Who are we?

We are a fully inclusive club and welcome players of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds to play both social and competitive cricket. We offer a wide range of cricket on Saturdays, Sundays, and midweek.

Originally the club existed purely for Bank of England staff and pensioners, but over time this grew to include family members and ex staff. Small numbers of non-Bank affiliated individuals were eventually permitted, but it was not until 2020 that we became a fully open club. We continue to recognise our Bank heritage and affiliation by aiming to be the cricket club of choice for staff in the London area, whilst also being welcome to all in the local community.

Our junior section was founded in 1993 thanks to the hard work of Barry Brown, and what began with just a small number of young cricketers has since expanded to a thriving membership. Many of our young cricketers have gone on to represent the club at all levels, and we aim to continue developing our own talent for the future.

Where are we based?

We can be found in South-West London, making us accessible for both those within London and north-east Surrey.

Our home from 1908 was the Bank of England Sports Centre in Roehampton. However, in 2019 the Bank took the decision to lease out the site and the future of cricket there remains uncertain. Our new home ground is Oberon Playing Fields in Raynes Park.

Club History

There are historical records of a Bank of England Cricket Club (BOECC) dating back to 1867, but fixtures were infrequent and the club loosely formalised. The modern founding of the club occurred in 1908 with the formation of the Bank of England Sports Club in Roehampton, South-West London.

The club played friendly cricket from 1908 through to 1970, with the superb facilities attracting fine opposition from both near and far. Four Saturday teams and multiple Sunday sides were fielded, with club records being set that still stand to this day; B.A Smith's 145 wickets in 1942, Peter Feldwick's 10-46 in 1946, Ralph Smith's 193 not out in 1947, plus John Hopwood's 2055 runs in 1948.

Our league adventures began in 1971 with the formation of the Surrey Cricketers League (SCL). We did not win any silverware but were fundamental to the continued organisation of the league, with our own Barry Hoffmann eventually becoming its Chairman. In 1987 the SCL merged with the Surrey Championship (originally formed in 1968), which is where we have played ever since.

Playing availability was excellent throughout this period, and for several years the club were able to field five Saturday teams. This helped the 1st XI to our first promotion from Division 2 in 1989, as we took a seat at the top table of Surrey cricket for the first time. The feat was repeated in 1993, this time unbeaten, eventually leading to our highest ever finish of 4th in Division 1 in 1999. At the time this made us the fourth best team in all of Surrey – not bad for a bunch of bankers! It also earned qualification for the first ever season of the newly formed Premier League in 2000.

This proved to be a short-lived experience as relegation swiftly followed, but in 2001 we bounced back for another crack at the Premier League in 2002. Immediate relegation again followed, and this remains our most recent season in the top division. A period of rebuilding followed as we yo-yoed between the divisions, mostly downwards, and by 2009 were in Division 3. The success of the junior section (formed in 1993) stabilised the club hereafter, and in 2015 we took a step back in the right direction with promotion into Division 2, where we have remained since.

At the end of the 2019 season our ground was leased out, so since 2020 our new home ground has been Oberon Playing Fields in Raynes Park. This helped to bring the whole club closer together, which included the 1st XI's run to the T20 Cup quarter finals in 2021.

Curiously, despite five promotion campaigns the club is yet to win a 1st XI league title. Fortunately, the same cannot be said for our other sides, with the 2nd XI winning Division 1 in 2002 (plus two other promotion seasons), and the 3rd XI also winning their respective Division 2 in 1990. The Midweek XI has found success by winning the London Banks Cup in 1990 and 1994, whilst in recent years the Public Services T20 Tournament has been claimed on six different occasions, most recently in 2019.

As a club we are not all about winning, with a fine tradition of socialising on numerous club tours, including major trips abroad to Barbados (1982), Australia (1988), New Zealand (1993) and South Africa (2003). An annual tour to Sussex ran for almost 60 years between 1921-1979, and to this day we still arrange annual trips to Kent (since 1923) and Buckinghamshire (since 1986).

Welcome to our 2022 members' handbook, which brings together all the essential information about the club for our members ahead of the season.

We very much appreciate the contribution of our growing band of sponsors, without which our new life as a fully open cricket club would be hard to maintain.

For the first time in our history, we will have a shirt sponsor as **PRESTIGE CARS AND COURIERS** will be the principal partners of the club. I encourage all members to buy the playing shirt here to support this partnership. Prestige will also be providing food and drink on President's Day on 7th August and have challenged us to a T20 match on 16th August.

We also welcome on board <u>WOODFORD SOLICITORS</u>, whose logo will feature on the sleeve of our playing shirts. Our returning sponsors include <u>FAB</u>, who were brave enough to be the first on board and provided many prizes throughout 2021, plus <u>WIMBLEDON COMMON GOLF CLUB</u>, who will host our annual golf day on Bank Holiday Monday 2nd May.

Their support is invaluable, and we would also like to also thank **BUFFALO**, who provide kit for the end of season raffle; **SHEEN SPORTS**, who have had a relationship with our colts for many years, where our members can enjoy a discount; **SW19 DESIGN & PRINT**, whose work includes the banners of other sponsors at Oberon; and **TIFLEX**, who provide cricket balls for some of our friendly games. Please do support these companies and make their representatives welcome at our events.

2021 was a year of transition as we enjoyed a full season of cricket after covid – please see the 2021 annual cricket report here for full recap. 2022 is shaping up nicely to be even bigger and better, so please do get friends and family involved.

The All-England Lawn Tennis Club (AELTC) has decided that there will be no cricket at our former ground at Roehampton. We are making representations to official bodies about this, but we must plan on the assumption that a return may not be

possible. We have retained the flexibility to do so if the opportunity arises but are pressing on with plans to further improve our alternative locations.

We continue to work with Hall School to upgrade the facilities at Oberon and during the winter a shed has been built to accommodate the heavy roller, which also provides some additional storage. A defibrillator has been purchased for the site (but fingers crossed we never need to use it), whilst we have also invested in a new boundary rope to provide more of that traditional cricketing feel. Perhaps most importantly, we have also ordered a mobile batting cage to be used in conjunction with a flicx roll up wicket, giving us an on-site net option for players to warm up in. We continue to investigate options around building a proper artificial net facility, but this is a long-term project that will require significant funding.

We have managed to secure a new location for 3rd and 4th XI cricket, hosted by Wimbledon Rugby Club at Beverley Meads Recreation Ground. There is a small pavilion by the pitch, plus a bar. Crucially, the ground is a short walk to Oberon, so the club can more easily socialise together on Saturdays as games conclude. At both grounds, we must remember the importance of being good tenants and good neighbours, as well as the Bank of England's reputation.

Training for both seniors and juniors will continue to take place at Barn Elms Sports Trust, which worked well last year.

2022 will see the welcome return of tea during afternoon games. Match fees have been adjusted to reflect this and are easily payable via the Pitchero app. At both of our main grounds food shall be supplied by **LEE HOME COOKING** and I'm very much looking forward to what's in store!

Like every club, we depend on volunteers to keep going. If you can help in any way, then please do let us know. The Social Secretary position is open, and we need new recruits for both our junior and commercial sub-committees. We will also sponsor some of the cost for coaching, umpiring and first aid courses, so please do get in touch if interested.

We can all help to raise funds for the club and our 2022 charity of the year <u>Chance To Shine</u>. One simple step is to sign up to <u>Easyfundraising</u>, as you can raise money for free simply by shopping online. And now that we are a Community Amateur Sports Club, we can receive tax efficient donations (see <u>here</u>).

Throughout the year we organise many club events, competitions, and tours. Further details can be found here and these help to bring the whole club together, whilst raising vital funds and sometimes offering the chance of prizes. Please do diarise them and sign up.

Always a dubious accolade to be asked to follow the Club Chair in the introductory section. I hope that this introduction will flow seamlessly on in much the same manner as I have modelled my batting style after Mr Andrews. I am delighted to have been elected as Club Captain, following on from the fine work of Saugata Sen last year.

Firstly, I need-as always-to pay tribute to our incredibly hard-working Management Committee who have put us in such a fantastic position for the start of the new season. The work that our Chair and Secretary especially have accomplished to get us to where we are today has been nothing short of heroic. The Club owes them a huge debt that I'll completely forget about when Peter drops a skier off my bowling in May.

Chief amongst these successes is the fantastic news that the 2022 season will bring a shiny new venue for our devastating opening spells, incredible screaming catches, and heroic batting collapses. Bringing the Club closer together has been a key focus of the Committee, so it's incredible to now have two home grounds within a 1-minute drive from each other in Raynes Park, at Oberon and Beverley Meads (Wimbledon Rugby Club). It's a great venue and the social side of the Club will only go stronger with all 4 Saturday sides, plus the Sunday team and both midweek sides, playing so close to each other.

Saugata's role was crucial in the strides we have made to come together as a club. From a captain's perspective last year, having a central coordinator behind the scenes was a huge deal and I have big shoes to fill, so I have already extended my follow-through to half the wicket to copy his bowling style.

One of Saugata's main achievements was in the number of juniors playing senior cricket, and this is something I'll be working on closely with the Colts Co-ordinator Rich Kendall. This was at its highest level for years and even meant the resurrection of an occasional 5th XI, so maintaining that player pathway is going to be a key focus in the continuing success of the club. This is in no small part due to the immense contribution of Barry Brown and Charlie Armour, and as they retire from roles in the junior section, they have an enormous

legacy to be proud of with colts of all eras throughout the Club, from the 1s captain to the deepest depths of the 4th XI.

So, with new venues and a potential golden generation coming through the youth section, will this result in glory on the field? No team will be striving harder for that than the 1st XI, with captain Kit Winder aiming to achieve promotion after last year's 3rd place in Division 2. In the T20 Cup, the team will be looking to replicate last year's Cinderella run to the quarter finals.

The other Saturday sides will be hoping to achieve success in their own competitions, whilst giving opportunities to the Bank stars of tomorrow. The 2nd XI will once again be led by club stalwart Aaron Crane in 2nd XI Division 3, where a new challenge awaits after a couple of seasons of squad rebuilding. With some exciting new players coming into the squad, Aaron's side are one to watch this year at their new level.


The 3rd XI hope to build on a strong finish to last year's historic campaign in Division 6 East, which saw an artificially tricky division due to Covid realignment. Away from Saturdays, the rest of the Club continues to go from strength to strength, offering something for everyone. On Sundays players from across the club join together to play traditional friendly cricket, mostly at home. The team is captained by a different player every week, and it is a great place to enjoy your cricket in a less pressurised setting.

Our activities are not just limited to weekends. The Bank Blitz T20 XI play in the Surrey Slam with some competitive but fun cricket under captain Rich Kendall. John Jackson's Midweek XI play a mixture of afternoon declaration and evening T20 games and these games are open to all, but we also try to include our Bank staff element as much as possible. Perfect for those who have recently had an unsuccessful meeting with a particular opponent and are looking for revenge on the field. Finally, we shall also be re-entering the winter Indoor Cricket League in a desperate attempt to fill the long, cold, winter months.

I can't wait to get out there and sign up for as much cricket as possible in 2022. There's so much to be optimistic about around the Club, both on the field and off it. Please make your captain's lives easier by regularly updating your availability on Pitchero. It is so hard finding players at late notice, so please try to honour your cricketing commitments once made. We'd love there to be an endless supply of replacements but if you drop out on a Friday, someone is playing with 10! Junior Cricket Coordinator's Message

Firstly, a huge thank you to the legendary Barry Brown, who has been the lead organiser of our junior section since its inception in 1993. I was one of the beneficiaries of this, although winning the league as an u13 back in 2002 now seems like a very long time ago!

Barry is taking a well-earned back seat after almost 30 years, although I'm very pleased to say will continue to provide support as part of a three-pronged management team alongside myself and Mo Dilshad. This should ensure minimal disruption behind the scenes, with Head Coach Ian Hussain continuing to lead our ECB qualified coaching team.

It is very exciting to be able to provide junior cricket again in 2022, as we continue to build upon the big re-start for BOECC junior cricket of 2021. Our players needed to catch up on the cricket missed in the 2020 covid season, and performances (and results) improved markedly as the 2021 season progressed.

Numbers have been very promising at winter training with many coming on leaps and bounds. It will be great to see how much they have developed when summer training and matches begin in late April.

Training will again be taking place at Barn Elms Sports Trust (BEST), which worked well last year. The setting is very pleasant, and parents are encouraged to stay with a BYO glass or two, or to visit the nearby Red Lion pub. The BEST facilities are good and serve our purposes well, whilst we continue to engage in dialogue regarding any potential future return to the Bank Sports Centre in the longer term.

The Surrey Junior Championship enjoyed a successful debut season last year, bringing together all junior cricket within the county under one banner. This has formalised a standard set of playing conditions and will help to benefit young players across Surrey in the longer term.

As usual our youngest age group is the u7s / u8s (Years 2 & 3), who will focus on learning the fundamentals of the game at Friday night training. This is a great place to start in learning the essentials of technique, whilst also having fun. This age group

feeds into our youngest match playing team, the u9s (Year 4), who will be playing soft ball "pairs" cricket with 6 players per team in the Surrey Junior Championship. The number of participants has decreased to allow each child to have more "meaningful moments", and we will ensure everyone gets the opportunity to participate.

The u10 (Year 5) age group sees the introduction of the hard cricket ball, with numbers increasing to 8 per team. The cup competitions also begin at this age group, so our young players can enjoy the added excitement of knock out play.

The u12s (Year 7) are combined with our u11s (Year 6), with proper "out when you're out" cricket and the full 11 players per side. I'd like to say this is the format that will serve them well for the rest of their cricketing careers, but who knows what inventions will be around the corner?!

At the u13 (Year 8) age group players continue their development and start to really kick on as they become more accustomed to "out when you're out" cricket.

The u15s (Year 10) are combined with our u14s (Year 9) age groups, and we begin to look at identifying individuals who are ready to also play senior cricket through our player pathway. It was fantastic to see so many making their senior debuts last year, with the Saturday 4th XI and Sunday XI both ideal starting points playing friendly cricket. This helps to ensure youngsters can adjust and learn about the game in a pressure free setting.

Historically we have occasionally fielded an u17 team but that is not possible in 2022 due to limited numbers. This remains under review for the future as we would love to continue offering age group specific cricket at either u17 or u19 levels.

I would encourage all our players in the Academy (u16-u19) age groups to make themselves available for the senior adult teams. There is plenty of cricket to go around that suits all ages and abilities, and we are very keen to continue developing our own players. Many of our current adult players came through the BOECC junior section, including the current 1st XI, 2nd XI & 4th XI captains. All are very welcome at senior training on Wednesday evenings.

It goes without saying that looking after our young players is crucial, and all our relevant safeguarding policies can be found here. We take these seriously and ask anyone with concerns to report these to any Committee Member, or to our new Safeguarding Officer Michael Chadwick.

Lastly, I will make a point of reminding everyone that we need volunteers at all age groups. Be it to help take a register at Friday training, helping to umpire, or even providing a lift to others for matches, it would be great if everyone could do their part. We have always been lucky to have so many supportive parents at BOECC, and I am sure this will continue long into the future.

I look forward to a great summer of youth cricket!


