### Speech Day and the Last Day of Term

Hosts PGS won the toss and put us in to bat. At the top of the innings our pairs struggled to score runs and were out several times (minus five runs each time). The partnership between **Cameron Ward** and **Oscar Edwards**, however, settled the ship and they scored 25 from their four overs. **Alex Padbury** and **Sam Fussey** came in as our last pair and scored a brilliant 30 runs between them without any dismissals. Our total was 275-9 from 20 overs. (In pairs cricket teams start on 200).

When it was our turn to bowl we again started nervously. A catch was dropped and two easy run outs messed up in the early overs and it felt it wasn't going to be our day. The bowlers, however, all started to bowl good line and length and we took regular wickets (minus 5 runs each time) and started to catch and field brilliantly. **Arthur Bole** had the best bowling figures and was very tidy but every other bowler did their job admirably too. A great team effort. We restricted PGS to just 258 and took 10 wickets from their 20 overs so we won by 27 runs.

Very pleasing that the U11 team saved easily their best performance for the biggest and most important game. They now move on to represent Hampshire in the next round of

the Nationals. Well done to the whole team.

# Prep Sports Day - Monday 26th June - 10.15am

Yateley Manor Prep Sports Day will be similar in format to last year.

Children in Years 3 to 8 do not need to be in school until 9.50am when they must register with their tutors in the Fyson Blum Hall. Please note that there will be no breakfast service on this day. Children should arrive in their PE kit ready for the day and those in Years 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8 all need to bring their swimming kit too. School opens for supervision from 8.00am with morning coaches running at the usual time if you prefer your children to come in as normal. Please do not bring children to school between 8.50am and 9.30am as the car park will be congested due to the coaches taking Pre-Prep pupils on their trips. Events get under way at 10.15am. Please note that there are no after school activities or late supervision on this day for Prep, Pre-Prep or Nursery and children of all ages should be collected by 4.30pm. As most Prep parents attend Sports Day and take their children home, coaches are not normally required.

Coaches will leave at 4.30pm and there will be no shuttle service or coaches at 5.30pm. Please let your child's form tutor know by Monday 19th June if they need coach transport home.

There are six different main events and each year group can participate in at least 4 during the day. The other events will have been completed before Sports Day (see page 4 for details).

- 1. 300m/600m: Optional for any child in Years 3, 4 and 5 who would like to run 300m or Years 6, 7 or 8 who would like to run 600m.
- 2. <u>Inter House Tug Of War.</u> Everyone will take part in the house competition.
- 3. <u>Individual 75m Sprint Races</u>. All pupils will be seeded to ensure that pupils of similar speeds compete against each other.
- 4. <u>Inter House Swimming Gala</u>. An exciting and enjoyable event in which all the children take part.
- 5. Inter House Shuttle Relays. All girls and boys in the year group will be mixed at random in straight house shuttle relays.
- 6. <u>Athletics</u>: high jump, long jump, throwing or hurdles.

The final event of the day will be inter house running relays around the track. Each year group will have one girl and one boy relay event. Each event will consist of four children from each house competing against the other houses. This will bring the day to an exciting climax.

At the end of the day all the individual and team results will be added together and a House Athletics Cup presented to the winning House. There will also be a House Tug of War Shield, a House Swimming Shield and a Shuttle Relay Cup.

This is a lovely informal day (weather permitting) and most people picnic with their children on the lawn, although we are happy to provide a picnic lunch for those children whose parents are unable to attend. **Please let your child's form tutor know if this is necessary.** If the day is very warm, children should wear suitable hats and protective sun cream.

We want this to be a family day and your children will spend a lot of it with you when not in events. Please be aware that when they are with you they are your responsibility and when they are with us they are ours. Please listen for announcements and encourage your child to be at his or her next event five minutes before it is due to start.
