In both training and matches, I will...

- Always play to the best of my ability
- Play fairly – I won't cheat, complain or waste time
- Respect my team mates, the other team, the referee or my coach / manager
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of every game
- Listen and respond to what my coach / team manager tells me
- Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club

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# CODE OF CONDUCT – PARENTS & SPECTATORS



While attending both training and matches, I will...

- Remember that the children play for fun
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Remain outside the field of play and behind the respect barrier; be it a physical barrier or cones
- Let the coach do their job and do not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Avoid criticising players for making a mistake – mistakes are part of learning
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour; particularly verbal or physical abuse directed at match officials
- Remember that match officials are just as entitled to enjoy the match as players and spectators

I understand that failure to comply with the above could result in...

- A verbal warning issued from the club or a league official
- A meeting being arranged with the club, league or county FA welfare officer
- A meeting being arranged with the club committee
- An obligation to undertake an FA education course
- Being asked to leave the match venue by a club official
- A request from the club not to attend future games
- A suspension or removal of club membership
- An order to leave the club along with any dependents
- Police being called immediately for your removal to deal with inappropriate or threatening behaviour

In addition to the above, all incidents will be reported to the relevant league and the West Riding County FA.

I am fully aware that while the FA encourages the taking of appropriate images of children in football, I must first ensure that the club has parental consent from all player's participating in that game, on both teams, if I plan to share these with anyone or publish on a public domain ie) social media. While the club accepts photos are often taken as memories of your child in particular, failure to comply with this will be viewed as serious and you will be asked to take the images or videos down and attend a meeting with the club committee.

I understand that managers and coaches are unpaid volunteers who give up their free time to work with the team. As such, I will give them my support and will never complain about decisions either face-to-face or behind their back ie) behind the respect barrier or on social media. I will also contact the club if I see or hear of this taking place. I will take any issues to the head of boys / girls if issues persist.
