A lovely summer's day was much appreciated by the 151 boys and girls who took part in this year's Cubert 1 mile fun run and associated Toddlers Trot for the Under 5's which took place on Thursday 2nd June. For many of those taking part, it would have been their first introduction to running and racing on the roads, with several going on to become involved in athletics in general as they get older.

This event has normally been held in conjunction with the annual Cubert 5 mile road race, but with that event not taking place this year, the Cubert and Holywell Carnival Committee who organise the fun run, decided to feature it as part of the Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations.



The relatively flat route took the runners from the Church Fields, across the Village Square, a loop around the Jubilee Close Estate before returning to the Church Fields.

The first boy overall home was Ethan Lusty representing Tretherras School and Holywell Bay Surf Life Saving Club, in an excellent time of 5 mins 36secs, who just edged out J.J.Wells from Taunton and Jamie Ward for the second and third places. The first girl overall home was Claudia Connelly, in a time of 6mins 59secs, closely followed by Daisy Tait, with Seren McIntosh in third.

As an acknowledgement to all the hard work and training put in by all the youngsters of the local Surf Life Saving Clubs, an additional trophy was up for grabs for the first "Nipper" home. This went to Cameron Ellis, a member of the Holywell Bay SLC.

All of the other various category winners went home delighted with their trophies, and everyone who completed the course went home with a Goody Bag and proudly wearing their well earned medals for all to see.

First boy home in the Toddler Trot was 4 years old Harry Tenby, with Elsie Clemow, also just 4 years old, the winning girl.

All proceeds of this years run, which amounted to around £1100, will go towards the cost of maintaining, and the year on year increase in the number of excellent Christmas lights that appear on show every year in and around the village of Cubert.

## CVH MAINTENANCE UPDATE

The progress of our current projects to improve and maintain required standards are as follows at the time of writing on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2022

- **Main Hall Roof Repairs**  
On Going
- **Main Hall Floor Refurb**  
The floor is now over 40 years old and needs refurbishing. If left too long it will need replacing which will cost considerably more than a refurb. We have 3 quotes from last year and need to consider funding and management
- **Car Park Surface – Front and Rear**  
Consideration of different solutions is in progress. This will be a large project in terms of funding.

## VILLAGE HALL OPEN DAY REPORT – 2<sup>nd</sup> JUNE 2022

As part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations, Cubert Village Hall (CVH) held an Open Day for all the regular user groups/classes to demonstrate and display the offerings available and to launch the Paper Plane Competition. Included were groups for Tai Chai led by Alan Hughes, Su Han Ryu Karate led by Shaun Rollason and Ballroom Sequence Dancing led by Francis & Judy Phillips. The latter culminated with the dance invented specifically for the Jubilee "The Platinum Waltz".

A key part of the day was to unveil the repositioned original plaque celebrating the opening of the hall over 40 years ago on 12<sup>th</sup> September 1981. The hall was built by volunteers from the parish and financed through the efforts of local fund raisers and in September 2021, the CVH Committee received a request from one of the volunteer builders, Cubert resident Rodney Phillips, to put back on show, the original plaque unveiled on the opening day of the hall. The plaque had been hidden by a cupboard built to house the solar panel equipment installed in 2014. Removal was daunting. A replica was considered but this would not have the provenance of the original and two members of the committee, after taking all precautions, removed the plaque in one piece and relocated it to the main hall area.

Present for the unveiling were many of the original builders and fund raisers. Rodney Phillips then uncovered the plaque by removing the St Piran's flag with which it had been adorned. Sylvia Yeo, one of the original fund raisers, then cut the ribbon to open the new village hall storeroom extension finished last month.

The chairman of the CVH Committee, Francis Phillips, wishes to thank all the committee members, regular user groups and volunteers from the parish in making this day such a success. He also acknowledges the huge debt of gratitude owed to those past and present who made the building of this hall possible.

**Plaque Unveiling & Stores Opening Cubert Village Hall Open Jubilee Day 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2022**

The Cubert Village Hall was funded and built by local parishioners. The Parishioners got together a fundraising team and people to actually do the building themselves. Some with experience others that contributed their time to just move, carry materials, administration, table top sales, bingo, raffle tickets etc.

**Original Opening**

The Hall was originally opened on **Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> September 1981.**

**Request**

Last September 2021, the CVH Committee received a request from a **Rodney Phillips**, one of the original team that helped build this hall. The request, was to put back on show, the plaque unveiled at the opening day of the hall. In 2014 solar panels were installed and the control equipment was put on the wall of the entrance hall. A cupboard was built around the equipment for protection resulting in the opening plaque being hidden. It was a unanimous decision by the CVH committee to try and carry out the request. The location was above the solar equipment and removal was a little daunting to say the least. We considered a replica but this would not have the provenance of the original. However, after taking all the precautions necessary, we eventually managed to remove the original plaque in one piece.

**Storerooms Opening**

Also opened were the new CVH Storeroom Extensions No2 and No3. Storeroom **No1** was built and opened in 2018.....Storeroom **No2** is for much needed additional space for use by the Village Hall and its users.....Storeroom **No3** is for separate storage of equipment by other charities within the parish, such as Christmas lights.

**Rodney Phillips** was invited to step forward and unveil the original plaque. And **Sylvia Yeo** to cut the ribbon on the new storerooms.



After months of organising, the sun shone, and the crowds came. The big day had arrived and Cubert Village enjoyed Village Platinum Jubilee Celebrations!!

Awesome music, a variety of great food and drink, almost 12,000 ft of homemade bunting, a Bake-off Competition, Homebrew Competition, face painting, a ventriloquist, a stilt walker from the Circus School, a variety of stalls by local craftsmen and women, steam trains - 'Little Audrey' and 'Littler Audrey', Prickles & Paws, bouncy castles, go karts, unveiling of our tree, cream teas, beautiful floral displays and glorious weather were on hand for local residents and the large group of people, some dressed in 1950's style clothing! Even a King and Queen!

Cubert and Holywell Carnival Committee would like to express their sincere thanks to everyone who helped, attended, enjoyed, and supported the event.

The Beacon, designed and made by John Ledbury, was lit at the official time, 9.45 pm to great applause and cheers! With a spectacle of surprise, the Beacon was lit and brought to life with so many spectators watching on.

As the end of the day beckoned under a crescent moon, everyone danced and celebrated listening to Cyderfx in the marquee. It was a wonderful way to end a fantastic celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee!!

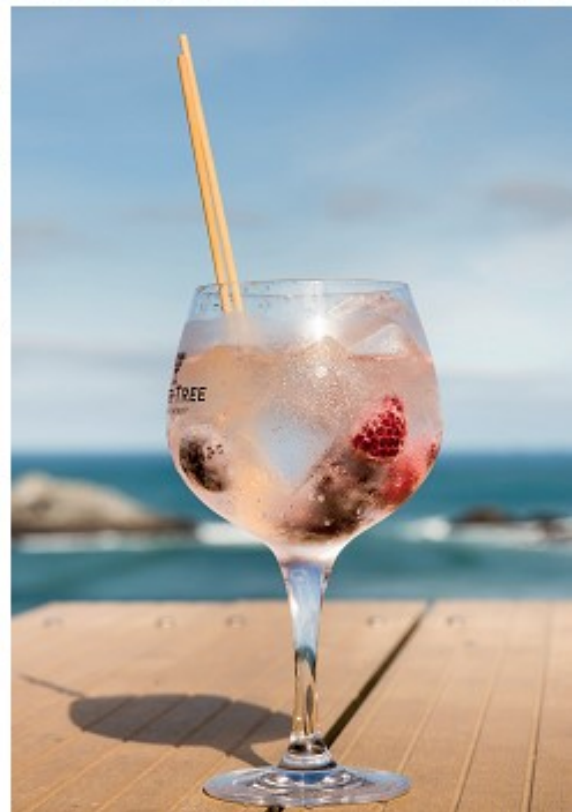
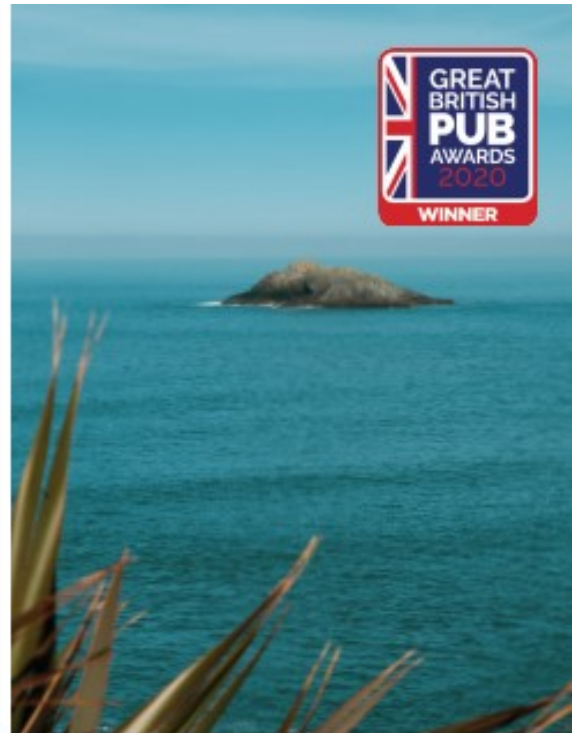

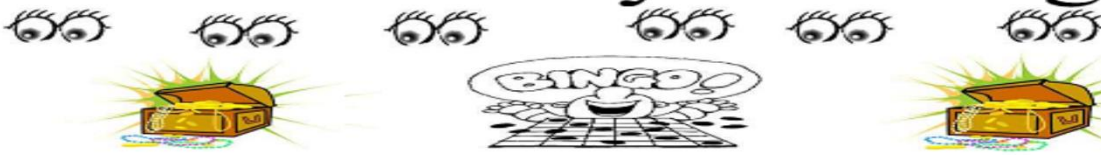

The Regular Parish Council meeting to be held on **20th July 2022** at 7.00pm in the Village Hall

Those of us of a certain age will recall units of length not related to the metric numbers we encounter today. Where do these older units come from?

If you walk around parts of Cornwall or even parts of our neighbouring country "England", especially around the Cotswolds, you will see many regular parallel mounds in the ground, are legacies of the ancient method of land management known as "strip farming".

From Saxon times until the late middle ages, a two field system of agriculture was used as the arable lands of a village and manor house were split into two large fields. The crops were grown in one in the first year and the second was used for livestock who obligingly fertilised that field ready for the next year's crop. Unused land was termed 'common' land for the use of all villagers.

The arable field was then divided into 'strips' and allocated to the villagers by the local Justice of the Peace, in order to feed their families. The number of strips depended on your station in the village and presumably on the integrity of the JP who, as Lord of the Manor, often took a large number for himself. However, the minimum allocation for any family was 4 strips.

Getting a good strip location was important due to the different fertility across the field and to avoid areas of flooding or shade etc. Allocations took place in church every Michaelmas (September 29<sup>th</sup>) where lots were drawn, but sometimes the Justice of the Peace just decided the allocations!

The fields were usually ploughed by 4 pair of Oxen (castrated bulls), using primitive ploughs. The plough always threw the earth in one direction i.e. outwards; thus over the years 'ridge and furrow' appeared. With 8 oxen there was difficulty in turning the team, and if you look closely you can see the furrows are 'S' shaped where the team started to turn before the end of each furrow. However, the oxen could only pull the plough just over 200 yards before needing to rest, so that over the years the furrow length was fixed at 220 yards – known as a furrow long or **FURLONG**.

A measure was also required to fix the width of a strip and luckily such a measuring stick was to hand – the Rod or Pole that was used by the ploughman to control the oxen. This stick was 16 ½ feet or 5 ½ yards long, thus the **ROD or POLE** as a unit of measurement was born. Although this unit is not much used today it is interesting to note that the depth of many cottages or barns is 5 ½ yards - so the Rod/Pole lives on! As mentioned above, the minimum allocation for one family was four strips and so the pole was used to measure out four strips. Four poles width equals 22 yards – one **CHAIN** – which is now used as the length of a cricket pitch.

As also mentioned, the minimum number of strips to feed one family was 4. Thus the area given to one family was 1 furlong (220 yards) x 1 chain (22 yards). This is 4840 yds<sup>2</sup> - which is one **ACRE**.

Strip farming was phased out by the Enclosure Acts in the late 1700s but you can still see the evidence next time you go for a walk in the country.

## Cubert Parish Social Club

### What is Happening ?

This is the question I have been asked many times over the last few weeks. Notably, this question was raised to me at the Cubert Village Hall (CVH) Jubilee Open Day.

Along with the question the following comments were made :

“We need somewhere in the village for social dialogue”.

“What are the CVH doing towards a social club?”

“We need some sort of community centre since the pub has gone”.

“I miss taking the children to the bingo that used to be held in the Anvil”

“Shame that all those charity quizzes are not held any more, I used to enjoy them and they were well attended, such a loss to the charities concerned”.

“We hear stories of resurrecting the Anvil but that appears to have died”

**The Anvil.** It is common knowledge within the parish that there is a group of parishioners attempting to resurrect The Anvil. If this was to proceed then the assumption would be that the need for a Cubert Parish Social Club at the CVH would no longer be required.

The CVH ran the survey on behalf of the parishioner who came forward with the social club idea and from that survey a report was issued by the CVH on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022 to the trustees of the CVH and a copy issued to the aforementioned parishioner who raised the idea.

The CVH is waiting for the last trustee to respond as at the time of writing. The other trustees are in favour of the idea of a social club at the CVH.

The survey response was low considering the number of forms issued, but, on the positive note over 95% of respondents were in favour of a Cubert Parish Social Club.

#### **Social Club at the CVH – How to make this happen**

The sub-committee would be responsible for initial business plans and then if given the go-ahead the planning, raising of funds, placing contracts or self-build and once built the running and management of the social club.

#### **What Happens Now ?**

Who in the parish is going to put their head above the parapet and start the proceedings towards creating a social gathering place in Cubert Parish ?

Any parishioner that is interested in forming a Cubert Parish Social Club at the CVH needs to hold a public meeting to form a working sub-committee to the CVH Management Committee to move this forward.

An Osprey has hatched in southern Britain for the first time in 200 years. The chick has yet to be spotted in its man made nest after its parents overzealous mating dislodged a webcam, but experts say the female removing egg shell and the male flying in with fish are proof. The five year projects success is down to Dorset charity, 'Birds of Poole Harbour' which set up nests after realising Scottish Ospreys stopped there en-route from Africa. Two more eggs should hatch soon and the charity's spokesman said "This is a monumental development."



A record Breaking Cuckoo who flew more than 69,000 miles in his lifetime has died. The tagged Cuckoo completed 6 trips from the UK to the Congo Basin in Africa in his 7 years, the most migratory journeys of any tagged Cuckoo. He also smashed records last April by flying more than 4,000 miles on one of his trips to Africa in just 7 days. At age 7 he was a year short of the longevity record for a wild UK Cuckoo, the British Trust for Ornithology said.

Although the Cuckoo has sadly died, his 6 years of location data lives on and his contribution to understanding of Cuckoo migration will continue to inform the B.T.O's research which hopefully will help reverse the sad decline of the Cuckoo population.

A Gull's nest and egg found in a waterpark's tipping bucket feature have delayed the attraction's summer re-opening. Wildlife laws say Herring Gulls cannot be disturbed, so experts had to monitor their home at a £350,000 Aquasplash. The park at Aberavon beach in South Wales is finally set to open after the parents left the nest and a damaged egg rolled out – possibly attacked by other Gulls. Neath Port Talbot Council said "Normally nests would be in a roof corner or camouflaged among pebbles. We are sorry this has ended in this way but all was done as stipulated by the law to ensure these Gulls were left in peace."

In Late May a two week old owlet seemingly abandoned by its parents and no nest was rescued. The Long-eared owl dubbed 'Elizabeth' was found on the Channel Island of Sark. She was in intensive care with Guernsey Society for the prevention of cruelty to Animals who said "We see quite a few Barn Owls but never a Long-eared owl chick. It's difficult to say why she was out of the nest but she was certainly too young."



Locally the Choughs are doing very well. On the 17<sup>th</sup> June Tim Hodder saw at least 14 (Fourteen) in two groups on the Kelseys. As he said "I think we can say they're established now."



On the 28<sup>th</sup> May Ben Hocking saw a Greater Spotted Woodpecker in his garden, similarly Brian Osborne had success again with Blue Tits using a nesting box raising 4 young which flew in the first week of June.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> June, Ben saw a solitary swift fly over.

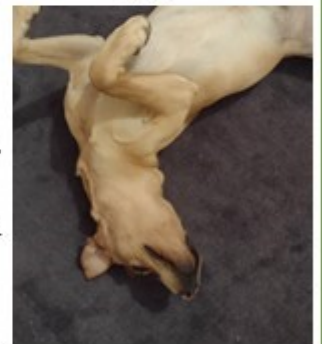

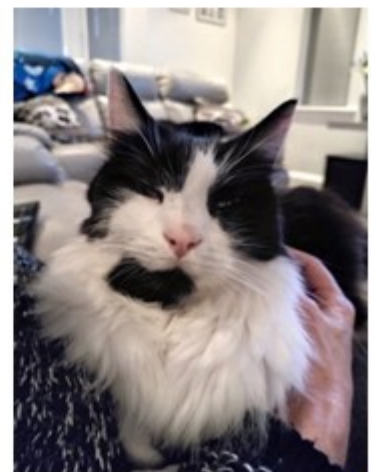

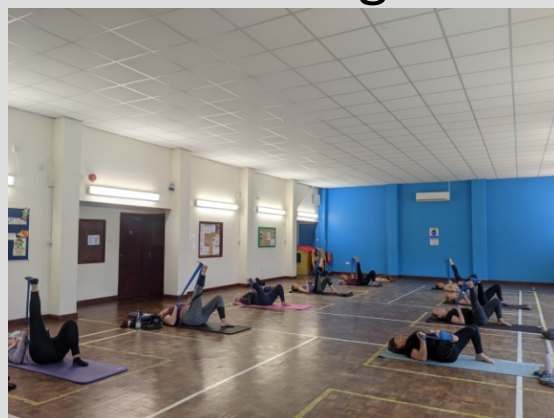
