At Shenley Academy we reward students who attend school each day and whose attendance is improving. A culture of praise and reward is something we are keen to establish here at Shenley Academy.

Students from Years 9, 10 and 11 have attended various trips to University College Birmingham in November and December. In November, we took students from Years 9 and 10 to World Skills Live. This was a fantastic careers event at the NEC, where students saw live career demonstrations from a range of different employers, including scuba diving, engineering and floristry. In December, we took Year 10 students to a Psychology

Day at the University of Birmingham, where students explored the psychology of the teenage brain. During the last week of term, Year 9 and 10 students also attended UNILIFE 2019: A higher education conference where they will gain an insight into what being a university student is really like. A big thank you to all students who have attended these trips, whose behaviour has been brilliant and we hope they have learnt a lot from them!

For six weeks, Jack and Maddy, two current students from the University of Birmingham, have been coming in to school to run two different coaching programmes for Year 10 students. Maddy has been coaching students on CV building skills, while Jack has been focussing on improving students' confidence for their exams once they reach year 11.

Various different mentoring schemes have also been running at the academy. Joe Deans, a Youth Worker associated with Newman University, has been providing an invaluable mentoring scheme. We are so sad to see Joe move on to a different school next term as his work has been so appreciated by his mentees. Students from Years 9, 10 and 11 have also participated in Aimhigher Plus mentoring with Charlotte, focussing on career aspirations, higher education and exam attainment.

# How to improve your child's attendance:

- Ensure your child attends every day, on time, equipped and ready to learn. Lesson time begins at 8.35am and students should 97%-100% be in the building by 8:25am. Students arriving after 8:35am may be marked absent and will require an explanatory note or the absence will remain unauthorised.
- Ensure the academy

- If your child is ill, contact the academy on the first day of absence and provide an
- explanatory note on their return to school.

  If no contact is received regarding the absence, it is recorded as un-authorised. Ultimately the academy is responsible for deciding if the absence is acceptable or not. Only genuine absence will be authorised. You will be asked to provide medical certificates if your child has a poor attendance record. This may also result in a home visit being conducted by the academy.
- Ensure that medical appointments are made outside of school time.
- Holidays should not be taken in school time. Any Leave of Absence can only be agreed by the Head Teacher and only agreed where there are exceptional circumstances.
- Respond to letters or telephone calls regarding attendance and punctuality.
- Contact your child's form tutor if you are experiencing difficulty in getting your child into school.
