'm delighted that this funding has been made available by Government to offer additional help for our businesses in North Northants.

"I would encourage anyone who thinks they are eligible to please make contact to see if we can help make a difference."

The celebration for Her Majesty the Queen's Jubilee is coming up, marking her accession to the Crown 70 years ago, although the coronation itself took place 69 years ago. If you pop into Oundle Library you will see a display of related articles plus a treasure hunt and information about how else the Library will be marking this occasion.

However, were any of your ancestors involved in the coronation ceremony or perhaps local celebrations? My father was a Group Scout Leader at the time and was proud to have been chosen to take part in a parade. But what about previous monarchs? If your ancestors were living in or near to London, I wonder what involvement they might have had.

Might they have been working at the Royal Court? Could they have been a member of the clergy? Or maybe even a choirboy? Have you discovered any interesting sidelines or hobbies of your ancestors that might point them in this direction?

It is not just coronations that could bring your ancestors into contact with royalty. Back in the mists of time, one line of my ancestors were blacksmiths in Kent. Although they were working in Tenterden, I have found documentary evidence that shows that they were responsible for the ironworks on some of Henry VIII's ships. That put a new slant on things when I visited the Mary Rose in Portsmouth!

In looking at a friend's ancestry recently, we discovered that he could trace his line back to Edward II. A slightly convoluted route, but the evidence was there. I have not worked out my friend's relationship to Danny Dyer (who is also able to claim this heritage) but it will be a several times cousin, several times removed! So you never know if you could be related to royalty – or how!

POST-16 AND NON-ENTITLED SCHOOL TRANSPORT: DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS

Pupils who are considering going into post-16 education in September 2022 or are of statutory school age but not entitled to free home to school transport are being encouraged by North Northamptonshire Council to apply for a seat on one of its existing contracted services. This includes children with Education, Health and Care Plans.

The council offers travel assistance for both sets of pupils – subject to eligibility criteria and the availability of transport.

The deadline for applications for the new academic year (starting in September 2022) is Tuesday 31st May.

Cllr Scott Edwards, the council's Executive Member for Children, Families, Education and Skills, said: "Applications need to be made before the deadline to ensure that the bus pass can be processed on time. Therefore I'd encourage all applications to be made as soon as possible.

"All the necessary information is available on the council's website and applications need to be made online."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "Applications need to be made on time to make

sure pupils don't miss out.

"We try our best to offer assistance to families wherever we can, however spaces are limited."

Post-16 and Non-Entitled school transport applications only cover one academic year, therefore a new application needs to be submitted every year.

It cannot be guaranteed that a seat will be available for a child for applications received after 31st May 2022.

Any applications received after the deadline may not be processed until the October half term and will be dependent on spare capacity being available. This would mean that alternative arrangements would need to be made so children could attend their education setting.

Applicants receive a confirmation email upon receipt. For applications received after the deadline, contact might not be made until the applications have been processed and a seat can be offered.

School transport can only be provided at the normal start and finish times (as published by the chosen educational setting). Individual course timetables cannot be taken into account.

For more information and to apply online please visit the council's website. Please be aware that if your child will be attending either Northampton College or Moulton College then parents should apply directly to the college for travel assistance.

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST SOUGHT TO TAKE ON THE RUNNING OF RAUNDS LIBRARY

As part of its Community Managed Libraries Programme, North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) has been working to find a viable solution to enable the transfer of Raunds Library into community management.

As an interim measure, in order to keep the library open for the local community, the council has worked closely with a volunteer group who have been occupying the library premises under a Tenancy at Will.

Before any final decisions are made and to ensure that the best possible service is secured for the local community going forwards, North Northamptonshire Council is putting out a call for any final expressions of interest to take on the running of Raunds Library as a Community Managed Library, under an agreed service level agreement.

The offer is as follows:

The council will provide and maintain:

- Access to the Library Management System in order to run a public library lending system as part of the countywide library offer, enabling customers to borrow and return stock at any library
- Public computer providing internet access for the public via the People's Network
- Self-service Kiosk
- Book stock on the day of transfer and an ongoing supply of new stock, which remains the property of the council
- Training and ongoing support for volunteers and staff running the Community Library through a team of Community Managed Library Co-ordinators

The Community Managed Library will need:

- To cover the costs of buying or leasing the library premises so that it can be run as a library, or to provide alternative premises that can be run as a library
 - To cover the costs of running the premises
 - All staffing and or volunteers to provide at least 12 opening hours a week for the public library
- Cllr Helen Howell, the council's Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism, said: "Libraries provide important services for local people and continue to be a valued hub within our communities. I would like to thank the volunteers who have kept the library running in this interim period and we will continue to offer our support until a solution is found."

"The last couple of years have been difficult for many – particularly community groups who have seen demand for their services increase as a result of the pandemic, however we hope that this unique opportunity will spark interest and enable the local community to continue to benefit from a dedicated library service."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "Libraries are important community assets and I'm delighted that we're moving closer to finding a solution that allows this library to be managed by the local community."

BUY A PIECE OF HISTORY AND HELP THE UKRAINE APPEAL

Members of the Higham Ferrers Tourism Committee leave no stone unturned when it comes to raising funds for a worthy cause. Now, they are about to physically turn over stones to local people who want to buy a piece of unique history. They are selling off 34 stones that fell from the inner front perimeter wall of the 600-year-old Henry Chichele College last year.

Five tons of rubble crashed to earth from the College Street side of the site in February 2021, marking the first time that there had been a stone fall in 600 years. Specialist stonemasons were called in and their years of experience and conservation expertise have now returned the wall to its former glory. (They also restored a deteriorating and dangerous boundary wall in Saffron Road.)

They used replacement stones from the Churchfield Quarry in Oundle, fitting in some of the fallen stones where they could. However, 34 stones could not be fitted back into the wall and it is these that the

Tourism Committee is planning to sell off at their annual Chichele Garden Fair on 28th May, which this year will mark the 600th anniversary of the ancient site.

"We will be selling the stones from between £5 and £10 to anyone who wants a piece of history in their home or garden, with all the proceeds going to the Ukraine Appeal. People might want to say they own a medieval stone," said Liz Barnatt, the Tourism Committee Chair.

Committee member Carol Fitzgerald, who is also on the Chichele College Management Committee, said that the sale of the stones will make a lovely addition to the Garden Fair, which will

also feature music, refreshments, children's artwork based on the story of Henry Chichele, as well as a host of garden-related stalls.

"Each stone that is being sold will come with a special certificate," she said.

Chichele College, founded by Higham Ferrers-born Henry Chichele, an Archbishop of Canterbury, is owned by the Duchy of Lancaster and is a Scheduled Monument and part of the National Heritage Collection in the care of English Heritage. Higham Ferrers Tourism Committee cares for the day-to-day management of the site via a local management agreement with English Heritage, which met the substantial cost of the renovation work.

The Tourism Committee will also be sending the proceeds from their Fashion Show on 17th June and the Quiz Night on 29th October to the Ukraine Appeal.

Cllr Andy Mercer, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive Member for Housing and Communities, said: "I am pleased that we have been able to partner up with like-minded organisations once again to host the Northamptonshire Virtual

Funding Fair. After a difficult time for community groups, the sessions on offer are essential for anyone looking to fund a project and who wants to find out more about the opportunities available to them.

"With new schemes and funding opportunities appearing all the time, we would encourage anyone who is considering a community project to join us at one, or more, of our sessions between 7th and 9th June."

All sessions will take place on Zoom and places must be booked in advance via the online form.
