PORTISHEAD TOWN - CLUB HISTORY

Portishead were inaugurated early in the 1900's by Molly Jukes, the daughter of a local Rector, who had moved to Portishead in 1903. Always keen on sport, Molly formed a cricket side in 1910 and two years later a football team she called St. Peter's Portishead. Initially there were two teams, a First XI and Reserves and a year later a junior side was formed. In 1915 Molly married the Rev H.S. Briggs but her interest and devotion to 'the lads' didn't waver and despite the intervention of two World Wars she battled on as Chairman, Treasurer and Manager as well as playing in goal as often as she could.

In the early 1950's Molly stepped down and Portishead AFC, as the club were now known (following a name change in 1948), was left in the hands of Len Pickering and Eddie Clapson.

Following successive Divisional Championship in 1973 and 1974 the club were accepted into the Somerset Senior League in 1975 and a year later moved from their original pitch where the present Health Centre now stands to Bristol Road. As the result of the extra pitches available on the new ground, two new teams were formed incorporating the former Redcliffe Bay team. In 1995 a Colts side was formed and entered in the Weston & District League along with the third and fourth teams.

In 1991/92 Portishead reached the Somerset & Avon (South) FA Senior Cup Final where they lost 4-2 against Odd Down. In 1997, the first team again reached the final, this time beating Bridgwater Reserves 2-0 at Paulton. In 1993/94 under the leadership of Terry Hale the team won the Somerset Senior League Premier Division Championship, they retained this title in 1994-95, made it a treble in 1995/96 and notched up their fourth Championship win at the end of the 1997/98 season. In May 2000, Shaun Hill's side beat Radstock Town to win the Somerset Senior Cup for the second time.

Following major ground improvements and finishing the 2004/05 season as runners up in the Somerset County League the club applied for election to the Western League, were duly promoted for the start of the 2005/06 campaign.

Promotion to the Western League Premier Division would have been achieved following a runner's up position in 2006/7 had it not been for the ground failing to meet the required standards.

LONGWELL GREEN SPORTS - CLUB HISTORY

Founded in June 1966 following the great upsurge of interest in football following England's World Cup success of Bobby Moore and the England Team

Longwell Green Sports were originally formed from the workforce of the areas main employer, Longwell Green Coachworks, the team was run for many years by Harold Harding, a well know character in and around Longwell Green.

The first pitch was laid out on the same site of today's pitch and was, in 1966, open farmland. In its early years Longwell Green played in what was the Saturday Regional League and by the early seventies progressed to the District League.

By 1980 our current General Manager, John Gibbs joined the club along with several other players from Kingswood including our Reserves Team Manager, Jeff Fishlock. In 1982 the club became District League Division 4 Champions losing only 3 games all season.

In 1983 the club gained promotion to District Division 2, the following season the Reserve Team was formed. The first team won promotion 5 times in 9 seasons including Division 1 runners up and Senior District and Bristol Combination Premier Division 1 runners up in successive seasons, reaching Bristol Premier Division in 1997. The following season the club finished third, 2 points behind Bitton & Frampton and lifted the Premier Cup beating Highridge 3-2.

Our Reserves, by 1993, had reached District Division 2 following several promotions with many goals being scored by our current 3rd Team Manager, Andy Britton.

In 2002 the first team reached the GFA Senior Amateur Cup final played at County HQ, loosing on penalties to Nicholas Wanders.

At the end of season 2003/2004 the 1st Team gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League and following runners up to Highridge last season, were along with Portishead and Bradford-on-Avon promoted to the Western "Toolstation" League, we believe we may well have created a little county history by being the only club on record that have achieved promotion after only one season in the County League.

The club have always had an ambition to play at the highest level and this was rewarded when Matt Hale rejoined the club he first played for as a 15 year old before becoming a professional footballer with Bristol City, he has also played for Yeovil and Weymouth.

Matt returned in late 2003, to assist John Gibbs as 1st team player/coach, the team finished runners up to Sea Mills and were promoted to the County League. During the summer Matt Hale was appointed Club Coach and 1st Team Manager. Now

The club has over years produced many young players who have gone on to play for Conference and Western League clubs or have remained with the club, a number are now in our First Team squad.

In addition to the 1st Team we run a Reserves, 3rd & 4th Team, also an U18's who will play in the Gloucestershire County Youth League.

At the beginning of 2003 the club changed its name from Longwell Green Sports FC to Longwell Green Sports, joining forces with the Longwell Green Juniors and forming a Senior & Junior Netball team to form a broader community sports club.

Longwell Green has always had a commitment to developing young players and benefit from a tremendous spirit amongst its teams and club members.

At Present we are in Toolstation Division 1 . Our Present Manager is Joe White. He has assembled a good squad of players and we are hoping to have a very good season.

Sin Bins

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - will become mandatory for matters of dissent across all of grassroots football from the 2019/20 season.



HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go in to the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words or gestures questioning or undermining the ref's decisions



EXAMPLES OF DISSENT

- Shouting at the ref
- Questioning ref's ability
- Slamming the ball in to the ground
- Sarcastically clapping a decision

DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:

- 1st half:** Continues into 2nd half
2nd half: Continues into extra time
Extra time: Player can participate in penalties

THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Ref issues a yellow card and directs the player to the touchline



Player can't be substituted until period expires and not if all subs have been made



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a yellow or red card offence they can't take any further part in the game and can't be substituted



If the player commits a 2nd dissent caution and has already been booked, they will take no further part in the game and can't be substituted



If the player commits a 2nd dissent caution and no other offences, they will receive a 2nd sin bin. After which they can't take any further part in the game but can be substituted



If the player commits a yellow card offence on the field of play in addition to a period in the sin bin, they will continue to play



Ref decides when player returns to play
