

## BOLDMERE END SEASON ON A HIGH WITH A FUN-FILLED WATER CARNIVAL

July is always an exciting month on the Boldmere swimming calendar as it is associated with our annual Water Carnival. Although highly competitive and still very much an opportunity to score last-minute PBs, it is also the event that swimmers of all ages associate with fun and a celebratory atmosphere.

The Carnival which is usually open to all ages - from 9 years old to masters - was yet again attended by a large cohort of Boldmere swimmers. Over 100 of our own competitors raced against visiting members of Blythe Barracudas, Orion, Oswestry Otters, Halesowen, Lichfield, and Stratford Sharks Swimming Clubs.

The pressure was on for some of our older competitive team members as the standard of the event was really high. And although the Carnival was dominated by our club in attendance terms, we were still thrilled to notch a total of 90 gold medals, as well as 98 silvers and 74 bronzes. There were also 29 4th places, 26 5th, and 27 6th places in the 9-12 year categories. And what about these PBs - all 413 of them, and 2 new county records!

Very importantly though, the event was yet another opportunity for our younger swimmers to test their newly acquired technical and racing skills into the water - and score some fantastic results. We saw many of them beaming with pleasure as they reaped the rewards of their hard work in the pool.

Last, but not least, it was a day filled with dancing, teamwork, and an overall brilliant atmosphere across the board - as all the pictures clearly demonstrate. (cont page 2)

# BOLDMERE SWIMMERS AT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The last couple of weeks (from 22 July to 9 August 2023) saw the best swimmers across all age groups nationwide compete for some of the most coveted swimming titles at Ponds Forge in Sheffield. Once again we want to congratulate Connie P, Tom P, William T, Joshua D-T, Maryse M, and Jude D who qualified and competed at those events.

We already covered the differences between the British and the English (Scottish/Welsh) Championships, the qualification window and criteria in one of our previous newsletters (June 2023). To recap, the Boldmere qualifiers for this year were:

- William T (Boldmere), Maryse M (City of Birmingham / Boldmere) and Jude D (now swimming for Repton but who qualified whilst at Boldmere) competed at the British Summer Championships.
- Connie P and Tom P (Boldmere) plus Joshua D-T and Maryse M (City of Birmingham / Boldmere) who competed at the English Summer Championships.

And didn't they do well! Racing at the British Championships Will, Maryse and Jude swam in 9 events altogether. Jointly, they achieved 8 PBs and reached 2 finals each (Will in the 100m Breaststroke and 200m Breaststroke; Maryse in the 100m Breaststroke and 200m Breaststroke and Jude in the 100m Backstroke and 200m Backstroke). Will secured a Bronze medal in the 100m Breaststroke, breaking the County Record in the process.

At the English Championships Tom, Josh, Maryse and Connie swam in 5 events between them. They achieved 4 PBs and Maryse reached the final of the 200m IM.

Huge congratulations to all of our Boldmere swimmers! You stepped up to the mark, performed magnificently on the national stage and did yourselves and the Club proud. Enjoy your well-earned summer break!

# TEAM BOLDMERE WITH AN IMPRESSIVE MEDAL SCOOP AT THE WELSH NATIONALS 23

This years' Swim Wales Summer Open meet was held at the Wales National Pool Swansea from 3 to 7 August 2023.

Competing for Boldmere were 5 swimmers - Lewis D, Alfie E, Clark H, Ollie B and Cerys T - led by our Head of Junior Swimming Coach Ellen Ratcliffe. Between them, they competed in 20 events and 7 finals over the 5 days and achieved a total of 12 PBs, 12 Top 10 finishers, 3 Gold medals, and 2 Bronze medals.

#### Many congratulations to:

- Lewis D for winning GOLD in the 15yrs 400m IM, 200m Breaststroke and 100m Breaststroke. He also took away the Bronze medal in the 1500m Freestyle. All these accounted also for 6 PBs - impressive, Lewis!
- Alfie E swam extremely well and well deserved his Bronze medal in the 16yrs 200m Butterly. That was a PB for him too!
- Clark H was a finalist in the 17+ 100m backstoke and finished 4th, also scoring a personal best in the process.
- Finally, Olly B was a finalist in the 12yrs 200m Breaststroke event and walked away from Swansea with 4 PBs.

But swimming was not the only thing on the menu there. The team - including swimmers, parents, and the coach - also enjoyed a meal out one of the evenings creating a great social atmosphere and enjoyed themselves hugely outside of the pool!
