## Review of the 2013 Season

After a decade playing in Cambs Junior League 1, promotion to the Senior Leagues for the 2013 season began well for the **Barley 1st XI** when they defeated **Balsham** by eight wickets. Led once more by **Brian Symes**, the much anticipated fixture against **Godolphin**, scheduled for the second weekend, which would be the first meeting between the teams since Barley's victory over the Newmarket club in the Challenge Cup Final of 2012, was unfortunately rained off. A fifty run defeat to **Sawston** in week 3 was soon forgotten as Barley bounced back with 7 and 8 wicket victories against **Fordham** and **Balsham** and a loss, by 13 runs, to **Horseheath** was then followed by wins against **Wilbrahams**, **Bottisham & Lode** and **Fordham**. In a dramatic tie, Barley then lost by just 4 runs to **Cottenham** followed by a loss to a strong NCI XI but followed those two reverses with victories against **St Giles**, **Newport** and **Girton**. This raised hopes that Barley could push for promotion but a second loss to **NCI** followed by a comprehensive loss to **Godolphin**, by 110 runs, dented hopes of moving up to Cambs Senior 2 in 2014. Revenge for their earlier loss to **Sawston** came in week 14 followed by a 6 wicket victory against **Girton** which once more revived hopes of promotion. These were soon dashed after losing by just two wickets to **Wilbrahams** and despite winning their final three fixtures against **Newport**, **Girton** and **Bottisham & Lode**, Barley ended up just below the promotion places having won 15 from 22 fixtures. Top of the averages was **Sami Ullah** who scored 636, averaging 42.4 including two centuries. He just pipped **Shafi Ullah** who scored 619 runs in 2013. The pair also topped the bowling statistics with **Shafi** taking 43 wickets at 14.2 and **Sami** taking 59 wickets at an amazing 7.7 including 7 for 16 against **Newport** amongst a total of six, five wicket hauls. **Zahid Lalporwal** was kept busy behind the stumps by some lively bowling and ended up with a good haul of 12 catches and a stumping.

2014 will see Barley resume hostilities with some familiar foes, including **Barrington** and **Cokenach**, who won Junior 1 South in 2013 but were pipped to the league cup by **Chippenham**. New opposition for 2014 will include **Cherry Hinton**, **Chippenham** and **Yelling**. Jamie Walters, a Barley stalwart, retired from 1st XI cricket during 2013, but may return in 2014 for the seconds, whilst **Ali Wallace** and **Rick Wilson** have lost their marbles and moved to Cokenach for 2014. As per usual, we welcome several new players to Barley this season.

**Barley 2nd XI had an unusual but enjoyable season in 2013.** In their infinite wisdom, the Cambs Cricket Association once again sought to reorganise structure of the league with the result that Barley 2nd XI played in a combined League of teams from divisions 4 and 5. Facing 17 different teams only once meant that the "Seconds", ably led once again by **Graham Litson**, encountered a wide variation in the quality of their opposition. Losing eight matches with nine either won or cancelled due to bad weather, highlights of the season included a 99 run win against **Mill Green**, where **Ed Whybrow** scored 102 on his debut for the Barley and along with **Chris Allan** made an opening partnership of 200. **Chris Allan** topped the batting with 343 runs, including two 96's, followed by **Dave Riggs** with 255 including a 95 not out. **Peter Chuck** took 25 wickets at 14.2 whilst **Graham Litson** took 24 at 26.2 including 5 for 50 against **Linton**. **Lorcan George** took 14 wickets and would have taken many more had he not been regularly called up to the 1st XI where his abilities have yet to be fully utilised. **Mohammed Din** only played three games for the 2nd XI but managed one excellent performance when he took 6 for 38 against **Mill Green**. In 2014 **Craig Jackson** will be taking over as captain of the Barley 2nd XI and is looking forward to a season in Cambs Junior 5 where Barley will face some familiar teams from 2013 as well as new boys **Cokenach, Wilbrahams, Balsham** and for the first time in many years, **Langley**.

**The friendly XI was undefeated in 2013.** Led by **Lorcan George** and with regular cup matches scheduled throughout the season, we were lucky to fit in nine friendly matches. Of these, six were won by Barley whilst 3 were drawn or abandoned due to the weather. These games, once again, were invaluable for introducing new players to the club and provided a run out for a new crop of good young players including **Elliott Bonnett, Robbie Ponting, Eric Davis, James** and **Ben Trewitt, Evan Goldman, Luke** and **Tom McMahon, Rob Knobel-Forbes** and **Joseph de Souza**.

**Many thanks must once again go to Rod, Anne and Brian Symes for the groundwork they carry out at the club and thanks must also go to all those wives, girlfriends and players who prepare our excellent teas as well as to all the committee members and friends of Barley CC who support us every weekend throughout the summer and who contribute to a variety of fund raising events held throughout the year.**

CRICKET.—During the last week cricket has been the chief game and topic at Barley. Commencing on Tuesday, May 26th, with a match between a team of ladies of Barley and neighbourhood captained by Miss M. Boucher, and a team of gentlemen, the gentlemen playing left handed with broomsticks, just managed to win. Miss Gibbs for the ladies with 17, and Mr. C. Lewis, of Cambridge, for the gentlemen with 41, were top scorers. For the ladies Miss M. Boucher made an ideal captain and wicket-keeper.—On Thursday, May 28th, Melbourn cricketers came to Barley and were rather badly beaten, owing chiefly to the effective bowling of Nat Hayes, and the batting of G. Casbon who made 38 not out; and on Saturday, May 30th, Great Chishall cricketers came to Barley, the home team again proving victorious by 25 runs on the first innings, Nat Hayes and W. Wilkerson's bowling being very effective for Barley. W. Pegram for Chishall 9, and A. Livermore for Barley, 17, were top scorers. The culmination of the cricket week finished up on Whit-Monday with the most interesting match of the series, viz, two barley teams of cricketers under and over 25 years of age; the veterans being captained by Mr. Clear Wilkerson, and the juniors by Mr. Chuck. This was a very interesting game, the play being very even, the juniors eventually winning by 7 runs on the first innings. A. Scripps for the old ones and R. Day for the juveniles did most damage with the ball. In batting Herbert Slater 20 for the seniors, and Ernest Chuck 23 for the juniors, were highest scorers. This match was played on the Plaistow, and was witnessed by two or three hundred people, the delightful weather bringing out both old and young.

## Barley cricket match report from 100 years ago

HERTS & CAMBS REPORTER AND ROYSTON CROW

FRIDAY JULY 17 1914

CRICKET FESTIVITIES. HERTS POLICE BEATEN.

Although the **annual match between the Herts. Police (E Division) and Barley** had to be postponed from Thursday until Saturday that did not mitigate in any way against the enthusiasm of the villagers, who turned up in large numbers and cheered themselves hoarse, when Barley brought off a double victory over the redoubtable "men in blue." Last year, it will be recalled, the police won the cricket match by one run, but this year they had to eat humble pie, being defeated by 7 runs, the victory being largely due to the bowling of veteran *Nat Hayes* and *W. E. Wilkinson*, and the forceful batting of *A. Hayes* and *E. Chuck*.

The only batsmen among the "Peelers" to make a stand were *Jones* and *Smith*, the former being a very pretty bat, with a variety of strokes. It was rather unfortunate that *Pc. Hart*, to whom the success of the festivities is mainly due, should have been given out "stumped" before he had a chance of showing his prowess with the bat, but the decision was undoubtedly a correct one, though it was not well received by the crowd. However, Hart had an opportunity of showing his capabilities later on when with two brilliant catches he dismissed *E. Hayes* and *R. Livermore*.

At the conclusion of the match a hundred yards challenge match was run off between *Pc. Hart* and *W. E. Wilkinson*, the latter in a spirit of bravado giving the "bobby" yards for years - 22 yards start - and getting handsomely beaten by 15 yards, with the result that the funds of the Police Convalescent Home have benefited.

Perhaps the greatest interest was centred in the tug-of-war between eight picked residents of Barley and the men of the Royston section under *Sergt. Chapman*. It was a 12 feet pull, and *Supt. Reed*, who had been present throughout the proceedings acted as judge. The first pull occasioned much excitement. It was a fairly long one, and time and again Barley recovered lost ground, but were eventually pulled over. Great was the excitement when ends were changed, and despite the fact that *Pc. Hart's* little son so far forgot himself as to put his "immense" weight on the rope, Barley had little difficulty in drawing level. The third pull was all in favour of Barley, who secured a popular record, due perhaps to the prowess of an ex-middle weight Army Champion. Both teams with their friends were hospitably entertained to tea by *Mr. Ellis*

**Wilkerson**, who was heartily thanked on the proposition of **Mr. W.E. Wilkinson**, seconded by **Supt. Reed**, the latter being guilty of an awful pun when he congratulated Barley on their victory over Hart's (Herts) police.

**Mr. Wilkerson**, in reply, said he was pleased more because Barley had won. He hoped the fixture would continue to be an annual one. As the match had to be continued, **Mr. Wilkerson** refrained from asking them to drink the health of Barley C. C., but instead he invited the company to smoke to the continued prosperity of the Barley Club.
