Wildcat fifth year forward Jordan Janssen became Wayne State's first-ever Academic All-American last season earning Second Team honors. The Lincoln East graduate had a 3.77 grade point average working on a master's degree in business administration. On the court, Janssen averaged 19.9 points and 8.1 rebounds per game last season, scoring double figures in 27 of 28 games. He ended his Wayne State career as the all-time leading scorer (2,104) and rebounder (1,146).

Wayne State College has been a vital part of Northeast Nebraska since James M. Pile founded the college as Nebraska Normal College in 1891. From the early days as a private higher education institution with a handful of faculty and students until today, as a strong and proud member of the Nebraska State College System boasting more than 4,500 students and 450 faculty and staff, Wayne State has served as an educational, economic and cultural engine for Northeast Nebraska and beyond.

Wayne State College is a leading comprehensive college in Northeast Nebraska distinguished by providing quality academic programs in a personalized setting. We're located on a 128-acre campus and boast a 20:1 student-to-faculty ratio. Wayne State College is best known for our friendly atmosphere, affordability, academic excellence, and successful graduates. Wayne State is nationally ranked and has received recognition for affordability, academic excellence, and community service. WSC began as a college primarily for teacher education but now offers more than 130 undergraduate programs and several graduate programs. Education students are provided with valuable opportunities for hands-on teaching experience. Business, criminal justice and pre-professional programs are also popular at WSC. We have a solid reputation in educating future healthcare professionals as well, thanks to a high placement rate in the allied health fields at University of Nebraska Medical Center, as well as other regional schools.

Service-Learning is an important component of education at Wayne State College. Students lead community projects designed to integrate meaningful community service with instruction and reflection to enrich the learning experience, teach civic responsibility and strengthen communities.

Wayne State inspires students through access to affordable, high quality academic programs, personalized support services, and a culture committed to diversity, sustainability, and creativity. The College strengthens communities by engaging students in experiential learning and leadership opportunities. Wayne State serves the region through cultural opportunities, strategic partnerships, and innovative economic development programs.

WSC takes pride in the success of its extra-curricular activities as well, including performing arts and athletics. Rice Auditorium is the home to the WSC indoor sports programs. It seats approximately 1,700



for basketball and volleyball events. In addition, the auditorium, through the use of its stage, can accommodate 2,500 to 3,000 for commencement, theatrical performances, lectures and other similar events.

Memorial Stadium/Bob Cunningham Field: The stadium is used for seating up to 4,000 spectators for Wayne State College and Wayne High School football games. It also houses a press box and concession stand. WSC also hosts many high school track meets at this facility.

Ley Theatre, located in Brandenburg Hall, has fixed seating for 150. Additional seats may be added to accommodate up to 220. Ramsey Theatre, located in the Peterson Fine Arts Building, can accommodate 650 people on its main floor and balcony.

We are proud to offer exceptional education at an affordable cost. With low tuition rates and financial assistance given to most of our students each year, WSC is the most affordable and best quality four-year college in the region. Our value, combined with personalized attention from caring professors and staff, a friendly campus community, and opportunities to learn in and outside the classroom, makes WSC a great place for students to thrive and advance their futures.

Wayne State's four academic schools, Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Behavioral Sciences, and Science, Health, and Criminal Justice, offer more than 130 programs of study and 55 minors in 15 academic departments, awarding bachelor's, master's and education specialist degrees in a variety of programs and fields. There are 121 full-time, ranked faculty, 118 part-time faculty, and 18 graduate assistants.

Wayne State College competes in NCAA Division II, and is a member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Competitive sports include football, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's track and field (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's cross country, baseball, softball and women's soccer. Two new sports were added for the 2019-20 season - women's golf and beach volleyball.

Wayne State continues to invest in upgrades to athletic facilities. The most recent additions include the completion of the Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex (formerly the Carlson Natatorium). A new state-of-the-art press box was completed in the summer of 2018 at Bob Cunningham Field. In the last two years Rice Auditorium has installed a videoboard and new branded playing surface to enhance the Wildcat fan experience.

Construction began in the summer of 2023 on the Athletic and Recreation Complex Renovation and Addition project. The \$32-million project is a multi-phased construction project designed to have a significant impact on Wayne State and the region it serves. The project will include a new air-supported structure with an indoor track and turf field and renovations to Rice Auditorium and the Recreation Center and is expected to be completed by the fall of 2025.

WAYNE STATE ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Marysz Rames President

Dr. Marysz Rames was appointed the 13th president of Wayne State College by the Nebraska State College System Board of Trustees on June 18, 2015. She came to Wayne State from Dakota State University in Madison, S.D., where she had served as interim president since Aug. 15, 2014.

Rames earned her education doctorate in adult and higher education in 1997 from the University of South Dakota in Vermillion. She earned her bachelor of science degree in business administration and communication studies, with a minor in economics, in 1982, and her master's degree in educational administration in 1986, from University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colorado.

She spent one year (2014-15) as interim president at Dakota State University (DSU) in Madison, South Dakota. During this time she was instrumental in promoting a strong shared governance system, finalizing the university's five-year strategic plan, revitalizing the university's Foundation and actively raising funds to increase scholarships. Rames also worked with the legislature and others in several major new construction and renovation projects.

Prior to her interim appointment, Rames served as the vice president for student affairs from 2000 until June 2015 at South Dakota State University (SDSU) in Brookings. As the senior student affairs officer, Rames oversaw numerous university divisions and initiatives, including, but not limited to, enrollment management, student success, strategic planning, fundraising/fiscal management, diversity and inclusion, collaborative partnerships, leadership development, and increasing efficiency and effectiveness for students.

Rames served as an assistant professor of education at SDSU, teaching courses in administration and leadership in student affairs; serving on master's and doctoral students' graduate committees; and conducting research in financial trends in higher education, student retention and completion, and affordability and access to higher education. Rames also served as the interim associate vice president of student affairs (1997-1999) and the interim director for diversity enhancement (1999) at SDSU.

Prior to her arrival at SDSU, Rames worked at Aims Community College in Greeley, Colo., and the University of Wyoming in Laramie. Her scholarly presentations include topics such as student services, retention efforts, and working with today's college students.

Rames and her husband, Steve, have two children - Matthew and Jessica.



Mike Powicki Director of Athletics

Mike Powicki is in his 12th year (2023-24) as Athletic Director at Wayne State College. Powicki began his duties at Wayne State College on July 23, 2012 and has been instrumental in improvements to athletic facilities and staffing during his 11 years at the institution.

Over the past 11 years at WSC, over \$13 million has been invested in facility improvements, staffing and operations enhancements. More facility additions and renovations are planned in the near future as Wayne

State began construction in the summer of 2023 on a \$30 million athletic/recreation facility addition and renovation project that includes the addition of an air-supported indoor structure and major renovations to the Recreation Center, Rice Auditorium and the Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex. The three-phase project has a tentative completion date set for the fall of 2025.

It was a banner year for Wildcat athletics in 2022-23 as Wayne State captured two NSIC championships in football and volleyball to go with a division crown in men's basketball. Two teams - football and volleyball - qualified for the NCAA Division II National Tournament with volleyball hosting the NCAA Central Regional Tournament in Rice Auditorium. WSC also had one individual national champion during the 2022-23 school year with Brooklyn Chippis winning the NCAA championship in the weight throw at the NCAA Division II Indoor Championships.

Wildcat student-athletes continued to excel in the classroom during the 2022-23 school year. 14 of 15 sports at Wayne State posted a cumulative grade point average over 3.00. WSC had 249 Presidential Scholar Athletes and 144 NSIC All-Academic selections with 51 student-athletes posting a perfect 4.00 GPA in either the 2022 spring and/or fall semester. Wildcat athletics also had nine seniors who received the NSIC Myles Brand All-Academic With Distinction Award and for a 18th straight season Wayne State athletics had an Academic All-American as five Wildcat athletes were named College Sports Communicators Academic All-Americans.

The 2021-22 school year saw two more projects created to benefit Wildcat athletics. The Rice Auditorium Stage Conversion Project, totalling \$1 million, will enclose the current stage and create an open-air room to provide premium fan seating and in-game hospitality area for Wildcat volleyball and men's and women's basketball games in Rice Auditorium along with providing a multi-use area for student-athlete recruitment and team meetings. Another project scheduled for completion in late August is field turf installed on the WSC Soccer Pitch.

Powicki was instrumental in the addition of two sports to Wayne State athletics in 2019-20 with the addition of beach volleyball and the re-instatement of the women's golf program. He also orchestrated the renovation of the former natatorium into the Indoor Athletic Complex that will benefit all Wildcat athletic programs. Powicki also helped orchestrate the largest single scholarship gift in the history of Wayne State as the Gardner Foundation announced on October 3, 2019 a \$1.8 million gift to the school. Included in the gift was a one-time donation of \$300,000 toward the Indoor Athletic Complex along with \$150,000 toward athletic operations and \$925,000 toward athletic scholarships to WSC.

Wildcat student-athletes continued to excel in the classroom during the 2019-20 school year. 11 of the 13 sports at Wayne State posting a cumulative grade point average over 3.00. WSC had 212 Presidential Scholar Athletes and 142 NSIC All-Academic selections with 47 student-athletes posting a perfect 4.00 GPA in either the 2019 spring and/or fall semester. Wildcat athletics also produced an all-time high six Academic All-Americans in the 2019-20 school year and had one NSIC Elite 18 Award winner (Aaron Ras was a repeat selection in baseball).

In the summer of 2019, Rice Auditorium benefitted with the addition of several upgrades that included new (hanging) baskets, hallway graphics of current and past Wildcat athletes to enhance the look of Rice Auditorium and a newly designed floor/playing surface.

The Bob Cunningham Field Press Box Replacement project covering \$3.9 million was done in 2018. The project increased the amount of work space for media and staff working home events at Cunningham Field. The new facility also provides universal space on the lower level that will give WSC athletics an opportunity to host special events and create additional revenue through corporate sponsorships and donor stewardship.

In the fall of 2018 new Daktronics video scoreboards and a sound system totaling over \$200,000 were installed in Rice Auditorium to enhance the game day experience for Wildcat fans and student-athletes.

The first major athletic project that was completed under the guidance of Powicki was the Bob Cunningham Field/Memorial Stadium Renovation project. The project began in May, 2013 and was highlighted by installation of artificial turf, ornamental fencing, press box graphics and new goal posts. The \$1.6 million project also included the widening, lengthening and re-sodding of the Wildcat Soccer Pitch, along with installing new irrigation, facility fencing, scoreboard and making the facility ADA accessible. The Dr. LeRoy Simpson Track at Memorial Stadium was re-surfaced and painted in the summer of 2014 as the final phase of the project.

Powicki currently serves on the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association Board, NCAA Division II Central Regional Advisory Committee for baseball and is on the Northern Sun Conference Hall of Fame Committee. He also serves locally as the Wayne Kiwanis Board President, Vice President of the Wayne Area Economic Development Board of Directors and Revitalize Wayne Committee.

Powicki currently serves on the NCAA Division II Athletic Directors Association Board, NCAA Central Regional Advisory Committee for baseball and is on the Northern Sun Conference Hall of Fame Committee. He also serves locally as the Wayne Kiwanis Board President along with the Wayne Area Economic Development Board of Directors and Revitalize Wayne Committees.

Prior to arriving at Wayne State, Powicki served as Assistant Athletic Director at Minnesota State University in Mankato, Minnesota. He was the Assistant Athletic Director for Marketing and Corporate Partnerships from 2008-10 and was promoted to Assistant Director of Athletics for Development and Strategic Partnerships in 2010 where he served in that role until July 2012 when he arrived at Wayne State.

While at MSU, Powicki successfully developed and executed the athletics department revenue generation plan, responsible for generating \$1.7 million annually. Powicki managed all fundraising, development and marketing operations while overseeing the athletic department marketing/fundraising staff.

Powicki also served as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs at Upper Iowa University from 2004-2008 where he was a part of the Peacocks transition from NCAA Division III to NCAA Division II status and into the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. While at Upper Iowa, Powicki monitored all team operations, recruiting and fundraising budgets. Powicki oversaw the UIU Recreation and Fitness Center staff, budget and overall operation.

In his time at Upper Iowa he created and sold athletic corporate sponsorship opportunities, supervised and coordinated all athletic department fundraising activities, developed and implemented the Peacock Club for donors and successfully completed the "Road to Glory" athletic facility capital improvement project. He also served as tournament director for various national and regional NCAA Division II Championship events.

During his tenure at UIU, Powicki served as an adjunct professor for the Exercise and Sports Studies within the Department of Education. Powicki obtained his bachelor degree from the University of Iowa in exercise science in and earned his masters degree in exercise and sport science/sport administration from Wisconsin-La Crosse.

Mike has two daughters - Faith and Elle (pronounced L) - and resides in Wayne.



WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Memorial Stadium / Bob Cunningham Field

Memorial Stadium has been “Home of the Wildcats” since 1931 when the college purchased 11 acres of land for athletic fields. The grandstand was constructed in 1933. The stadium was officially designated Memorial Stadium following World War II in honor of the Wayne State students who served in the war. Bob Cunningham Field was named in 1993 for the WSC three-sport Hall of Fame standout (1936-39).

The press box underwent a complete renovation with replacement done in 2018. The new structure is 5,220 square feet and includes an elevator along with club level for corporate events.

The main stadium has seating for 2,500 fans while the bleachers on the east side of the field can seat an additional 750 fans. During the summer of 2013, Cunningham Field underwent a renovation with synthetic field turf replacing the grass surface.

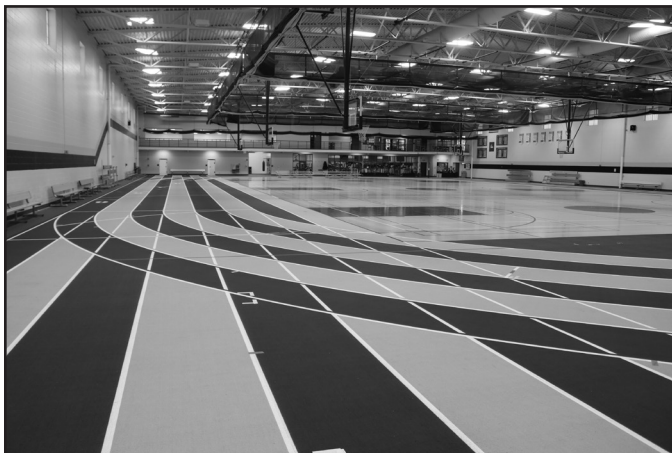


Recreation Center

The Wayne State College Recreation Center opened in 1987 and is the college’s main facility for student recreation and selected athletic activities.

The main area in the Recreation Center provides a six-lane running track that was resurfaced in 2021 and has three full-size courts for basketball, volleyball, tennis and badminton are also housed in the rec center. Racquetball, weight training, aerobics, gymnastics, wrestling and sauna facilities are all available to WSC students, faculty and staff.

The Recreation Center also houses locker rooms for Wildcat athletic teams and offices for the WSC athletic department.





WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Rice Auditorium

Rice Auditorium serves as the home for the Wildcat volleyball squad as well as men's and women's basketball teams. Recent upgrades to the arena include the stage conversion project in 2022, new baskets and rebranded playing surface in 2019 and a new scoreboard, videoboard and sound system in the fall of 2018.

The gymnasium area seats approximately 2,500 for basketball games and volleyball matches. Named for John D. Rice, Wayne State College president from 1951-56, Rice Auditorium was the site of the 1999 NCAA Division II North Central Regional Men's Basketball Championships, the 2006 NSIC Red Baron Women's Basketball Classic, 2012 NCAA Division II Central Regional Women's Basketball Championships, 2022 NCAA Division II Central Region Volleyball Championships and 2023 NSIC Volleyball Championships.



Wildcat Strength/Conditioning Center

Recognizing the importance of first-class facilities for their student athletes, the Wayne State College athletic department completed a state-of-the-art renovation to its athletic facilities in the fall of 2008, building a new weight room at Memorial Stadium.

All Wayne State student athletes have utilized the benefits of new weight room equipment that features 18 platforms and racks, dumbbells and selectorized machines. The facility allows 72 student athletes to work out at the same time.

The project has enhanced Wayne State's ability to attract high quality student athletes and provide current team members the resources necessary to compete at the NCAA Division II level.



WSC Soccer Complex

Located east of Memorial Stadium and adjacent to the baseball field, the WSC soccer field made its debut in the fall of 1997, in time for the inaugural Wildcat soccer season. The most recent improvements to the facility happened in 2022 when new field turf was installed replacing the natural grass surface.





WAYNE STATE FACILITIES



Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex

The Kirk Gardner Indoor Athletic Complex was completed in September, 2020 and has benefitted all athletic teams at Wayne State College. The space in the former Carlson Natatorium turned the indoor swimming pool area into an indoor turf sports facility.

The indoor complex features three batting cages/nets along with putting greens and volleyball net hook ups along with employee offices on the balcony above that overlooks the practice area.

Wildcat athletic teams utilize this new facility in preparing for the start of their seasons, especially spring sports that can not get outside to practice before the start of the season with winter conditions.



Pete Chapman Baseball & Softball Complex

The baseball and softball complex opened in the spring of 1996. Located north of Memorial Stadium, the complex provides a picturesque setting for baseball and softball games. The baseball field received a face lift in the summer of 2004 with the addition of lockerrooms, rest rooms, a concession stand and a press box. A new outfield fence was installed before the start of the 2005 season.

In the spring of 2006, the facility was named the Pete Chapman Baseball/Softball Complex in honor of the late Wayne State College athletic director/football coach and his contributions to the Wildcat athletic department. In the fall of 2006, a locker room/press box was constructed at the softball field, giving softball players their own locker room facilities. Prior to the start of the 2007 season, a new 10-inning electronic scoreboard was installed at the baseball field.

In the fall of 2007, a concrete pad and walkway was installed from the Recreation Center parking lot to the baseball/softball complex. The concrete walkway replaced the previous hard rock path, making it easier for fans and the handicapped to watch Wildcat softball action. A large concrete pad was also poured between the softball and baseball fields and the area between the clubhouses had new sod installed, making the Pete Chapman Complex even more fan-friendly.

In the spring/summer of 2008, batting cages and an enclosed pitching cage/bullpen area were also constructed north of the softball clubhouse giving Wildcat softball players more tools to work on their skills. The summer of 2009 saw a new wood fence installed in the outfield for softball.

The Pete Chapman Softball Complex hosted the 2010 NCAA Division II Central Regional and a new digital scoreboard was installed at the softball field in the spring of 2011, making the Pete Chapman Complex one of the premier softball/baseball facilities in the Central Region.





ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES



Muffin Morris *Head Athletic Trainer*



Dr. Muffin Morris is in her 16th year (2023-24) at Wayne State College as the Head Athletic Trainer. She oversees athletic training for all 15 sports at Wayne State College and is the head athletic trainer for football and men's basketball.

She also serves as an advisor to the WSC Student Athlete Advisory Committee and worked three years (2013-16) as senior women's administrator.

Prior to arriving at Wayne State, Morris worked four years at the University of South Dakota. She served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer and worked with football, swimming/diving, track and field/cross country and volleyball programs with the Coyotes.

Morris, a native of Chariton, Iowa, earned her bachelor's degree from Buena Vista University in athletic training in 2004. She received her master's degree from the University of South Dakota in 2006 in health, physical education and recreation and obtained her doctorate degree in adult/higher education from the University of South Dakota on July 31, 2008.

Morris resides in Wayne.

Dr. Joseph Carreau *Board Eligible Orthopaedic Surgeon*



Dr. Joseph Carreau joined CNOS in 2016 after completing fellowship in Orthopaedic Sports Medicine at the University of Iowa. He is originally from Colorado where he attended Colorado State University for his undergraduate education. Thereafter, he pursued medical school at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska and in 2005 traveled to San Diego to complete his orthopaedic surgery residency at the University of California, San Diego. There he received extensive

training in adult and pediatric trauma and joint replacement surgery. He developed a special interest in advanced arthroscopy and the treatment of athletic injuries, thus chose to pursue fellowship training in Sports Medicine through the University of Iowa.

HEAD COACH JEFF KAMINSKY



Jeff Kaminsky is in his eighth year (2023-24) as Head Men's Basketball Coach at Wayne State College. He has increased the win total of the Wildcats in his six of his seven seasons at the school and has records of 98-98 overall and 72-71 in NSIC games. In his 36 years as a head coach, Kaminsky's overall record is 550-465.

Wayne State captured a third NSIC South Division title in the last five seasons under Kaminsky in 2022-23 recording an 18-11 overall record and 13-9 mark in the NSIC South Division. The Wildcats set



a new school record shooting 80.1 percent (370-462) from the free throw line, which ranked third-best in NCAA Division II. Fifth-year senior Jordan Janssen capped a stellar Wildcat career as the school's all-time leader in scoring (2,104) and rebounding (1,146) earning All-NSIC First Team and NABC All-Central Region First Team honors. He also became Wayne State's first-ever College Sports Communicators Academic All-American earning Second Team honors.

Under Kaminsky in the 2021-22 season, Wayne State finished 14-12 overall and third place in the NSIC South Division with an 11-8 league mark. The 'Cats had two All-NSIC performers - Justin Eagins (First Team) and Jordan Janssen (Second Team) and were ranked in the NCAA Division

II Central Region Rankings for a second straight season. WSC led the NSIC in turnover margin (+3.12) and steals per game (7.38).

In the COVID-shortened 2021 season, Kaminsky coached the Wildcats to a second NSIC South Division title in three seasons, going 11-7 overall and 10-4 in the NSIC South Division. He also led the Wildcats to the NCAA Division II National Tournament for the first time in 21 years as WSC fell to MSU Moorhead in the opening round of the NCAA Central Regional in Aberdeen, South Dakota. Kaminsky was named NSIC South Division Coach of the Year following the successful season for the Wildcats. Junior center Jordan Janssen was named NSIC South Division Player of the Year and NABC First Team All-Central Region while Justin Eagins collected NSIC South Division Freshman of the Year honors.

Wayne State was 10-22 overall and 7-15 in the NSIC South Division in the 2019-20 season. Kaminsky recorded his 500th career victory on November 22, 2019 with a 73-63 win over Central Missouri. Sophomore center Jordan Janssen collected All-NSIC Second Team honors after averaging 16.9 points and 10.1 rebounds with 17 double-doubles during the season.

Under Kaminsky in 2018-19 the Wildcats posted a 21-10 record and earned a share of the NSIC South Division title with a 14-8 league mark. It was the first 20-win season for the Wildcat program since 1999-2000 and was just the second winning season at WSC in the last 10 years. WSC received its first regional ranking in nearly 20 years and the team's nine game win streak at the beginning of the season was the longest since Greg McDermott's final campaign in Wayne (1999-



2000).

The 2018-19 Wildcats led the NSIC for a second straight season under Kaminsky in most turnovers created (13.8) while also topping the league in turnover margin (+3.45), steals per game (7.3) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.337). WSC had three players earn All NSIC Honors - Kendall Jacks (First Team), Trevin Joseph (Second Team) and Vance Janssen (Honorable Mention).

The Wildcats were 14-17 and 9-13 in league play during the 2017-18 campaign. It was a four win improvement over his first season on the Wildcats sidelines. WSC ranked first in the NSIC in turnovers created (13.5) and was third in the league in turnover margin at +2.52. The Wildcats also improved in scoring defense allowing 2.3 points per game fewer than the previous season to rank sixth in the league.

Under Kaminsky in 2016-17, the Wildcats posted a 10-19 overall record and 8-14 mark in the NSIC South Division in his first season as head coach. WSC doubled its win total from the previous season (5-24), starting the year with a road win at Missouri Western 70-57 that snapped a 17-game road losing streak dating back to January 31, 2015. The Wildcats ended the year with six road wins, one more than the previous three years combined.

WSC also made substantial improvements defensively in 2016-17 under Kaminsky as the Wildcats allowed nearly 10 fewer points than the previous season. The 'Cats ranked sixth in the league allowing 75.8 points per game after inheriting a team that was 16th the previous year while allowing 85.1 points a contest. Wayne State also ranked first in the league in turnover margin (+3.07) averaging only 10.8 turnovers a game while creating a league-high 13.9 a contest.

When hired at WSC, Kaminsky brought 29 years of collegiate head coaching experience and over 450 career wins to the Wildcat program. Kaminsky served 11 seasons as the head coach at Valley City State University in North Dakota before coming to Wayne, compiling a 183-144 record that included five 20-win seasons in his last nine years at the school. His 2015-16 team recorded a 22-11 record and advanced to the second round of the NAIA Division II National Tournament while finishing the season ranked #21 in the final NAIA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll.

Kaminsky's 2012-13 team posted a 23-7 record at Valley City State while advancing to the NAIA National Tournament for the first time since 1987.

Kaminsky also served 11 years (1994-2005) as head coach at Wisconsin-Superior where he also served as the interim athletic director overseeing 16 sports from 2000-2004.

His first collegiate head coaching job was at Mid State Technical College in Wisconsin where Kaminsky spent seven years as head coach, accumulating a 153-70 record with three consecutive Wisconsin Junior College State Championships.

Kaminsky began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Division I Kent State in the 1985-86 season, helping the Golden Flashes to a 19-10 record and second place finish in the Mid American Conference.

Kaminsky graduated from Grand Valley State University in Michigan where he was voted GLIAC Scholar Athlete of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year as a senior helping GVSU to a 21-7 record and Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament. He began his collegiate playing career at College of DuPage in Illinois where he was a Junior College Honorable Mention All-American in the 1982-83 season helping his team to a 28-4 record. Kaminsky was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in June, 2022.

Kaminsky obtained his bachelor degree from Grand Valley State in psychology and earned his master's degree from Kent State University in sport psychology.

ASSISTANT COACH NATHAN STOVER



Nathan Stover Assistant Men's Basketball Coach



Nathan Stover enters his eighth year (2023-24) as Assistant Men's Basketball Coach for Wayne State College.

WSC won a third NSIC South Division title in the last five seasons in the 2022-23 season going 18-11 overall and 13-9 in the NSIC South Division. It marked the sixth time in seven years that Wayne State increased its win total under Stover.

Wayne State was 14-12 overall and finished third in the NSIC South Division at 11-8 during the 2021-22 campaign. The 'Cats led the NSIC in turnover margin (+3.12)

and steals per game (7.38).

Stover helped coach the Wildcats to a second NSIC South Division title in three years in 2021, posting an 11-7 record and 10-4 mark in the NSIC South Division. WSC earned the #4 seed to the NCAA Central Regional, marking the first time in 21 years that the Wildcats qualified for the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball National Tournament.

The Wildcats improved their season win total for three straight seasons under Stover as WSC finished 21-10 overall in 2018-19 and won a share of the NSIC South Division regular season title with a 14-8 league mark. Wayne State led the NSIC in turnovers created for a second straight season (13.8) and also topped the league in turnover margin (+3.45) and steals per game (7.3).

Stover helped the Wildcats to a four game improvement in the 2017-18 season as WSC finished 14-17 and 9-13 in the NSIC. The Wildcats lowered their scoring defensive average by another 2.3 points compared to the previous season and created a league high 13.5 turnovers per game.

In his first season (2016-17) at Wayne State, Stover helped the Wildcats double its win total from the previous season, going 10-19 after inheriting a team that was 5-24. Under Stover, the Wildcat defense improved 10 spots in the NSIC going from 16th at 85.1 points a game in 2015-16 to sixth at 75.8 points per contest in the 2016-17 campaign.

Stover came to Wayne State after serving 11 years as assistant coach at Valley City State University in North Dakota where he also worked as the intramural director at VCSU. Stover helped turn around a Viking basketball program, recording five 20-win seasons in nine years to go with two NAIA national tournament appearances while posting a 183-144 overall record.

Stover helped coach the Vikings to a 22-11 record and a share of the North Star Athletic Association regular season title. Valley City State also advanced to the second round of the NAIA national tournament and finished the season ranked #21 in the final NAIA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll. VCSU also advanced to the NAIA national tournament in the 2012-13 season under Stover with a 23-7 mark.

Prior to arriving at Valley City State, Stover spent four years in the high school coaching ranks serving three seasons (2002-05) as the head boys basketball coach at Jamestown High School in North Dakota. He was also the head girls and head boys basketball coach at Harvey High School in North Dakota during the 2001-02 year.

Stover got his start in collegiate coaching as a student assistant coach at North Dakota State working under Tom Billeter and Ray Giacoletti. He was later moved up to graduate assistant coach from 1999-2001 and worked under Greg McDermott (former WSC head coach and current Creighton head coach) and Ben Jacobson (head coach at Northern Iowa).

Stover graduated from Valley City State University in 1999 with a bachelor of science degree in elementary education and obtained his master's degree in sport management from North Dakota State in 2006.

Nathan and his wife, Kristin, have two children - a daughter Kayleigh (8) and son Ethan (5).

Mason Denholm Coaching Assistant



Mason Denholm is in his second year (2023-24) as a coaching assistant with Wayne State men's basketball.

Wayne State captured the NSIC South Division title for the third time in the last five seasons in the 2022-23 season with records of 18-11 overall and 13-9 in the NSIC South Division in Denholm's first season at WSC.

Denholm comes to WSC after spending the last three years as assistant coach (two as a graduate assistant) at Grand View University where he helped lead the 2021-22 team to a 17-11 overall record and 12-7 league mark while advancing to the NAIA National Tournament. The 2021-22 team tied for second in the Heart of America Athletic Conference after being picked 12th in the pre-season coaches' poll. Denholm helped recruit one All-American and five All-Conference players as an assistant at Grand View.

Denholm attended Grand View University where he was a player on the Vikings men's basketball team and was on the 2016-17 NAIA National Tournament Team. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in business management in 2017 and earned a master's degree in sport management in 2018.

Josh Lorenson is in his second season (2023-24) as a graduate assistant coach with the Wayne State men's basketball team.

Lorenson comes to WSC after serving as manager with the University of Minnesota men's basketball team. Duties included setting up and cleaning up for practice and games, assist with team travel, handling equipment and team gear, assist the team during games and other duties.

A graduate of Stillwater High School in Minnesota, Lorenson has also worked youth basketball camps.

Lorenson earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Minnesota in sport management and will pursue a master's degree at Wayne State College in sport and recreation management.





2023-24 WILDCAT OUTLOOK



The Wildcats finished 18-11 last season and won the NSIC South Division title for a third time in five seasons with a 13-9 league mark.

Eighth year head coach Jeff Kaminsky, who is 98-98 on the Wildcat bench, needs to replace three starters from last year's team that includes the school's all-time leading scorer (2,104) and rebounder (1,146) Jordan Janssen, shooting guard Nate Mohr who was a 1,000 point scorer (14th / 1,307) along with the school's #4 3-point shooter (257) and Nick Ferrarini, who scored 1,027 points in his three years at WSC. The Wildcats also lost shooting guard Justin Eagins (11.3 ppg), a two-time All NSIC selection, who transferred to Minnesota State.

"Although we lost our four top scorers and three 5th year seniors, surprisingly my first comment is that we are still an experienced team," said Coach Kaminsky. "We have six



players on our roster who are in their fourth season who have all been a part of our rotation in the past. I think the new players we have on our roster will meet the specific needs that our team has based on the strengths of our returners. We will have one of our most athletic and versatile teams during my time as the coach at Wayne State. I am excited about the versatility that our team has on the defensive end and the balance we can have offensively. We will have several players taking on expanded roles this season. I am looking forward to that."



Eight of the 16 players on this year's team have never played in an NCAA collegiate game - two redshirt freshmen, five true freshmen and a junior college transfer.

Wayne State was picked 11th in the 2023-24 NSIC Men's Basketball Preseason Coaches' Poll released October 12th by the league office in Burnsville, Minnesota. Redshirt sophomore guard Alec



Millender was listed as the Wildcat to Watch in the NSIC this season.

WSC does return two starters from last year - junior forward Cody McCullough and junior guard Jay Saunders. McCullough averaged 8.2 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season (5th-NSIC) while tied for third in blocked shots per game (1.2). Saunders started all 29 games at guard and accounted

for 6.3 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.2 assists per contest.

The 'Cats also return redshirt sophomore guard Alec Millender, who was a medical redshirt last season after averaging 10 points and 2.7 assists per game.

"Not only is Alec a really good player, he is an outstanding leader," commented Kaminsky. "In his first season (20-21), Alec was honorable mention all-conference. He played injured much of his sophomore season and missed last year entirely with a season ending surgery. Alec is healthy and ready to have an impactful season. He can change the game with his defensive ability, passing, and scoring. He truly makes everyone else around him better."

The Wildcats also added JUCO All-American Trey Deveaux (Central CC), who was NJCAA Division II First Team All-American last season averaging 18.9 points per game while helping the Raiders advance to the national tournament with a 22-11 record.

Five returners will be called on to help fill the roles of some of the departed Wildcats this season.

Sophomore guard David Harmon played in all 29 games last season and accounted for 3.6 points a contest. Junior forward Elijah Watson saw action in 14 games and averaged 3.1 points and 2.1 rebounds a contest.

Junior forward Noah Erickson appeared in 24 games last year, recording 1.6 points a contest, while junior guard Sean Stokes and sophomore guard Ryan Blum bring experience to the Wildcat roster.

This year's roster is filled out with five freshmen - 6-3 guard JJ Ferrin from Omaha Skutt Catholic HS, Landon Classen, a 6-3 guard from O'Neill High School, 6-7 freshman forward Wade Voss (Lincoln Southeast), 6-6 freshman guard Zach Anderson of Martin County West High School in Minnesota and 6-8 freshman forward Aiden Sullivan of Olathe Northwest High School in Kansas.

The 2023-24 schedule features an exhibition contest at Creighton, ranked eighth in Division I to start the season, a three-game trip to Puerto Rico along with 15 home games in Rice Auditorium. The 'Cats open the season Friday, November 10th in Puerto Rico against Sagrado Corazon and the first home contest is Friday, November 17th vs. Simpson College from Iowa.

THE NORTHERN SUN INTERCOLLEGIATE CONFERENCE



THE HISTORY OF THE NSIC

From its modest origin as a six-team alliance over nine decades ago, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference has matured into a 15-team union of upper Midwest colleges and universities to form arguably the strongest affiliation in NCAA Division II.

The NSIC can trace its roots to 1932 when six schools, including Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University, Mankato, Minnesota State University Moorhead, St. Cloud State University, University of Minnesota Duluth and Winona State University signed on as charter members. All remain active subscribers of the league today.

Southwest Minnesota State University was added in 1969, followed by Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (NE) in 1978, Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota Crookston in 1999, the University of Mary and Upper Iowa University in 2006, Augustana University in 2008 and Minot State University and the University of Sioux Falls in 2012.

Minnesota State, St. Cloud State and Minnesota Duluth left the league to join the North Central Conference but returned to the NSIC in 2008. University of Minnesota, Morris and Michigan Tech University were once part of the NSIC family as well. Upper Iowa left the league following the 2022-23 season.

In 1992 the NSIC became a true athletic showcase for both men and women with the merger of the traditional Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) and the Northern Sun Conference (NSC), the home of women's athletics since 1979.

Before NSIC affiliates became certified for championship competition in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in 1995, its member institutions filled prominent roles in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). NIC and NSC clubs annually dispatched qualified student-athletes to national tournaments and captured several NAIA teams and individual championships.

The NSIC continues to make a major imprint nationally, winning 25 national titles since 2006. Winona State men claimed NCAA II Basketball Championships in 2006 and 2008 and narrowly missed a third crown, falling in a last second shot in 2007. In addition, the Warriors established a NCAA II record of 57 consecutive victories.

Concordia University launched an ongoing streak of seven consecutive NCAA II Volleyball Championships in 2007. In 2008 the Golden Bears won 37 straight matches after a season opening loss on their way to a second consecutive title and scripted a marvelous encore in 2009 with a perfect 37-0 finish, a third straight national crown and a winning streak of 74 straight matches. In 2010 the Golden Bear extended that NCAA record win streak to 75 before dropping their second match of the season. They started 2010 with a 10-4 record before ripping off 22 straight wins on their way to their fourth straight national title. In 2011, after overcoming midseason injuries, the Golden Bears hit their stride. The Golden Bears knocked off No. 1 and undefeated Cal State San Bernardino to become the first team in the history of NCAA Division II women's volleyball, to capture a fifth consecutive NCAA Division II Championship. Then in 2012, the Golden Bears again made a late season and championship match surge as they defeated Tampa 3-2 after trailing 0-2 to win their sixth straight NCAA Division II Volleyball National Championship. In 2013 Concordia-St. Paul won the NSIC regular season title, but was defeated in the NSIC Tournament Championship by Minnesota Duluth. But from there the Golden Bears ripped off six straight NCAA postseason wins, extending their streak to 42, on their way to a 3-0 sweep of BYU-Hawaii to win another NCAA National Championship. After a two year hiatus, the Golden Bears return to the top of Division II volleyball as they won the 2016 and 2017 national championships.

In a most surprising run, Minnesota Duluth completed a perfect 15-0 season by winning the 2008 NCAA Division II Football Championship. The Bulldogs, limited to only 24 scholarships by league rule, swept a field of fully-funded teams, including top ranked Grand Valley State and number three Northwest Missouri State. Two years later, in 2010, the Bulldogs repeated that feat, going 15-0 again to win the national championship. The Bulldogs became the first NCAA Division II football squad to win two national championships with undefeated records.

Minnesota State added more luster to the league by finishing 32-2 and claiming the 2008-09 NCAA II Women's Basketball Championship. The Mavericks rolled to a wild 103-94 victory over Franklin Pierce to set a NCAA record for total points in the title game.

In 2017 the Maverick softball team went 64-7 to win the National Championship. The Mavericks went 10-1 in NCAA play, including 5-0 in Salem Virginia as they defeated Angelo State 5-1 in the championship game.

The Mavericks added their third team national championship in 2021-22 when they took home the women's indoor track & field championship. Makayla Jackson took home individual championships in the long jump and the 60m dash, while Denisha Cartwright won the 60m hurdles title, helping the Mavericks score 56 team points.

Augustana got into the mix of national championships in 2011 when their women's cross country team turned in a true team performance in Spokane, Washington. All five Viking runners earned All-American status as Augustana won the first cross country national championship in NSIC history.

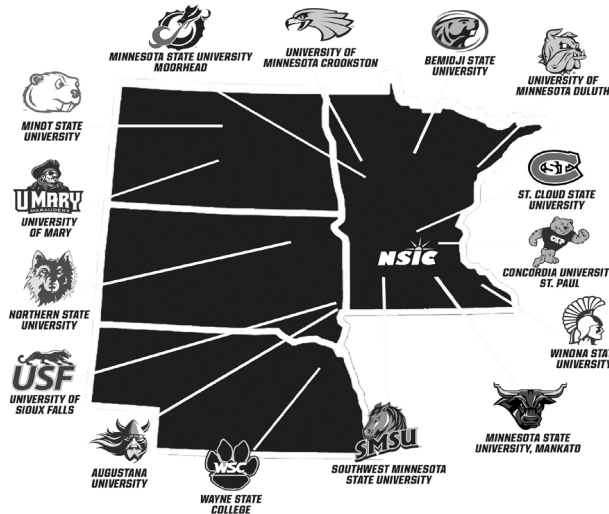
The Vikings men's basketball team won the 2015-16 National Championship after going 34-2 and defeating Lincoln Memorial 90-81 in Frisco, Texas. The 2018 Augustana baseball team became the first NSIC institution to win a national championship in baseball, as the Vikings had an impressive post season, going 8-1 in NCAA play and a perfect 4-0 in Cary, North Carolina to finish the season 52-9.

In 2019 it was the Augustana Softball team that made a run to the national championship as the Vikings went 61-11 and defeated Texas A&M Kingsville twice by the score of 6-4 to win the National Championship.

After multiple runner-up finishes, the St. Cloud State Huskies finally captured the national championship in wrestling in 2015. They repeated in 2016 and then took home the title again in 2018, 2019 & 2021.

The NSIC has now had 18 student-athletes awarded with the NCAA Elite 90 Award on 21 occasions. Earning the award were Joshua Strong (UMD, MBB, 2023), Kennedy Brady (CSP, VB, 2023), Rachel Rairdon (AUGIE, WCC, 2021), Ryan Schlichte (MSU, FB, 2019), Sasha Hovind (NSU, ODTF, 2018), DJ Polard (NSU, Men's Basketball, 2018), Grant Pulver (UMD, Cross Country, 2017), **Leisa McClintock (Wayne State, Volleyball, 2015)**, Tavia Rutherford (Sioux Falls, Golf, 2015), Claire Sames (SMSU, Volleyball, 2014), Kara Pioske (Concordia-St. Paul, Volleyball 2013), Billy Brockmueller (Sioux Falls, Cross Country 2012, 2014 & IDTF 2014), Ben Keller (Minnesota State, Baseball 2012 & 2013), Cody Lensing (Augustana, Wrestling 2012), Kendra Huettl (Minnesota State, Softball, 2011), Matt Braithwaite (Augustana, Cross Country, 2010) and Lauren Brown (Winona State, Outdoor Track & Field, 2010).

Member schools continue to emphasize the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. The NSIC is committed to providing rewarding experiences for its student-athletes, and while the challenges that loom are sizable, indeed, the NSIC is surely well positioned for the future.
