

Welcome to the new season and a third new league in 3 seasons for London Cornish as we follow London 1 South and Regional 2 Thames with Regional 2 South-East, which sees us reconnecting with a few old

friends and lining up a couple of new league opponents too in Reeds Weybridge and Sidcup. Our 6th placed finish in Regional 2 Thames last season was the highest we have ever finished in the league structure and was followed by the 2s landing the Middlesex Merit Table Cup with a fantastic win against London Welsh Druids, a fine reward for everyone at the club.

In terms of ins and outs, the coaching team remains much the same as it did last season and, though we have lost a few players with a few moving away/abroad and Tony Pellow taking the step up to Esher, we have also recruited well with more to follow, a few lads blooded last week and a few more to follow today. We continue to be dogged in the early season by weddings, world cup holidays and iron man entries so the shape of the team may take a few weeks to settle down but as the narrow defeat last week demonstrated, we retain our competitiveness and our ability to land bonus points at will, much as we did last season where only Champions H&F landed more than LCRFC.

Reflecting on our 36-31 defeat at Beckenham last week, a key period either side of half time cost us when we conceded a penalty try, a charge down try and lost 2 players to the bin at the same time. We continued with our tremendous ability to finish games at a pace and you suspect that we could have turned it round with another possession but it wasn't to be – the hosts have clearly recruited well since last season (notably from Westcombe Park RFC) and might surprise a few sides on dry ground in the weeks ahead. Today we welcome Old Reigatian back to the REMPF, them having been a regular opponent of ours until around 6 or 7 seasons ago. They began the season in tremendous fashion thumping Sidcup and will no doubt be ambitious to follow up in similar fashion today, so we will need to play with a little more control than we did last week if we are to carry the day. Welcome to OR's and their supporters and I hope you enjoy the pre and post match.

The sharper eyed amongst you will note that I am not pitch side today and this is one of the rare occasions in my tenure here that I am indeed missing, but not without good reason. I will be down at Camborne Rec this afternoon watching Camborne v Redruth as the pair go head to head in National 2 West league action for the first time in the same league since 1991, more than a decade before I took on the DoR role at Cornish. They are suspecting such a large crowd I have had to secure tickets in advance, though it helps that our Club Secretary here at LCRFC is a steward on match days at Camborne, though he did slightly begrudge having to pick up tickets for a chopper! I have my spies relaying scores to me however so twitter will be updated as will the final score on GMS.

You will no doubt have noticed that our programmes are no longer printed – this is simply a cost/waste issue as we felt that folks tend to discard the hard copies once they have read them and we could save a significant amount by using the digital versions instead. Perhaps one day when our finances allow, we can return to the printed versions and your feedback is always welcome, but for now we go digital.

The forecast is for today to be another burning hot afternoon so please do slap on the factor 50, wear a hat if not playing and rehydrate whenever you get the chance!

Club History

London Cornish celebrated its 60th Anniversary last season, having been formed as Cornish Exiles in 1962 by a group of like minded men from God's Country, who met up in Fleet Street's Cock Tavern.

The club changed its name to London Cornish shortly thereafter and played occasional fixtures in a variety of locations until moving to the current ground, the Richardson Evans Memorial Playing Fields in the late 1960's. These grounds have been rented to us every season since then by the Wimbledon & Putney Common Conservators. A Conservators rule forbids any matches kicking off later than 1415 on a Saturday. The club moved its training base to Rosslyn Park RFC's all weather surface in August 2016.

The advent of the League system saw London Cornish begin life in the Middlesex divisions, and there we stayed until 1997/98 when we transferred to Surrey. We steadily rose through the leagues in the noughties, and in our 54th season in 2016/17, after a decade spent at Level 7, produced a stellar unbeaten season to win London 2 South-West 4 seasons at the Level 6 London 1 South have seen us consolidate our promotion. We remain at Level 6 for the 2022/23 season, but with the RFU's league reorganisation, we will find ourselves playing in Regional 2 Thames. Playing at Level 6 makes us the joint 5th highest ranked Cornish club behind the Pirates, Redruth, Camborne and Launceston. The club runs 3 teams most weekends during the season and have entered a Vet's team into the Middlesex Vet's league for the first time this season

Our Director of Rugby, Redruth born Dickon Moon, begins his 21st season at the helm in 2023/24; he is very proud to have been part of the successful Bill Beaumont Cup Senior Cornwall County coaching set up in recent seasons. He is an Honorary Life Member of LCRFC. We are an open club and our players are drawn from across the County and around the globe, but we remain true to our Celtic roots and are proud that plenty of Cornishmen play in all of our sides at the club. Our 3 sides also boast players from Britain and Ireland, Australia, New Zealand and elsewhere around the globe.

The club crest is half the One-and-All Cornwall logo and half the red cross and sword on a white background of London and we proudly wear the black and gold colours of the Cornwall County XV. Permission for this was kindly granted by the patron of the Cornwall RFU, who is the late H.R.H. Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

Most seasons since 1983 we have travelled to Cornwall to play for the Arthur Hunt Memorial Cup. While this used to be against the Cornwall Junior Cup Winners, with our steady progression through the leagues, from season 2010/11 the winners of the Cornwall Senior Cup hosted LCRFC. The trophy was given to the club by the widow of the late Arthur Hunt, who fulfilled most of the committee roles at the club during his time. Plans are afoot to relaunch the competition in the near future, with the help of our vibrant and active LCRFC Cornwall Supporters Group.

Entry to all our home matches remains free, and at league matches we also provide free programmes so supporters (and sponsors!) are hugely encouraged! From 2016/17, LCRFC hosted our opponents at Roehampton CC on Putney Common, a venue we can use exclusively each Saturday during the season.



Directions from the ground - Turn left out of the carpark exit and head into the right hand lane of the A3. Loop around the roundabout to head back up past the ground on the other side of the road. Drive up the hill and stay in the middle lanes ignoring the first major turning toward Roehampton. Once beyond the lights edge into the left hand lane and turn off onto Tibbet's Corner Roundabout. Take the first exit toward Putney and then the first left onto Putney Heath. At the mini roundabout take left exit onto Wildcroft Road and drive 500 yards up the road to the junction with Telegraph Road. Drive past The Telegraph Inn on your right hand side through the track to the Roehampton Cricket Club on your left, where there is plenty of free parking.
