GEORGE HUSACK

Head Coach

SAN DIEGO STATE, 1991

When he assumed the role of head coach for the Crimson Tide men's tennis team in 2012, George Husack had a vision to instill a winning mentality in Tuscaloosa and bring Alabama to national prominence. After only months at the reins, Husack had the Tide back in the NCAA Championship tournament.

After only one season, it was evident Husack's vision was coming to life. In addition to making the NCAAs as a team for the first time in three years, Husack's development of individual players shined. Jarryd Botha, the Tide's No. 1 player, nearly tripled his win total from the previous year, earned a national ranking and claimed spots in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships. He, and Doubles Championships. He, and honors in doubles, the first for any Tide doubles team in two decades.

Despite losing three starters and gaining only one freshman, the team collected four more wins in Husack's first year than it did in 2012, with that 2013 win-total including a 4-3 victory in the SEC Championship against sixth-ranked tournament host Ole Miss. Botha and Becker O'Shaughnessey

earned All-SEC honors, while Daniil Proskura was named SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and recipient of the ITA Arthur Ashe Leadership & Sportsmanship Award for the Southern Region.

In 2020, Husack had the Tide in a position to make its third straight NCAA Tournament appearance as the team had an 11-5 overall record and was ranked No. 26 in the country before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The team reached a season-high No. 17 ranking on March 3.

Husack brought the Tide back to the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2009-10. In the 2019 campaign, the team was the No. 2 seed in the Austin Regional before falling in the first round of the tournament.

In doubles, Husack coached senior Mazen Osama and sophomore Patrick Kaukovalta to the program's first-ever national championship appearance, which includes the singles, doubles and team tournaments. The duo won four-straight matches in the NCAA Doubles Championships before falling in the national championship and finishing as national runner-up. The doubles All-Americans finished the season tied for the highest doubles ranking in program history at No. 4 in the country.

As a team, the Tide spent 14 of 16 weeks of the spring season in the top-25 of the Oracle/ITA National Team Rankings, including a season-high No. 16 ranking on Feb. 20, 2019.

In 2018, the Tide was not satisfied with only a berth in NCAA Tournament as UA went on a historic run to the Round of 16. After upsetting No. 23 (No. 2 seed) Tulane 4-1 in the first round of the Tallahassee Regional, No. 3 seed Alabama moved on to only its fourth Sweet 16 appearance in program history after defeating No. 11 and host Florida State, 4-2. The Tide finished the season with 20 wins, marking only the 10th team in UA history to do so.

The Tide's historic season did not end after team championships, as junior All-American Mazen Osama became the first Alabama player to make it to the Round of 16 of the NCAA Singles Championships and then topped it by advancing to the quarterfinals. Every year under Husack,

Alabama has earned a berth in the NCAA Doubles Championships, in 2018 Osama and partner Edson Ortiz made it as one of the 32 pairings.

Year two did not end with as many wins as Husack would have liked, but there were still several positives to take away from the 2014 campaign. Playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation against 21 nationally-ranked opponents, the Tide walked away with 14 victories in all. During the final weekend of March, late into the SEC season, Alabama posted two huge wins, beating No. 26 Vanderbilt, 4-1, and No. 13 Kentucky, 4-2. The victories against the Commodores and the Wildcats were the Tide's first in both series since

For the second year in a row, Husack had a doubles team earn All-America honors with senior Daniil Proskura and sophomore Becker O'Shaughnessey receiving the nod. The duo was ranked throughout the season and reached a high of No. 7 after defeating the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in consecutive weeks. Individually, the two were named all-conference performers with Proskura making the first team and O'Shaughnessey the second team, while Proskura repeated as the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Nikko Madregallejo also earned a spot in the postseason mentions as he was one of eight rookies named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

O'Shaughnessey returned to the postseason in 2015, partnering with freshman newcomer Korey Lovett. The duo marked the fourth consecutive doubles team Husack guided to the NCAA Doubles Championship. The pair played the majority of the dual match season together at No. 1 doubles for the Crimson Tide where they won 11 matches, including four against nationally-ranked opponents.

Under Husack's watch, Lovett turned in one of the best freshman campaigns in the history of the Alabama men's tennis program in 2015. Lovett collected several postseason accolades including the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's Rookie of the Year Award for the Southern Region, as well as a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

The Tide shined off the court in 2015 as well, earning the highest GPA of all men's programs at Alabama with a combined 3.34 average.

In 2016, members of the Alabama men's tennis team were selected to compete in the NCAA singles and/or doubles championships for the fifth consecutive season. Mazen Osama and Korey Lovett were awarded a No. 5-8 seed in the NCAA doubles championships, the third pair to do so under head coach George Husack, while Osama also earned a spot in the singles field of 64. He was the first Alabama freshman to make the cut since two-time All-American Francisco Rodriguez did so in 1997.

Husack, the 2012 ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year, joined the Tide after having spent three seasons as associate head coach for the four-time defending national champion University of Southern California. In his role with the Trojans, he was responsible for coaching, player development and recruiting.

As a team, USC compiled an 85-6 overall record throughout his tenure and had four individuals earn a combined 10 All-America honors under his watch. Husack also helped train and motivate one of the most decorated players in collegiate tennis history, Steve Johnson, who won back-to-back NCAA record singles championship and amassed 72 consecutive singles victories.

Prior to his appointment at USC, Husack spent two seasons as associate head coach at Illinois after having been the head coach at Santa Clara for five years.

While at Illinois, Husack helped the Illini make two straight trips to the NCAA Round of 16 while coaching student-athletes that attained top-10 rankings nationally in both singles and doubles. As with USC, his primary responsibilities included player development and recruiting.

Husack assumed the reins of head coach at Santa Clara in 2002, after having served as an assistant since 1995. Throughout his tenure as head coach, he built a program that reached many milestones including the highest national singles and doubles rankings in school history, a program record for most team wins in a single season (20-8 in 2007), 19 All-West Coast Conference singles and doubles selections and 14 All-WCC All-Academic or ITA Scholar-Athlete honorees.

Husack, also an accomplished player in his own right, spent two seasons competing professionally on the International Tennis Federation and United States Tennis Association tours.

In addition to his professional experiences in tennis, Husack spent time in the business sector serving as a plan specialist for Franklin Mutual Fund, an operations analyst for Wells Fargo, and the Director of Marketing and Corporate Partnerships in athletics at Santa Clara.

A native of San Mateo, Calif., Husack earned his bachelor's degree in finance from San Diego State in 1991, while later attaining an MBA in marketing from the University of San Francisco in 1995. As a member of the San Diego State men's tennis team, he served as team captain as a senior and helped the Aztecs attain the program's first top-25 national ranking.

Husack and his wife Kristina have three children: Nina and twins Grant and Greta.

Dimitar Kutrovsky joined the Alabama men's tennis coaching staff in 2019-20 as an assistant coach after being officially hired on June 25, 2019.

In his first year, Kutrovsky helped the Tide to its 11-5 overall record and No. 26 national ranking before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The team reached a season-high No. 17 ranking on March 3.

Kutrovsky spent his previous four years with the University of Texas San Antonio and shined as a recruiting dynamo for coach Rodrigo da Silva, as he helped boost the UTSA roster with a strong ability to scout and sign international talent.

In addition to his time at UTSA, Kutrovsky has

Ezequiel Gils is in entering his first year as the volunteer assistant coach with Alabama after spending last season in the same role with Rice University.

A former two-time NAIA All-American at Tennessee Wesleyan, Gils worked at Rice after spending four years at Cedar Bluff Racquet Club in Knoxville, Tenn., where he recruited and trained junior players. He led an 18A Junior Team Tennis team that finished seventh at nationals, as well as created and implemented an advanced junior development camp that included video analysis and fitness.

Gils began his collegiate career at Tennessee Tech where he was a member of the 2012 OVC coaching experience with the junior program at the South Austin Tennis Center and the Austin Polo & Fitness Tennis Club.

As a player at the University of Texas, he was one of the most decorated in Longhorns history, as Kutrovsky finished his career as Texas' all-time winningest player with 230 combined victories in singles and doubles. A four-time All-Big 12 performer and two-time doubles champion, he helped UT reach the NCAA Championship match in 2008 and the semifinals in the following season to go along with a pair of appearances in the Round of 16.

As a senior in 2010, he was named Big 12 Player of the Year and earned All-America accolades in both singles and doubles while helping Texas to a 27-3 record, conference regular season and tournament titles and the NCAA Round of 16. He advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship singles bracket and was ranked as high as No. 7 nationally by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association. He finished his career as a three-time Singles All-American and one-time Doubles All-American.

After college, the Sofia, Bulgaria, native played professionally, reaching a career ranking as high as No. 293 by the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP). He captured a pair of singles titles at the Futures level, posted eight wins in the Davis Cup and reached the semifinals twice at ATP events.

Before playing collegiately and professionally, Kutrovsky achieved the No. 1 ranking for 16U and 18U in Bulgaria and was ranked as high as 69th by the International Tennis Federation as a junior. He competed in the Davis Cup for Bulgaria in singles and doubles, while also playing in the Junior French Open Championships.

Kutrovsky earned a bachelor's degree in communication studies from Texas in 2010.

regular season champions before transferring to Tennessee Wesleyan in 2014. He earned back-to-back All-America honors, finished his senior season with a 17-0 mark in singles and an 18-2 record in doubles, and was named the AAC Men's Tennis Player of the Year in 2015. A two-time team captain, Gils was named to the Daktronics-NAIA Scholar Athlete Team as a senior and named Tennessee Wesleyan's Most Representative Male Student.

While in college, he coached at the Hugo Armando Tennis Academy in Bradenton, Florida where he worked with a number of players, including 2018 Australian Open junior champion Sebastian Korda. Gils began his collegiate coaching career at Tennessee Wesleyan in 2015. There, he assisted with match coaching, led practices, and recruited players, including an NAIA All-American athlete.



Dr. Stuart R. Bell became the 29th president of The University of Alabama on June 18, 2015. Currently in his seventh year of leading the University, Dr. Bell previously served the Capstone for 16 years as a faculty member and then department head of mechanical engineering.

Under his leadership, the University developed and implemented a strategic plan, Advancing the Flagship, which promotes institutional progress with scholarship and teaching, research and creative activity, inclusion and diversity and the recruitment and retention of highly qualified faculty and staff. Since the plan's launch, UA has seen an increase in both student retention and graduation rates; has increased faculty headcount to support the University's instruction, research and service goals; has witnessed the growth of sponsored program awards crucial to direct learning and experience opportunities for students; and has benefited from three consecutive historic fundraising years. New interdisciplinary research centers have also been established and join many other programs on campus focused on solving critical, real-world challenges.

Prior to becoming UA's president, Dr. Bell was executive vice president and provost at Louisiana State University and served as both the chief academic officer and the chief operating officer. Before his time at LSU, Dr. Bell served the University of Kansas as dean of the School of Engineering.

With research concentrations in combustion engines, Dr. Bell has expertise in fuels for engines, innovative engine designs and modeling of engine and engine processes. He founded and directed UA's Center for Advanced Vehicle Technologies, an interdisciplinary research center producing new generations of engineers and scientists. Dr. Bell was also inducted as an Engineering Department Fellow by UA's department of mechanical engineering. He was awarded the Society of Automotive Engineer's Ralph Teetor Award for Outstanding Contributions to Research and Teaching and the T. Morris Hackney Faculty Leadership Award for the College of Engineering.

Dr. Bell was also honored with the Richard S. Woodbury Award from the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, was selected as a recipient of the Dwight Look College of Engineering Outstanding Alumni Award from Texas A&M University and was elected to the Academy of Distinguished Alumni in Mechanical Engineering at his alma mater. He also recently joined the 2021-2022 SEC Executive Committee

An Abilene, Texas native, Dr. Bell earned a degree in nuclear engineering from Texas A&M in 1979. He earned his master's and doctoral degrees in mechanical engineering from the same university in 1981 and 1986, respectively.

It was also at Texas A&M that Dr. Bell met his wife, Susan. They are the proud parents of three adult children, Stuart, Stacy and Stephen and three delightful granddaughters and a grandson. Both of Dr. Bell's sons followed in his footsteps and are engineers. His daughter Stacy is a UA alumna.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



With more than 25 years of experience in sports administration, Alabama Director of Athletics Greg Byrne has built an impressive career highlighted by consistent competitive success, innovative strategies, vigorous fundraising and a strong emphasis on academic excellence and student-athlete enhancement.

Named Alabama's 17th Director of Athletics on January 17, 2017, he made an immediate impact on the Crimson Tide, developing and implementing both The Standard, a strategic plan outlining the mission statement and core values of Alabama Athletics, and The Crimson Standard, a 10-year, \$600 million capital initiative focused on the renovation of facilities and development of infrastructure.

Additionally, The Standard provides benchmarks in the areas of academics, student-athlete welfare, athletics

success, financial resources, facilities, staffing and operating with integrity, while The Crimson Standard is designed to provide the foundation for future success in all aspects of the collegiate experience.

Under Byrne's leadership, the Crimson Tide has:

- Posted its highest finish in program history in the Learfield IMG College Directors' Cup at the conclusion of the 2020-21 season, placing seventh, as well as its second-highest finish at 14th following the 2017-18 season
- Added high-impact coaches Nate Oats (men's basketball), Brad Bohannon (baseball), Lindsey Devine (volleyball), Glenn Putyrae (rowing) and Margo Geer (men's and women's swimming & diving) to the Tide's lineup, all five of which made immediate impacts in lifting their respective programs up the national ladder
- Won the 2021 and 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship, earned a place in the CFP Championship Game in 2018, 2019 and 2021 and collected Southeastern Conference titles in football (2017, 2020), men's basketball (2021), gymnastics (2021), softball (2021, 2019) and men's indoor track & field (2018)
- Brought home individual and relay national titles in cross country, gymnastics, swimming & diving and track & field and produced more than 100 All-Americans in 12 different sports
- Earned over 40 CoSIDA Academic All-America certificates as well as some of the nation's top academic honors, including the NCAA Top 10 Award, the NCAA Elite 90 Award, CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year, NCAA and SEC Postgraduate Scholarships
- Earned the H. Boyd McWhorter Male SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 2017 and produced 14 SEC Scholar-Athletes of the Year in 10 different sports, including a conference-record eight during the 2019-20 academic year

- Added a state-of-the-art, first-of-its-kind Sports Science Center featuring advanced treatment services and technology with spaces dedicated to cryotherapy, chiropractic care, stretch, massage, relaxation, recovery and mental health services
- Improved and renovated Bryant-Denny Stadium, including enhancements to all team and recruiting areas, renovations of multiple fan areas, including new Loge and sky boxes and a trio of club areas and an added student plaza
- Renovated and expanded the football team locker room, training room, equipment room and lobby within the Mal M. Moore Athletic Facility
- Added and renovated multiple areas of the John and Ann Rhoads Softball Stadium, with upgrades to the press box and clubhouse, the addition of a new umpire locker room, new restrooms and a new concessions building, as well as new hardscape for the plaza and entryway along first base
- Revitalized the Alabama Aquatic Center with a renovation that included the addition of an outdoor pool



The son of Bill Byrne, whose long and highly successful career included 30 years as an athletics director, Greg Byrne has spent a lifetime around major college athletics. That background has allowed the younger Byrne to consistently develop and grow as a dynamic and impactful administrator with each new role he has undertaken, with career highlights prior to Alabama that include:

- Serving as the University of Arizona's Vice President for Athletics (2010-17) and Mississippi State University's Director of Athletics (2008-10), making Alabama the third NCAA Division I program he has led
- Fostering major improvements across the spectrum of sports at both Arizona and MSU, raising the bar to new heights when it came to student-athlete enhancement and academic success in preparation for life after sports
- More than \$140 million in construction and renovation of athletics facilities at Arizona
- Serving as the youngest athletics director in the SEC and the youngest to lead an athletic
 program at the NCAA Division I-A level while at Mississippi State where he oversaw the
 hiring of head football coach Dan Mullen and former head baseball coach and current
 Director of Athletics John Cohen
- Experience in the Southeastern Conference, having spent 2002-05 at the University
 of Kentucky as Associate Athletics Director for Development and Fundraising prior to
 serving as Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at MSU from 2006-08 before
 becoming the Bulldogs' Director of Athletics
- Working at the Fiesta Bowl (1994-95), Oregon (1995-98) and Oregon State (1998-2002)




2021 SEASON REVIEW

• Alabama earned its 20th berth to the NCAA Tournament. The national appearance is the third consecutive for the Crimson Tide, after qualifying in 2018 and 2019 (there was no NCAA Tournament in 2020 due to the pandemic) and fourth appearance under head coach George Husack.



•The Tide advanced three to the NCAA Championships Singles and Doubles Draw. Edson Ortiz earned a place in the 64-player singles draw, while Patrick Kaukovalta and Riccardo Roberto made the 32-team doubles draw. In addition, Zhe Zhou was an alternate in singles.



• Zhe Zhou was named the ITA Southern Region Most Improved Senior. Zhou started his career playing at the No. 6 spot as a rookie before working his way to No. 58 national ranking as a senior while playing at the No. 1 spot for the Tide.



• Ortiz also earned All-SEC First Team honors, the program's 51st first team honoree and 82nd overall All-SEC selection. Ortiz was named an All-SEC honoree for the third year, earning first-team accolades in 2019 and 2021 and second team in 2018. There were no All-SEC honors in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



• Alabama had a strong performance at home, winning 12 of 16 matches in Tuscaloosa. The team saw a upset win over No. 15 Kentucky, edging the Wildcats 4-3 in a late February match, and a victory over No. 15 Mississippi State in its home finale.



• The men's tennis team placed 10 student-athletes on the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's (ITA) Scholar Athlete Team. Rudi Christiansen, Gabriel Diaz Freire, Sam Fischer, Jeremy Gschwendtner, Patrick Kaukovalta, Alexey Nesterov, Edson Ortiz, Vincent Rettke, Avi Shugar and Zhe Zhou were recognized for their performance in the classroom. Nesterov and Ortiz earned ITA Scholar-Athlete honors for the fifth consecutive year. Fischer and Kaukovalta earned the honor for the fourth time, while Gschwendtner and Zhou were named to the team for the third time and Rettke for his second time. Christiansen, Freire and Shugar picked up their first honor.

As a team, Alabama recorded a 3.66 GPA for the academic year and saw everyone on the team post a 3.0 or better. Christiansen, Freire and Zhou each had a perfect 4.0 GPA for the year. Under head coach George Husack, the Crimson Tide has captured 46 honors as the team qualified as an ITA All-Academic Team for the ninth consecutive season.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP APPEARANCE



Mazen Osama and Patrick Kaukovalta became the first players in program history to make it to a national championship, after finishing as the national runner-up in the 2019 NCAA Doubles Championships. The duo fell to No. 2 Maxim Cressy and Keegan Smith of UCLA, 6-3, 6-4, on May 25 in the 2019 NCAA Men's Tennis Doubles National Championship at the USTA National Campus in Orlando, Fla.

The No. 11 pair in the country finished their season with a 19-8 record, while Cressy/Smith ended their year with a perfect 21-0 record. On May 24, the duo made history by advancing to the program's first-ever national championship after besting SEC-foe No. 32 Braun/Oradini of (Mississippi State) in the semifinal.

On May 23, Osama and Kaukovalta became just the third doubles pair in program history to advance to the semifinals and the first to do so since 1990. Earlier in the week, Osama and Kaukovalta earned All-America honors after earning two victories in the tournament, including defeating No. 13 Blumberg/Boyden (UNC).

On May 21, Osama and Kaukovalta picked up their first-career NCAA Doubles Tournament victories after defeating No. 17 Kellovsky/ Ponwith of Arizona State in straight sets in the first round.

ALABAMA TENNIS FACILITY



THE ALABAMA TENNIS STADIUM

Alabama tennis student-athletes have the privilege of playing in one of the finest facilities in the country as the Alabama Tennis Stadium was one of nine winners of the 25th Annual USTA Facility Awards Program. The outdoor complex, built in 2004, features 12 hard courts with overhead seating for 2,000 spectators that faces all courts.

The \$4.2 million facility houses a team lounge with a flat screen television and couches, a conference room, coaches' offices, player locker rooms with private restrooms and showers, a full-service athletic training room and a concession stand with kitchen. In addition, the facility contains an elevator from the first level up to the seating area.

Not only is this complex conducive to the highest level of competitive play, it is also a terrific place for hosting school and community tournaments, with amenities for spectators and visiting teams.

THE ROBERTA ALISON BAUMGARDNER TENNIS FACILITY

In 2012, the tennis programs gained the addition of the Roberta Alison Baumgardner Tennis Facility, which houses six indoor courts. Located adjacent to the outdoor stadium, the facility features a lobby, restrooms and overhead seating above the courts in addition to seating at court level.

The building, dedicated on April 28, 2012, is named after one of the most successful tennis players in Alabama history. Alison Baumgardner lettered for three seasons at Alabama on the men's tennis team. Men's coach Jason Morton discovered the Alexander City, Ala., native and enticed her to play on the varsity men's team at the Capstone because there was no women's team at the time. She won the women's collegiate singles championship titles in both 1962 and 1963 and teamed with Missouri's Justina Bricka for the 1963 women's collegiate doubles national title.

Baumgardner was a four-time Blue Gray and three-time Southern Tournament champion. She is a member of the Southern Lawn Tennis Hall of Fame, the Southern Tennis Hall of Fame and the Women's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame. Baumgardner was also among the inaugural inductees into The University of Alabama's Tennis Hall of Fame. She passed away on March 20, 2009 at the age of 65.

The addition of the indoor will not only provide a facility for the teams to compete during inclement weather, but it also will benefit Alabama when submitting bids to host events such as the NCAA Championship.
