Big Dipper

It has certainly been something of a rollercoaster ride this last two or three weeks. After hitting top spot for the first time this season we slumped to successive defeats at Workington and Featherstone. Then after getting ourselves up for the visit of Dewsbury we hit a steep downward section at Barrow with our worst performance of the season.

Despite the criticism which came our way after the first two defeats. I was confident we could turn things back around for one simple reason. They were largely the consequence of mistakes, not a lack of effort, mistakes we had not previously been prone to on quite such a scale.

At Workington the mistakes with the ball meant we were unable to mount any sustained pressure on their line. At Featherstone the failure of Jon Wray to clear up a kick and the two knock ons in our 20 metre area by Whetu Taewa and Allan Dunham cost us 10 points at a time when we were already 9-2 down but not out. After that it was an almost impossible task against a side equally desperate to win.


Mistakes I am afraid are part of the human condition.

The bottom line is that players are not machines. The trick is trying to keep them to a minimum. Against Dewsbury we simplified the game plan and as a result completed 38 of our 40 sets with the ball, a staggering total. In other words the players had learned from their mistakes and put it right.

week's defeat Last however, was far more worrying. We were simply blown away, and seemed unable to compete with Barrow's power and pace. With an injury list including Aston, Booth, Everitt, Slater, Smith, and Crane, all experienced campaigners, I am concerned that we are beginning to rely too heavily on the youngsters who have served us so well this year, largely in supporting roles

Equally the lion's share of responsibility is increasingly landing on fewer and fewer shoulders, which is beginning to take its toll. Let's all hope that this week's section of the rollercoaster is a sharp upward arc.

Craig Barker. Local lad who was with the Bears before signing for the Roughyeds. A stand off half with a neat pair of hands, this product of the Waterhead amateur club is still waiting the opportuity to command a regular senior place.

Keith Brennan. A late entrant to the pro ranks. Keith played for Higginshaw and Shaw Rhinos before impressing as an amateur for Oldham towards the end of the 1999 season.

Mark Campbell. One of the 16 new boys brought to the club by Mike Ford during the first two months of the player coach's reign. Formerly with Leeds and Keighley. this 21 year old hardworking back row forward is studying at Leeds University for a degree in chemical engineering.

Leo Casey. A tough prop who played for the former Oldham club. Featherstone, Swinton and Rochdale before signing for the Roughyeds for the 1999 season. Captained the side and, at the age of 32, became a firm favourite of the crowd. Recently returned from a three match suspension after being sent off at Rochdale in the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

Jason Clegg. A product of Littleborough RL Club. this heavyweight prop turned pro for the Bradford Bulls and had a stint with Batley before signing for the Roughyeds shortly after the club was formed. Made a first team place his own property in 1999 and earned selection for the West of Pennines side against an East side coached by Mike Ford. In superb form this season and was voted the Oldham player of the month for February.

Peter Ferris. Another former Higginshaw player and another late recruit into the pro ranks. Toured Australia with BARLA under 19's and represented BARLA under 23's but left the game to play for Duckinfield Rugby Union. It was there that Mike Ford spotted the utility back and invited him to join the Roughyeds.

Kevin Fitzpatrick. A fullback who made his name with Saddleworth Rangers before signing for Oldham at the age of 20. Recently celebrated his 21st while studying for a degree in journalism and the media. Hopes to make the headlines as well as write them.

Mike Ford. A scrum-half who has been making the right sort of headlines all his sporting life. Played for Wigan at Wembley when only 19. Also starred for Leigh, Oldham, Castleford, Warrington, Wakefield and South Queensland Crushers. Toured Down Under with Great Britain in 1988. Coached Bramley to mid table respectability in 1999 before landing his dream job of coaching his home town club. Still a key player with an excellent kicking game.

Anthony Gibbons. One half of the twin combination which played for Leeds Rhinos and Bramley before joining Oldham at the start of the 2000 season. The 23 year old is playing consistently well at centre but also helped out at scrum half against Rochdale in the cup.

David Gibbons. The other twin. Became a household name at Headingley and played more than 20 senior games, including several in the first Super League season of 1996. Formerly captain of Bramley, David will be a key figure for the Roughyeds at stand-off half.

Danny Guest. This 22 year old. 18 stone prop was an up and coming youngster with the Bears. Also played for Keighley and Lancashire Lynx before returning to Oldham. Has been playing mainly as a substitute this season but has been a consistent performer, as shown when scoring with his first touch of the ball in the recent rout of Lancashire Lynx.

Chris Naylor. A young prop formerly with the Academy sides at St Helens and Salford. Big and strong, Chris played for England in the Last Students World Cup, becoming the only English player to be named afterwards in an imaginary World X111. Played for the first team until picking a serious shoulder injury which he is just returning from.

Joey Hayes. A young winger who has crammed a lot into his relatively short spell as a pro. Made his name with St Helens but also played 11 Super League games for Salford City Reds last season. Turning into a real crowd favourite at Oldham and certainly must be one of the most exciting wingers in the NFP.

John Hough. Has had two cracking seasons in 1998 and 1999, when he took the club's player of the year award. Played more than 30 senior games for Warrington before returning "home" to Oldham. Been in tremendous form again this season which was encapsulated in a superb match winning try in the defeat of Widnes Vikings.

Kevin Mannion. 22 year old Kevin is a ball playing loose forward. who made his senior debut with Rochdale Hornets when only 16. Played for England and GB students, for whom he has toured Australia and played in France. Has put in some good performances this season but was unlucky in picking up a serious knee injury in the victory over Widnes Vikings.

Joe McNicholas. Broke his leg for the Roughyeds in the new club's first league game at Workington and missed the rest of the 1998 season apart from a brief spell as sub in the final match. A pacy winger. Joe bounced back to hold down a regular spot on the right flank in 1999.

Shayne McMenemy. Recent recruit to the club replacing the injured Tom O'Reilly. Began the season at Rochdale Hornets were he caught the eye of Mike Ford. Hard working second row forward this Australian made his debut 48 hours after arriving from Sydney.

Andy Proctor. Named captain of the club by Ford for the 2000 season. This former Saddleworth. Wakefield Trinity. Oldham and Bramley prop forward, now aged 30, won a Man of Steel award while with Trinity, as the club was then called, and has built a reputation as a player's player, who performs well above his weight.

Pat Rich. Another of the younger signings, 21 year old Pat is a native of the North-East. Played regular senior rugby for Keighley in 1999, while studying for a law degree at Leeds.

Can play centre or back row and recently achieved the new clubs points in a game record when scoring 18 in the win over Widnes.

Wes Rogers. A strong second row forward. Wes has joined his hometown club after stints with Widnes and Swinton. A hot property as a teenager, he was signed for Widnes by Doug Laughton.

Mark Sibson. An exciting full back and goal kicker, this 23 year old played for Loughborough University for four years before turning out for Castleford's Alliance side.

'Star to Watch'



Had a brief stint in France in the early part of 1999 before returning to the club. finishing the season and re-signing for 2000. A back row forward who tackles hard, runs strongly and uses the ball intelligently wide out.

Warren Barrow. Signed recently from St Helens Alliance side making his debut at Leigh on the wing. A regular try scorer whilst at Saints he can play on the wing or at centre.

Phil Farrell. Recently signed for the club after a successful loan period. Hard working back row forward who has the right pedigree, as he is the younger brother of Wigan and GB Captain Andy Farrell.

Neil Roden. Signed for the club from Wigan at the same time as Phil Farrell. Young half back who impressed in the Alliance side before making his senior bow against Hunslet at Boundary Park. Scored his first try for the club in the away win at Batley and looks like one to watch for the future.

Chris Holland. Aged 21. Chris has played for England and Great Britain students and took the Man-of-the-Match award in England's defeat by New Zealand at Hull in the last World Cup. Equally at home at centre or in the back row.





Ian Cutler presents lapel badges to the Managers of the South African teams on behalf of the Hull Kingston Rovers Supporters Group.


Badges were generously provided to both sets of players.

Premiership With MARTYN SADLER with MARTYN SADLER

MARTYN SADLER, editor of League Express, reports on the deserved winners of this month's Rugby League World NFP awards.

DONCASTER Dragons' centre or stand off Craig Weston has been selected as the Rugby League World Northern Ford Premiership Player of the Month for April, after scoring six tries and 84

points during the five games in the month. Craig, 26, formerly with Huddersfield Giants, deserves our hearty congratulations for his performances in April, which have helped the Dragons sustain a very strong challenge in the NFP table.

Indeed April was a good month for the Dragons, until the very last day of it at least. Before then they reached the top of the Premiership table, becoming the fourth club in the month to head the competition, before, the day after Murrayfield, losing by a single point at Widnes, and falling back into fourth place. Craig is now the NFP's top try scorer, having scored 20 tries in all competitions this season. He is just one short of Mark Roache's ten year old club record, with eleven league games left to play.

When Craig joined the Dragons during the close season his arrival was symptomatic of the drift to the Northern Ford Premiership from Super League after the mergers that took place in the elite competition.

His form throughout the season has been exceptional, and he is one of those players who refused to take his bat home because he was dropping to a lower division. Instead he has dedicated himself to the Dragons' cause, and has been a great asset for coach St. John Ellis. And he's keen to get back into Super League, although this time with the Dragons.

"There are plans for a new stadium to be built in the town, and if the facilities are there then there is no reason why Doncaster can't become a Super League club," said Craig in Rugby League World. "I'm not going to say that we will go out and win the NFP, because it's a great

competition with a lot of good sides in it.

"But we can win it, and I'm sure we'll be there or thereabouts at the end of the season."

Despite the Dragons' success, however, there could be only one club of the month in

April.
Keighley Cougars were unbeaten throughout the month, extending their winning run to eight matches. They have shot up to third place in the table, behind Leigh and Dewsbury, and they are looking stronger every week.

looking stronger every week.
And off the field the Cougars began their
Centenary Year celebrations before the
recent game against Barrow. Soon they
will be launching a limited edition
Centenary Shirt and a commemorative
book.

"This award is a credit to what everyone involved with the club has achieved this season," said Cougars' Managing Director Peter Rowe in Rugby League World.

"The players and coaches here have put in a magnificent effort all season, particularly in the last month."

Rowe believes that the Keighley public has reacted very positively to the club's Centenary celebrations, although he and his staff want to attract more supporters through the turnstiles at Cougar Park. They want to get back to the days when the Cougars could get 5,000 for big games, and they are hoping for a big turnout today against Workington Town, who themselves have enjoyed a great revival in April, that gives them an outside chance of reaching the top eight.

There's no doubt the Cougars, like a number of enterprising NFP clubs, deserve support like that. And with the way they are developing, I have no doubt that they will soon be getting it.

And I'm certain that this season's NFP top-eight play-off games will generate crowds the like of which will be unprecedented in the NFP competition.








Looking Back

As we are entertaining our friends from Oldham today it might be interesting to look back on those three momentous Challenge Cup semi finals played between our two clubs in season 1963/4 the season Rovers first got to Wembley.

The cup competition that year was punctuated by many replays with the Robins playing a total of eight matches including the final itself.

It all started with a first round fixture against Rochdale Hornets at Craven Park, which ended in a 12 all draw. Cyril Kellett landing a late penalty to earn Rovers a replay at the Athletics Ground the then home of the Hornets. The replay went according to plan with a comfortable 22 points to 7 win for the Red & Whites, with Alan Burwell playing a prominent role.

Round 2 and an away trip to York, which after a close first half the Robins came out winners by 23 points to 7. The match played at Clarence Street attracted a crowd of over 12,000 including an estimated 5000 from Humberside. This brought Barrow to Hull in the 3rd round and resulted in a 38 points to 4 victory in appalling conditions, this match has since been known as "Taylor's match" when the second row forward, then playing prop scored a superb hat trick of tries. The match due to the terrible conditions was brought to a halt early by the referee Mr. Thomas.

The Robins had now reached the semifinals for the third consecutive year and were given the draw most fans wanted when they were paired against Oldham. The league was at that time split into two divisions with Rovers mid-table in the first section and Oldham leading the second. It was decreed that the fixture should be played at Headingley, and after a very tight match with a minimum of open rugby Hull Kingston were leading 5 points to 3 with seconds to go. At this stage Oldham's experienced hooker Len McIntyre stepped up and dropped an equalising goal from about 25 yards out, the first time he had dropped a goal in a long and illustrious career. So the Robins and their supporters were denied at the death of a first appearance at the Empire stadium. Rovers points came from a try by Blackmore and a goal from Kellett. Oldham had a try from Smethurst, together with McIntyre's drop goal then worth two points.

The teams that day were Hull Kingston Rovers: Kellett, Paul, Major, Elliott, Blackmore, Burwell (A), Bunting: Tyson, Flanagan, Taylor, Palmer, Clark and Poole. Oldham: Dyson, Sims, Donovan, Smethurst, Simms, Nestor, Pycrof, Bott, McIntyre, Wilson, Major, Whitehead and Parker, The referee was Mr. Davies and 28,556 fans watched the match.

This meant that a replay had to be arranged and this time it was to be played the following Wednesday night at Station Road Swinton, with a 6.45pm kick off. Another enthralling match followed, containing possibly the best football played in the three matches, and again Oldham came from behind to snatch a 14 all draw, after the Robins had seemingly got in a winning position, leading by 14 points to 7 with 10 minutes to go. Frank Dyson kicking a penalty with the last action of the match after the Robins scrum half Arthur Bunting had been penalised at the final scrum. This meant extra time and Oldham took the lead with a try from their second row man Geoff Robinson, in the first period of extra time. However shortly after this the referee then called a halt to proceedings as it was getting very dark, and there were no floodlights at the ground in those days.

Rovers' tries were scored by Burwell (2) Major and Blackmore with Kellett landing a goal. Oldham's points came from tries by Geoff Sims and Trevor Simms with Dyson kicking 4 goals. The Robins had made one enforced change with John Taylor pronounced unfit they brought in John Bath at prop. Oldham too made one change with Dave Parker also unfit they switched Harry Major to loose forward and brought Geoff Robinson into their second-row. This match was watched by a total of 27.209 people.

With this match being abandoned it now went to a third meeting, this to be played at Fartown the old ground of Huddersfield, at the slightly earlier kick off time of 6.30pm, this to take place the following Monday. Again another tremendous match ensued but this time there was to be no mistake and the Robins went through to their first Challenge Cup final at Wembley. The game ended 12 points to 2 with tries by Arthur Bunting and Mike Blackmore and 3 Cyril Kellett goals, against a solitary penalty by Dyson for Oldham.

The Robins had made one change for this third match Jim Drake who had a superb game replacing John Bath in the front row. Oldham were unchanged. The referee however was changed with Mr. Coates replacing Mr. Davies who had taken charge of the first two fixtures. This second replay attracted the biggest crowd with 32,757 cramming into Fartown. on a very wet night. This meant that a total of 89,368 fans had watched these three semi finals.

It is interesting to note that Widnes our opponents at Wembley played a staggering ten matches including the final on their cup run that year.

In between the two replays, on the Friday, the Robins had fulfilled a league fixture against Swinton at Craven Park losing by 14 points to 5 but putting up a tremendous performance against the champions elect. Colin Hutton coach at the time elected to play a second string team for the match in view of the pending cup semi-final replay the following Monday. The line up that played that night makes interesting reading it was: McNamara, Harris Moore, Raper, Multins, Cooper, Gillard, Fox (F), Holdstock, Drake, Murphy, Mennell and Wallis.

The final against Widnes was unfortunately lost by 13 points to 5 the main highlight from a Rovers point of view, being a super try from Alan Burwell.


