









Model Of Effective Transition







Consultation with Head Teachers



Worked with Teaching Schools and University



Utilised skilled staff from within existing tutor team and identified staff to develop from across the city



Created an outline programme/flexible



Consulted Head Teachers/ suitability of content



Started delivery September 2013



All courses were observed by a former HMI and feedback from delegates
