- **Defibrillator** the village has a defibrillator on the front of the WI Hall which is checked weekly. If there is a medical emergency in the village that involves using the emergency service 999, an assessment will be made by the operator as to whether it is appropriate to use the defibrillator and the code to access it will be given. They will also automatically send an ambulance. Once activated the defibrillator will talk you through how to use it.
- Ulgham Village Cricket Club the season has started again but with restrictions linked to Covid. The club has carried out quite a bit of refurbishment over the last few months and if anyone can use two steel lockers that are surplus to requirements but don't have locks that work !!! please get in touch with Colin Tait Tel. 07966914715.
- Littering there has been an increase in litter lately, particularly at each end of the village. We do have a group of dedicated residents who pick up litter every month in normal times, but they have not been operating during the lockdown. However, some residents have continued to do this on an individual basis throughout the last year and we thank them for this service.
- **Hedges** a gentle reminder that overhanging hedges should be kept trimmed where they are causing obstruction on footpaths.
- **Mobile Library** this service has just started up again as restrictions are lifted. The library will visit the village once a month beginning in the Forge Estate on June 25<sup>th</sup> between 2 and 2.30pm. For subsequent months, what do potential users of the library think would be a good location, perhaps having one at each end of the village? Please get in touch with anyone on the list at the end of the circular. These services will eventually stop unless we use them.
- Village Website the new address for the village website is ulgham.org. Northumberland is part of a government pilot scheme to increase the speed of broadband to gigabit.
- Ulgham Village Together Facebook Page a good site for sharing information and keeping in touch with residents who use it. However, we are aware that not everyone uses social media and we will always try to pass on any information to everyone in the village whenever we can.
