

Aide Mead is a product of the Oldham Bears Academy and this utility back is a handy member of the roughyeds squad. He has played on the wing this season and has not let the side down.

Afi Leuila is the only member of the Bears Super League squad to join the ënew' Oldham team. He is of Tongan origin and Afi is a strong running three-quarter whom likes nothing better than to attack the opposition.

Brian Quinlan is a local born goal kicking centre or second row who missed most of last season through injury.

Mick Farrell is a 21 year old utility back who was outstanding for Rochdale Hornets during 1997 but had a disappointing 1998. This ex-Waterhead amateur has just broken into the first team and is playing centre for his hometown club.

Joe McNicholas is a young winger and one of the most exciting prospects in the new Northern Ford Premiership. Having turned down an offer from Bradford Bulls Joe was unfortunate to miss most of 1998 after breaking his leg in the early season. Rochdale born he is armed with pace and a great side step.

Paul Crook is a halfback who previously played with Dewsbury, Oldham Bears and Hull Sharks. He is a creative player who is happy to play at either stand-off or loose forward.

Craig Barker is a local halfback or hooker who was not always a first choice during 1998 and this has been the case so far this season. After some impressive performances in the alliance side he is beginning to get first team opportunities.

Leo Casey is now at the veteran stage and has returned to Oldham during the close season. He has represented Ireland at international level and this tough prop forward was delighted to be named as Captain for this season's campaign. His performances during 1999 have been outstanding and he has certainly led by example.

Jason Clegg is a former Bradford Bull prop forward and has opened this season in barnstorming form, with atypical rampaging try in the Law Cup against Rochdale Hornets. ECleggy is becoming a firm favourite with the Oldham spectators with his eye-catching performances.

Laurent Minut is a French fullback who signed from Villeneuve. Known as ëMins' to his team-mates he is a courageous tackler and good under a high ball.


Emmanuel Peralta came to Oldham with his team-mate Laurent. ëManu' is no stranger to England having previously played for the Cougars.

Lawkholme Len

Today's visitors, Oldham are in effect a new club, Oldham Bears having gone into liquidation in 1977. In essence though it's the same club that was founded in 1895-6 and was an original member of the Northern Union. They have won several cabinets full of trophies through the last century and many fine players International ranks. The last time they visited Keighley was in March 1990 when they defeated us 10-30 going on to gain promotion to the first division that season.

It was good to Keith Dixon playing at his familiar full-back position against Lancs Lynx. Signed in 1984 and now in his third spell at Keighley surely 'Dicko' must be one of the clubs most enduring players. In his Keighley career up to the start of this season he had appeared 238 times with 27 substitutions, scored 95 tries, 320 goals and 20 drop-goals. A total of 1,040 points. Let's hope he can make his century of touchdowns this year.

Today's delve in the Cougar Archives takes us back 75 years. In May 1924 Keighley entertained Bradford Northern in the traditional end of season Lazenby Cup match in front of 5,000 spectators. Foster at scrum-half turned in a fine

performance in what turned out to be a very one-sided game. In the first half there were tries for Keighley by Hodgson and Craven and a penalty goal by Davis. In the second period Holmes scored two tries and Kendall also crossed the chalk to make the final score 19 points to 5. The 1924 team was: Browning, Holmes, Kendall, Perkins, Craven, Foster, Hey, Thompson, Davis, Hodgson, Jones, Walton and Spavin.

15 years ago in May 1984 Keighley News summed up team's season with the headline, "What a disaster - the worse since the war in playing terms". Coach Lee Greenwood had just been sacked and Geoff Peggs had taken over. There were plans to sell Lawkholme and re-develop the site as a supermarket. The team finished off the season with a 14-38 defeat by Workington. Terry Brearley scored a try in the first half and then Mick Hawksworth was 'unstoppable' scoring a try in the second period. A triallist scored a try in injury time to complete the scoring. The 1984 side was: Rowett (Allard), Triallist, Mitchell, Cholmondley, Brearley, Robinson (Ellis), Sellers, Raistrick, Farrell, Procter, Fairhurst, Rowse and Hawksworth. The attendance was 465.



Roy Sabine had been putting in some outstanding performances in for amateurs Low Moor as well as playing for Yorkshire Amateurs and captaining the English amateur under 19 side. Not surprisingly he came to the attention of many professional clubs and in fact had signed for trials with Halifax. Keighley Chairman John Smallwood, tipped off by Sabine's neighbour Bill Shreeve, arranged a meeting with Roy and snapped him up right away from under the nose of Halifax. Sabine scored a try on his debut in September 1958 against a Castleford side featuring fellow debutante, Alan Hardisty. In the next game away at Halifax Roy scored a hat-trick of tries in the 22-9 victory over the Thrum Hallers underlining to Halifax what they had missed out on. During the next eight seasons, mostly at standoff but a few times at centre, Roy played in 179 matches scoring 46 tries.

His career for Keighley, however, was interrupted by National Service in the Army in which Roy played for the Duke Of Wellington's

regimental team who became Army champions two years running. After his return to Lawkholme and the 13-a-side code Roy became an integral part of the 1962-3 Division Two promotion winning side.

He made two appearances for Yorkshire in 1963, one of them against the Australian touring team in which Roy systained an injury that cost him his Great Britain call up against the Aussies. Further Injury ended Roy's playing career at Keighley in 1966 retiring on doctor's orders. Roy, however returned to the club in 1975 as coach with the colts but playing in a further eight games for the first team. Moving up to coach the first team he went on to take the club to the memorable Challenge Cup semifinal at Fartown in 1976 when Keighley lost to the eventual winners St. Helens. Roy finally left the club in October 1977.
