

There is a kitchen garden, orchard, herbaceous borders filled with roses, perennials and shrubs, paths and many pots, filled with succulents, herbs and colourful annuals. Steps abound so sadly not wheelchair friendly.

The garden is set on a hillside with lovely views across the village. It comprises a cottage style garden; then a series of water features inc a stream and a 'champagne' pond; and finally a vegetable plot, small orchard and wildflower meadow. Artistic touches run throughout and local artwork is featured. The ponds attract great crested and common newts, frogs, toads and grass snakes. In addition to the garden there will be a small collection of vintage and classic cars on display. Gravel paths and lawn.

Five very different and interesting gardens displaying a variety of styles and a range of spring flowers. Bumble Cot is a small courtyard style garden, 64, Main Street is planted to encourage wildlife with views to open countryside with a variety of trees. Woodmill is a recently redeveloped garden with areas planted in both traditional and modern styles. Penwood is a small, pretty cottage garden and Home Farm is an informal, family garden with a beautiful spring woodland of $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres, planted in 2000. All of the gardens are partially wheelchair accessible, although some have gravel paths. Inaccessible areas will be clearly labelled.

The garden is over half an acre which inc a walled cottage garden, stumpery, potager, fernery and woodland walk. The planting consists of many unusual shrubs and trees and over 90 clematis, climbing roses and colourful herbaceous borders. The garden has been featured in Garden News and Garden Answers. May need to access over a gravel drive.



1 THE DAIRY, HURST COURT A2

Sun 19 May (1-5). Adm £5, chd free. Light refreshments. Visits also by arrangement 19 May to 31 Aug for groups of up to 20. Adm inc tea and coffee. Cakes may be purchased.

Developed over the last 17 years from a muddy $\frac{1}{4}$ acre patch attached to a barn conversion, the garden now contains a large Japanese Koi Carp pond, goldfish pond and

a stream with planting having a Japanese connection viewed from winding paths. With many rhododendrons, camellias and azaleas combined with cloud pruning and a variety of other plants, an air of peace pervades the garden.



Walks through the wonderful ancient oaks and ash underplanted with spring bulbs and lawns surrounded by rampant cow parsley. South facing terrace with seasonal planting. Teas and light lunches in garden, live music from Happy Jazz Band.

David Austin roses chosen for their scent feature throughout, inc a 30' rose arch. A shade house with unusual hardy plants and a Hosta Theatre. Regular changes to planting. Wigston Framework Knitters Museum and Secret garden nearby open Sunday afternoons. Parts of the garden can be viewed, narrow paths and step limit full access.
