In all grades the club has won 32 competitions including 3 premier titles in 2005, 2009 and 2013. It has also won the Ainge Shield (for best overall club) on a number of occasions. Two All Blacks – Taine Randall and Sam Harding were members at the time of their selection. Our most recent All Black prior to these two players was Paul Henderson in 1991. Players who have played for the club who went on to become All Blacks were Andrew Hore, Gareth Evans

and Brad Weber.

Approximately 40 players have represented Otago in the period while a number of others have represented other provinces. Twenty-Five players have played for the Highlanders while a few others have played for other franchises.

This latest 25 years in the club's history has coincided with the introduction of professional rugby. This has brought new challenges to all amateur rugby clubs. Attracting able administrators and coaches who are prepared to give their time freely has become an ongoing problem for all clubs.

That the Dunedin club has been able to not only fill these positions year after year but done so with highly competent and innovative people is a great credit to the club and its culture.

The future is bright and it is over to the players, administrators and coaches of the future to ensure that the proud record and traditions of the past are maintained and enhanced.

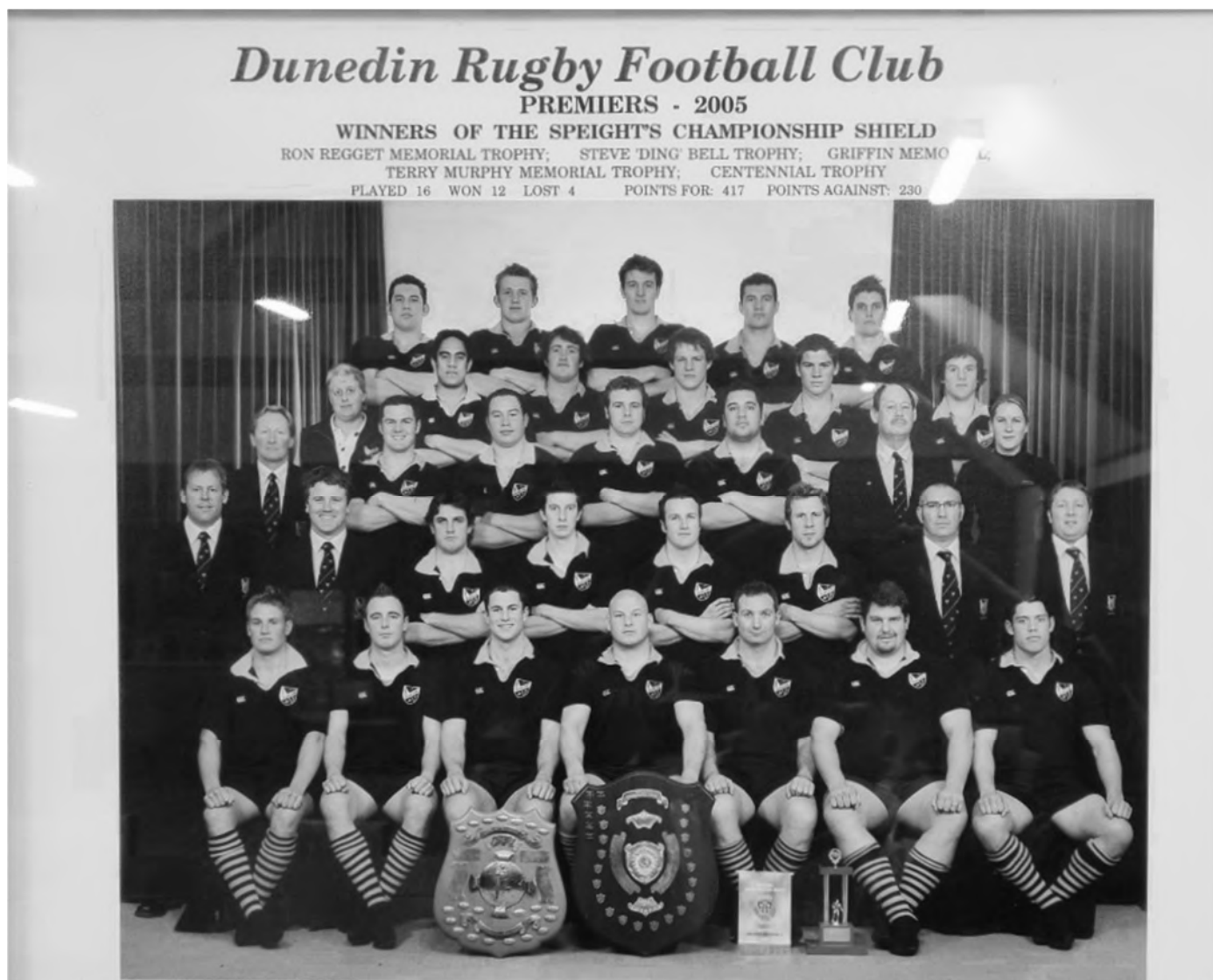

ARNOLD L. MANION - Club Patron



The recent passing of our club patron brings to an end a life few rugby folk now or in the future will be able to emulate. When rugby people throughout New Zealand and overseas spoke or heard of the Dunedin Rugby Club, the name Arnold Manion immediately came to mind. Arnold spent most of his life closely associated with the club. Indeed, the Dunedin Rugby Club was very dear to Arnold and it could be said Arnold was very dear to the Dunedin Rugby Club.

Looking at the life of Arnold Manion. One keeps turning to the Sermon on the Mount and noting in particular "Always treat others as you would have them treat you". He's was a man who probably never offended anyone in his life – except the enemy who got in his way while fighting in the Tank Brigade in the Second World War – Arnold had such an easy-going nature.

To begin with, life wasn't easy for Arnold. He lost his parents early in life. Arnold first kicked a rugby ball while attending the 'Sisters of St Joseph's School' in Waimate. Then came a short period at Marist Brothers School in Invercargill, which combined with St Catherine's Dominican Girls School in 1983 to become Verdon College. On coming to Dunedin Arnold was in the care of the Sisters of Mercy at Waverley home before going on to Christian Brother's high school, "Christies" as it was called since 1876 was in the O'Connor era. It was a good time around Rattray Street if you wanted to make something of your life, because Br M.M. O'Connor demanded full effort, in the classroom and on the playing field. He even persuaded Frank Hall to play rugby and become a valuable member of the first fifteen. Hall would later become one of New Zealand's best-known physicians. Br O'Connor saw it that "Christies" had the best rugby coaching. And by the best that saw that saw the great Billy and Jimmy Duncan, Denis Boreham, Monty McClymont and Alex McDonald. There were blackboard lectures to accompany Monty McClymont's "Potted Wisdom". Maxims such as "After cutting in, you must cut out again" and "you kick to gain ground and run to score tries" were lessons that stuck in Arnold's mind. These he used in his own playing days and also his coaching. Those were the Depression days and there was little or nil on the job market.

He joined the Dunedin Rugby Club in 1933, but in 1934, a matriculated Manion with higher leaving to boot, found himself as a roustabout at St Kevin's College Oamaru His former mentor and Headmaster at "Christies" Br O'Connor was now rector at St Kevin's and offered Arnold employment. Arnold was asked to pursue accountancy, but the 6am to 6pm work day did not encourage serious study. Still, he found time for rugby and he represented North Otago as a five-eighth. While at C.B.H.S. Arnold had played for the First XV for three years 1930-31-32.

Arnold was recognised as an extremely competent first five-eighth who varied play well. He kept the opposition thinking with astute kicking and Arnold new how to set up a running back-line.

Arnold re-joined the club in 1935 and he played five-eighth for seven seasons in the seniors, captaining the team in 1941. In that season Arnold represented Otago against Canterbury, North Otago and Southland. In October 1941, Arnold entered the Army. Joining the N.Z. Tank Brigade. He played here and overseas with such famous players as Charlie Saxton, George Hart, Brushy Mitchell, Steve Robinson, Rod McKenzie, and double international Martin Donnelly who later played for England.

Back from the war Arnold again captained Dunedin Seniors in 1946, his last season as a player, retiring at the age of 32. Arnold then coached the seniors for eight years from 1947 to 1954 during the time his team won the Senior Championship in 1951. In 1954-55-56 Arnold was President of the D.R.F.C. and in 1958 he became a Life Member.

Arnold served 13 years on the Committee of the Otago Rugby Football Union from 1955 – 1967. In 1958-59 he was Convenor of Selectors and Coach of Otago and it was a big occasion for Arnold when his team defeated the touring British Lions in 1959 by 26pts to 8. Arnold was Vice-President of the O.R.F.U. in 1969 – 70 and President of the Union

In 1971 he was made a Life Member of the O.R.F.U. in 1979. – Only the fourth to receive this honour in the Union's 125-year-old history.

Arnold was a foundation member of the Sassenachs Rugby Club of Otago that began in 1973. In 1982 he became President of the Sassenachs Club. Arnold was the first President of the N.Z. Marist Rugby Federation and also a foundation member of the South Island Easter Rugby Tournament in 1947.

As the Dunedin Rugby Club's delegate, he attended every Easter Tournament except two. This Tournament lapsed after some forty-five years.

In the mid 1950's together with Maurice Kerr and Alby Beck, Arnold began rugby coaching and games competition every Saturday morning for the pupils of convent schools in Dunedin. This continued for some thirty years until 1985 when the Clun entered teams from Under 8 upwards in the Saturday morning schoolboy competitions.

Hundreds, even thousands of young children were introduced to Rugby by Arnold. John Preston one of the most valued All Blacks in the 1991 and 1995 World Cups and also a former Wellington Captain began his rugby in this competition while a pupil at St Brigid's, Tainui, in the mid 1970's.

Rugby remained prominent in his retirement. Last year, Lions coach Sir Clive Woodward and manager Bill Beaumont made a special trip to the Little Sisters of the Poor home at Brockville to visit him.

One could fill pages with a proper and fitting tribute for Arnold Manion for the work he carried out in and around the Club. Some of the younger Club Members and Supporters may not be fully aware of the contribution Arnold made to rugby not only in the Club but also to the City of Dunedin, the Province of Otago and indeed the entire country.

Arnold embodied all the grand qualities of the game of rugby which we must be careful to protect. Arnold was for the game, the Dunedin Rugby Club and Otago Rugby, not himself. And he was for the players, not publicity. The Dunedin Rugby Club is deeply grateful to Arnold Manion for what he did and for what he meant to the club.

*"But it isn't the winning – nor the scoring, nor the cheers,
It's the friendships and the memories, that last through the years.
It's the camaraderie that is born of valour not of fame,
It's the sheer exhilaration – when you play the rugby game!"*

Most members of the Otago Rugby Union Board were present at the Requiem Mass at St Patrick's Church, South Dunedin, as were most of its Life Members, together with a large congregation made up of club members, supporters, friends of Arnolds and representatives from other Clubs and organisations with whom Arnold was associated. From Arnold's Funeral Eulogy

Arnold Manion was born in Christchurch in 1914 and spent his early life in Methven, Waimate, and Invercargill before coming to Dunedin in 1924 to live at the St Joseph's Orphanage in Waverley and attending the Christian Brothers Primary and secondary Schools. He was a member of the CBHS 1st XV in 1930-31-32. On leaving school he shifted to Springvale, near Alexandra, where he worked for a short time and played some rugby for the Alexandra club, before shifting to Oamaru to work at St Kevin's college. He played rugby for the Maheno club and represented North Otago in 1934. On returning to Dunedin in 1935 he joined the Dunedin club and played senior rugby from 1935-1941 representing Otago in 1941.

He was drafted into the NZ Tank Brigade in 1941 and went overseas with the 20th armoured regiment for whom he served in Italy until the end of the war in 1945. The 20th regiment fought at the famous battle for the monastery at casino. While overseas he played some rugby with and against many of the names synonymous with the legendary Kiwi rugby team. After the war Arnold attended as many of the 20th regiment reunions as he could and kept close contact throughout his life with many of his war comrades.

On returning home from the war, he played senior rugby in 1946 and then coached the seniors from 1947-54 winning the senior competition in 1951. He was President of the Dunedin Club from 1954-56 and elected a life member in 1958. He was coach of the Otago team along with Peter Johnstone in 1958 and 1959, the latter team defeating the British Isles 26-8. It was in that same year at the age of 45 he suffered a heart attack. Doctors told him that damage had been done to his heart and not to look forward to a long-life expectancy and that he should just take each year as it came. Arnold did for another 47 years. He was involved with the South Island Marist Tournament, which was held every Easter from its inception in 1947 until its demise in 1986. He was delegate for virtually all of that time and attended most, if not all the tournaments.

He was the instigator of schoolboy rugby for boys attending the convent schools in Dunedin. He along with many helpers taught the basics of rugby to the youngest of the players for many years. There will be still men who played in those Saturday morning games and will recall Arnold's rugby prayer that had to be recited before the games started. "When you pass the ball, it must be not too high, not too low, not too fast and not too slow"

The game of rugby has certainly changed since those days.

He served on the ORFU from 1957-67 and was President of the ORFU in 1971. He was made a life member of the ORFU in 1979 an honour he was immensely proud of. He was appointed Patron of the Dunedin club in 1982. Arnold also served for a period on the executive of the Sassenachs rugby club.

As stated previously he returned to Dunedin in 1935 and in those hard days of the 1930's had numerous jobs. He used to recall one job he had which was that of a door-to-door salesman for a new invention called an Electrolux. In the first six months he didn't sell one. How he survived is anyone's guess but survive he did. He spent most of his working life however in the office of Emslie and Flockton, panel beaters in South Dunedin. On his retirement he took himself off on an overseas trip to seek out relations in Ireland which he did. At the same time, he was able to realise one of his dreams and that was to see the All Blacks play a test in a foreign land. He had an incredible ability to recall people, places and events that happened and enjoyed relating stories about the characters he had met over the years through his work, during his war service, and with his involvement with rugby.

Many stories have been told of the Christmas holidays Arnold and his mates had for many years at the Wanaka camping ground and later on at Uncle Toms Cabin in Arrowtown. Tales of each day organising games of cricket, rounder's and running races for the kids at the camping ground, the golf matches, the card games, the haggles and so on have been told and retold many times over. They were stories of fun days and laughter and Arnold revelled in reminiscing about those happy days.

He was a great collector of memorabilia and kept scrapbooks of many events that occurred during his lifetime including scrapbooks of the rugby reports in Monday mornings ODT from 1945 to 1995. Fortunately, these are still in existence and are to be filed in the Hocken Library.

After his rugby playing days were over, he became a very keen golfer and was a member of the Chisholm Park Golf club where he played for a number of years and where he once again enjoyed the camaraderie of the other members.

A sportsman through and through and although he enjoyed any successes the Dunedin club or Otago achieved, he was always ready to remind us all to be humble in victory and gracious in defeat.

A mild-mannered man of a friendly disposition he was known throughout New Zealand by many people, young and old, from all walks of life and was greatly respected by all who knew him.

He was a member of the Dunedin Rugby Football Club for 72 years and he is missed by all members as he will be by the many friends, he made in the wider rugby fraternity.

He was a man of integrity, totally loyal to his beloved rugby club, to the Otago province, to his many friends and their families, to his country, and God.

81313 LCpl Arnold Lawrence MANION NZ Army 20 Bn & Armed Regt 2 NZEF

Arnold enlisted into to the NZ Army on the 15th October 1941 and after basic, and corp training he was posted overseas on the 10th December 1942 with the 8th reinforcements of 218 officers and 5387 other ranks on the Aquitania from Wellington, arriving at Port Tewfik in Egypt as part of the Middle East and Central Mediterranean forces 20bn/Armed Regt 2 NZEF, Arnold served in the latter stages of the Western Desert campaigns in Tunisia and Libya.

Regrouping at Maardi with the NZ Div., Arnold a Sherman tank driver in 20 Armd Regt landed at Bari, Italy on 29 October 1943. beginning with the battles around the Sangro & Orsonga, Arnold with the 20th was in February 1944 part of the NZ DIV at Monte Cassino, then Florence in August 1944, Rimini & Romagna in October, Faenza in December, Senio from February to early April 1945, before the 20th crossed the river Po on the 29th April. To enter Trieste on the 2nd of May 1945.

With the end of the war and victory in Europe 8th May 1945, the NZ Div. remained defending Trieste against a hostile Yugoslavian Tito led partisan army before eventually moving to Lake Trasimene to disband in July 1945.

Arnold then returned to NZ on the 30th September 1945 with the Tekapo draft on the troop ship Dominion Monarch landing in Lyttleton on the 1st of October 1945 being eventually discharged from the NZ Army on the 11th December 1945. For his service to New Zealand Arnold was awarded the following campaign and service Medals: The 1939-45 Star, The Africa Star, The Italy Star, The Defence Medal, The War medal 1939-45, The NZ War Service Medal. During the time of war, Arnold fought a good fight for his country and his friends and we thank God for his steadfastness in adversity, for his courage in the day of battle, and for the memories he has left to us who knew him. And we pray, that we and each succeeding generation in this land, ever keeping the valour of our Returned Servicemen and Servicewomen in proud remembrance, may strive to be worthy of their service overseas and in our land. To the glory of God and the freedom of mankind.

Many years ago, Arnold told that as a boy he had some trouble with the three "R's", Reading, Riting and Rithmetic – be that as it may, he certainly had no problem with the three "F's" that played such a large part in his life, namely his Faith, his Friends and his Football.

His Faith – he served well during his life and practised it until his death, and proudly so.

His Friends – he valued, be they workmates, servicemen, neighbours or members of sporting clubs, especially rugby clubs, whose members he appreciated and made so many lifelong associations.

His Football – to which he devoted so much of his life. Especially to the Dunedin Club.

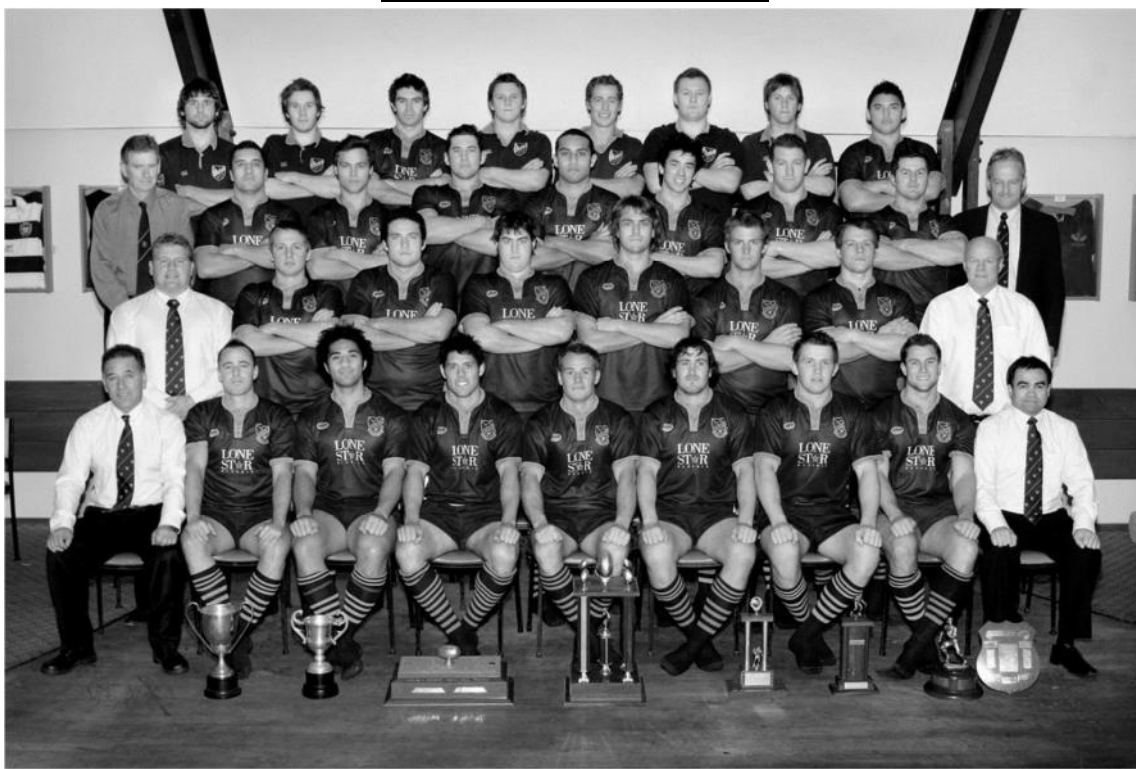
Arnold set himself high standards in his own life and he expected those he coached in rugby to set themselves and strive to achieve similar standards. A Strict disciplinarian, he had no time for foul or unfair play and expected all to give only their best – this, he said, developed character and good character was the making of a good man. In administration he epitomised the true value of the meaning of the word. He was Efficient in his dealings, Enthusiastic in his actions and had ability to Communicate at all levels and earn the respect, the support and, the admiration of those with whom he dealt.

Arnold Manion was, in every respect, a man, at all times “On the Ball”.

In 1970, Tom was elected onto the committee of the DRFC and began his long

affiliation with the administration of Dunedin. In 1980 Tom was awarded Life Membership as recognition for his service and input into the Club.

Many of the facilities we take for granted today at our club can be attributed to the Tom's hard work, perseverance and ability. The library, the lighting on numbers 2 and 3 ground, the shower block and changing rooms to mention a few. Given it was Tom that managed to get the dunes raised along the side of number 1 ground I wonder what he would have thought about the current proposal to let the sea continue its march and take over Kettle Park? As recalled in the 125 Years History of The Club- Tom was one of Club's likeable personalities, a man with a twinkle in his eyes, a smile on his face and an Irish joke to tell. With Arnold Manion and Alby Beck (both also DRFC life members), he formed an affable trio. These "three musketeers" or "bachelor triplets" had much in common: football, golf, tramping, horses, holidays and above all the Dunedin Rugby Club. "Uncle Tom's cabin" in Arrowtown gets mentioned on many occasions throughout the book- testimony to it and his popularity. Tom was a very proud club member and especially proud of the several Premier Championships won by the club over recent years, along with the growing success in all grades. The development of the club, its growth and its success also gave Tom cause for pride and rightly so.

To the family we thank you for allowing us to be part of Tom's farewell today but we also thank you for the contribution. Tom made and for the contribution you have all made to our club. You will always be welcome in the clubrooms of the Dunedin Rugby Football Club and Tom will be remembered forever within the Club.

Mike Denton tragically passed away in September, at the age of only 29, while on an end of year rugby trip to Bali, with his Nedlands Rugby Club (Perth, WA) team mates. Mike's rugby background began with the DRFC Juniors, followed by his time at Kavanagh College which included 2 years in the First XV in 1999 and 2000. He spent 5 years out at "Shark Park", primarily as a 2nd 5-8, with 2 years in the Bulls Premier Colts, 2 years in the Premier IIs, and finally in 2005, being part of the Premiers championship winning squad. In addition to being part of the special banner winning year in 2005, one of Mike's proudest rugby days came in 2001. In that year his Bulls Colts team defeated their fellow Mako Colts team during the competition round – that was to be the only defeat suffered by that very talented team that year as they went on to win the championship. On migration to Perth in 2006, Mike continued with his passion for rugby by joining up with the Nedlands Rugby Club and had completed his 5th year in their Premier team this year. Mike's rugby pinnacle would have been his inclusion in the Western Force 'A' Programme in the last year.

LD (Bill) Lawrence

Our oldest & longest serving Life Member L.D. (Bill) Lawrence died in early August; his passing is mourned by all club members. On leaving Christian Brothers High School, Dunedin (now Kavanagh College) Bill joined the club & quickly rose through the grades to the seniors, joining them at the tender age of just 21. He immediately made his mark as a highly promising 1st, 5/8 & developed a combination with 1//2 back Bert Haig which was to last several years during which they established themselves as the number one inside back combination in the competition & saw the team become a strength to be reckoned with. This strength grew in 1951 which saw the team win the senior banner for the first time since 1908.

In the final 3 matches, against Zingari, Pirates & the final with Varsity A Bill drop kicked a goal in each close fought match in fact in the Pirates game he did it twice against a side including Ray Bell & Kevin Skinner, both just back from touring Australia as All Blacks. Bill played for Otago in 1950 after having represented Metropolitan for the previous two seasons. While still only 22 he joined the club Committee on which he served for a very long time, culminating in his appointment as President in 1968-9 and received the deserved honour of Life membership in 1972. Bill also chaired the club Centennial Committee in 1971.

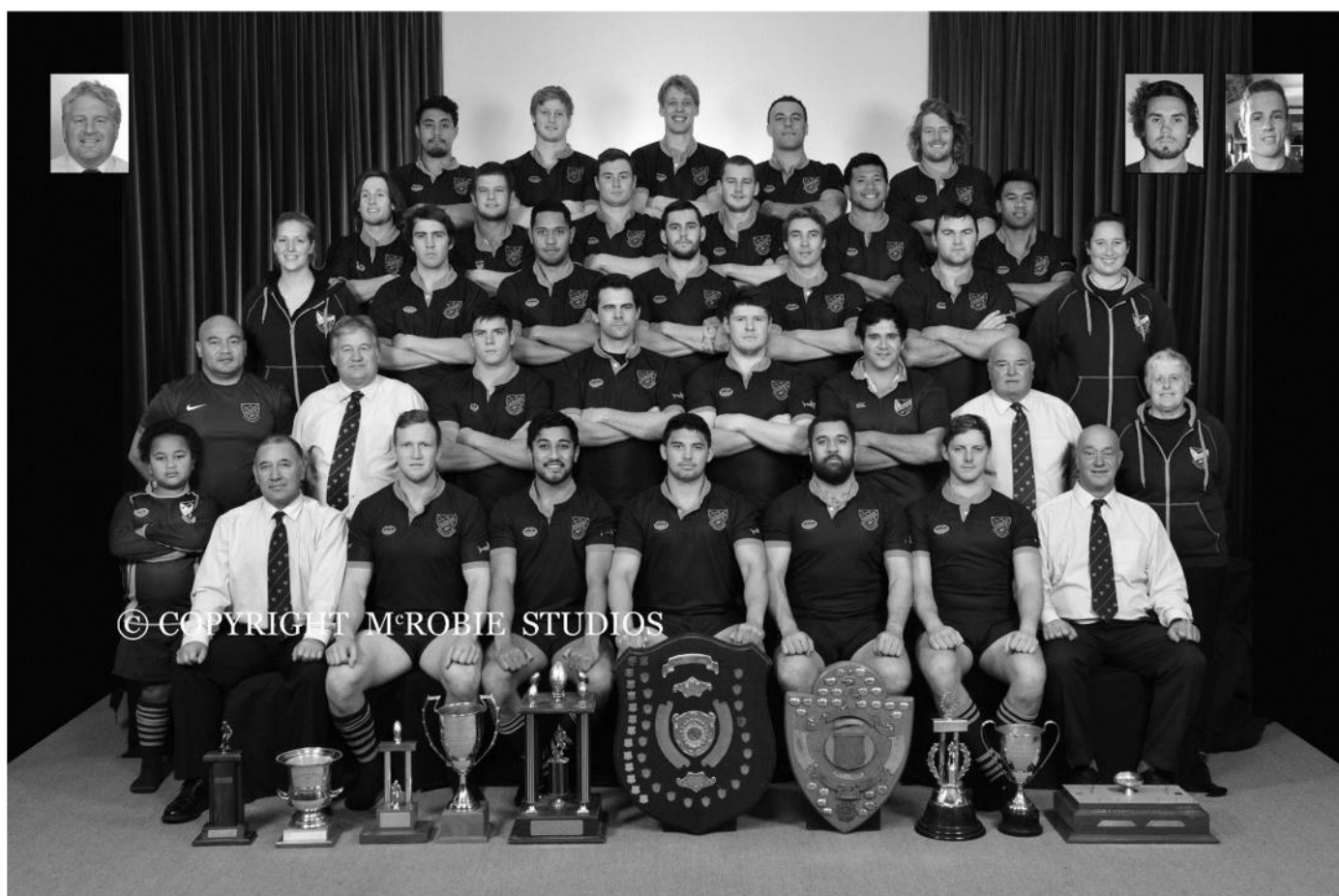
On retiring he turned to coaching & in his first year coached our first ever selected Colts side which finished runner up to university; actually, beating the students in the last game of the season by 5 to 3. He successfully coached our Senior side for several seasons; it was not long before his innovative ideas & success were noted by the Otago Union & he was appointed coach of Otago from 1973 to 1976 not only enjoying considerable success but introduced several young backs who went on to wear the silver fern.

Bill kept in close touch with the club over the years never missing a championship final & was a very proud man to witness the many successes of our Premiers over especially the last 25 years.

Possessing a wonderful tenor voice & a lovely sense of humour Bill gave much to the club; his lilting voice in song proving so very popular on many club occasions. Popular across the city around the club scene Bill always set the very highest of standards both on & off the field. We have all lost a loyal member & friend; the memories may fade over time but will never be lost in a club where he was much loved & respected. Only last year he so enjoyed the 1951 surviving members reunion at Kettle Park.

Club members were shocked to hear of the sudden passing of Mick (Mike) Wassell in October of this year. Mick had a close association with the Club over a long period of time in a number of different roles, and older members recall Mick as being a very skilled, fiercely competitive and an ‘80-minute man’ in his playing days. Mick was schooled at “Christies” and joined the rugby club in 1958. His position was flanker.

The Seniors were struggling in the lower reaches of the club competition at the time, and this may not have assisted the cause). After his playing days had ended, Mick coached in the Colts grades in the early 1970s, with a good share of successes achieved.

In later years, and over a considerable period of time, he was a committed sponsor of the Club through his vehicle repairs business, and also closely followed the exploits of the Club, especially in the years when his son, Danny, played through the grades and at Premier level.

Mick is survived by his wife Maureen, 3 daughters and 2 sons, and the Club’s sympathies go out to the Wassell families on his untimely passing.

2009 – 156 players and 10 teams. 5 players represented Otago. Sio Tomkinson represented the South Island.
2010 – The under 13's won their competition. Eight teams competed.
2011 – The under 12's and Under 10's won their competition. Under 11's won their grade.
2012 – The under 13 Mako's won their Competition. The under 11's won their grade.
2013 – 151 players. The under 12 Tigers won their competition. Max Gomez (Under 65Kg) and Connell Webb (Under 48Kg) made their respective Otago teams.
2014 – The under 13's won their competition.
2015 - Numbers down. Jay Davis (Under 48Kg) made the Otago team.
2016 – Number of players up on previous year.
2017 – Another year of increased numbers.
2018 – Numbers increased again. Under 9's unbeaten and won the junior team of the year.
2019 - Increased numbers meant 8 teams competing. A brilliant year for the under 10 Threshers. Winning the NZ Junior Rugby Festival for under 10's (unbeaten). This tournament held in Queenstown attracted teams from all over New Zealand and Australia. Probably even more importantly they picked up the trophy for the best Sportsmanship Team throughout all grades (over 40 Teams involved).
