At the start of 2014, the British Canoeing Coaching Strategy Group initiated a review of our qualifications. This resulted in proposals to revise the structure, with a phased approach to the development (and implementation) of the various components. The first phase focused on the Club Activity Assistant, piloted at the start of 2016. This was followed by developments within the Leadership strand, including a new Paddlesport Leader Award, rebranding of the 4 and 5 Star awards, and the introduction of a Guide scheme; all launched April 2017.

This next phase focuses on the development of the qualifications previously pitched at UKCC Level 2. The development is, in the main, focused on a restructuring and creating discipline specific pathways available across all disciplines. This will significantly change the prerequisites and the pathway through taught and assessed elements. Direct entry to the Racing Coach Award, removal of the portfolio and specific deliverers.

The 'Coach Awards' will supersede the current Level 2, Moderate/Advanced Water Endorsements, and Discipline Support Modules. The qualifications are designed for people whose core function is to coach paddlers who want to gain/improve paddlesport skills within the discipline chosen. This will include coaching beginners new to the sport, or paddlers looking to develop their skills in the given discipline/environment.

PADDLE-ABILITY

Paddle-Ability is the term used by British Canoeing to describe all Paddlesport activity for disabled people. The term focuses on a person's ability to take part in Paddlesport rather than their disability. British Canoeing encourages and supports anyone with any disability or impairment to participate in competition in specific Paddle-Ability events and mainstream competition. Specific Paddle-Ability events are held at National Regattas in Nottingham from April to September. Racing is based on ability (in time bands).

Entries must be submitted, in advance, with other club entries via the Club Team Leaders. If your club does not already have an appointed team leader please contact

Entrants may have an escort boat to provide support to the starting posts; limited support is also permitted during races. Escort paddlers will be expected to wear yellow escort bibs.

PADDLESAFE – SAFEGUARDING AND PROTECTING CHILDREN

British Canoeing is committed to ensuring that everyone can enjoy Paddlesport in a safe environment in which they are protected from any form of poor practice or abuse. We continue to work towards and maintain the standards set for sport and to implement the requirements set within government guidelines and legislation.

Everyone in Paddlesport has a responsibility to help safeguard and protect those involved in the sport. Sometimes this can be a daunting prospect. To support those involved in our sport British Canoeing and the home nations have developed a range of policies, procedures and guidance. These can be found on www.britishcanoeing.org.uk and each home nation website. We ask that club Secretaries/Welfare Officers know where to find the information and make sure it is shared and discussed at club executive and general meetings.

The procedures stem from the following principles:

- The child's welfare is paramount.
- Anyone under the age of 18 is classed as a child.
- All children, regardless of age, any disability they have, gender, racial origin, religious belief
 and sexual identity have a right to be protected from abuse.
- Coaches, clubs and centres need to be provided with advice to raise awareness of best practice, guidance and support should they become involved in an abuse situation.

Safeguarding Support Officer - While the welfare of young people is the first consideration, British Canoeing recognise that coaches, volunteers and helpers may also require support if an allegation is made against them. In these cases individuals should contact the British Canoeing Safeguarding Support Officer whose role is to listen, support, help and provide advice (contact details below). They will not be involved in the case and will be completely independent of the investigation.

Event Management - Event organisers should take note that there is a requirement to provide a Welfare Officer at all events where children are participating. For further details refer to the guidance sheets on the website – Paddlesafe Events.

Good Practice Guidelines

By following these guidelines you will help to protect both the children/adult at risk in our sport and our coaches/helpers from wrongful allegations.

- Avoid situations where you are alone with one child/adult at risk. British Canoeing
 acknowledges that occasionally there may be no alternative, for example, where a child/
 adult at risk falls ill and has to be taken home. We would stress, however, that one to one
 contact must not be allowed to occur on a regular basis.
- If any form of physical support is required ask the paddler's permission, explain what you are doing and why to both the child/adult at risk and their parents/carers.
- Where possible ask parents/carers to be responsible for children/adults at risk in changing rooms. Always ensure that whoever supervises young people work in pairs.
- Where there are mixed teams/groups away from home, they should always be accompanied by an adult male and female coach/helper.
- Don't allow physically rough or sexually provocative games, or inappropriate talking or touching.
- If it's necessary to do things of a personal nature for children/adult at risk, make sure you
 have another adult accompanying you. Get the consent of the parent/carer and if possible
 the child/adult at risk. Let them know what you are doing and why.

PADDLESAFE – SAFEGUARDING AND PROTECTING CHILDREN

- Ensure that any claims of abuse by a child/adult at risk are taken seriously and that it is dealt
 with by people who know what to do.
- Ensure that the nature and intensity of training does not exceed the capacity of a child's/ adult at risk's ability and stage of development.
- Follow the British Canoeing guidelines for photography and video use (see Guidelines for use
 of Photographic and Filming Equipment)

Ensure your club adheres to British Canoeing best practice guidelines and requirements with particular reference to:

- British Canoeing Safeguarding Children Policy and Safeguarding Adult Policy.
- · British Canoeing Code of Ethics.
- Safe recruitment and vetting practices including appropriate Disclosure checks, where eligible, in accordance with home nation and government guidelines.
- Safeguarding training.
- Club Welfare Officers attend specific training to support their role- Safeguarding and Protecting Children and Time to Listen workshop.
- Publicise your Club/Event Welfare Officer contact details.
- Publicise the NSPCC Child Protection Helpline.

BRITISH CANOEING SPRINT RACING COMPETITION RULES

Issue date: 1 January 2018

Introduction

The purpose of this document is to provide the Rules that govern:

- a) Sprint Racing (named Canoe Sprint by the International Canoe Federation)
- b) The conduct of that Racing

It follows as closely as possible the wording and sequence of the International Canoe Federation Canoe Sprint Competition Rules taking effect from 1st January 2017. However, it also contains some additional regulations or changes to those rules as determined from time to time by British Canoeing Sprint Racing Committee.

The following words, acronyms and abbreviations are referred to in this document:

BC British Canoeing (the Governing Body for Canoeing in Great Britain)

BOA British Olympic Association (the National Olympic Committee for Great Britain)

ICF International Canoe Federation

IOC International Olympic Committee

NOC National Olympic Committee

SRS Sprint Racing Section of BC (responsible to BC for the control of Sprint Racing competitions in canoes and kayaks over distances up to and including 5000 metres)

SRC Sprint Racing Committee (elected by the Sprint Racing Section to carry out the objectives of the Section on a day-to-day basis).

RC Regatta Committee (a sub-committee of the SRC responsible for organising and conducting National championships and other competitions on behalf of BC)

Aims and Definition of Sprint Racing

The aim of a canoe sprint competition is for people to race each other in kayaks and canoes over a clearly defined unobstructed course in the shortest possible time according to the rules. The course should be as flat and still as can be obtained. Although the course length may be any distance up to and including 5,000 metres and competition organised for any craft, the official events and distances recognised by BC and ICF are the following:

For men and women: K1, K2, K4, C1, C2, C4, 200, 500 and 1000 metres

K1, K2, K4, C1, C2, 5000 metres or 2500 for some Junior events

Paracanoe, men and women Kayak KL1, KL2, KL3 200 metres Va'a VL1, VL2, VL3 200 metres

Part V - SPECIAL RULES FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

Part I - GENERAL REGULATIONS

There are three levels of competition: - International, National Status and Club/Regional.

1. INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS

- 1.1 The ICF has ruled that all International Competitions must take place in accordance with the ICF Canoe Sprint Competition Rules. All competitions organised by either BC or a BC Club are considered international if competitors of a foreign country are invited to participate.
- 1.2 These competitions must be supervised or managed by at least one accredited official in possession of a valid ICF Canoe Sprint Official card.
- 1.3 Foreign Nationals (Complies with ICF GR 3).
- 1.3.1 No member of a foreign Federation or club may compete or be invited to compete in an open or national competition within the United Kingdom without permission from the RC.
- 1.3.2 Only the members of clubs or associations affiliated with an ICF Member Federation have the right to participate in an international competition.
- 1.3.3 A competitor is always allowed to take part individually in an international competition but must in each case obtain special permission from his/her national federation.
- 1.3.4 A competitor may take part on behalf of BC provided they are domiciled in the UK, if he/she obtains the authorisation of his/her Federation of origin. This authorisation has to be sent before 30th November prior to the year concerned to the ICF Headquarters with a copy to the Chairman of the ICF Canoe Sprint Committee.
- 1.3.5 If he/she has lived for 2 (two) years or more in the UK, the approval of his/her Federation of origin is no longer required.
- 1.3.6 A competitor may not compete for more than one Federation in any calendar year in the sport of canoeing.

2 NATIONAL STATUS COMPETITION

- 2.1 All competitions announced as National Status competitions shall be held in accordance with BC Sprint Racing Competition Rules.
- 2.2 National Status Competitions are those at which promotions within the National Divisions take place.
- 2.3 National Status Competitions are organised on behalf of BC.
- 2.4 All competitors at National Status Competitions must be registered with the RC and must be BC members or, if racing in a Junior "D" class or Mini Sprint, a member of a club which has a registered youth section and is affiliated to the BC.
- 2.5 Organisers of National Status Competitions shall declare the competition is being held under BC rules.
- 2.6 National Status Competitions require permission from the SRC. Applications shall be directed to the Secretary of the SRC. Such permission would require:
- 2.6.1 Observance of BC Sprint Racing Competition Rules.
- 2.6.2 Inclusion the words "Under BC Rules" on all printed matter issued in connection with the competition.
- 2.6.3 Compliance with Part III Rule 13.5 regarding Regatta Officials.
- 2.7 National Status Competitions will be included in the official BC Calendar of events.
- 2.8 Within 14 days of the close of a competition a completed regatta programme with the official results, shall be sent by the Organisers to the Secretary of the SRC.

3 CLUB/REGIONAL REGATTAS

- 3.1 BC members are allowed to participate with non BC members.
- 3.2 No promotions will be made at Club or Regional Regattas. Performance will not affect National Ranking.
- 3.3 The Rules and Classes may be altered to suit the event requirements.
- 3.4 Organisers of Club & Regional Regattas can include their event in the Handbook Competition Calendar (at no charge) and may place an advert in the Handbook for the event on payment of the appropriate fee.
- 3.5 Organisers are asked to encourage all who take part to become BC members. Where fees are charged, BC members should be charged a reduced fee.
- 3.6 To ensure uniformity, organisers are asked to follow BC Sprint Racing Competition Rules as far as possible. Organisers are asked to make it clear in all literature what the event rules will be.
- 3.7 Club & Regional status competition can be included in the official BC Calendar of events.
- 3.8 Within 14 day of the close of a competition a completed regatta programme with the official results shall be sent to the Secretary of the SRC canoesprint.secretary@britishcanoeing.org.uk
- 3.9 British Canoeing's information package 'Organising a Canoe Sprint Club event' is available from the website or by contacting the SRC Secretary.

4 COMPETITIONS OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED KINGDOM

4.1 No Club or member of a Club or individual member of BC may compete outside the United Kingdom without permission from the SRC. See Rule 1.3

5 MEMBERSHIP OF MORE THAN ONE CLUB OR CHANGE OF CLUB

5.1 When a competitor is a member of two or more clubs he/she shall, by March 1st have declared the name of the club in whose colours he/she will race that year in individual events. A person joining a second club after March 1st must continue to race for his/her first club. A competitor who has changed his/her club is not permitted to race for his/her new club, unless prior consent of his/her old club has been obtained. The consent shall not be withheld in the case of a change of residence from one area to another.

6 ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY AND SPONSORSHIPS

- 6.1 The rules of the International Canoe Federation or the National Olympic Committee shall apply to all matters relating to Amateur Status. At present there are no regulations specific to Amateur Status other than as broadly listed in 6.3.
- 6.2 Foreign Teams, may receive compensation/assistance authorised by BC to cover financial expanse to participate in an UK competition. Under no circumstances shall any payment exceed the sum of actual expenditure.
- 6.3 A Competitor may not:
- 6.3.1 In the practice of sport and in the opinion of BC manifestly contravene the spirit of fair play in the exercise of sport, particularly by the use of doping or violence.
- 6.3.2 Have allowed his/her person, name, picture or sport performance to be used for advertising, except when BC or its Committees enter into a contract for sponsorship or equipment. All payments must be made to BC and not to the individual.
- 6.3.3 Participate in any competition on condition of a financial consideration.
- **A Competitor may accept**, during a period of preparation and/or actual competition which shall be limited by the rules of BC and its Committees:
- 6.4.1 Assistance administered through the BOA or BC Performance Programmes: living expenses, insurance cover in respect of accidents, illness and disability; personal property, sports equipment and clothing; cost of medical treatment, physiotherapy and authorised coaches.
- 6.4.2 Compensation authorised by his/her NOC or BC Performance Programmes, in the case of necessity, to cover financial loss resulting from his/her absence from work or basic occupation in the Olympic Games and sports competition or other canoeing activities. In no circumstances shall payment made under this provision exceed the sum which the competitor would have earned in the same period. The compensation may be paid with the approval of BC or BOA at their discretion.
- 6.4.3 Prizes won in competition or other canoeing activities, within the rules established by BC and its Committees and the ICF.
- 6.5 In all cases which are not covered by the above regulations (6.2 and 6.3), the corresponding rules of the ICF or the BOA shall apply.
- 6.6 Procedures to be undertaken by those seeking, obtaining and disbursing sponsorships, sports scholarships and awards.
- 6.6.1 Details of all personal sponsorship arrangements, sports sponsorships and other awards, offered to or negotiated by individuals or organisations, must be submitted by beneficiaries to the BC Committee responsible for administering the particular activity, for registration and approval. When doubt exists regarding the appropriate Committee to whom information should be furnished, BC Headquarters will arrange for the necessary action to be undertaken.
- 6.6.2 A central registry of all personal sponsorship arrangements will be maintained by BC Headquarters, and will be available for inspection by authorised officers of BC.
- 6.6.3 The term "personal sponsorship arrangements negotiated by beneficiaries" shall include:
- 6.6.3.1 Payments made to athletes selected through the UK Sport Performance Matrix and administrated by BC Performance Director.
- 6.6.3.2 Sponsorship provided by individuals (not family), commercial, industrial, and public authorities, National and Regional Sports Aid Foundations, Local Authorities, Trust Funds, Educational Institutions and agencies, Clubs and other miscellaneous supportive groups.

7 CLASSIFICATION OF PADDLERS

- 7.1 Junior: A Junior is a competitor under 18 years of age at the beginning of the current calendar year. A Junior will have junior racing status unless promoted to senior racing status. Each Junior status competitor will be nominated to compete in one of the Junior classes as laid down from time to time by the SRC. Juniors who have Senior status may race in the appropriate Junior age group for National Championship events.
- 7.2 Senior: A Senior is a competitor who is over 18 years of age at the beginning of the calendar year, will have Senior racing status. Each Senior status competitor will be nominated to compete in one of the Senior Classes as laid down from time to time by the SRC.
- 7.3 **Master (Veteran):** The first year a paddler can compete in a Master event is the year that his/her thirty-fifth (35th) birthday falls in, provided he or she is not already nominated to compete in Men's A or Women's A who, irrespective of their age cannot compete in Master events.
- 7.4 Promotions: Entry into and promotion between classes will be at the discretion of the SRC and will be based on results gained in competition at regatta venues nominated by the SRC. A competitor may, at the discretion of the SRC, be permitted, on application by his Team Leader, to revert to a lower class.
- 7.5 Mixed Events: Mixed events where male and female competitors take part in the same boat are permitted.
- 7.6 Status: Status in Kayaks has no bearing on status in Canoes and the converse. Similarly, the status in the Paddle-Ability class and/or the Paracanoe classes has no bearing on the status in the ability Kayak and/or Canoe classes, e.g. a Senior A class competitor in Canoe may be in a different Senior class in Kayak.

8 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE AND TROPHIES

- 8.1 In order to be eligible to win a National Championship title a Competitor must:

 Be a British Citizen and be a current member of British Canoeing (including, SCA, CW & CANI

 Juniors registered with family membership, do not need full British Canoeing membership)

 and not currently representing or in the selection process to represent another country; or
- 8.1.1 Have been resident in the United Kingdom and a member of British Canoeing, (including, SCA, CW & CANI Juniors registered with family membership, do not need full British Canoeing membership) for at least 2 (two) years. For clarification, the residency shall be calculated as being the 2 years immediately preceding January 1st in the year of the relevant competition
- 8.2 In entering a National Championship, competitors agree to abide by this Eligibility Policy and comply with the requirements and procedures of the National Championships organisers.
- 8.3 If a Competitor is not a British Citizen and has not been Resident in the United Kingdom and a member of British Canoeing, (including, SCA, CW & CANI) for the necessary 2 (two) years (in accordance with B 1.1. above) and there are exceptional circumstances then they may apply to the Head of Governance and Compliance requesting discretion to be exercised. Any applications should be submitted at least four weeks prior to any National Championships event in which they wish to compete.
- 8.4 Decisions are final and in the absolute discretion of the British Canoeing Chief Executive who shall consider each case on its own merits and decisions do not create a precedent for any future cases.

BC SPRINT RACING COMPETITION RULES Part II - CLASSES AND BUILDING REGULATIONS

9 WEIGHT AND DIMENSION LIMITS

9.1 An athlete who competes in a boat that does not conform to the weight and dimension limits at Table a, will be subject to a penalty as described at Part IV Regulation 31.

Note: The length of a kayak or a canoe shall be measured between the extremes of the stem and the stern. Stem-bands or other projections of the stem or stern, if any, are to be included. Any rudder forming a continuation of the length of a kayak is not to be included in the measurement.

The weight of a boat shall not include any loose fittings, any fixed absorbent material must be dry.

10 ATHLETE IDENTIFICATION AND TRADEMARKS

- 10.1 Boats, accessories and clothing may carry trademarks, advertising symbols and written text.
- 10.1.1 There are reserved places on equipment (eg. boat and paddles), with size limitations for trademarks and advertising. These areas are dedicated for the identification of Athletes/NF, Manufacturer, Organiser, BC and ICF (including sponsors). Any advertising material shall be placed in such a way that it does not interfere with competitor identification and does not affect the outcome of the race
- 10.1.2 If an athlete's name is displayed, it shall be placed on each side of the boat under the cockpit.
- 10.1.3 Athletes should wear clothing in compliance with the club colours registered with the SRC, or those of the national federation they represent if competing as an invited international athlete.
- 10.1.4 The advertising of tobacco and alcoholic products is not permitted.
- 10.1.5 Political messages and images, symbols and slogans unrelated to sport funding are not permitted.
- 10.1.6 Any boat, accessory, or article of clothing, which does not comply with the above conditions, will be ineligible for use during a competition.

11 CONSTRUCTION

- 11.1 The boat must be constructed so that it remains buoyant and floats in a horizontal position when filled with water while supporting the crew. Boats inherent buoyancy must be supplemented by additional and visible fixed flotation material or by the provision of sealed bulk heads.
- 11.2 No part of an athlete's body should be attached to the boat in anyway.
- 11.3 Section and longitudinal lines of the hull of the kayak and canoe shall not be concave.
- 11.4 The deck shall not be higher on any horizontal point than the highest point of the front edge of the first cockpit.
- 11.5 No foreign substance which gives a competitor an unfair advantage should be applied to a boat.
- 11.6 No part of the boat (including the seat and the footrest) shall have moving parts which can be used to help propel the boat in a way which would give competitors an unfair advantage.
- 11.7 A boat or competitor may be equipped with a device which provides real time feedback on performance for use by television or event presentation. Devices may be used by the competitor for analysis following a race but in no circumstances, may the device be used to provide real time feedback to a competitor during a race.

Kayaks

- 11.8 Kayaks shall have one rudder. Over-stern rudders may not be thicker than 10mm for K1 and K2, or 12mm for a K4.
- 11.8.1 The boat shall be designed as a sit-in (Kayak type) not a sit-on (Surf Ski type).
- 11.8.2 Weed deflectors fitted forward of the rudder are permitted.

Canoes

- 11.9. Canoes must be symmetrical along their longitudinal axes.
- 11.9.1 Rudders or any guiding apparatus directing the course of the canoe are not permitted.
- 11.9.2 C1 and C2 boats may be entirely open. The minimum length of the opening shall be 280cm and the edge of the side of the craft (gunwale) can extend maximum 5cm into the craft along the whole opening. The boat can have a maximum of 3 strengthening bars with a width of maximum 7cm each.
- 11.9.3 C4 canoes may be entirely open. The minimum length of the opening shall be 390cm and the edge of the side of the craft (gunwale) can extend maximum 6cm into the craft along the opening. The boat can have maximum 4 strengthening bars with a width of maximum 7cm each.

Innovations

11.10 Significant innovations in equipment including, but not limited to, boats, related equipment and clothing, must meet the requirements and conditions concerning innovation contained in the ICF Canoe Sprint Racing Rules

12. Boat Control

- 12.1 The length of a kayak or a canoe shall be measured between the extremes of the stem and the stern. Stem-bands or other projections of the stem or stern, if any, are to be included. Any rudder forming a continuation of the length of a kayak is not to be included in the measurement.
- 12.2 No alterations in canoes and kayaks are permitted after the measuring and weighing and before the competition has taken place.

Before Weighing the Boat:

12.3 All loose fittings shall be removed. Permanent knee rests attached in a definitive way to the floorboard and buoyancy attachments consisting of water absorbing material must be absolutely dry at the first weighing.

Part III - ORGANISATION OF COMPETITIONS

13 Officials

Duties of the Organising Committee

- 13.1 An Organising Committee is responsible for the preparation and running of the competition.
 - The Organising Committee shall, in particular:
 - 1) Fix the date and the programme of the regatta in agreement with the SRC.
 - Draw up and distribute the advance programme including the date and time of the team leaders' meeting.
 - 3) Make available a stretch of water and technical equipment conforming to the present Sprint Racing Competition Rules.

13.2 Competition Committee

The competition is to be managed by a Competition Committee consisting of:

- 1) Chief Official
- 2) Chief Judge
- 3) Deputy Chief Judge

For National status competitions two members of the competition committee must be registered Regatta Officials of BC Sprint Racing Section.

For an international regatta, two members of the Competition Committee must be in possession of a valid International Canoe Sprint Official card.

13.3 Duties of the Competition Committee:

- a) Organise and supervise the competition.
- b) In the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances which makes it impossible to carry out the competition, postpone the competition and decide on another time when it may be held
- c) Hear any protests that may be made and settle any disputes that may arise.
- d) Apply disciplinary procedures in cases where the regulations are broken during a race.
- e) Should a competitor be injured during a heat, the Committee may allow him to participate in another heat.
- f) The decision of the Committee shall be based on BC Sprint Racing Competition Rules.
- g) Penalties in accordance with BC Rules or the SRC Disciplinary Regulations may also be imposed i.e. disqualification for a longer period than the duration of the competition in question.
- h) Before any decision is made regarding any infraction of the rules, hear the opinion of the Umpire who controlled the race in which the infraction was said to have occurred. The Committee is to seek the opinion of other officials supervising the race, if it is felt to be of importance in clearing up the alleged offence.
- 13.4 If its nature and extent demand, each competition shall be held under the supervision of the following officials:

Chief Official Aligner(s)
Chief Judge Starter(s)

Deputy Chief Judge Course Umpire(s)
Competition Manager Turning Point Umpire(s)
Boat Controllers Finish Line Judge(s)
Announcer Media Officer

If circumstances permit, one person may function in two of the above positions.

- 13.5 The Chief Official, Chief Judge, Deputy Chief Judge, Competition Manager, Starter, Umpires, should, if possible, be registered BC Regatta Officials.
- 13.6 Unauthorised persons must not enter any official's area unless the Competition Committee or the Jury send for officials or team officials in order to solve problems.

13.7 The National Champion Competition Jury:

- a) Final authority for National Championship Competitions shall rest with a Jury composed of a Chairman and four members.
- b) The members of the Jury shall be appointed by a quorum of the SRC prior to the commencement of the competition. (In the event of a quorum not being present, the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or another official of the SRC and two Committee members may appoint the Jury).
- c) The Chairman of the Jury will be the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the SRC or an elected SRC member.
- d) Subordinate to this Jury are the Chief Official and other officials shown in Rule 13.2.
- e) A protest made during the competition must be handed to the Competition Committee not later than 20 minutes after publication of the results.
- f) An appeal against a decision of the Competition Committee must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury and handed in not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed, in writing by the Chairman of the Competition Committee, of the decision against the competitor or crew and has signed the receipt.
- g) The decision of the Jury is final.

13.8 Duties of Officials

- 13.8.1 The Chief Official, who is also the Chairman of the Competition Committee, decides all matters arising during the actual competition, which is not dealt with in these rules. With the confirmation of the Competition Committee, he/she may disqualify any competitor who behaves improperly or who, by his conduct or speech, shows contempt towards the competition officials, other competitors or onlookers (see Rule 31.6). All officials are responsible to the Chief Official.
- 13.8.2 The Chief Judge cooperates with the Chief Official and he/she substitutes for the Chief Official in case of necessity.
- 13.8.3 The Deputy Chief Judge will closely cooperate with the Chief Official and the Competition Manager and will handle the administrative tasks of the competition.

He will collect the notes from the Team Leaders of the participating teams/clubs on the changes before the beginning of the Team Leaders' meeting and put them in order according to the races. At the meeting, he/she will record all changes announced by the Chief Official in his own programme.

If necessary, he/she will check the personal identification documents of the competitors and their age.

He will collect the forms necessary for the administration and any other means necessary for the secretariat.

In case of computer data processing, he/she will keep in contact with the responsible IT person. During the competition he/she will check the results race by race and will prepare the list of the boats qualified in the next round.

He will formulate the decisions of the Competition Committee passed on the subject-matter of any protest and will arrange to have it recorded. He/she is responsible for the accuracy of these records. To perform the written tasks the Deputy Chief Judge can employ a Competition Secretary, assistants and office staff as necessary.

- 13.8.4 The Competition Manager will keep in constant contact with the organisers to solve any problems that may arise during the competition. He/she supervises the races and is responsible for ensuring that the programme is followed without unnecessary delay. He/she shall inform the officials concerned punctually before a new race starts. He/she has to deal also with the good function of the competition administration of the races, (programme, drawings, results, technical documents, boat control, press, protests, etc.) He/she shall make certain that the announcer gives all the necessary information about the races such as the start order, the name of any competitor failing to start and the results.
- 13.8.5 The Boat Controller/s will only allow athletes to compete at the race, whose identification has been checked and whose boat, equipment, clothing, starting number and body number conform to the rules. The Official in charge must inform the Competition Committee in the case of missing boats. The competitors having passed the control are entered in a written report.

(International competitions).

- a) They will also check for any performance enhancing foreign substance on the boat any forbidden devices mention in rule 11. Should any of the boats not fulfil the requirements concerning classification (rules 9 to 12), they shall be excluded from the competition. The organisers will provide for this purpose certified weighing and measuring devices
- b) Standard checking procedures will be applied. Boats are to be selected at random from the participants in the races for boat control after the finish.
- 13.8.6 The Starter decides all questions concerning the start of the races, and is solely responsible for decisions as to false starts. His/her decision is final. He/she shall see that the starting equipment is in good working order. He/she shall communicate with the Competition Committee and after having received a signal from them that all is ready, he/she shall order the competitors to their places and carry out the start according to the Racing Rules. It is the responsibility of the Starter to be satisfied that the circumstances at the start are free from any hindrance.
- 13.8.7 The Aligner the duty of the aligner is to bring the boats to the starting line with the least possible delay. Their duties will be to check the uniformity of the competitors including their attire as well as the number on the back and the boat (lane) number.

If an automatic starting system is in use the aligner's (international events) will be positioned in two separate boats behind the starting line. They will have an unobstructed view inside the system's boots.

When all boats are aligned and completely inside the boots the aligner will raise a white flag signifying to the starter that they are in position to start. When the boats are not in the boots, the aligner shall raise a red flag. If there is no automatic starting system, the aligners may be repositioned

- 13.8.8 <u>The Course Umpire</u> shall see to it that during a race the rules are complied with. If the rules are broken, the Umpire shall report immediately the infraction to the Competition Committee.
 - a) The Competition Committee shall decide whether any of the competitors concerned shall be disciplined or not. If the Umpire has a report of an infraction of the rules he/she shall show a red flag after the race and shall make a report before the Umpire's next race takes place. In such a case, the Competition Committee shall make known its decision immediately and before the result of the race is announced.
 - b) If there is no infraction to report, the Umpire shall show a white flag.
 - c) In races of 1,000 metres, the Umpire shall follow the race in a motorboat. In races of 200 metres, the Umpire(s) shall not follow the race. One or two Course Umpires positioned before the start line. One or two Course Umpires positioned behind the finish line. For the 500 metre races, either system as used for the 1000m or the 200m may be adopted for the Course Umpires to do their task. The Chief Official will decide on the most appropriate system to be used, based on his/her opinion of the course features.
 - The Course Umpire can follow and judge the race also from the Finish Tower as instructed by the Chief Official.
 - d) He shall be completely unhampered during the race. No one except the Umpire and the driver shall be admitted to the boat reserved for him.
 - e) In long distance races with many competitors, more than one Umpire will be nominated. One of the Umpires shall, if possible, follow the leading group in the race, but without disturbing the other competitors.
 - f) In case of hindrances the Course Umpire must stop the competition passing all boats in the race and waving the red flag or using a sound signal until all boats have stopped paddling. After this all boats shall return to the start. The Course Umpire shall report immediately the infraction to the Competition Committee.
 - g) When a motorboat is not used, one or more Umpires shall be placed in such positions from which they can ensure that the rules are being complied with.
- 13.8.9 The Turning Point Umpires, when a race is run along a course with one or more turning points, one or more Umpires and one recorder must be stationed at every turning point, where they gain the best view of the turn.

- a) The Turning Point Umpire shall see that the competitors turn according to the rules. The recorder shall make a list of all who pass the turning point.
- b) Immediately after the race, the Turning Point Umpire shall report to the Competition Committee as to who has turned and if any infraction of the rules has taken place.
- 13.8.10 The Finishing Line Judges decide the order in which the competitors passed the finishing line. The order of the boats arriving at the finishing line will be decided by Photo Finish if a Photo Finish System is used.

The position of the competitors in the boat will be recorded with video camera at the time of arriving at the finish line. The Chief Finish Judge will decide with the recording whether the competitor was in his/her boat upon arriving or not and report it to the Competition Committee. When there is no Photo Finish System, the Finishing Line Judges decide the order in which the competitors have passed the finishing line. The Judges shall be placed in a position where all lanes at the finish line can be clearly seen.

If the Judges differ regarding the placing of two or more competitors, a simple majority shall decide the dispute, in the absence of Photo Finish. In the case of equal voting, the Chief Judge has the casting vote.

When there is no Photo Finish, the Finishing Line Judges are responsible for recording the times. This shall be done by means of stopwatches or suitable electronic equipment.

It is the responsibility of the Chief Finish Line Judge to ensure that the timing equipment is working correctly. The Chief Finish Line Judge shall divide the work amongst the timekeepers. At the end of each race, he shall compare the official times with the other finish line judges and immediately inform the Chief Official of them.

Each race shall be timed by at least two watches. When the watches have not recorded the same time, the longest (worst) time shall be taken as correct. The stopwatches are to be started when the electronic or optical signal from the start is received.

When a Photo Finish is used the result determined by the Finish Line Judges shall be compared with it, with the photo finish being decisive. Video films are not a substitute for photo finish.

- 13.8.11 <u>The Announcer</u> shall, on the instructions of the Competition Manager, announce the start of each race, the order of the starting and the position of the competitors during the race. After the race is finished, he/she will announce the results.
- 13.8.12 The Media Officer must supply all the necessary information to the representatives of the press, radio and television about the race and its progress. He/she is authorised therefore to ask for information from the different officials who must procure for him/her as soon as possible the copies from the official results.
- 13.8.13 It is the Officials' obligation to perform their tasks in conformity with the Sprint Racing Competition Rules.

Every judge will have the obligation to check whether all means and equipment necessary to perform his/her tasks are operational. In the event any shortcoming is found, it must be reported to the Chief Official or Competition Manager.

Unauthorised persons must not enter any Officials' area unless the Competition Committee or the Jury send for officials or team officials in order to solve problems.

14. Invitations

An invitation to an Open Regatta shall contain the following information:

- a) Time and place of the regatta.
- b) Situation and plan of the course.
- c) Classes and distance of the races.
- d) Sequence and starting times of races.
- e) Whether the races are to be held on still or running water, up or down stream and minimum depth of water.
- f) Amount of entry fee.
- g) Address to which entries should be sent and the last date for receiving entries. This date shall not be earlier than 14 days prior to the first day of the competition.
- h) Conditions/terms of participation

15 Entries

- 15.1 Entries for Open National Regattas can only be made in accordance with the regulations given in the invitation. An entry shall, however, always contain the following information:
 - a) Name of club or federation to which competitors belongs.
 - b) Classes and distances in which the competitors propose to compete.
 - c) Name, sex, age, citizenship, national federation/BC membership number of competitor
 - d) Similar details of reserves if anv.
 - e) All entries should be in writing (Online, Letter, Fax, Email, etc.). Where verbal communication is used, it must also be confirmed in writing by the given deadline (midnight on the due date). In the event of conflicting information, the information with letterhead and/or signature will take precedence.
 - f) Late entries shall not normally be accepted. The acceptance of late entries shall be at the discretion of the Competition Committee who may charge up to double the entry fee.

g) Racing Colours

When making the entries, Clubs/squads must have given the colours of the clothing worn by the competitors and these colours must not be changed during the competition. **N.B.** Every sprint racing club must register their racing colours with the RC (and any changes thereto). All competitors must wear the correct club/squad colours and for them to be visible at all times while racing

15.2 The Regatta Committee will accept entries in conformity with entry deadline, Sprint Racing rules and the conditions/terms of participation. Therefore, the Regatta Committee can reject or delete from the competition, entries of participants who fail to observe the Sprint Racing rules and/or the conditions/terms of participation.

16. Regatta Programme

16.1 Not later than 24 hours before the first race of the regatta, the programme shall be available, giving the names and citizenship/clubs of the competitors and the results of the draw.

17. Heats and Finals

- 17.1 At least three kayaks or canoes must be entered before a race can be held. If the number of entries in races up to and including 1,000 metres is so great that heats are necessary, the number of kayaks or canoes in each heat and in the final must not exceed nine (9).
- 17.2 The division of competitors into heats shall be determined by drawing lots.17.3 For National regattas the procedure for selecting competitors to race in finals will be based on one of two criteria: either by <u>time</u> or by <u>positions</u> as obtained in heats. The criterion used for each event will be decided by the SRC and published in advance of the event and in the programme
- 17.3 Where the width of the course permits, eight or nine kayaks or canoes shall participate in the final if more than this number has been entered in the entire event, as follows:

3 to 9 entries Direct final

10 to 18 entries Two heats, one Final

19 to 45 entries Required number of heats (3-5), two Finals

46 and more Required number of heats (6 or more), three Final

- 17.4 When making the draw, the difference between the number of competitors in the heats of the race shall not exceed one. If the number of competitors in the heats varies, the earlier heats shall have the largest numbers.
- 17.5 Any crew which has not taken part in a heat as instructed shall not be allowed to compete in the final.
- 17.6 The composition of a crew which has qualified for semi-finals or for the final must not be changed. Heats and the final shall be run on the same stretch of water.
- 17.7 For races of more than 1,000 metres, heats shall not be held, and all boats taking part shall start simultaneously.
- 17.8 Should the width of water not permit a simultaneous start, starts at regular intervals shall be permitted.

18. Team Leaders' Meeting

At least 2 hours before the first race of the competition, the team leaders' meeting is to be held. At this meeting the names of team leaders should be advised. The organisers will describe the regatta course and all other arrangements, which should be adhered to for the duration of the competition. The Chief Official will describe the competition programme and ask for any changes to the entries.

19. Alterations to Entries and Withdrawals

- 19.1 Notification of any alterations in the entries must be given in written form to the Regatta Secretary's Desk at least one hour before the race.
- 19.2 The withdrawal from a race is considered final and no renewed entry of the same crew is allowed.
- 19.3 Every competitor whose entry has been confirmed, at the time of the team leaders meeting or subsequently via the Regatta Secretary is obliged to take part in their event.

20. Alterations in the sequence of events

The sequence of races given in the programme and the intervals between races as given in the racing programme are binding on the organisers. Alterations cannot be made unless the respective Team Leaders at the competition give their consent.

21 Course, Markings and Layout

The course consists of up to nine lanes, number one shall be on the left then number two and so on. When there is television coverage of an event, the lane numbering may be in the opposite direction – from right to left, so that the list of competitors and their lanes shown on the television screen match the appearance of the races to be televised.

- 21.1 For National Championships and where possible for other competitions the turning points shall be marked by at least six flags (or buoys) which shall be readily distinguishable and shall, if possible be diagonally divided with one half in red and the other half in yellow.
- 21.2 Both the start and the finishing lines shall be marked with red flags or buoys, at the points where these lines intersect the outer limits of the course.
- 21.3 Before the start of the races the racing course shall be measured and marked by means of clearly visible flags mounted on buoys.
 - a) The course at the start shall permit a clear width when possible, of at least 9 metres for each lane.
 - b) For National Regattas the starting and finishing lines shall be at right angles to the course.
- c) The finishing line shall be at least 45 metres long and be marked by two flags. The Finishing Line Judges must be placed as near to the finishing line as possible.
- For National Championship races up to 1,000 metres, the course must be straight and in one direction
- 21.4 For races exceeding 1,000 metres turning points are permitted. For National Regatta races exceeding 1,000 metres the following conditions should be fulfilled, if possible:
 - a) The distance between the starting line and the first flag of the first turning point (1st leg) shall be straight and at least 1,859.25 metres.
 - b) The distance between the last flag of the first turning point and the first flag of the second turning point (2nd leg) shall be straight and maximum 1759.25 metres.
- c) The distance between the last flag of the second turning point and the first flag of the third turning point (3rd leg) shall be a maximum of 500 metres.
- d) The specifications of all other stretches shall be in accordance with point "c".
- e) The radius of each turn should, if possible be at least 40.5 metres.
- f) Both the start and the end of the race shall be in front of the Finishing Tower.
- g) The red flags of the finish line shall be placed as much to the outside as possible in order to get the widest feasible finish line.
- h) Any starting pontoons are to be removed.

21.5 For competitions, including the National Championships, these conditions should be complied with, unless a special dispensation for the course has been obtained from the SRC through the Secretary.

22. Boat Numbers

All kayaks and canoes shall carry a vertical number plate made of non-transparent material marked with black numbers on white or yellow background indicating the lane. The numbers on the plate must measure 15 cm in height and 25 mm in thickness. The plates shall be placed on the centre line of the afterdeck or thwart. The size of the number plate shall be 18×20 cm. Any personal numbers provided by the organisers shall be placed on the back or if necessary the

front of the competitor as required by the organisers.

23. Instructions for Competitors

Written instructions shall be available for competitors at least 2 hours before the start of the competition, containing the following information:

- a) Detailed information on the courses and their markings
- b) Starting time
- c) Starting line
- d) Finishing line
- e) Competitors racing number (if used)
- f) Type of boat control
- g) Position of any award ceremony

Part IV - RACING REGULATIONS

24. Means of Propulsion

- 24.1 Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double-bladed paddles.
- 24.2 Canadian Canoes shall be propelled solely by means of single-bladed paddles.
- 24.3 The paddles may not be fixed to the boat in any way.

25. Start

- 25.1 Competitors shall be on the water at the start area, not less than five minutes prior to the specified time of their race. The start area is defined as being the area of water within 100 metres before the starting line.
 - Two minutes before the start time the competing boats must take the lane allocated.
- 25.2 Competitors shall be at the start area in time to allow satisfactory preparation for the start.
- 25.3 The start shall be given without reference to absentees.
- 25.4 If competitor(s) fails to start a final having taken part in the heat without a valid reason approved by the Competition Committee, they will be penalised. A competitor, who arrives too late at the start, shall be considered to have voluntarily withdrawn and may be penalised under this rule.
- 25.5 When signalled by the Starter, the competitor will take the start position designated so that the bow of the boat is on the start line. When an automatic starting system is employed the competitor will place the bow of the boat in the starting boot. When all boats are properly aligned, the aligner, if used will then raise a white flag.
- 25.6 If the Starter is not satisfied with the line-up he/she will call "STOP", and hand over to the Aligner for repositioning.
- 25.7 The starting command will be "Ready Set Go" ("Go" can be a shot or strong signal). At the "Ready" command the competitors begin their preparation to paddle. At the "Set" command the competitors place their paddle in the catch position. The competitor must not paddle forward or this action will be deemed to be a false Start. The boat must not move forward at this point in the starting procedure. The Starter when satisfied with the competitors positioning and attention will say "Go" (or shot or powerful sound). The competitors must only react to the start command/signal "Go" and are not permitted to anticipate it. The competitors can paddle only upon hearing the starting signal/command "Go".

- 25.8 In the event of a false start, the Starter must immediately give a powerful sound signal. On hearing this signal all competitors must stop paddling and follow the Starter's instructions for a new start. Before the new start, the Starter must identify the offending crew/s and give them a warning. In the event of a second false start by the same crew the boat will be disqualified from the race and must leave the starting area and the course immediately.
- 25.9 The Starter may also recall competitors for a new start in the event of any unforeseen circumstance a malfunction of the starting equipment for example. In such a case the same powerful sound signal must be given. If a malfunction of the starting equipment was caused through a boat making a false start, the crew must be given a warning, even though that boat may not have crossed the start line. If the malfunction was not the cause of any competitor making a false start, no penalty shall be imposed.
- 25.10 The Starter will start the race when he/she is satisfied that everything meets with his/her approval. He/she will report any disqualification to the Chief Official.
- 25.11 In the long distance races the starter shall declare "START WITHIN ONE MINUTE" when he is satisfied he will give the starting signal by a shot or a short powerful sound. The Starter will start the race when he/she is satisfied that everything meets with his/her approval. He/she will make a written report on any disqualification and forward it to the Chief Official.

26. Paddling on the Course

- 26.1 <u>In races up to 1000 metres</u>, competitors must keep the whole of their boat within the four-metre wide central area of their lane from the start to the finish of the course. Upon any deviation, the boat must go back immediately to this central area of the lane. No boat must come nearer than five metres in any direction to the boat of another competitor that is, gunwale to gunwale or bow to stern
- 26.2 If a boat leaves the centre of the lane and does not return to it, the competitor may be penalised.
- 26.3 A boat which leaves its allocated lane must be disqualified from the event.
- 26.4 If a race is declared null and void, no change of the composition of a crew is permitted at the new start.
- 26.5 If there is a capsize the competitor or crew is eliminated from the race.
- 26.6 The Umpire has the right to interrupt a correctly started race if unforeseen hindrances arise. The Course Umpires with a red flag and sound signal may effect such an interruption. Competitors must immediately stop paddling and await further instructions.
- 26.7 If a paddle is broken a competitor cannot be provided with a new one by a supporter.
- 26.8 Paracanoe races only: Spray decks must not be used unless permitted by the Chief Official due to severe water condition

27. Pacing

- 27.1 Taking pace or receiving assistance from boats not in the race or by any other means is not permitted.
- 27.2 When a race is in progress, it is strictly forbidden for any crews not taking part in the race to interfere or impede the race by proceeding over a part of the marked course, this includes creating wash even from outside the marking buoys.

28 Competitions for Long Distance

- 28.1 Races of more than 1,000 metres, competitors may deviate from their lane providing they do not impede other competitors.
- 28.2 When a race is run on a course with turning points these shall be passed to port (i.e. in an anticlockwise direction).
- 28.3 A competitor will not be disqualified for touching a turning buoy, unless, in the opinion of the Turning Point Umpires, an advantage has been gained there from. In making a turn, the boat shall follow as closely as possible the course as marked by the buoys at the turning points.
- 28.4 If there is a capsize the competitor or crew is eliminated from the race if he/she or they are not able to get in the boat without outside help.
- 28.5 Any competitor who unnecessarily deviates from their course may be disqualified. is responsible

for a collision or who damages the canoe or kayak or paddle of another can be disqualified and can be required to pay damages.

28.6 Group Racing and Overtaking

- a) When a boat is overtaking another boat, it is the duty of the overtaking craft to keep clear of other competitors at all times.
- b) When a boat is racing in a group of competitors it is the duty of all competitors in the group to keep clear of other competitors at all times. This rule applies to any manoeuvring within the group.
- 28.7 <u>Collision or damage</u>. Any competitor who is considered by the course umpire or race official, to have been responsible for a collision, or who damages the boat or paddle of another competitor may be disqualified.

29. Finish

- 29.1 The boat has finished the race when its bow crosses the finish line with all crew members in it. The Finish Line Judges will determine the result of the competition based on the order of the boats arriving according to the rules.
- 29.2 If two or more boats reach the finishing line at the same time they are awarded the same classification in the final. In the case of a dead heat finish for any position, which determines the advance to the next level of the competition the following rules will apply:
 - a) Wherever there are sufficient number of lanes available in the next level of the competitions, drawing of lots will determine to which race each boat will advance. If necessary lane number 10 will be used.
 - b) Wherever there are not enough lanes available there will be a re-race between the boats involved 30 minutes after the race.
 - c) In the case of a dead heat in the re-race, drawing of lots will determine the outcome.
- 29.3 At BC SRC sponsored events, 1 or more competitors may be selected at random to bring their boats to Boat Control after each race, except in the case of a National Championship finals where the first 4 boats to finish will be selected.

30. Tasks of Competitors after the Race

- 30.1 The competitor must leave the course after the finish of the race and cannot disturb the next race.
- 30.2 The crews selected by the Competition Committee for boat control to proceed immediately to post race boat control, failure to do so will be penalised.
- 30.3 If selected for doping control, the competitor must comply with the obligations stipulated by the BC Anti-Doping policy.
- 30.4 Before the award ceremony the top three crews of the final must be present at the location and time indicated.
- 30.5 At National Championships, competitors must wear club, team/squad Racing Colours or Tracksuit at the award ceremony.
- 31. Penalties. Any infringement of the Sprint Racing Competition Rules and including the Terms/Conditions of Participation may result in the imposition of a penalty. At the discretion of the Competition Committee this penalty may be either Disqualification, or a Warning delivered to a competitor via his/her Team Leader. At National Sprint Regattas a further option is the award of Penalty Points in accordance with National Sprint Regattas Disciplinary Procedures as described at section B. In determining the specific form a penalty will take the Competition Committee will consider factors including, but not limited to, the nature of the race, the experience level of the competitor(s) involved and any further impact the decision may have.
- 31.1 Any competitor who attempts to win a race by any other than honourable means, who breaks the Racing Regulations, or who disregards the honourable nature of the Racing Regulations, will be penalised.
- 31.2 Should a competitor have completed a race in a kayak or canoe which is shown upon inspection not to conform with the classifications (see rules 9 to 12) and building regulations, he/she will be penalised.

- 31.3 A competitor who is deemed to have received external assistance during a race, including but not limited to objects thrown into the course, will be penalised.
- 31.4 A crew that has been accompanied along and adjacent to the racecourse by other boats while the race is in progress will be penalised.
- 31.5 Disqualifications by the Competition Committee may be confirmed in writing with the reasons. The Team Leader has to acknowledge receipt on a copy with the exact time, which is the start of the protest time.
 - Failure to deliver the copy confirmation of the disqualification to the team leader does not invalidate the disqualification.
- 31.6 The Competition Committee may discipline any competitor or Official whose behaviour is detrimental to the good order and conduct of the competition. The Competition Committee may disqualify him/her for that competition.

32 Protests

- 32.1 A protest against a crew to compete in a race shall be advised to a member of the Competition Committee not later than one hour before the start of the race. A protest made later within 30 days from the date when the race in question was held is only permitted if the officials of the club of the competitor making the protest can prove that the facts on which the protest is based came to their knowledge later than one hour before the start of the race.
- 32.2 A late protest, against a crew shall be referred to the SRC accompanied by the prescribed fee (see below).
 - A protest, against a crew made during the competition must be handed to the Competition Committee not later than 20 minutes after publication of the results.
- 32.3 A protest made during a competition must be addressed to the Competition Committee not later than 20 minutes after the Team Leader has been informed on the decision against his/her competitor or team and has signed the receipt.
- 32.4 All protests must be made in writing and be accompanied by a fee of £15.00. The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld. If the protest is not upheld the fee may not be refunded, at the discretion of the Competition Committee or SRC hearing the protest.
- 32.5 When a protest or a report is made against an athlete or a team, the team leader of the athlete/team in question shall be presented with the protest or report to read.

33 Appeals

Competitors have the right to appeal to the SRC through their club or team management against a decision of the Competition Committee, within 30 days from the date when the race was held. In the case of National Championship Competitions the appeal must be made to the Competition Jury in accordance with Rule 13.7. A fee of £70.00 shall accompany the appeal. The fee will be refunded if the appeal is upheld. The BC SRC (or Jury in the case of a National Championship) decision is final.

Part V - SPECIAL RULES FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

34. National & Open Championship Medals, National Champions and Trophies:

Only members of BC who qualify under Rule 8 can become a National Champion or be awarded a National Championship trophy.

- 34.1 National & Open Championship medals will be awarded to the first three boats, regardless of nationality
- 34.2 National Championship Trophies winners & the National Champion will be the best placed British paddler.
- 34.3 Irrespective of the number of competitors in a National & Open Championship event, Trophies and Gold, Silver & Bronze medals will be awarded as appropriate.

Notes to the British Canoeing Sprint Racing Competition Rules

Races Exceeding 1,000 Metres at the National Water Sports Centre Nottingham,
Rules 21.4 and 21.5

Because of limitations at the National Water Sports Centre - mainly the start pontoon being fixed for the Start of 5000 metre or 2500 metre events - it is not possible to comply with the Rule and provide the three courses required. The 2nd leg under the Rule is 47.75 metres too long. The requirements given in the Rule are those of the ICF, which the BC must shadow in its own Rules.

Long Distance Courses at the National Water Sports Centre, approved by the SRC

To provide flexibility there are three turning points with the $\underline{\text{start}}$ and $\underline{\text{finish}}$ of the turns as follows:

- 10 metres beyond the finish line
- 2. 450 metres from the finish line
- 3. 1123 metres from the finish line

Domestic Course - 2 laps

a)	Between the start line and first flag of the first turning point =	1229.25 metres
b)	Between the last flag of first turn and first flag of second turn =	1133.00
c)	Between last flag of second turn and first flag of third turn =	1133.00
d)	Between last flag of third turn and the finish =	1123.00
e)	Three turns of 127.25 metres each =	381.75
		5000.00 metres

Short Course for Juniors - 1 lap of Domestic Course - 2500 metres

a)	Between the start line and first flag of the turning point =	1229.25 metres

NB With a fixed start position and by using the same turning buoys for the 5000 metre course an exact 2500 metre course cannot be obtained. It is 20.5 metres short.

BRITISH CANOEING SPRINT SECTION DISCIPLINE REGULATIONS

These Disciplinary Regulations adopted by the Sprint Racing Committee on the 7th June 2008 are intended for all complaints other than "Field of Play" incidents, but including any event referred on by a Protest Committee dealing with a field of play incident.

These Regulations set out how matters referred to the Sprint Racing Committee by the Union's Investigations Officer or a Protest Committee are dealt with.

1. Interpretation

1.1 In these regulations the words and expressions used shall have the following meanings:

"the Board" the board of the Union as constituted under the Memorandum

and Articles of Association of the Union:

"the Investigations Officer" the Investigations Officer of the Union appointed by the Chief

Executive from time to time;

"the Protest Committee" the persons appointed from time to time by the Sprint Racing

Committee or an event organiser to deal with matters arising

during competition;

"the Executive Committee" the persons elected or appointed at an ACM to the Sprint

Racing Committee from time to time;

"Member" an individual member of the Union participating in the Discipline

in respect of whom a complaint has been made under

Regulation 2.1 of these procedures;

"the Union" British Canoeing;

1.2 All references to periods of a number of days, relate to the period starting the day after the date of posting or the date of receipt where documents are delivered by hand or the date of the incident or meeting and ending the day of receipt, meeting etc.

1.3 Words denoting the singular number shall include plural number and vice versa and words denoting the masculine gender shall include the feminine gender.

2. Disciplinary Procedure

- 2.1 The Executive Committee shall appoint a panel of three of its members ("the Panel") to hear and determine any complaint or matters referred to it by a Protest Committee or the Union's Investigations Officer under Regulation 6.2(a)(ii) of Part A of the Union's Dispute Resolution and Disciplinary Procedures for matters other than Doping and Child Protection Matters. The Executive Committee and the Panel shall deal with such matters in accordance with the procedure set out below.
- 2.2 The Panel shall ensure that as soon as practicable and within 14 days of receiving the complaint from either the Investigations Officer or a Protest Committee, a copy of the complaint has been handed personally or by recorded delivery post to the Member. Notification of the date when the Panel will meet (via e-mail, personal or conference call communications, if deemed appropriate) to consider the complaint will be set as soon as practicable and within 30 days and an invitation to provide in writing, within 14 days (or such shorter time period as the Panel thinks fit) of the notice, any rebutting facts, mitigation, explanation or submission must be sent to the Member with the copy of the complaint. No member of the Panel may consider the matter in the event that he has a conflict of interest or could not be regarded as being impartial in the matter. In such circumstances, the Panel shall, in its sole discretion, replace that member with another member of the Executive Committee and if no such member can hear the matter then that member shall be replaced with another elected member of the Union for the only purpose of considering the complaint.

BRITISH CANOEING SPRINT SECTION DISCIPLINE REGULATIONS

- 2.3 At the same time the Member shall be asked whether he wishes to be present at the meeting when the complaint is being considered, in which case that Member shall be informed that they may attend to make representations and that he may be asked questions. The Member shall also be informed that if no reply is received within the period of 14 days (or such shorter time period as the Panel thinks fit) the Panel will consider the complaint in his absence on the basis of the facts and statements in their possession. The Panel may invite the person making the complaint to comment on any reply provided by the Member, and shall supply a copy of any such comments to the Member before the meeting. The Panel may in its sole discretion invite the person making the complaint to attend the meeting.
- 2.4 At the meeting the Panel shall consider the complaint and any statement made in writing or orally by the Member. If that Member has asked to be present at the meeting he must have been given not less than seven days (or such shorter time period as the Panel thinks fit) notice of the meeting and he must have been invited to attend the meeting and offered the opportunity of being accompanied by an advisor. The Panel may question either party, if present, may call upon them to supply additional evidence or may adjourn the meeting to a later date. Once the Panel has completed its consideration of the complaint, it shall provide the Member with its written decision as soon as practicable and in any event within 14 days of the date of the original meeting or any adjourned meeting.
- 2.5 On completing its considerations of the complaint, the Panel shall draw up its findings of fact and may decide:
 - (a) to reject the complaint; or,
 - (b) to warn or reprimand the Member; or,
 - (c) to suspend the Member from participating in specified events or training facilities held under the Sprint Racing Committees jurisdiction either:
 - (i) for a specified period, not exceeding three months; or,
 - for a specified number of such events or facilities, not exceeding five in number, consecutively, where that number, would not have taken place within the threemonth period specified above; or,
 - (d) to recommend to the Board that the Member should be suspended from participating in Sprint Racing events or training facilities for a longer period or that the Member should be suspended or expelled from the Union, or that some other specified penalty (such as suspension of funding) should be imposed by the Board.
- 2.6 Where the Panel has found against the member, it shall as soon as practicable and in any event within the 14 days of the date of its original meeting or any adjourned meeting notify that Member by recorded delivery post of its findings of fact and of its decision and the grounds for that decision or recommendation, and shall inform him of his right of appeal under Regulations 2.8 and 2.9 below, and shall send a copy of the notification to the Board.
- 2.7 Where the Panel has made recommendations to the Board under 2.5(d) above, the Board shall decide whether or not to adopt such recommendations a Board Meeting shall be convened (via e-mail, personal or conference call communications) as soon as practicable to decide on the sanction to be imposed.
- 2.8 If the Member or the person who made the original complaint disagrees with the decision of the Panel, he shall be entitled to make a new complaint pursuant to Rule 3.1 (b) of Part A of the Union's Dispute Resolution and Disciplinary Procedures for matters other than Doping and Child Protection Matters by way of a Notice. The Notice must set out in detail why the Member or the person who made the original complaint disagrees with the decision of the Panel. The Notice must be accompanied by a cheque for £100 made payable to the Union ("the Deposit"). This

Deposit shall be held by the Union and re-paid to the Member or the person who made the original complaint in the event that his complaint against the Decision is upheld by an Arbitral Panel or Disciplinary Committee. Where the Member's or the person who made the original complaint is rejected by an Arbitral Panel or Disciplinary Committee or if the matter is resolved by mediation, the Deposit shall be retained by the Union.

2.9 The Investigations Officer shall consider the matter and decide if the Notice shows that there is on the face of it sufficient evidence for the case to be determined in accordance with Rule 6.1 of Part A of the Union's Dispute Resolution and Disciplinary Procedures for matters other than Doping and Child Protection Matters. If he does so decide, he shall refer the Dispute to be decided by the Disciplinary Committee or to resolve by arbitration or by mediation in accordance with Rule 6.2 of Part A of the Union's Dispute Resolution and Disciplinary Procedures for matters other than Doping and Child Protection Matters. A different person shall be appointed as the Investigation Officer to make this decision to the person who was appointed as the Investigations Officer to review the initial Complaint against the Member.

Clause 8.2 of the Terms of Reference of the Sprint Racing Committee

The Executive Committee shall have the power to appoint a panel of three persons to decide any matter referred to it pursuant to Rule 6.2(a)(ii) of the Union's Dispute Resolution and Disciplinary Procedures for matters other than Doping and Child Protection Matters in accordance with the Disciplinary Regulations approved by the Board and adopted by the Sprint Racing Committee from time to time.

In addition to the Section's Disciplinary Regulations the British Canoeing Sprint Racing Committee adopted regulations on 1 January 2001 as follows:

3. Code of Ethics

Everyone within the BC Sprint Racing Section is subject to the conditions and ethics as given in Section 5 of the BC 'Coaching Code' published by the BC UK Coaching Service, and are required to operate under the same general Sport and Recreation Code of Ethics.

4. Regatta Officials

- 4.1 It is vital for the honourable nature of the Sport that Officials are not subjected to any act that may compromise their position.
- 4.2 Regatta Officials must not be threatened or subjected to harassment, intimidation or abuse. No attempt should be made to persuade Regatta Officials to take an action which is dishonest or contrary to the Official's code of ethics or honourable nature of the Sprint Racing Regulations. This applies at any time, in or out of competition. It is incumbent on each Official to report all such acts.
- 4.3 The report should be in writing and sent without delay to the Sprint Racing Committee (through the Section Secretary) who will consider the matter in accordance with the Section's Disciplinary Regulations.
- 4.4 In the event of an action taken immediately prior to or during a BC Regatta, the Official should hand their written report to the Chief Official. The Chief Official with the Regatta Committee must take action in accordance with the Section's Disciplinary Regulations.

Boats: there is no storage available onsite at all times. It is entirely the owners' responsibility to ensure that their boat(s) is (are) used and handled safely, stored securely or moved around the venue.

All boats must have adequate buoyancy to keep the boat afloat when filled with water and support the weight of the paddler(s). Competitors will be disqualified or incur penalty points if found to have paddled in a boat with insufficient buoyancy.

All boats require visible additional Buoyancy, a Number slot on the center line of the aft and to comply with minimum Weight regulations. Boats are checked by Boat Control at all national regattas.

Lane Numbers: Paddlers/clubs require their own lane numbers (1-9). Sets are available for sale at £25 from the Secretary's desk.

Guidelines for entry to National Sprint Regattas.

See page D1 in the Handbook for the 'Standards for Racing' chart for entry level times to race at National Sprint Regattas. All the ability classes shown together in a band have the same fastest and slowest standard times and/or HCs. The times between indicate how the times might change depending on the Handicap applied to allow for the weather conditions.

National Regatta Minimum Time Standards are monitored; **Penalty Points can be awarded** for not achieving the minimum national regatta standard times. Applicable only to the slowest classes for each group; i.e. when paddlers can't be demoted (allowance will be made for the prevailing weather conditions).

The Sprint Registration Scheme is a unique database for sprint clubs and paddler. Team Leaders must confirm when first registering their paddlers that paddlers have achieved the BC 2 Star or Paddlepower Discovery qualification or have paddling competency equivalent to these awards.

Competitors must be current members of a National Federation. (i.e. British Canoeing, or WCA SCA, CANI). The only exceptions are BC Mini Sprint or Junior D paddlers who are members of BC affiliated club with a registered junior section.

The number used to register these juniors will be the club's affiliation number followed by their own club paddler number. When juniors are promoted, to division 'C' or above, they must become a member of the British Canoeing. **Team Leaders will need to update the on-line Paddler Registration database with the junior's new BC number.**

Only Registered Paddlers can compete in a British Canoeing National Sprint Regatta. Please note, Paddler Registrations close approx. 1 week before the regatta entry deadline.

Ranking List: The ranking list (see Section D) is intended as a 'working' list and includes registered paddlers who have entered a National Regattas during the last two or three years or those considered likely to race in the current season. Paddlers registered in the past, but not listed in the Handbook are retained in the Database archives and can be reinstated at any time by their Team Leader if they are a current BC member.

National Entries must conform with British Canoeing Sprint Racing Competition Rules (pages A4 –A24) and National Regatta Conditions/Terms of Participation (pages B11–B16) See also Team Leaders' Responsibilities page B10 and Notes for Canoe classes on page B12

New for 2018

An Annual National Club Medal competition:

All British medal winners of National Championship events, including Paracanoe, the Mini Sprint and Paddle-Ability series medal winners will gain points for their Clubs. Points will be allocated to the first three medal winners, in each championship event. The winning club will be the club with the most points gained during the year. There will be an exciting prize for the club with the most points (medal winners) at the end of the season.

'Band Together' Regatta - 2nd –3rd June 2018: for this 1 regatta only. All Kayak Events refer to the Standards of Racing Bands, see page D1 in the Handbook and not as the usual separate kayak classes within each band. K1 events will be raced irrespective of paddlers age, i.e. no Senior or Master or Junior events but will be separated by gender. K2 and K4 includes all within the numbered Band, irrespective of age and gender. Canoes will race separately to the kayaks in their usual seeded races.

New for 2018 cont'd

Introduction of a trial Under 12s Sprint Kayak K1 Event:

To assist Under 12s to progress into the main classes at our National Sprint Regattas, during 2018 we are introducing a Under 12s sprint K1 event run over a 500m course starting at the **May Regatta**.

Depending on the interest, a review at the end of the season will determine its development.

It will be the club Team Leader/Coach's responsibility to make sure that their Under 12 paddlers are confident and competent to paddle down the HPP course in a sprint K1.

For this event:

- Any Sprint K1 other than a Lightning may be paddled.
- Boys must be able to cover 500m in a minimum of 3.45 minutes and K1 events will be run as an all-boys event.
- Girls must be able to cover 500m in a minimum of 3.45 minutes and K1 events will
 run as an all-girls event.
- The races will only be combined if there are insufficient numbers.
- Existing Lightning paddlers may enter this event providing they have achieved the
 required time in their own sprint K1 and their Team Leaders have registered them in
 the database with this K1 time as an Under 12.
- All Under 12 paddlers for this class/event, must wear a buoyancy aid at all times when they are on the water.
- Once they have achieved the time for D Classes they will automatically be promoted.
- · Existing D Class paddlers are not allowed to enter.
- The U12 K1 events will score points during the Inter club McGregor Challenge regatta which will go towards their club's score.
- Lightning/Mini Sprint Series points accumulated will continue to be added to the club's points and go towards the Marsport Trophy.

SUMMARY OF TEAM LEADERS' RESPONSIBILITIES

PRE-REGATTA - At the Club & Submitting Entries

- Ensure that the club you are representing is affiliated to British Canoeing
- Ensure all paddlers have achieved the relevant standard (time & proficiency) to compete at National Regattas. (Note: Penalty Points may be awarded if the minimum standards for racing at National Regattas are not achieved in races).
- Ensure paddlers hold current BC membership before submitting their entries.
- Update any changes to name of Team Leader and/or Deputy Team Leader, including contact details for both, via the On-line Database.
- Update any changes to club paddler information (i.e. newly promoted Girls/Boys C membership number) via the On-line Database.
- Inform any changes to the club's racing colours to the Club Colours Official on Regatta.ClubColours@Britishcanoeing.org.uk
- Ensure that paddlers understand the BC Sprint Racing Competition Rules and the Terms/Conditions of Participation.
- Encourage paddlers to purchase their own Sprint & Marathon Handbook.
- Promote National Regattas to club members.
- Complete the regatta entries On-line by the closing date & arrange prompt payment of the race fees.
- Check timetable for clashes and problems. Check the detailed regatta programme ensuring that every entry made is shown correctly.
- Check and pass on to your club members any additional safety information & rules distributed via the programme or noticeboard.

BEFORE THE START OF RACING

- Ensure that paddlers and their boats are adequately prepared for conditions
- Ensure that all paddlers are fully aware of safety measures
- Check that boats have sufficient, and visible, additional buoyancy to keep the boat floating level with the water and support the crew when capsized.
- Arrive on time for the Team Leaders' meeting. Be ready with all known deletions and crew changes. Make any late entries (if lanes are available) during the meeting.
- Advise paddlers of any changes and/or alterations to the programme.

DURING COMPETITION

- Ensure paddlers arrive in time for their races, wearing club colours which are visible and with the correct lane number.
- Ensure that K4s/C4s, if required, are booked in advance. Boat hire is included in the Race Entry Fee.
- Be available during the competition to act on behalf of your club regarding further deletions and crew changes.
- Be available during the competition to receive notification of disqualifications and deal with any problems or protests involving paddlers from your club.
- Collect from, and promptly return to, the Secretary's Desk all Long Distance Numbers. A deposit of £10.00 is required.

AFTER THE REGATTA

- Display the Official results on Club notice board
- Take the required action on promotions or demotions of your club paddlers

Terms/Conditions of Participation

1. Team Leader Appointment

- a) Clubs are to register the name of the Club's Team Leader (and if you wish, a nominated Deputy), in the On-line Database, accessible via http://canoesprint.britishcanoeing.org.uk.
- b) If the registered Team Leader is unable to attend a regatta then he/she must inform the Chief Official and nominate their Deputy as early as possible before the regatta.

2. Communication

The Organising and Competition Committees will only communicate with Team Leaders (or their nominated deputies).

3. Safety

- 3.1 The Team Leaders are responsible for the safety of their club members and should ensure that: -
- a) Paddlers are suitably dressed for the weather, water and race conditions.
- b) Paddlers are able to perform basic capsize drills and are briefed on what to do when approached by an umpire boat
- c) Paddlers are able to swim at least 50 metres in clothing without a personal flotation device.
- d) Boats must have sufficient buoyancy to float level with the water while supporting the crew when capsized. Boats' inherent buoyancy must be supplemented by additional and visible fixed flotation material or by the provision of sealed bulkheads.
- e) All competitors are in possession of a lifejacket or buoyancy aid that conforms to the standard of the I.C.F or EN 393 & 395.
- f) Paddlers are aware that the Competition Committee may at their discretion cancel or postpone racing, or insist on the wearing of buoyancy aids. Whenever buoyancy aids are compulsory (for defined classes of paddlers or all) an Orange flag will be displayed on the flag pole by the Finish tower.
- 3.2 In the event of an electrical storm paddlers will be required to leave the course immediately. A public address announcement will be made, umpire boats will ring a bell. Racing will not recommence until deemed safe by the Competition Committee.

4. Club Colours

- **4.1**. The Paddler's registered club 'colours' must be worn and be visible when competing.
- a) Crew boats where more than one club is represented, paddlers must wear the club colours for the club in whose name they are registered.
- b) Clubs racing for the **first time at a National Regatta** may request exemption by applying to the Club Colours Official on Regatta.ClubColours@Britishcanoeing.org.uk.

 To arrange a limited period when the club's competitors can wear a plain white shirt with no

markings. The club must register its colours within this limited period.

5 Entries.

- a) Team Leaders must complete their club's on-line entries before the entry deadline.
- **b)** Payments for entries, must be made at the time the entries are submitted. Either by a bank direct transfer or by phone to the BC Office using a credit or debit card or post a cheque to the BC Office.
- c) Telephone entries are not accepted.
- d) The entry closing date is normally the Friday 2 weeks before the event.
- e) No entries are accepted after the deadline other than at the Team Leaders meeting if spare lanes are available, then Team Leaders may be able to request a 'Late' entry.

Terms/Conditions of Participation

- f) Entries made without the correct fee(s) being paid when the entries are submitted can be charged as 'Late' Entries.
- g) No refund of race fees will be made in the event of cancellation of part of or the whole of the competition for whatever reason

6. Notes on Classes

- a) Kayak competitors are divided into Men & Women; these two subdivisions are then further divided by age into groups Senior, Masters (over 34yrs) & Junior (under 18yrs), They are then further divided into age and/or ability classes, as shown on the Standards for Sprint Racing (page D1).
- b) Masters; the first year a paddler can compete in a Masters event is the year of their thirty fifth birthday (35th) providing they are not already ranked in Men's 'A' or Women's 'A.' who, irrespective of their age, cannot compete in Masters events.
- c) Canoe paddlers are divided into Men & Women. These two subdivisions being further divided into two age groups Junior & Senior. They are then divided into ability groups as shown in the Standards for Sprint Racing (page D1).
- N.B: All Canoe races, except when there are sufficient numbers of entries for National Championship events, will be in combined mixed classes, (i.e. include male, female, senior & junior). Athletes will be seeded from regatta to regatta and placed in the appropriate seeded finals, or when there are 27 or more entries for an event, into seeded heats progressing by time to 2 Finals. Fastest Men/Boys = Final M, Fastest Women/Girls = Final W
- d) Promotions/Demotions within classes will be based on improvement/decline in standard of performance. Once ratified by the SRC nominee, will take effect at the next regatta.
- e) When applying for registration, the time submitted is the time recorded for a 500m test/race, in order that new paddlers can be classified correctly. Beginners **do not** automatically start in the "D" group.
- f) The chart 'Standards for Sprint Racing' on page D1 demonstrates the way in which the subdivision bands are made according to speed. The ability classes shown together in a band have the same fastest and slowest standard times. The intermediate times shown indicate how the times might change depending on the Handicap applied to allow for the weather conditions. Penalty Points may be awarded if the minimum standards for National Regattas are not achieved in classes where paddlers can't be demoted.
- g) Combined Events To facilitate programming, the Organising Committee reserves the right to combine classes in any distance at any regatta.
- h) Paddlers must race ONLY in their designated class for singles events (K1 and C1). Exceptions may be made at the request of national coaches.
- i) Competitors may race in a Standards for Sprint Racing time band above their designated class in crew boats only, with the following exceptions:
 - i) Men or Boys may not paddle in Women or Girls races
 - ii) Seniors or Masters may not paddle in Junior races
 - iii) Seniors or Juniors may not paddle in Masters races

7. Before Team Leaders meeting: Check your Programme

a) On receipt of the Regatta Programme, Team Leaders are to verify their club's entries in order to raise any issues for correction at the Team Leaders Meeting.

Note. You may find it useful to print a copy of your entry for this purpose as the meeting goes very quickly, and leaves no time for hesitation.

b) The Organising Committee will do its best to arrange the programme so that all races in each class are scheduled to give a minimum rest period of 40 minutes between races. Any competitor racing above their designated class in crew boats or in two designated classes i.e. both kayak and canoe, cannot expect the programme to accommodate this situation.

8. Team Leaders' Meeting

- a) There will be 1 meeting per regatta, at 8am on Saturday (unless otherwise stated) at the regatta course. If the meeting cannot be completed in a reasonable time it will be adjourned and the time of the reconvened meeting announced.
- **b)** Each club's nominated Team Leader will deal with alterations and late entries at the meeting.
- c) The Team Leader will be responsible for all the money owed for all entries placed. This money must be paid by 4pm. on Saturday. Failure to pay on time will incur a £20.00 surcharge that must be paid by the end of racing on Saturday. Failure to meet this deadline will result in all paddlers from that club being disgualified from Sunday's racing.

Terms/Conditions of Participation

d) Procedure for Team Leaders Meeting

- i) Team Leader signs in on arrival.
- ii) Meeting commences promptly at 8.00 a.m.
- iii) Technical announcements.
- iv) If there are any objections to the programmed order of events they must be raised at this stage.

e) Late entry provision: -

- i) Events will be dealt with in race order.
- **ii)** The Chief Official will call out in order each set of heats (or finals, if there are no heats). Team Leaders needs to scratch all competitors not intending to race, or make any required suitable changes. They should call out the lane number first then the club followed by the competitors' name(s).
- iii) If there are any vacant lanes the Chief Official will then ask Team Leaders to raise one hand for each late entry they wish to make. If there are more late entries required than there are vacant lanes available, a draw will take place.
- iv) It is not permitted to return to an event that has been concluded.
- v) Late entries will be accepted for long distance events (5 km.), up to one hour before the race, on payment of the <u>standard late entry fee</u>. Entries can be made on the form available from the regatta secretary's desk.

9. Additional Late Entries (after the Team Leaders' Meeting)

Extra late entries after the Team Leaders meeting for laned races will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances and at the discretion of the Competition Committee.

Any such entries will be charged a double entry fee.

10. Lane Numbers

- a) All boats must be fitted with a Number slot on the centre aft line of the boat and the correct number displayed in all races.
- **b)** Races of 1000m or less require a Lane number. Sets of numbers 1-9, are available for sale at £25 from the Regatta Secretary's desk.
- c) For races over 1000m in length, long distance races number boards must be obtained from the Regatta Secretary's desk by Team Leaders. A deposit of £10 will be charged and £5 deducted from the deposit for any numbers lost or not returned.

11. Crew Names

- **a)** Notification of any deletions, additions or changes to crew names must be made at the Regatta Secretary's desk at least <u>60 minutes before the race</u>.
- b) Any crew which has not notified the full set of names may be allowed to start the race but will not appear in the results, nor will they go forward to the next round of the competition.
- c) Paddlers who take the place of other paddlers without the proper substitution notification being made at the Regatta Secretary's Desk, could be liable to be allocated 1 penalty point each and the boat disqualified from the event.

12. K4/C4 Hire

- a) K4s for hire will be stored on racks outside the boathouse.
- **b)** K4s must not be put down on the ground & crews must not sit in the K4s except when they are on the water.
- c) Young paddlers must be supervised by a responsible adult when launching and recovering the boats. The Organising Committee reserves the right for their Boathouse Official to refuse a boat to any youth crew that is not accompanied by an adult.
- d) Check your boat before you use it. If it is not in order or damaged, please report the fact to the Official, so that you are not accountable for any loss or damage.
- e) C4/K4s can be booked for any race during the course of the day as soon as the boathouse is open, and the Official is present.

Terms/Conditions of Participation

- f) Crews must supply their own wing-nuts and toggles when they report to collect the boat they have booked.
- g) Crews must use the boat allocated or risk disqualification from the race.
- h) Plastex K4s will only be allocated to Senior or Junior A, or combined A/B, class races.

13. Protests & Disqualifications

- a) Notification of disqualification will only be made to the Team Leader or his/her nominated deputy.
- b) Any protest or appeal can only be made by a Team Leader.

Note: Team Leaders should realise that it is impossible to adequately umpire all races in every regatta. Where infringements are observed these will be reported to the Competition Committee who will, if necessary, inform the offending paddler's Team Leader. Not all infringements may be observed by Officials. Team Leaders have a responsibility to explain the situation to paddlers who could easily become frustrated by what might seem to be an arbitrary system of justice.

14. National Regatta Results

Unofficial Results are available on-line during the regatta from www.regattaresults.org.uk. The Official Results including promotions will be available as soon as possible after the event from www.canoeracing.org.uk/sprint/

15. Car Parking

a) Team Leaders MUST take an active part to see that club members observe the car parking lines. Access for emergency vehicles must NOT be impeded. Particular attention should be paid to the access road in the vicinity of the Centre Buildings.

Note: The access road and pontoon on seating side of the tower is a No Parking Area.

- **b)** Parked cars must not obstruct the launching access for K4s to the concrete pontoons in front of the boathouses.
- c) Owners should park their vehicles within the marked designated parking areas, responsibly, safely and without causing obstruction at all times.
- d) At certain times during a competition it may become necessary for safety reasons to restrict movement of vehicles on all, or parts of the access roads around the course. Notice will be given if this is required

16. System for junior membership of a British Canoeing Affiliated Club

- a) A junior club member need not be a full member of BC in order to race in the Mini Sprint Series, U12s or Junior D Classes provided they are a member of a BC affiliated club with a Registered Youth Section. The membership number used for sprint registrations will be the club's affiliation number followed by his (her) own individual club number.
- b) When promoted to class 'C' or above, the junior must become a full member of British Canoeing in their own right. Team Leaders will need to update the On-line Paddler Database with the juniors new BC number as soon as possible.

17. 'Tiddly Winks' and Boards

Coloured counters (known affectionately as Tiddly Winks) are awarded for the first three places in all Final 1s in the junior classes. These awards can be collected from the Regatta Secretary's desk. Also available, at a cost of approximately £5, is a small wooden board on which the self-adhesive counters can be mounted for posterity!

18. All National Regattas are held in accordance with British Canoeing Sprint Racing Competition Rules and these terms/conditions of participation.

Terms/Conditions of Participation

British Canoeing Sprint Regatta "Liability" Statement

Canoeing and Kayaking are assumed-risk water-contact sports. Participation in these sports carries an inherent risk of injury to competitors and damage to property. Participants should be aware of the risks involved in these sports and are responsible for their own actions and their involvement in these sports.

In all cases competitors compete entirely at their own risk.

The Regatta Organisation, the Sprint Racing Committee and British Canoeing exclude liability for any loss or damage that may occur to competitors or property during participation in canoeing and kayaking to the fullest extent permitted by law.

All competitors must be <u>current</u> members of British Canoeing except for juniors ranked in 'Girls D', 'Boys D', Girls U12 or Boys U12 and 'Lightning A' or 'Lightning B' who are members of BC affiliated clubs with a registered junior section. Regatta Entries are accepted on the basis that each competitor and Parent / Guardian of a junior is aware of and has accepted the above conditions. Team Leaders are to ensure that all of their club competitors are aware of and accept the above statements.

In the event of unsuitable weather conditions, the organisers may at their discretion cancel or postpone a race(s), or insist on the wearing of buoyancy aids. An Orange flag will be displayed on the flag pole by the Finish Tower to indicate that buoyancy aids are compulsory for any (or all) classes of paddlers.

INTER-CLUB NATIONAL COMPETITION

The MacGregor Paddle Challenge



John MacGregor M.A., Trinity College, Cambridge; (1825-1892) Barrister-at-Law, Captain of the Royal Canoe Club, through his extremely popular books and magazine articles from 1865 to 1892, practically invented the sport of canoeing (or kayaking).

The beginning of recreational canoeing can be traced directly to an Englishman, called John MacGregor, in the middle of the nineteenth century. He was a man with a penchant for boat design and exploration, who developed his craft based on the Eskimo Kayak, which he named *Rob Roy*. He took the boat on long journeys along the rivers and across the lakes of Europe, lecturing and writing about his travels as he went. His tales attracted quite a following and soon there were many kayaks in Great Britain based on his kayak design that is still referred to as a *Rob Roy*.

Canoes are the larger category under which kayaks fall: while all kayaks are canoes, not all canoes are kayaks. Paddlers in kayaks sit with their legs stretched out in front of them and canoeists generally paddle from a kneeling position. Most canoes are open hulled; while kayaks have covered decks. Canoe paddles are typically single bladed, while kayak paddles are double ended.

Some might say these differences occur because of the type of water available, but a look at the evolution of British canoeing culture during the past one hundred and twenty years would suggest that the major changes are due to those who have written and taught, coupled with the availability of canoes or kayaks.

The first period from 1865 evolved from the founder of British canoeing, John MacGregor. His book, *A Thousand Miles in the Rob Roy Canoe*, fired the imagination of the Victorians. The 'Rob Roy' was a stable kayak, went in a straight line and had a large cockpit. Made of wood, it was easy to handle and a boat in which any beginner would have felt safe. In this period, wooden canoes were imported and were used for family outings and touring, the limitation to the growth was the cost of the wooden craft.

The second period from the 1930s to the 1950s is identified with the wooden frame and canvas kayaks and the start of the BCU Coaching Scheme. Percy Blandford wrote books and produced a host of designs for the Scout movement, which brought canoeing to a much wider number of people. The low cost, make-it-yourself PBK (Percy Blandford Kayak) designs, were, like the *'Rob Roy'*, stable, went in a straight line, and had large cockpits. The British Canoeing Coaching Scheme was started in the 1950s by John Dudderidge. The original proficiency tests were designed around the use of the open cockpit straight-line kayak.

The third period, which had a massive impact on both the expansion and the change in direction of British canoeing culture started around the early 1960s, when in 1962, the BCU appointed its first Director of Coaching, Oliver Cock, giving added drive to what was to become a very powerful teaching scheme. For various reasons, the Coaching Scheme became more and more interested in rough water canoeing. At the same time, glass reinforced plastic became available. Moulds were produced for the home builder and the designs reflected the interest in rough water. Thousands of kayaks were produced with rockered hulls and small cockpits. By 1980, the Coaching Scheme had 3,000 members almost all teaching in the close fitting cockpit kayak. So powerful had that culture become that, if the word 'canoeing' is mentioned to almost anyone in Britain, their immediate image would be that of a young man or woman strapped into a kayak, wearing a crash helmet and wetsuit, performing turns and rolls on rapidly moving rivers. This was a great image for the adventurous teenager but daunting for many others who might wish to paddle. Indeed, a far, far cry from the canoeing of MacGregor.

MacGregor spent part of his youth in Halifax, Nova Scotia, where his father was stationed in the 1830s in a fort. He may have picked up some canoeing experience there.

INTER-CLUB NATIONAL COMPETITION

Reading his books one notices he carried in his canoe a number of religious tracts (in a movement called "Muscular Christianity") written in the local language and was always ready to hand them out. He did not travel on Sundays, but did lecture on his travels and gave much of the profits to charities, especially to boys in the inner cities.

He published accounts of several other canoe cruises, including one to Scandinavia and another to Jordan and Egypt. The appendix to that book gives some construction details for his canoe designs.

His wooden split paddles were presented to Royal Canoe Club in 1959. Subsequently these were used as the trophy at the BCU National Inter-Club Sprint Racing Regatta, being first presented in 1977 to the winning club Fladbury and still fought over annually. A full list of winners can be found on page C13.

The MacGregor Challenge is a National Inter Club competition with competitors register within a national 'sprint standards for racing' ability class.

Note: We are currently reviewing the point scoring process with a focus on creating a parity with club size and their ability to win the competition. If this modelling exercise is completed sufficiently early, a revised set of rules will be made available before entries for the MacGregor regatta are opened.

Scoring for the MacGregor Paddle Challenge Competition

Under the following system most clubs should have an opportunity to achieve a winning score:

- Each Club will score 1 point for each promotion accredited to any Under 12 Kayak, Junior (A to D), Masters (A to D) or Senior (A to D) ability class paddlers since and including the previous MacGregor regatta.
- Each Club will have deducted from their score penalty points accrued by every Under 12
 Kayak, Junior (A to D), Masters (A to D) or Senior (A to D) ability class paddler since and
 including the previous MacGregor regatta.
- 3. Regatta officials will score1 point for every half day worked to put towards the MacGregor competition for their nominated club. To qualify, they need to have volunteered and attended for the equivalent of 6 days (12 points) since the previous MacGregor regatta.
- The scoring at the Inter Club Regatta will be on the following basis:
 Each Club will score its best U12 Kayak, Junior (A to D), Masters (A to D) or Senior (A to D) ability class paddlers.
 - 12 K1/C1 results in all finals
 - 6 K2/C2 results in all finals
 - 3 K4/C4 results in all finals

Scores will be awarded, provided there are at least three crews participating, on the following basis: First - 20 points, second - 19 points, third - 18 points and so on.

5. Notes:

- a. Composite crews, with members from more than one Club, do not score.
- At least 50% of the crew must be registered in the class in which they are racing.
 i.e. 2 paddlers in a K4 or 1 paddler in a K2.

Crews may be made up with paddlers from a lower ability band with the following exceptions:

- i. Men may not paddle in Women's races.
- ii. Boys may not paddle in Girls' races.
- iii. Seniors or Masters may not paddle in Junior races.
- iv. Seniors or Juniors may not paddle in Masters races
- c. No one may enter any singles class other than their designated class as shown on the Paddler Database File. Exceptions may be made when national coaches wish to enter paddlers in a different class.

Disciplinary Procedures

Offences Incurring Penalty Points

The Chief Official will be solely responsible for all disciplinary matters of a minor nature, under the operation of a penalty points system, referred to in Rule 31 of the British Canoeing Sprint Racing Competition Rules. At his / her discretion, he / she may authorise the issuing of penalty points to each paddler involved in each of the following offences. These offences are considered to be detrimental to the efficient operation of regattas and / or potentially hazardous.

• C	Racing in incorrect colours
• N	Racing with incorrect or missing number
 Z 	Failure to observe water zoning procedures
• S	Unauthorised substitution for another paddler
• F	Failure to report, having qualified, for a final
• D	Conduct during racing likely to cause injury or damage to equipment
• L	Use of offensive language
• U	Underweight boat (see note 1)
• R	Failure to report for boat weighing immediately (see note 2)
 B 	Insufficient buoyancy (see note 3)
• T	Race times below minimum Sprint Standards of Racing for National Regattas (see note 4)

Notes

- Weights must be properly fixed to the boat or seat. Stones in bags or any other temporary system will not be accepted.
- 2. Boats required for weighing will be notified shortly after the finish of the race.
- Boats buoyancy will be checked. Penalty points will be applied or competitor(s) can be disqualified from a race if Officials find a boat has been on the course without visible additional buoyancy (or fixed bulkheads).
- Applicable only to the slowest classes for each group, i.e. when paddlers can't be demoted, (Men's D, Masters D, Women's D, Women Masters B, Boys D & Girls D)

Accumulation of Penalty Points and Penalty Fines

- When a paddler accumulates a total of 4 or more penalty points, he / she is liable for a fine of £10 per point in excess of 3 points.
- 2. Fines are to be paid at the Regatta Secretary's Desk
- 3. A paddler liable for a fine cannot race until the fine has been paid.
- 4. Penalty points are accumulated over 4 consecutive regattas and are not restricted to a single year. Thus, for example, penalty points incurred in the last regatta of the year will remain active until the start of the 4th regatta of the following year.

Notification

Team leaders may be notified when a penalty point has been issued to a paddler from his / her team.

A record of all the active penalty points is listed at the end of the official results for each regatta.

Disciplinary Matters of a More Serious Nature.

In respect to all other disciplinary matters the Chief Official, Competition Committee and the Competition Jury must act as described in the Sprint Racing Rules which include penalties in accordance with British Canoeing Rules or the Sprint Racing Section Disciplinary Regulations.

N.B. A reported incidence of dissent / abuse towards a Regatta Official, another competitor or their equipment, or a spectator must be treated as conduct prejudicial to the interests of the sport and dealt with under the Section Disciplinary Regulations.

MINI SPRINT SERIES 2018

The Mini Sprint Series is run alongside the National Sprint Regattas held at Holme Pierrepont in Nottingham during May, June, July and September.

The Mini Sprint series has been specifically developed to suit the needs of young people who have chosen this discipline at this time. It is part of the Paddlesport foundation which helps them progress into whichever discipline they may eventually choose. The programme has taken into account that full sized K1s, K2s and K4s are too large for young people. Together, Canoe England's Paddlesport Participation Programme and British Canoeing Sprint Racing Committee have formed the Mini Sprint Series. This has evolved from the Lightning series that was originally only a K1 event. Now as a weekend event it is giving racing experience on the National course so that the paddlers have a smooth transition into the Class D events.

The aim of the series is:

- To introduce young paddlers to the venue.
- To develop experience of sprint competition at a national event.
- To develop teamwork.
- To have the opportunity to develop competitive paddling skills.
- To become motivated to progress through the main classes.
- To meet and make friends with paddlers from other clubs.
- To enjoy, have fun and become confident sprint paddlers.

Team leaders notes on entries and kayaks

- The paddlers will compete over 500 metres in Lightning K1, Hody-style K2s and Rocket K4, with heats and finals run and timed on the main regatta course.
- The cost per seat is exactly as other junior paddling categories.
- Please ensure you enter your paddlers in the correct category, which is based on time, not age. Only Lightning kayaks are to be paddled in the K1 events.
- Clubs should bring their own Hody-style K2. If using a make other than Hody please inform
 the Chief Official before the event. Regatta.ChiefOfficial@britishcanoeing.org.uk
- Rocket K4s only will be used and can be supplied by the SRC. Clubs may bring and use their own Rockets.

When booking a K4:

Team Leaders will book a whole K4, as with classes C and D. When combining with paddlers from other clubs it is the responsibility of the Team Leaders involved to arrange who pays for the entry and to collect payments. It is not the organisers or the volunteer official's remit to sort out your payments. Any changes to your entry must be made at the main Team Leader's meeting. Further changes for entered crews may be made at the Secretary's desk providing all paddlers and team leaders know of the changes.

MINI SPRINT SERIES 2018

Mini Sprint Cup Series

This series is a whole season event and the **Marsport Trophy** will be awarded in September to the club with the most points. Individual paddler points will be awarded for each event during May, June, July and September with double points being awarded at The MacGregor Inter Club Regatta.

Mini Sprint Cup Rules 2018

- Points are accumulated at each event leading to a final at the September Regatta.
- . Mini Sprint points do not count towards The MacGregor Inter Club points.
- At the MacGregor Regatta the Mini Sprints receive double points for their paddling and these go towards the Mini Sprint Cup competition which runs separately from the main Inter Club Competition.
- Mini Sprint Cup includes overall prizes for both male and females in each category and an overall club prize. Details are as follows:

Entry Conditions

To enter the Mini Sprint Series the young people must be under 12 on 1st January 2018 and have achieved at least Paddle Power Discover standard and must be able to paddle a K1 Lightning over 500m in less than 4 minutes.

Categories

- A: (LTA) for those who can complete 500m in under 3 minutes 30 seconds
- B: (LTB) for those who complete 500m between 3 minutes 30 seconds and 4 minutes

Entries

- All entry fees are per seat and will be entered with your club's main regatta entries.
- . Please read notes on entering Rocket K4

Events

May, June and July Regattas with the finals at the September Regatta 2018.

Points Scoring:

All National Mini Sprint winners (individual) are awarded on the same system. Their 2 best regatta scores added to their Mini Sprint Inter Clubs score.

All points scored will count only towards The Mini Sprint Team and individual events.

National Regattas (May, June, September): in K1, K2 and K4.

1st place scores 10 points, 2nd place scores 9 points etc. down to 10th place where
everyone after that scores 1 point, the total number of points scored across K1, K2 and K4
will be added together to determine the results at each regatta. For the K2/K4 races the
same points scoring system will be used i.e. the winning crew will receive 10 points for each
paddler.

MINI SPRINT SERIES 2018

Inter Clubs Regatta (July) in K1, K2 and K4

1st place scores 20 points, 2nd place scores 19 points etc. down to 20th place where everyone after that scores 1 point, the total number of points scored across K1, K2 and K4 will be added together to determine the results. For the K2/K4 races the same points scoring system will be used i.e. the winning crew will receive 20 points **for each paddler**.

Team Event:

The points scoring system is based on each club's best 2 regatta results scores added to their Mini Sprint Inter Clubs points score.

Promotions:

- Promotion from Mini Sprint Category B to A will be based on K1 500m times.
- Promotions from group B to A will automatically be done in the May and June regattas. The
 best set of existing regatta points will be carried through and added to the paddler's July and
 September points gained in A.
- Promotion into Boys D and Girls D is based on normal regatta entry guidelines. This is only
 done after a discussion with the team leader.
- When a paddler is too old to participate in the Mini Sprint Series they do not automatically
 move to D classes. They must reach the required standard. See the Standards Chart on
 page D1. They would be allowed to paddle only in D Class crew boats, with established D
 Class paddlers.

Prizes:

- Tiddly Winks will be awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd places in the K1 Final One only of each
 category and for the three fastest K2/4 crews in each category within the Mini Sprint series.
- Medals will be awarded to the overall series winners 1st, 2nd, 3rd male and female in each
 category. The Marsport Trophy will be awarded to the Club that has accrued the most
 combined category points.
- All participants will be awarded a Certificate each month they enter. These are to be collected by the team leader from the Secretary's Desk.

NATIONAL REGATTA OFFICIALS

Anyone interested in finding out more about assisting at National Regattas is invited to come and sit alongside experienced officials to find out what is involved. The training of officials is a highly important area of our activities with training during National Regattas and at 'out of season' workshop days. A few experienced officials do go on to take the International Canoe Federation Technical Officials Examination, thereby becoming qualified to officiate at ICF or ECA Internationals. ITOs, must have worked a minimum of 6 days (12 points) during the current year to be eligible to apply to be nominated for an International appointment the following year. Regatta Officials interested in knowing more about what this entails contact the Chief Official. Several officials are working in Pre-Regatta groups such as timetabling where paddlers are put into races, updating club colours, registration of paddlers and putting together the printed programme. We also have an IT team who are striving to develop a program that will reduce the workload for

entering and paying, also involved in the further development of the results service.

We are continually trying to recruit volunteers to help run our increasingly popular regattas. No experience or special skills are required but working as a team is important. Just half a day helping, whether morning or afternoon, would be greatly appreciated.

We are looking for assistance with First Aid throughout the regattas. As with the officials this is worked on a rota basis headed by a full time paramedic who takes overall responsibility for reporting accidents. All clubs have qualified first aiders who could help with this important service.

From 2018 all Regatta Officials will be able to earn points which will be added to their club's MacGregor score. 1 point will be awarded for each half day worked. The points become transferable to the club once a minimum of 12 points (6 days) has been accumulated since the previous MacGregor. Points will also be awarded to those who attend workshops. A total of 20+ points is achievable by each official. Officials who are not members of a club may donate their points to a club of their choice.

Tokyo Strategy and Funding:

British Canoeing is in the fortunate position as a sport to receive a significant level of funding from the National Lottery which is allocated through UK Sport. The ultimate purpose of the funding for the World Class Performance Programmes is to win Olympic and Paralympic medals. Our process in achieving this starts by focusing on individuality by putting athletes right at the heart of everything we do to create an athlete centred culture.

British Canoeing's Performance Programme funding is dedicated to supporting the most talented athletes in the Olympic disciplines of Canoe Slalom and Canoe Sprint Racing and the Paralympic discipline Paracanoe to win medals at the highest level. Having consistently won Olympic medals since 2000, the sport gained its first ever Olympic Champion, Tim Brabants, in the K1-1000 in Beijing in 2008. At the London 2012 Olympics, Ed McKeever followed this success, winning Gold on home soil in K1-200. We had our best ever Olympic results at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, with Liam Heath winning Gold in the K1-200 and Liam Heath & Jon Schofield winning a Silver medal in the Men's K2-200 event. We also had great success in our Paralympic debut, winning three Gold medals (Jeanette Chippington, Anne Dickens & Emma Wiggs) and two Bronze medals (Nick Beighton and Ian Marsden) at the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games.

Our overall aim is to improve on our Rio 2016 performance at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games. For the Tokyo cycle the British Canoeing Olympic and Paralympic programme will be based at two High Performance Centres. The Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe programmes will be primarily based at Holme Pierrepont in Nottingham and the Canoe Slalom programme will be primarily based at the Lee Valley Whitewater Centre in Hertfordshire.

In 2017, the first year of the Tokyo cycle, athletes in each discipline achieved some outstanding World and European Championship successes. 2017 has also seen significant changes to the personnel within Slalom, Sprint and Paracanoe and was notable as we took time to review the culture within our World Class and Talent programmes. We have introduced some significant and positive changes to improve the wellbeing of athletes and coaches in the programme and this work will continue at pace in 2018.

British Canoeing receives funding from Sport England to support its Talent Programmes. Our vision is to create a world-leading Talent Programme which discovers, nurtures and delivers an oversupply of talented athletes with the characteristics required for senior international success for our World Class Programmes. The vision is also to create an environment committed to the pursuit of excellence and to supporting every athlete to be the best they can be.

Overview of the 2018 Selection Process

Please Note:

At the time of print the 2018 Selection Policy is being finalised. The final copy of the selection policy will be published on the British Canoeing website in January 2018 and can be accessed by the following link www.britishcanoeing.org.uk/olympic-paralympic/policies/

With less than 1000 days until the Tokyo Games, the halfway point in the Tokyo cycle will be reached during 2018.

The Purpose of the Selection Policy is to clearly outline the processes which will lead to the selection of the best athletes for the major canoe sprint competition events in 2018. The Selection Policy is designed to allow athletes to produce optimum performance at the World Championships through clear selection assessments and prioritising preparation for key competition events across age groups.

The Selection policy will focus strongly on supporting the optimal performance delivery in Tokyo and will be focused on Tokyo 2020 Olympic events. The primary aim of the Senior & U23 Competition Programme is to provide opportunities for athletes to develop the racing skills and experiences in order to deliver our 2020 Mission and meet our annual milestone targets. (Section 2)

The Canoe Sprint International Panel (IP), which is appointed by and reports to the Board of British Canoeing, is responsible for all aspects of developing, approving and managing the implementation of the selection policy. This includes the annual policy for all Great Britain Canoe Sprint representative teams at Senior, Under 23 and Junior levels and also the Olympic Selection policy for 2020.


Performances at the Junior & U23 European Championship will determine selection to the Junior & U23 World Championship Team (stage 1 selection). If there are unfilled places in Olympic classes following the Junior European Championships, subject to achieving performance standards, the first boat in the July regatta in specific classes will be considered for Junior World Championship team selection (stage 2 selection).



British Canoeing Talent Programme Overview

As a Talent Programme we look to support athletes along the pathway and within their clubs, acknowledging the support they receive from their club coaches.

Within the British Canoeing Pathway we look to support athletes and those who support the athletes through their journey through 3 layers:

Racing Skills Programme:

Clubs are an essential part of a healthy talent pathway and provide environments which support individuals to fulfil their potential. The England Talent programme is engaging in work to help develop clubs, coaches and parents. British Canoeing is committing to support and work in partnership with coaches, athletes and parents during the Tokyo Olympic cycle to provide support to develop and grow club athletes. Racing skills looks to bring coaches, athletes and parents together to share knowledge and to allow those to be better informed to aid the growth of the young paddler in a fun and inventive way. The programme is all about developing an athletic athlete that wants to remain in the sport, whether it be Sprint, Marathon or any other discipline they choose.

Within the Racing Skills training days, we look to develop the club coaches' experiences and knowledge by creating open forums and workshops lead by the club coaches involving the Talent Coach Development Manager and Talent Pathway Manager working from a framework to help increase the club coaches and athletes' experiences and knowledge. It's not just about developing athletes, the days are also about the coaches and the parents, running individual workshops for each group.

Super Regional Squads:

The SRS programme aims to support, develop and prepare athletes in a manner which assists them to gain the skills and characteristics required to progress onto the British Canoeing ENTS Programme and onto longer term senior international success as members of the GB Sprint Team.

Throughout the course of the year a number of training days and camps will be set out to equip athletes with the skills and training necessary to progress onto Junior teams to compete at the Olympic Hopes and major Championships.

The Regional days provide the opportunity for athletes/Parents and coaches to engage with the Regional SRS coach to help support the athlete in their training in their individual environment.

England National Talent Programme:

The ENTS programme aims to support, develop and prepare athletes in a manner which assists them to gain the skills and characteristics required to progress onto the British Canoeing World Class Podium Potential Programme and onto longer term senior international success as members of the GB Sprint Team.

The ENTS programme sets out to equip athletes with the skills and training necessary to progress onto Junior teams to compete at the Europeans and World championships.

ENTS Camps provide the opportunity for athletes/Parents and coaches to engage with specialist providers in Psychology, Nutrition, Performance Lifestyle and S&C to help support the athlete in their training.




Figure 3: Canoe Sprint Athlete Pathway




Figure 4: Paracanoe Athlete Pathway

All classes within the same band are subject to the same performance standards.

The handicap (HC) column is used to vary the standard time for each band to account for racing conditions at the time. Promotions (P) and demotions (D) are possible on 1000m, 500m, 200m races.

There is no significance to the order in which classes are listed within each time band.

PLACID WATER RACING AWARDS

The awards are intended to recognise and encourage improvement in canoe and kayak racing performance. They can be attempted in any canoe or kayak, although the aim is to encourage the use of straight running craft in an individual's progression to modern racing boats.

The 500m Award is particularly useful to determine the appropriate level of entry for paddlers into Marathon and Sprint Racing.

Canoeing and the Environment:

Canoeing is an exciting, adventurous, competitive and recreational activity from which much of the enjoyment and adventure comes from the natural environment. Every canoeist must remember to respect all wildlife, and take care not to damage or destroy the environment, by observing the <u>You</u>, Your Canoe and the Environment leaflet.

Assessing:

Any Level of British Canoeing Coach (in current membership) or British Canoeing Affiliated Club Official may test candidates for the Placid Water Racing Awards. The awards are administered by the Home Nation Associations on submission of individual Placid Water Racing Award Pass Slips (available from the Home Nation Associations).

1) Time Trial Awards:

Type of boat: Any canoe or kayak

Aim: To introduce and encourage new paddlers to club based competition

The Time Trial Award can be tested over any distance from 2,000 to 10,000 metres. It is awarded on the basis of speed (minutes per 1,000 metres) and can be attempted in any type of canoe or kayak. The award is designed to be flexible; to suit whatever placid water is available. Testing can be organised as part of a fun race, a club handicap race or specially organised time trial.

COACHING AND LEADING THE COMPETITION DISCIPLINES

Developing your coaching and leadership skills through British Canoeing courses

There are various pathways enabling both paddlers (boat based) and non-paddlers (bank based) to become Competition Coaches. There are a range of direct entry awards available, which could be the first step for any aspirant coach or leader.

Paddlesport Instructor

The Paddlesport Instructor (formally Level 1) is aimed at those delivering introductory Paddlesport events and taster sessions, providing fun and engaging experiences for all ages and any of the competitive paddlesport disciplines. The Paddlesport Instructor can plan, deliver and review short coaching sessions, normally with the support of a more qualified coach, so is a great first step for those new to coaching.

If you wish to enter the Coaching Scheme as a 'Boat Based Coach', then you will need the 2 Star Paddlesport Award or the Paddle Power Discover Award or higher, together with completion of a Foundation Safety and Rescue Training Course. The 2 Star is an award that has to be taken in Canoe and Kayak. The choice of boat that is used for each of these is entirely up to you! If you want to use your C1 or K1 for the canoe or kayak aspects of the course, you are entitled to do so.

If you wish to enter as a 'Bank-Based Coach', then you only need to complete a Foundation Safety and Rescue Training Course.

The Foundation Safety and Rescue Course may be included in Paddlesport Instructor course by adding an extra day, or it could be attended prior to the Paddlesport Instructor Training Course.

The Paddlesport Instructor is takes place over 4 days. The course may be modulated over weekends, evenings or during the week over a longer period of time. This offers flexibility to aspirant coaches.

Assessment takes place during the course, with a number of tasks being performed and continual feedback given by the course tutors. The course is generic in nature with opportunity to explore different methods of coaching in and to a variety of craft; canoes and kayaks; singles and crew boats, which offers a great opportunity to try out new boats! Again, you can use the craft you regularly paddle and coach from for the majority of the course.

Coach Award

Launched in January 2018, the Coach Award creates discipline specific pathways across all disciplines, including the Racing Coach Award. The Coach Awards are designed for people whose core function is to coach paddlers who want to gain/improve paddlesport skills. This will include coaching beginners new to the sport, or paddlers looking to develop their skills in the given discipline/environment. The Racing Coach Award is open to boat-based and bank based paddlers.

The Racing Coach Award includes a 2 day of Core Coach Training and a 2 day Racing Coach training, which is concluded by a 1 day assessment. There are direct entry options available, a British Canoeing membership is the only prerequisite of the Core Coach Training. Where relevant, coaches who have already completed various British Canoeing qualifications can by-pass the Core Coach Training and/or Discipline Specific Training. Coaches who have completed the Sprint Discipline Support Module Part 2 (training and logbook) can choose to by-pass the respective Racing Coach Training if they feel confident with the content.

There is a supportive eLearning package available to aid learning.

COACHING AND LEADING THE COMPETITION DISCIPLINES

Performance Coach

Performance Coaches (formally Level 3) are discipline specific and is available in Sprint or Marathon. Performance Coaches are trained to oversee an annual programme for paddlers and coaches under their direction. It is the ideal qualification for those coaches who have a lead coaching role within a club.

Performance Coaches can be boat based or bank based. They would need appropriate qualifications or experience required to fulfil the conditions to become a boat based coach.

The Performance Coach Course consists of a 3-day (or equivalent) Generic Core, this is followed by 3 Intermediate Supporting Modules and then a 2 day Discipline Specific Course. Then various assessment tasks have to be fulfilled over a 12 month period. The assessment process involves two parts, one in the training environment and one at a competition environment with the coach's own long term athletes.

Paddlesport Leader

The Paddlesport Leader Award is aimed at paddlers taking on formal leadership responsibilities in benign, sheltered water environments and aims to support Leaders to run safe, quality, enjoyable trips based on their group's needs and aspirations. For example, in a racing club, a Paddlesport Leader could provide a safety overview on a training session chaperoning other paddlers.

The Paddlesport Leader is a direct entry award and training is not compulsory. Leaders can opt for British Canoeing Paddlesport Leader Training courses, which are available to support you in your development of the required skills. These courses typically cover leadership skills, and the associated personal skills, safety and rescue skills. Alternatively, you may wish to opt for more bespoke training opportunities. For example, private tuition, in-house training at your club, working alongside/shadowing other Leaders, or conference/symposium workshops.

The only prerequisites for the 1 day assessment are Home Nation membership and a one day First Aid Award.

There are supportive resources available, including the <u>Paddlesport Leader eLearning</u>, a Skills Checklist and Leading Experience record.

Support Modules for Marathon or Sprint

Any level of Coach can attend a one-day DSM course. These are available in both Sprint and Marathon and focus on the basic aspects involved in coaching, particularly forward paddling technique in canoe and kayak. It is designed to give the Coach an initial understanding of Sprint and Marathon Coaching. Supporting Modules

To help a coach or leader with their personal development, there are a number of Foundation Modules and Intermediate Modules available as supporting units. This includes the Strength and Conditioning Foundation Module is available for clubs or groups of clubs to access. This course is aimed at the coach who wishes to commence Strength and Conditioning work at the club without having to rely on expensive equipment or hiring sports halls or gyms.

COACHING AND LEADING THE COMPETITION DISCIPLINES

APL

In some instances aspirant coaches may have prior experience that may enable them to enter the Coaching Awards programme at a higher level.



Chairman's Foreword - 2018

Our racing calendar, with its varying and challenging programme, is the envy of others. It is of course the MRC that oversee and regulate, but more importantly, it is the dedication and hard work of all our clubs and their many unpaid volunteers that put on the weekly events that should really be congratulated. Our success in attracting competitors & perhaps increasing BC membership, is being recognised by BC with a significant increase in our central grant for the first time in over 10 years. These will be available on the MRC Website in July and August ready for 1st September 2018. Details of the purpose of the changes will be made available before this.

Following discussion at the ACM it is decided that Club Colours are compulsory at all future Assessment Races. Any paddler who is not a member of a club with registered colours must wear a white top.

Your committee are pleased to hear from you regarding improvements you would like to see. We hope that 2018 and beyond will see us working more closely with the DW organising committee, the many schools competitors and see further developments to broaden the appeal of our discipline. One major draw of our competitions is the diversity of our courses, water conditions and venues. It is vital that race organisers continue to deliver challenging and stimulating courses, and do not succumb to the temptation to sterilise races in imitation of international formats, or in misplaced fear of Health & Safety legislation. BC fully support our approach of risk assessments and competitor disclaimers, so both competitors and organisers can be sure that there is a clear understanding of the assumed risks in our sport.

PART A: RULES FOR COMPETITION

General Rules Applying to All Races

1) DEFINITION

A marathon race can be raced over any distance: usually between 3km and 200km. All competitors must race the correct course as determined by the race organiser, must go round all turn buoys and must exit and enter the water at a portage within the designated areas.

2) BEHAVIOUR

- a) Canoeing is a non contact sport and competitors shall race in a fair manner.
- b) When a canoe or kayak is overtaking another canoe or kayak it is the duty of the overtaking craft to keep clear of other competitors at all times.
- c) When a canoe or kayak is racing in a group of competitors it is the duty of all the competitors in the group to keep clear of other competitors at all times. This rule applies to any manoeuvring within the group.
- d) All paddlers will wear appropriate clothing when racing. This is a minimum of singlet and shorts. These should preferably be in club racing colours.
- e) During the course of a competition any items discarded by a competitor anywhere other than in a proper bin, must be recovered by the athlete, their support crew or coach immediately. It is the athlete's responsibility to ensure that this has happened. An event official witnessing non-compliance with this rule shall report the infringement to the race organiser and the offending competitor will be disqualified. Any repeat infringements by the same competitor shall be subject to disciplinary proceedings by the Marathon Racing Committee.

3) THE RACING STRUCTURE

- a) The marathon racing system has been designed to encourage all levels of competitor from the raw beginner to top class internationals. There are five categories of race: -
- b) GROUP A These races will appear in the Racing Handbook calendar and/or the calendar published on the MRC website. For these races the race levy must be paid and competitors must be British Canoeing, Canoe England, WCA, SCA or CANI comprehensive members (see Rule 13).
 - i) Divisional races registered by the Marathon Committee. Promotions will be calculated by the HRM program for these races, with input from the Rankings Officer.
 - ii) Races and time trials registered by the Marathon Committee but not in the divisional system such as stage marathons, descents, Watersides, Frank Luzmore, Thameside etc.
 - iii) The National Championships.
 - iv) Promotions between divisions may take place based on the results of all group A races.

c) GROUP B

i) Those races in the regions and at clubs that do not appear in the calendar. These will include handicap and fun marathons. No promotions will take place at these races. Clubs are encouraged to hold handicap races throughout the year as an introduction to competing in the divisional system. These should be over a 3-10km course with handicaps based on age, experience and type of boat.

d) GROUP C

- i) All Lightning and Junior K2 races forming part of the Geoff Sanders Trophy or held at Regional Hasler events, the National Marathon Championships or the Hasler Final registered by the Marathon Racing Committee – see rules 49-58. For these races:
 - All competitors must be British Canoeing, Canoe England, WCA, SCA or CANI comprehensive members.
 - (2) No race levy will be payable.

4) CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The racing year shall be from 1st September of any year to 31st August of the following year. When a competitor is a member of more than one club, he shall declare before 1st September to the Race Records Officer of the Marathon Committee the name of the club for whom he will race the following racing year. When a competitor changes his club in mid season, he is permitted to compete for his new club, instead of his old, provided that prior consent of the old club is obtained. This consent shall not be withheld unreasonably, particularly in the case of a change of residence from one area to another. Application should be made via RMAs. The agreed change must be advised to the Race Records Officer in writing before points can be allocated to the new club in club competitions.

5) SAFETY

a) Competitor responsibility

- i) Competitors must render their boats sufficiently buoyant to remain afloat and to support the crew in the event of capsize. Buoyancy must be fixed in the boat reasonably sufficiently to satisfy rule 27 of the ICF Marathon Rules which states that: 'Each boat must carry sufficient buoyancy, either in the construction of the boat or fixed subsequently, to keep the boat floating level when filled with water.' British Canoeing Marathon Committee rules interpretation of this is that inherent buoyancy provided by 'Vac-bag' or 'sandwich' construction is not alone sufficient and must be supplemented by adequate fixed additional flotation material or by the provision of sealed bulkheads.
- ii) Competitors must be able to swim adequately in the waters on which the race is being held. It is the responsibility of each competitor (or of a parent in the case of a junior) to inform their team leader of any medical condition that may affect this. If the competitor is entering an event where they have no team leader, it is their responsibility (or of a parent in the case of a junior) to take appropriate precautions and inform the organiser.
- iii) On open water adequate spray covers must be worn.
- iv) All paddlers are required to render assistance to other competitors in distress.
- v) The wearing of life jackets or buoyancy aids is compulsory for all paddlers ranked in divisions 7, 8 and 9 irrespective of the race they are entered in. This applies to singles and doubles races.
- vi) Life jackets must comply with either the European Standard 'EN393 or 395 or the International Standard 'ISO 12402'.

b) Team Leader responsibility

- i) Team Leaders should decide if paddlers in the higher divisions should wear life jackets or buoyancy
- ii) Should a member of your team (or a parent in the case of a junior) inform you of any medical condition that may affect their safety, you should ensure that they take appropriate precautions and that the organiser is informed.

c) Race Organiser responsibility

- i) Race organisers may require life jackets or buoyancy aids and spray covers to be worn and will have the FINAL say as to who should wear them (except where this is covered by rule 5a(v)) depending on weather and water conditions. Such equipment must be provided by the competitors.
- ii) The penalty for infringing any safety rule is disqualification from the race.
- iii) Should a team leader, an individual paddler (or a parent in the case of a junior) with no team leader, inform you of any medical condition that may affect their safety, you should ensure that they have taken appropriate precautions and that these fall within the compass of your risk assessment before accepting the entry.

Canoeing and Kayaking in all its forms is an 'Assumed Risk - Water Contact' sport.

6) DISCIPLINE

Marathon racing is subject to British Canoeing Marathon Racing Committee Disciplinary Regulations and to British Canoeing Disciplinary Code. See http://canoeracing.org.uk/marathon/index.php/disciplinary_matters/

These apply to all BC Marathon races.

For the avoidance of doubt, any complaint that an individual member of British Canoeing (competitor or non-competitor) has behaved in a manner described in clause 1.1 of the Disciplinary Regulations shall in the first instance, where possible, be lodged with the Race Protest Committee in the manner described in Marathon Racing Rule 18(g) (i) and (ii). The Protest Committee shall determine what action, if any, shall be taken. If the Protest Committee decides that the complaint should be referred to the Marathon Committee, the race organiser shall report the matter to the Secretary within three working days. The Marathon Committee will consider the matter in accordance with the Disciplinary Regulations.

Race Organisers should note the powers in clause 2.1 of the Procedures to apply immediate discipline where members or competitors have displayed violent or unreasonable behaviour.

7) ANTI-DOPING

Marathon racing is subject to the ICF and UK Anti-Doping Rules See https://www.britishcanoeing.org.uk/competition/anti-doping-1/

8) BROKEN PADDLES / BOAT

A competitor must not change boats during a race, but may change paddles in the case of breakage.

9) WASH HANGING

- a) Competitors must not hang on the washes of powered craft.
- b) In an assessment race wash hanging or interfering with any other boat or competitor who is not in your own class/race is not permitted. Anything that may be construed as interference, such as wash hanging or assisting another competitor/crew will result in disqualification of all involved, if proven. Furthermore, it is expected that when being caught by faster competitors from another class/race, paddlers will show good sporting behaviour by staying at least 3m clear, and giving up the racing line to avoid suggestion that any advantage was gained by either party.

10) ASSISTANCE TO COMPETITORS

A competitor may receive food and drink during a race. Competitors with a disability may receive assistance at portages, but no other assistance unless permitted before the race by the organiser.

11) BOAT DESIGNS

Any type of canoe or kayak can be used.

Kayaks shall be propelled solely by means of double bladed paddles.

Canoes shall be propelled solely by means of single bladed paddles.

The paddles must not be attached to the boat in any way, being supported only by the hands.

For GROUP A races boats must comply with the ICF regulations as detailed below:-

single kayak max length520cm (unless it is a recognised surf ski design)

double kayak max length650cm single canoe max length520cm double canoe max length650cm

Boats over 460cm in length must not have concave sections unless classified as Wild Water Racing boats and falling within the ICF regulations for such boats.

12) BRITISH CANOEING MEMBERSHIP

- a) All competitors in GROUP A and Group C races must be COMPREHENSIVE (from April 2018, this will become "ON THE WATER") British Canoeing, Canoe England, WCA, SCA or CANI members. Membership numbers must be quoted on entries and results and a valid membership card or photocopy must be produced at race check in. Juniors ranked in divisions 7, 8 & 9 and Lightning competitors who are members of clubs with registered junior sections, should produce their registered junior section card instead.
- b) At all Regional Hasler events:
 - i) All competitors in divisions 1 to 6 must produce a valid membership card or photocopy at race check in. A competitor who has not raced in the last 5 years may buy an Event Ticket, but only one Event Ticket per season.
 - ii) All competitors in divisions 7, 8 and 9 must produce a valid membership card or photocopy at race check in or, if junior, produce their registered junior section card. Any competitor unable to do so will be required to buy an Event Ticket but only one Event Ticket purchase is allowed per season.
 - iii) Race results may be checked for valid membership. Club points will be deducted and the race shall not be counted as a Hasler qualifying race where:
 - Any competitor is found subsequently to have competed without a valid up-to-date membership, or
 - (2) A competitor in divisions 7, 8 and 9 is found to have bought more than one Event Ticket per season.
 - iv) An event ticket only provides temporary insurance cover to take part in a single event and is not a "day membership" or boat license for the use of waterways, as provided for most waters, with full British Canoeing membership.
- c) At National Championships all competitors in divisions 1 to 9 must produce a valid membership card or photocopy at race check in or when entries are made. A competitor who has not raced before may buy an Event Ticket, but only one Event Ticket per season. A competitor claiming to have membership but unable to provide evidence may also purchase an Event Ticket.
- d) Upon promotion to Division 6 there is a period of grace of 4 weeks during which a junior, racing with a registered junior section card, must become an individual comprehensive member of British Canoeing/Canoe England/WCA/SCA/CANI.

13) RACE LEVY SCHEME

At all GROUP A races, published in the Racing Handbook and/or the calendar published on the MRC website, there will be a race levy of £3.00 for each senior and veteran paddler by age, as recognized by their British Canoeing, Canoe England, WCA, SCA or CANI membership, and £2.00 for each junior paddler

by age, as recognized by their membership. The levy to be charged on all paddlers checked in irrespective of whether they start or finish the race. The race levy for all categories of races is to be remitted by the Race Organiser to the Treasurer within 7 days of the race. Cheques should be made payable to "BC Marathon Racing Committee" and sent to David Enoch, 102 Bingham Road, Radcliffe-on-Trent, Nottingham NG12 2GT.

Those clubs wishing to pay the levy by electronic transfer should remit to

14) RACE REGISTRATION

The organiser of a GROUP A race must apply to the Calendar Organiser for that race to be registered. This must be done by the autumn of the year preceding the event. The event must be organised and run under the Marathon Racing Rules. Registered races may advertise through British Canoeing and may appeal through the Marathon Committee in cases of dispute or difficulty. Refer to British Canoeing Disciplinary Code at http://canoeracing.org.uk/marathon/index.php/disciplinary-matters/

The registration fee will be the race levy described in rule 13 and the organiser must comply with the requirements of rule 18.

15) BOAT NUMBERING

At all GROUP A races competitors shall number their boat in the following manner. Paddlers racing in divisions 1-8 **must** display vertical number plates secured to the boat number holder with a pin or clip.

ALL numbering of vertical boards will be on both sides of the board and numbered in one of two acceptable formats:

a) digital style format numbering, created from black insulating tape, no less than 12mm wide. The digits should be formed from small strips of tape in 50mm and 100mm lengths to make up the numbers. The number must be presented on an OPAQUE WHITE number board measuring 150mm in height and 280mm in length, with rounded top corners. Hand written crayon and felt tip pen numbering is not acceptable.

b) Alternatively an OPAQUE WHITE number board measuring 150mm in height and 200mm in length, PRE-PRINTED and issued by the event organiser is also acceptable.

Race organisers will be able to refuse entry to a race where these rules are not complied with. Yellow number boards will **not** be acceptable.

Paddlers ranked in Division 9, Lightning, club and fun race paddlers may alternatively use 225mm diameter white discs which should be displayed on fore and aft decks or as directed by the organiser. Any paddler not displaying a number plate at the start of any race, or whose number is not clearly legible, will not score club points. If the number becomes detached from the boat, it is the paddler's responsibility to make sure the marshals and finish judges know their number to ensure inclusion in the results.

16) FINISHES

A competitor is deemed to have finished a race when the bow of the canoe or kayak has crossed the finishing line on the water with the competitor(s) in it.

17) ASSESSMENT RACES

The Marathon Committee will co-ordinate with race organisers to determine assessment race venues and the dates will be shown in the Racing Handbook. At these races, assessment classes may be separated from other race classes and may be run over the same or different courses. Club colours must be worn at assessment races. In the case of foreign nationals racing for selection at assessment races, the rules applying to this are specified in PART F at the end of this section.

18) ORGANISATION OF GROUP A RACES

- a) Clubs hosting races must be affiliated to British Canoeing.
- b) The race shall be open to canoeists who are members of an ICF affiliated federation.
- c) The race shall be properly advertised and the organisers shall issue adequate instructions on request, up to one month before the event, to prospective competitors or interested group leaders.

- d) In the event of circumstances which render it impossible or unsafe to run the race as planned, the Race Organiser shall take all reasonable steps to inform the competitors and supporters at the earliest possible moment.
- e) Race Organisers shall charge an entry fee for each competitor to include the levy cost. This fee may be reduced for juniors and augmented for late entries.
- f) Changes of class/division and late entries shall be permitted if the organiser so wishes. Information regarding late entries and class/division changes should be available to competitors at least 30 minutes before the start time of the class/division concerned.
- g) The Race Organiser shall provide a Protest Committee consisting of three officials or members of the organising body to hear and settle all protests by any competitor in that event. The following rules will be observed:
 - i) The protests must be received within 30 minutes of completion of the relevant race and before the announcement of the final results. Failure to observe this will invalidate the protest.
 - ii) The protest must be in writing to the Race Organiser and must give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules.
 - iii) The Protest Committee must meet immediately to hear all the evidence and to consider the protest's validity in accordance with British Canoeing and Marathon Racing Rules.
- h) A protest against an organising body may only be dealt with by the Marathon Committee. Any such protest must be made within 3 working days in writing to the Secretary of the Marathon Committee and give full details of the alleged infringement of the rules. The person making the protest must also inform the secretary of the club or body concerned within 3 working days. Failure to comply with these conditions will invalidate the protest.
- Appeals against the decision of the Protest Committee are permitted and these will be heard by the Marathon Committee.
- j) Within 2 working days of the race the results are to be emailed to the Rankings Officer, the Race Records Officer, the Regional Marathon Advisor and to <u>marathonresults@canoeracing.org.uk</u>, so that promotions can be ratified and the results uploaded onto the marathon website. See Useful Addresses page F3.
- k) Within 7 days of the race the Race Organiser must remit the race levy together with the race results in accordance with rule 13.

19) ORGANISATION OF GROUP B RACES

- a) For these races competitors do not have to be British Canoeing, Canoe England, WCA, SCA or CANI members, there is no levy and no requirement to submit results to the race records officer. Race advertising, entry fees and classes are at the discretion of the organiser. The formal requirements to register club membership and for protest procedures are not necessary.
- **b)** Rules 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 shall apply to all GROUP B races.

Rules Applying to Regional Divisional Hasler Races

20) Regional divisional Hasler races are GROUP A races and all of rules 1 -18 above shall apply.

21) REGIONS

- a) The regions are determined by the Marathon Racing Committee for England plus Scotland East, Scotland West, and Wales. Each region will run its own league championships throughout the year and will decide how many results are to be counted by clubs. It is hoped that eventually there will be enough races in each region for clubs to count their best 8 or 9 results from the total number of races.
- b) Clubs wishing to be included in the regional league and score Hasler points must be affiliated to British Canoeing, have registered their club colours, have provided a contact email address and been assigned a unique 3 letter club abbreviation. This process is done via the Regional Marathon Advisor.

22) THE DIVISIONAL SYSTEM

- a) Entry into the divisional system should be based on the standards detailed in the "Standards for Racing" (page D1).
- b) Club coaches are responsible for ensuring the ranking status of their paddlers and where necessary to ensure they are re-ranked appropriately.
- c) The divisional system is arranged into nine separate singles divisions 1-9 and eight separate doubles divisions numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9. Race Organisers must offer the following races at all events except where varied as agreed with the Regional Marathon Adviser.

- i) Division 2 & 3 doubles race over 20 km.
- ii) Singles races for each of divisions 1 to 9.
- iii) Doubles races for each of divisions 4 to 9
- d) Each year a divisional list will be published in the Racing Handbook for singles divisions 1-8. These lists are checked and any paddler not having competed for two successive seasons is removed from the lists. Each autumn clubs are asked to submit a list of the paddlers who will not be active for the coming season and where appropriate, to amend a draft of the proposed divisional lists.

23) THE HASLER TROPHY

The Hasler Trophy is the National Team League Championships and is competed for throughout the season on a regional basis. The Hasler season is defined by the races designated 'H' in the Racing Calendar of this Handbook. Races relating to the following season are designated 'H2019.

24) TYPES OF COURSE

Whilst there will be some variations due to local conditions and types of course available, the normal distances will be:-

Div.1, 2 & 3 Singles and 2 & 3 Doubles

Full senior course of about 20km with any degree of severity.

Div.4, 5 & 6 Singles and 4, 5 and 6 Doubles

Course of about 13km which may include portages and/or weir shoots.

Div.7, 8 & 9 Singles and Doubles

Course of about 6.5km with the minimum practical hazards.

25) COMPETITORS

- a) Each club will be allowed as many competitors as it wishes.
- b) A paddler can only compete in one race in a qualifying event.

26) SEPARATE STARTS

Each quorate race of six or more starters must be started separately. Two or more quorate races of less than six starters (i.e. with 3 or 4 or 5 starters) over the same distance may be started together, but for all other purposes are treated as separate races.

27) SYSTEM FOR AMALGAMATION DUE TO LOW ENTRIES

If there are fewer than three entries in a division then they will be started with a race of the same distance but will not be combined for the purposes of results or club points. If no race of the same distance is available, they should be started (but not combined) with the nearest possible race below. It will still be the case that some divisions will be inquorate particularly in smaller regions. The practice of

clubs communicating with each other about entries, in advance of events, to avoid inquorate classes, particularly in the higher divisions, is to be commended.

28) COMPETING IN A CREW BOAT

- a) When competing in doubles events the competition ranking shall normally be an average of the individual paddlers' rankings (all halves rounded down). Example: division 4 paddler and division 5 paddler average 4 (ignoring the half), race in 4 4 K2.
- b) Paddlers ranked in division 1, 2 or 3 must race over the 20km course.
- c) There is no Division 1_1 K2 at regional races (which also means there is no K2 race for a Division 2 paddler racing with a Division 1 paddler. A Division 1 paddler may race with a Division 3 paddler in Division 2 2 K2 and so on using the two principles above.)
- d) All paddlers competing in crew boats must show their singles ranking on the entry form and these rankings must be shown on the results.

29) SPECIAL PRIZES

Race organisers are encouraged to give prizes for special groups of paddlers e.g. first under 16, first C1. In particular they are strongly recommended to give a prize for the first woman in each division and for the highest placed TC2. This kind of encouragement is particularly important in the divisional system.

30) POINTS

- a) In regional races only those clubs within the region will score points. Paddlers from other regions will not be taken into account when calculating points except that their time will be used for the 110% calculations if they are the fastest boats not promoted.
- b) To be included for points, clubs must be registered within their region as described at Rule 21b).

- c) All competitors in both singles and doubles must show their singles ranking at race check-in. Competitors not doing so will not score points in the regional competition and may not count the race as eligibility to compete in the final.
- d) Only competitors racing in their club colours will score points. In a crew boat, if one paddler wears club colours and one does not, only the paddler wearing the colours will receive points.
- e) The points system will be as follows.
 - i) Divisions 1-9 in singles and 2-9 doubles will count for points.
 - ii) Points will be awarded to each paddler in both singles and doubles 20 for 1st, 19 for 2nd, 18 for 3rd and so on down to 2 points to all paddlers who finish within 110% of the time of the fastest boat not promoted in a singles race and within 110% of the winners' time in a doubles race. One point only will be awarded for paddlers who finish outside the 110% limit irrespective of their position. This to apply to all races except division 9 singles and doubles which will receive 20 for 1st, 19 for 2nd, 18 for 3rd and so on down to 2 points for all paddlers who finish.
 - iii) Transferred paddlers racing in a different division under the provisions of rule 27 will count for Hasler points but their times will not be used for the 110% calculations.
 - iv) Paddlers in a separate assessment race at a Regional Hasler event will not score Hasler points.
 - v) Each club will count its twelve best scoring paddlers from any divisions in any combination of K1/C1/K2 or C2. Doubles boats can be counted even if some of these boats contain just one paddler who is eligible for Hasler points for a particular club.
 - vi) At each event the club with the highest score will get 10 regional points in the regional competition, 9 for 2nd and so on.

31) RACE RESULTS

Race Organisers must report their results using the HRM computer program. Race Organisers are encouraged to use the HRM program at the race to complete entries and calculate results at the meeting. If this is not practicable, results must be recorded later onto the HRM for reporting to the MRC in compliance with rules 18 j) and k).

32) PROMOTIONS

- a) Promotions between the divisions throughout the season will be based on the table "Standards for Racing" ("the Table") [See page D1 of Racing Handbook]. Column HC of the Table assumes a World Champion takes 60 seconds to paddle a given course and ranks paddlers in singles divisions from 1 to 9 based on the number of additional seconds it would take for competitors to cover that same course. P/D Factor expresses these same times as factors. For example, a top ranking paddler in division 7 would be expected to take 90 seconds giving a P/D Factor of 1.5.
- b) Promotions will be calculated on the following principles on the basis of singles results subject to the other provisions of this rule 32;
 - <u>Divs.1, 2, 3 & 4</u>

 There are no automatic promotions to divisions 1, 2 & 3. Promotion times will be shown in the race file but promotions will not be indicated on any results printed on the day. The Rankings Officer in consultation with the Regional Marathon Adviser must ratify these for publishing with the official results on the Marathon Website.
 - Divs 4 and 5

 Promotions to divisions 4 and 5 will be calculated by taking the times at each race of the mid-placed paddler in divisions 4, 5 and 6 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these three divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Promotion Factor for divisions 3, 4, and 5 to give the times for promotion to divisions
 - Divs 6, 7 and 8

 Promotions to divisions 6, 7, and 8 will be calculated by taking the times of the midplaced paddler in divisions 7 and 8 divided by the Mean Factor for each of these two divisions. The average of these calculations will be multiplied by the Promotion Factor for divisions 6, 7 and 8 to give the times for promotion to divisions 8 and above

[The above is an outline description of the promotion process. The detailed bases for calculations are available on canoeracing.org.uk/marathon]

- c) Promotions may take place on either singles or doubles performances. Performances in doubles divisions will be monitored by the Ranking Officer and promotions made under Rule 32(j) where considered appropriate.
- d) Status in canoe will not affect status in kayak and vice versa.
- e) No automatic promotions will be made under Rule 32 (b) where there are fewer than 5 starters in any race. However, the Ranking Officer in consultation with the Regional Marathon Adviser may amend or dispense with this limit if persistently low numbers in a division are clearly preventing the promotion system from operating as intended.

- f) Promotions are not limited to one division. For example, a division 9 paddler with a time faster than that required for promotion to division 7, would be promoted straight to division 7. However, it is the responsibility of the Team Leader, coach and/or the individual to try as accurately as possible to enter a new paddler into the correct division for his/her ability. Accordingly, those paddlers promoted more than one division will forfeit Hasler points from that race.
- g) Where the HRM computer results system is used at a race, automatic promotions will be shown on the race results and take immediate effect. The only exceptions are those for division 1, 2 & 3 which must first be ratified by the Rankings Officer. All promotions (automatic and others) will be confirmed on the race results posted on the marathon website. It is the responsibility of paddlers and coaches to check these and ensure they are implemented with immediate effect.
- h) Once promoted, paddlers must race in their correct division, or higher division, except under the provisions of rules 27 and 28. Any competitor found racing in a lower division, singles or doubles, except under the provisions of rules 27 and 28, may be disqualified from the event and be banned from the next three Hasler races in the competitor's region. The exception is for promotions awarded at races held at the beginning of a new racing season and before the Hasler Final held in that year. These promotions will not apply at the Hasler Final of the current season but will apply to all other races. (E.g. A div. 6 paddler promoted to div. 5 in September 2018 at a race designated as H2019 can still race in div. 6 at the 2018 Hasler Final but must race in div. 5 at all other races.)
- i) All paddlers, both from within the region and from other regions are eligible for promotions.
- j) The Marathon Committee has discretion to promote or to withhold promotion at any time it is found to be necessary. This discretion is delegated to the Ranking Officer.

33) DEMOTIONS

a) Divs. 1, 2 and 3

Demotions from Divisions 1, 2 and 3 will be made by the Rankings Officer in consultation with the Regional Marathon Adviser.

b) Divs. 4 to 9

Application for demotion from Divisions 4 to 8 may be made to the Regional Marathon Adviser by the club coach/team leader. The Regional Marathon Adviser shall confirm his decision in writing/email/message to the club coach/team leader and to the Race Records Officer after agreeing this with the Rankings Officer.

- c) Demotions will be limited to one division.
- d) Demotions may be based on singles or doubles performances. Performances in doubles divisions will be monitored by the Ranking Officer and demotions made under Rule 33h) where considered appropriate.
- e) Status in canoe will not affect status in kayak and vice versa.
- f) Once demoted paddlers may nonetheless choose to race in any higher division. Paddlers competing in the Hasler Final shall race in the division according to their ranking status at the close of the prior season (normally 31 August). Thus demotions awarded in the new racing season immediately prior to the Hasler Final will not apply at that Hasler Final.
- g) All paddlers, both from within the region and from other regions are eligible for demotions.
- h) The Marathon Committee has discretion to demote or to withhold demotion at any time it is found to be necessary. This discretion is delegated to the Ranking Officer.

Rules Applying to the Hasler Final

34) The Hasler Final is a GROUP A Divisional race and all of rules 1-16 and rules 18, 24, 26, 31, 32 and 33 above shall apply.

35) CLUB ELIGIBILITY

The top scoring clubs from each region as determined by the regional Hasler competitions, plus a team from the Combined Services, may compete in the Hasler Final at the end of the season. The number of clubs from each region will, be based on the number of affiliated clubs who have actively participated in the previous season, as indicated by Hasler Race results recorded on the MRC Website. Each region will automatically have 2 qualifying places, irrespective of the number of active clubs. Each region will receive an extra qualifying place for each 3 clubs in excess of 4.

- a) Additionally a team from the host club (or from each host club if there are two organising clubs) may compete if they have **not** qualified from the regional competition.
- b) Each eligible club will be allowed as many competitors in the final as it wishes.

36) PADDLER ELIGIBILITY

- a) A paddler must complete 3 qualifying events during the season to be eligible for the final. There are exceptions for Div.1 senior men's kayak, Div.2 and above junior men's kayak, Div.3 and above women kayak, Div.4 and above junior women kayak and Div.3 and above canoe, and for paddlers in the Combined Services, who must complete 2 qualifying events.
- b) Qualifying events are regional Hasler races and all assessment races for that season. This does not include races designated for the following Hasler season. Also a paddler may count completing a National Championships race on one or both days as one qualifying race. The previous Hasler Final does not count as a qualifying race.
- c) The qualification must be in the same type of boat (i.e. canoe or kayak).
- d) Paddlers are only eligible to paddle in a singles race at the Hasler Final if they have completed 3 qualifying events in singles. The exceptions in rule 36(a) apply equally in this rule.
- e) A paddler can only compete in one race at the final.
- f) The Regional Marathon Adviser will check the eligibility of paddlers from his region for the final. This will include holding current British Canoeing, or equivalent, membership. The Race Records Officer will be able to produce listings on request to help clubs and Marathon Advisers carry out this task.

37) CLASSES

There will be races for each singles division 1 to 9 and each doubles division 1 to 9.

38) COMPETING IN CREW BOATS

At the Hasler Final where crew members in doubles races are ranked in separate divisions they must race in the classification of the higher ranked paddler.

39) POINTS

- a) All competitors in singles and doubles must show their singles ranking on the entry form. Competitors not doing so will not score points.
- b) Only competitors racing in their club colours will score points.
- c) Point scoring at the final will be as described in rule 30e (i), (ii), (iii).
- d) Each club will count its six best scoring singles boats and its three best scoring doubles boats, provided that both of the crew are members of the same club.

40) TROPHIES

- a) The Hasler Trophy will be awarded to the club scoring the most points at the final
- b) The Regional Trophy will be awarded to the region with the highest aggregate score at the final from their three highest scoring clubs.
- c) The Adam Thomasson Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Div.2 race at the final.
- d) The Ross Warland Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the highest placed junior in the Division 4 race at the final.
- e) The Committee Cup will be awarded to the highest placed junior woman K1 in the highest division at the final.
- f) The Ken Pereira Cup will be awarded to the highest placed junior C1 in the highest division at the final.
- g) The Rhodes White Trophy will be awarded to the senior man K1 with the fastest time over the 12 mile course.
- h) The David Shankland Trophy will be awarded to the senior or junior woman K1 with the fastest time over the 12 mile course.
- i) The Barber Trophy will be awarded to the junior K1 with the fastest time over the 12 mile course.
- j) The Bill Sparks Trophy will be awarded to the highest placed veteran K2 in the highest division at the

Rules Applying to the National Championships

41) The National Championships is a GROUP A race and all of rules 1-18 above shall apply.

42) DEFINITION

- a) The National Championships shall be called The British National Open Marathon Racing Individual and Team Championships and will identify the various National Champions.
- b) There must be at least 5 entries for a National Championship race to take place.

c) Where a race is inquorate the paddler may transfer to another class for which they are eligible [see rule 43al.

43) PADDLER ELIGIBILITY

- a) Paddlers may compete in races specified for those of a higher ranking but will not be allowed to compete in races specified for those of a lower ranking. (E.g. an U18 may race as an U23 or Senior but not as an U16 or O34.)
- b) Senior and Veteran Women paddlers may compete in a doubles crew in Senior and Veteran Men's kayak races of the same or higher ranking.
- c) All ages are calculated at 1st January of the year of the Championships.
- d) In the case of foreign nationals racing at our National Championships the rules applying are as follows.
 - i) In order to be eligible to win a title in National Championships a Competitor must:
 - (1) Be a British Citizen and be a current member of British Canoeing (including, SCA, CW & CANI Juniors registered with family membership, do not need full British Canoeing membership) and not currently representing or in the selection process to represent another country;
 - (2) Have been resident in the United Kingdom and a member of British Canoeing, (including, SCA, CW & CANI Juniors registered with family membership, do not need full British Canoeing membership) for at least 2 (two) years. For clarification, it is the 2 years immediately preceding the relevant event and as soon as the individual it is at the point of renewing for a third year they shall have satisfied this condition.
 - ii) In entering a National Championship competitors agree to abide by this Eligibility Policy. Any competitor winning a title may, at the absolute discretion of the organisers, be requested to supply proof that they satisfy B1 a) or B 1 b). Any competitor not complying with this requirement within a reasonable time will be liable to disqualification from receiving a National Championship title and will only be eligible to receive a race placing. Any disqualifications under this clause B2 will be subject to specific race rules and if applicable the British Canoeing dispute resolution policy.
 - iii) If a Competitor is not a British Citizen and has not been Resident in the United Kingdon and a member of British Canoeing, (including, SCA, CW & CANI) for the necessary 2 (two) years (in accordance with 1.b. above) and there are exceptional circumstances then they may apply to the Head of Governance and Compliance requesting discretion to be exercised. Any applications should be submitted at least four weeks prior to any National Championships which they wish to compete in.
 - iv) Decisions are final and in the absolute discretion of the British Canoeing Chief Executive who shall consider each case on its own merits and decisions not create a precedent for any future cases.

44) NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP CATEGORIES

- a) There will be separate races for men's kayak, women's kayak and senior canoe.
- b) Senior paddlers in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 26km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Senior Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain
 - ii) Senior Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 Senior paddlers in canoes will race over a course of approximately 13km. The winners shall be deemed the:
 - iii) Senior Men's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain. (for singles)
 - iv) Senior Women's National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain. (for singles)
 - v) Senior National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain. (Doubles open to men and women)
- c) Paddlers aged under 23 in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 26km, in singles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 23 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Under 23 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- d) Paddlers aged under 18 in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 20km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 18 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Under 18 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain
 - Paddlers aged under 18 in canoes will race over a course of approximately 6.5km in singles. The winner shall be deemed the:
 - iii) Under 18 National Canoe Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- e) Paddlers aged under 16 in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 13km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 16 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Under 16 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain
- f) Paddlers aged under 14 in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 6.5km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 14 Men's National Kavak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Under 14 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain
- g) Paddlers aged under 12 in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 6.5 km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 12 Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain
 - ii) Under 12 Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- h) Paddlers aged 34 or over: Kayak men will race over a course of approximately 20km and kayak women over a course of approximately 13 km in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- i) Paddlers aged 39 or over: Kayak men will race over a course of approximately 20km and kayak women over a course of approximately 13 km in singles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 39 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 39 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- j) Paddlers aged 44 or over in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 13km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 44 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 44 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- k) Paddlers aged 49 or over in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 13km, in singles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 49 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 49 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- Paddlers aged 54 or over in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 6.5km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 54 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 54 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- m) Paddlers aged 59 or over in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 6.5km, in singles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 59 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 59 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- n) Paddlers aged 64 or over in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 6.5km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 64 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 64 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- o) Paddlers aged 69 or over in kayaks will race over a course of approximately 6.5km, in singles and doubles. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Over 69 Veteran Men's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Over 69 Veteran Women's National Kayak Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- p) Mixed Crews There will be a Mixed K2 race for paddlers ranked in divisions 1 9 over a course of approximately 13km. This is open to all seniors, veterans and juniors. Crews must consist of one female and one male paddler. The winners of this race shall be deemed the Mixed National Marathon Champions of Great Britain.
- q) Where crew members in doubles races are in different categories they must race in a category for which they are both eligible.

45) LIGHTNING CATEGORIES

- a) Lightning Paddlers aged under 12 will race over a course of approximately 3.5 km. The only competitors eligible for this event are paddlers in Lightning K1s ranked below Division 8. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 12 Men's Lightning Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
 - ii) Under 12 Women's Lightning Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- b) Lightning Paddlers aged under 10 will race over a course of approximately 3.5 km. The only competitors eligible for this event are paddlers in Lightning K1s ranked below Division 8. The winners of these races shall be deemed the:
 - i) Under 10 Men's Lightning Marathon Champion of Great Britain.

- ii) Under 10 Women's Lightning Marathon Champion of Great Britain.
- c) Points will be awarded to count towards the Spanish Galleon team trophy for Lightning paddlers at the National Championships, These do not count towards the Geoff Sanders Trophy.

46) TEAM COMPETITION

- a) Points will be awarded per paddler both in singles and doubles races for National Championship categories 20 points for the winner then 19, 18, 17 etc. down to one point for each finisher.
- b) All competitors in singles and doubles must show their singles ranking to be eligible for team points.
- c) Only competitors racing in their club colours will score points.
- d) A trophy, The Spanish House, will be awarded to the club scoring the most points at the National Championships counting all categories in Rule 44.
- e) A trophy, The Spanish Galleon, will be awarded to the club scoring the most points in the under 12 and under 10 age Lightning categories (Rules 45(e) and (f)).
- f) The Women's Team Trophy This trophy will be awarded to the club with the highest scoring Women's K1 team. Results will be taken from their top four highest scoring finishers, with at least one of the finishers competing in either the Senior Women's K1 or Under 23 Women's K1. (See below)
- g) Scoring/Rules for Women's Team Trophy:
 - i) Points from the highest four scoring female K1s from one club in any age group from Under 12 upwards, will be combined and the club with the most points from these four will be the winner of the Women's Team Trophy. (Lightning races do not count towards this score.)
 - ii) Points will be awarded as per the standard scoring procedure. (eg 20 points for 1st place, 19 points for 2nd place.)
 - iii) For the purposes of this Trophy, any male who may be entered in a Women's race will be ignored in the scoring. (eg a female K1 finishing 2nd to a male canoe paddler will score 20 points)
 - iv) To be included in the competition for The Women's Team Trophy, a club team MUST include one scoring paddler in the Senior Women's or Under 23 Women's category. (A club with 4 female paddlers but no Senior or Under 23 Woman is not eligible.)
 - v) In the event of there being a tie for first place, the clubs will be separated as follows:
 - (1) The highest number of 1st places achieved by four scoring paddlers (eg 1st, 1st, 2nd and 3rd will beat 1st, 2nd, 2nd, 2nd)
 - (2) If still tied, the club with the lowest combined time difference between each scoring paddler and the 1st place in their race will win
 - (3) If still tied then the Trophy will be shared
 - vi) All members of the winning Women's Team Trophy club team, regardless of whether their score was included in calculation, will be invited to share in receiving the Trophy.

47) PROMOTIONS & DEMOTIONS

Although no automatic promotions will take place at the championships, the Marathon Committee may exercise their right under rules 32 and 33 to promote or demote on the basis of the results.

48) HASLER QUALIFICATION

The event will not count as a Regional Hasler event nor be used to allocate points for Regional Hasler competitions. However, it may be counted by a paddler as a qualifying race for the Hasler Final.

Rules applying to the Geoff Sanders Memorial Trophy

49) THE SERIES

- a) Race organisers of regional Hasler races are encouraged to include Lightning and Mini K2 races in their programme. These races will qualify for the Geoff Sanders Series in which teams compete for the Geoff Sanders Memorial Trophy. Races can also be run at other times as part of an inter-club event.
- b) The Series will run from 1st September to 31st August the following year.
- c) Races in the Series will not be awarded Hasler points.
- d) Lightning races only will be included in the programme of the Hasler Final, but will not be used in scoring for the Hasler Trophy.

50) QUALIFICATION

- To qualify paddlers must compete in a Pyranha Lightning K1 or, in specified races, in a Mini K2 (maximum length 5.6m, minimum width 50cm).
- b) Those who compete in K1 races in other craft will not be eligible for points. Race organisers will need to show these as a separate 'Fun Race' if they wish to include these craft.
- Paddlers with a marathon ranking of Division 8 or above shall not be eligible to compete in the Series. (See rule 57)

d) Lightning races at the Hasler Final are open to all Lightning paddlers, whether their club has qualified or not.

51) COURSE

a) The course shall be 2-4 kilometres in length with no hazards.

52) CLASSES

- a) There will be four K1 classes in the Series: Boys under 10, Girls under 10, Boys under 12 and Girls under 12 and two K2 classes: under 12 and under 10.
- **b)** All ages as at January 1st preceding each race.
- c) Teams must inform the Series Coordinator (See rule 55) of the date of birth of each paddler.

53) POINTS

- a) Points shall be awarded in each class at each event with 20 points for the winner, 19 points for second and so on, down to 1 point for each paddler who completes the course.
- b) Points shall be awarded in each class at the Hasler Final event, with 40 points to the winner, 38 points for second and so on down to 2 points for each paddler who completes the course.
- c) Points are awarded in crew boats on a per seat basis.
- d) Points shall be awarded to all paddlers in the Series irrespective of whether the paddler is out of region.
- e) At August 31st each paddler's three best scores from the season will be counted towards their team's total. This will be added to the points won in the Lightning class held at the Hasler Final.
- f) The winner of the Geoff Sanders Memorial Trophy will be the team with the highest score as determined in e) above.

54) PRIZES

- a) Race organisers are encouraged to award prizes for the first three places in each class when holding a race. Marathon Committee certificates are available from Regional Marathon Advisors to give to all entrants, to encourage participation.
- b) The Marathon Racing Committee will provide medals for the first three places in each class at the Hasler Final event.

55) RESULTS

a) Results of all races in the Series should be forwarded to Peter Jones, the Geoff Sanders Coordinator. Email: petercjones@blueyonder.co.uk.

56) SAFETY

- a) The wearing of life jackets or buoyancy aids is compulsory for all paddlers.
- b) The requirements of Rule 5 must be observed in all respects.
- c) Race organisers must conduct a specific risk assessment for Lightning and Mini K2 races and, taking into account their age and experience, provide adequate safety cover (e.g. rescue boats and signage) over the whole course where considered necessary.

57) RACING IN THE HASLER COMPETITION

- a) The Geoff Sanders Series aims to introduce young paddlers into marathon racing but it is important that they do not remain too long in the class. Coaches and parents are best placed to decide when a junior is ready to race in the Hasler Series and the decision is for them to take.
- b) As part of their long term development paddlers in all Lightning categories are encouraged to compete in Division 9 K1 or K2. However, should the paddler be promoted to division 8 or higher from either a K1 or a K2 race in the Hasler Series or at the National Championships he/she will no longer be eligible to compete in the Geoff Sanders Series.
- c) Paddlers who are promoted to Division 8 or higher from any race in all Lightning categories at the National Championships are allowed to race in the Geoff Sanders competition at that year's Hasler Final. They will not be eligible to compete in the following season's Geoff Sanders Series.

58) RACE LEVY / EVENT TICKET

- a) Lightning races are classed as Group C races: no race levy will be charged.
- b) Paddlers who are not British Canoeing members or not members of a British Canoeing affiliated club with a registered youth section shall be issued with an Event Ticket to provide insurance cover. British Canoeing has agreed not to make a charge for the Event Ticket for Lightning paddlers.
- c) To promote racing at this introductory level, the MRC recommends a standard entry fee of £2.50.

Rules applying to the 5K Series

59) THE SERIES

The Series was introduced in 2010 and the main objectives are:

- a) Mass starts to teach paddlers to get off the line quickly and get into an appropriate group as soon as possible, in a bumpy water environment.
- b) Larger groups to teach paddlers to race effectively in groups.
- c) Minimum administration.
- d) Minimum number of classes.

60) RACES

The Committee aims to have at least two races in each region and to hold a national Final in the summer. Details of races will be publicised in the marathon calendar and on the website.

61) RULES

- a) 5K racing will be governed by the rules of British Canoeing Marathon Committee as set out in the Flatwater Racing Handbook.
- b) These races fall under rule 3)b)ii) 'Races and time trials approved by the Marathon Committee but not in the divisional system'.

62) RACE LEVY/BC MEMBERSHIP

- a) The race levy must be paid. The levy will apply to the event, not the number of races a paddler competes in on that day.
- b) Entrants must be comprehensive members of British Canoeing or junior members of a club with a registered youth section.
- c) Membership must be confirmed with entry or at time of booking in.

63) THE COURSE

- a) The course will be as close as possible to 5 kilometres. A GPS should be used to measure the length of the course, to enable time comparisons to be made throughout the country.
- b) There will be a minimum of one and a maximum of two turning points that will be in an anti-clockwise direction. There should be three buoys marking the turn in an even arc. It is acceptable for one of the turning points to be used twice.
- c) The course can be on any kind of water, but bear in mind the basic objective of teaching paddlers to race in large groups. Therefore, wherever possible, there should be as large an expanse of water as possible.
- d) The recommended race day is Saturday, although this is not compulsory.

64) CATEGORIES

- a) There will be the following categories: senior men, senior women, junior men, junior women, veteran men and veteran women.
- b) All categories will be able to compete in the following craft: K1, K2, C1 and C2.
- c) There will be two sets of starts for singles and doubles, to allow all paddlers to enter both races should they so wish.
- d) To achieve mass starts four starts are recommended:

In the first set of starts -

- 1. Junior, senior and veteran men K1;
- 2. Junior, senior and veteran women K1 plus C1;

In the second set of starts -

- 3. Junior, senior and veteran men K2;
- 4. Junior, senior and veteran women K2 plus C2.

The Race Organiser has discretion either to split starts into smaller groups or to combine starts where it is considered the numbers of competitors or the nature of the course make this appropriate.

65) RANKINGS

- a) Results including times will be submitted to compile a rankings list on a time-elapsed basis, initially for K1
- b) The ranking list will be updated and published on the marathon website as soon as possible after an event.
- c) The top ranking paddler in each category will receive a trophy provided by the MRC at the end of each season. The season will be the same as the Hasler season.

PART B: THE STARTING OF ASSESSMENT RACES, NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS RACES AND HASLER FINALS RACES

There is a necessity to maintain the standard of starting at assessment races and major championships. The following will apply to all assessment races, to all races at the National Championships and to all races at the Hasler Finals.

1) REQUIREMENTS

- a) The start line should be clearly defined on both banks.
- b) A clearly defined marshalling line must be established behind the start line.
- c) The race must be started by a person drawn from the approved starters list, who will have an experienced assistant.
- d) The marshalling line should be controlled by at least two experienced officials.
- e) The above should all be equipped with PA equipment or loud hailers that it is the responsibility of the race organiser to provide.

2) STARTING PROCEDURE

- a) The starter shall ensure all craft are lined up on the starting line as stationary as possible for the water conditions. When the starter is satisfied the line(s) is correctly positioned he/she shall give the signal to start by a shot, starting horn or the word 'go'.
- b) If a competitor commences paddling or attempts to start before any instruction to do so, he/she has made a false start.
- c) A competitor who crosses the line before the starter's start signal shall also be deemed to have made a false start.
- d) Refusing to obey the starter's instructions will also constitute an unfair start.
- e) A competitor who attempts a false or unfair start will be warned a maximum of two times. A third offence will result in the imposition of a two-minute penalty. A further offence by the same competitor will result in disqualification from the event. The disqualified paddler must leave the water immediately.

4) STARTERS' ADVISORY NOTES

In starting ANY race the following advisory notes should be applied by the race organiser and starter to achieve consistency.

The start of any race is critical and **fairness and consistency** are our aim. It is therefore highly important that you carry out procedures and endeavour to ensure everybody has a fair start.

The rules that will apply for major competition are laid out below. They can and should equally apply to ANY race. Once competitors who push the line or jump the start realise that that will get a 2-minute penalty, or be disqualified and asked to leave the start line, they will start to comply with your instructions.

Our aim is to make these rules the standard to which every race organiser works.

Some important points come from these rules, which should be noted and applied, on all starts:

If you control the boats at a no more than 'walking pace' as they come up to the line, then it is more likely you will control them on the line.

Make sure that your 'marshalling line' is not too close to the actual start line.

Do not 'hold' paddlers on the start line for too long - this will merely result in them 'pushing' it. Bring them very slowly up to the line and start the race quickly when there.

If the majority of boats advance over the line - the only way to bring them back is to get them ALL to paddle round and start again.

Do not penalise those who comply with your instructions and are on the line by starting the race when others are clearly in front of the line. Bring the non-compliant paddlers back round. Be prepared to warn twice and then

penalise with a 2-minute penalty or disqualify.

Refer to boats by their numbers or by the club colours not by the paddlers name and be prepared to record – or have an assistant record – any penalties given by boat number.

If you issue a penalty it must apply – it cannot then be ignored or withdrawn. If you disqualify a paddler do not start the race until he/she has removed himself from the line and from the water. It is not permitted for the disqualified paddler to paddle round with the other racers.

Do not tell paddlers that there is '1 minute to go' and them start them before a full minute has elapsed. Be consistent, if you say you will not start them for 2 minutes make sure it is a full two minutes before you do start them

Have a whistle ready to blow if there is a false start and you are recalling the whole race. Make sure that the paddlers know that is what a whistle means: STOP, there has been a total false start, come back to the line.

If you have paddlers 'hanging back' well behind the actual start line give them the opportunity **once** to come up to the line. If they are unwilling to do so after being asked, then concentrate on the front line to retain control and accept that those behind the line are more comfortable in the 'second line' position.

You are within your rights as the starter of an event to 'warn' coaches and spectators who are blatantly trying to encourage their paddlers to ignore your instructions and 'push' the start. Do not be afraid to do so.

BY BEING CONSISTENT AT ALL RACES AND ACROSS ALL STARTS PADDLERS WILL LEARN WHAT IS EXPECTED OF THEM.

PART C: RECOMMENDATIONS

These recommendations are to help clubs run well-organised races. You should not attempt to run a race without having attended others first.

1) ADVANCE INFORMATION

Advance information should at least contain the following details.

- a) Name, date and status of the race.
- b) Name of the organising body.
- c) Closing date for entries and whether or not late entries will be accepted.
- d) Person to whom entries and enquiries should be sent, with address, phone number and email.
- e) Entry fees and to whom these should be payable.
- f) An entry form asking for full details of competitors, though entries using the HRM system should be encouraged.
- g) Locations of start and finish, and directions for getting to these places.
- h) Check-in, briefing and start times.
- i) Brief description of the course.
- j) Any special regulations that competitors should be aware of before they arrive.
- k) Any major changes since last year.

2) SAFETY

Safety measures are largely at the discretion of the organiser, since courses and conditions vary considerably. All paddlers ranked in Divisions 7, 8 and 9 or competing in Lightning and fun races must wear a buoyancy aid [Rules 5 (a)(v) and 56 (a)]. Make sure you have adequate safety cover for all Lightning races. On the open sea it is wise to insist on buoyancy aids for all. On open water, rescue boats are very important. Ensure that no one is stranded or lost halfway round the course; it is important to account for all competitors. On calm water it is usually sufficient to have a back marker paddling the course. Marshals at turns and portages should carry safety equipment including space blanket or similar, throw line and mobile phone.

All Race organisers should prepare a Risk Assessment well ahead of their event and put in hand appropriate safety measures. Risk Assessments must be forwarded to the Regional Marathon Advisor before the event.

3) BRIEFING AND CONTROL

a) Deliver a briefing shortly before the race. Explain the starting procedure; starting order; describe any special features and hazards of the race course and emphasise any special regulations.

- b) Check that all boats are numbered clearly. It is the competitor's responsibility to number his boat, but it does make the finishers' job easier if number plates are legible. Provide large permanent marker pens at check-in.
- c) Use the starting order listed in Section 4.
- d) Make sure the course is clearly marked at all points where there could be doubt. Position marshals at turning points to check against a start list. Have clearly identifiable marshals at portages and shoots. The marshals should keep the passage clear for competitors, keep spectators and competitors off forbidden land and report any misdemeanours to race control. A marshal's directions should override any prior instructions.

4) STARTING ORDER

- a) The start order of the various classes or divisions can have a significant effect on the race results. The general principle is to start the fastest classes first and the slowest classes last. This minimises the chance of fast boats paddling through slower classes, picking up stragglers on the wash and dragging them back to the class leaders.
- b) The following is the recommended start order. Not all these classes will necessarily run at any one race.

5) STARTING

- a) Ensure that the paddlers can hear your instructions clearly.
- b) Ensure your start position is such that you can see the boat numbers and if necessary have a helper as a spotter.
- c) You or your helper should have a pen/paper to write down any number warnings and penalties.
- d) If the paddlers do not obey instructions then the rule must be followed with appropriate penalties.
- e) In the event of a false start use a whistle to recall the paddlers. The use of the whistle should be included in pre-race briefing.
- f) Try to ensure the paddlers approach the line very slowly.
- g) An upstream start is preferable if possible.
- h) If you make a requirement or statement as to what you are going to do, do not back down or change it under paddler or time pressure.
- i) Record accurate start times for all races these will be needed for the HRM program.

6) TURNS

- a) Clearly mark all turns. Use a buoy or buoys at each turn. Make sure these are clearly distinguishable. A clear description and location of the turn buoys must be given at the briefing.
- b) All turns should be properly marshalled. Each turn marshal should have a list of the race numbers that started and be responsible for checking that each boat properly completes the turn. A list of boats that did not complete the turn and a written report of the incidents at the turn must be provided promptly to the race control.

7) FINISHING & RESULTS

- a) Have a clearly marked finishing line. Signify a crossing of the line audibly by bell, whistle or hooter.
- b) Have a reliable, readable clock and a back-up in case of malfunction.
- c) Have a shelter in case it rains.
- d) Recording the finishing times and positions is the most important job you will do.
- e) Prepare in advance with numbered sheets. Have spare pens/pencils.
- f) Record the number and order of every boat as it passes the finishing line. Two tried and tested methods are:
 - (i) Have lined sheets, marked into two columns with one person writing the boat numbers and another the finish time. If possible have a third person calling out the finishing times. Number all finish pages to avoid confusion, OR
 - (ii) Have a team of three. Two work together, one calling boat numbers whilst the other records the number and time. The third person works independently recording the numbers in finishing order.

We do not recommend having the times written on one set of sheets and the numbers separately written on another set and then trying to match these together.

- g) A further fail-safe is to have a tape recorder at the finish line. Give the recorder to one of the finish team and tell them to 'talk' every boat over the line, giving number and time.
- h) At all Hasler events you must use the Hasler Race Management computer program (HRM) to produce your results. If possible use the HRM at the race. This will automatically calculate the elapsed time and finishing order of all boats, all singles promotions and the Hasler points. The results will be produced in the format required by the Race Records Officer. The HRM is designed for Hasler races and can be downloaded from the Marathon Canoeing website. If you want any help with the HRM please contact your Regional Adviser.
- i) Whether using the HRM or a manual system, have someone indoors to produce the results. Arrange a system for displaying the results as soon as you know them. Errors can be queried before prize giving. Hold the prize giving as soon as possible.

8) AFTER THE EVENT

- a) After the event is over the final result sheet needs to be produced. Keep all manual start and finish sheets as back-up.
- b) If you have run a Hasler event you must return your results using the HRM. This automatically produces the results in the correct format.
- c) Send results by email to the Rankings Officer, the Regional Marathon Advisor, the Race Records Officer and to <u>marathonresults@canoeracing.org.uk</u> within 2 working days so that promotions can be ratified and the results can be uploaded onto the marathon website. For all addresses, see page F3.
- d) . The race levy should be sent to the Marathon Racing Committee treasurer. See rule 13. Levy to be remitted within 7 days.
- e) Send Event Ticket money to British Canoeing HQ, Nottingham together with the name, post code etc. of those who have paid for an event ticket, on the form provided by British Canoeing.

PART D: VENUE AND ORGANISATIONAL CRITERIA FOR THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND THE HASLER FINALS

The Marathon Committee will look to the following ideal criteria when considering applications for the hosting of the National Championships and the Hasler Finals. Any club wishing to host the National Championships or the Hasler Finals will be expected to make a short presentation to the Annual Consultative Meeting or to the Marathon Committee outlining their proposals for the course and organisation to meet these criteria.

1) THE COURSE

- a) The course should be wide enough at the start to provide a fair start for all paddlers. It should also be wide enough throughout its length for competitors to overtake and pass each other in opposite directions
- b) The course should be capable of being paddled in an understern rudder boat.
- c) Portages should allow a minimum of 12 metres at the 'get out' and 'get in' points. Portages should not be of excessive number or length.
- d) Access to portage areas for spectators should be good with adequate parking, or pool transport should be provided.
- e) The course should be reasonably accessible for spectator viewing.
- f) There should not be too many other conflicting water users.

2) ORGANISATION

- a) The organising club(s) should have a proven track record in organising normal Divisional marathons.
- b) The venue should have good access by road and not be too far for the majority of paddlers to travel.
- c) There should be adequate camping facilities nearby, particularly for the two day National Championships.
- d) There should be adequate parking at the start and finish.
- e) There should be adequate covered checking-in and refreshment areas at the start and finish and a results display area.
- f) There should be adequate toilet facilities at the start and finish areas.
- g) There should be an adequate PA system at the start, briefing and prize giving areas.
- h) There should be adequate First Aid cover in appropriate areas.
- i) The starting of all races is to be as the procedure set out in PART C.
- j) There should be a computerised results facility capable of showing class results and team scores immediately after the races.
- k) Prizes at the National Championships will be the official BC National Marathon Championship medals and Divisional medals.

I) Prizes at the Hasler Finals will be the official BC Hasler Finals medals.

PART E: BRITISH CANOEING MEMBERSHIP AND EVENT TICKETS

All seniors and veterans must be full members of British Canoeing if they wish to race in a Marathon event that has been advertised in the Calendar. (From April 2018 this will be ON THE WATER membership category.) Juniors who are ranked in division 6 or above must also hold individual comprehensive (From April 2018 this will be ON THE WATER membership category.) British Canoeing youth membership.

A junior club member need not be a full member of British Canoeing in order to race in the lower divisions (7,8 & 9) of the Marathon racing system or in the other 2 categories of marathon races. He / she must, however, be a member of a club with a registered junior section and the number used for his or her identification will be the club's affiliation number followed by the paddler's own individual club number. However, the club abbreviation followed by the paddler's club number is easier and preferred by the Records Officer, both for identification and ease of recording. i.e. LIN/005, CHE/017. Note that event tickets are also required for Lightning paddlers who are neither British Canoeing members nor a member of a club with a registered junior section but the Event Ticket is issued to Lightning paddlers without charge.

Any junior promoted into a higher division (6 & upwards) must then become a full member of British Canoeing.

Race Organisers MUST still check that a competitor's membership is current either by photocopy of the membership card with the entry or by seeing the card on the day of the race.

If the card is unavailable or forgotten the paddler must purchase an "Event Ticket" as a "stop gap" but only once per season. The records officer carries out a check on event ticket issue for all race results and those paddlers abusing this system will be penalised.

The system is as follows:

- The tickets are for use by non-members at the entry level only of National Competitions requiring membership e.g. Divisional Racing.
- 2. For use at a British Canoeing event when the organiser believes a participant may be a member but the member cannot provide proof by way of a membership card.
- 3. Event organisers charge the current rate set by British Canoeing, which will be sent to British Canoeing HQ, Nottingham within 7 working days of the event.
- 4. Event Ticket fees are not refundable.
- The overall consideration is to encourage, in the best possible way, membership of the Country's Governing Body for Canoe sport.

PART F: ELECTION OF REGIONAL MARATHON ADVISER

- 1. Under the current Marathon Racing Rules, the Regional Marathon Advisor is an elected post.
- The election will take place each year between the Hasler Final and the end of November so that details can be included in the Racing Handbook. The election will be called by the RMA. If for any reason it is not appropriate to hold an election at this time, the MRC must be kept informed of the circumstances via the RMA Coordinator.
- 3. All clubs in the region registered as participating in marathon racing, must be invited to be involved in the process of election, with each club nominating one voting representative.
- The process will vary between regions according to local circumstances and may take place by email or at a meeting.
- 5. The process must involve the proposal of candidates and voting. Independent tellers may be used if necessary. The RMA may offer themselves for re-election. All candidates must have seen the document Regional Marathon Advisors Role. In some regions it may be appropriate to split the role and elect joint RMAs or for the elected RMA to nominate an assistant.
- 6. The RMA must inform the MRC of the outcome, with any changes to contact details, once the election has taken place.

MARATHON RACING - THE HASLER TROPHY

The story behind the Hasler Trophy

One of the most daring raids of World War Two took place on the night of 11^{th} December 1942 in the enemy-occupied port of Bordeaux in France. Operation Frankton involved 12 men in six canoes being taken by submarine to a position 10 miles south of the Gironde estuary on 7^{th} December. One of the canoes was ripped passing through the hatch of the submarine, but the other five then had an 85 mile paddle ahead of them. Two boats were lost in the tidal race and the remaining three carried on for three days, paddling in darkness and lying up during the day. One more boat hit a submerged rock and sank and the final two boats went on to Bordeaux harbour, where they attached their limpet mines and, assisted by the ebb tide, paddled silently



back down the river. The mines detonated and severely damaged four vessels and sunk one. The four remaining men beached before reaching the sea, scuttled their canoes and travelled overland to try to reach safety. Two were captured, but Major 'Blondie' Hasler and Marine Bill Sparks made their way to Spain – the only two of the original ten who survived. Hasler was awarded the DSO and Sparks the DSM.

After the war, Hasler went on to found the Single Handed Transatlantic Yacht race after a bet with his friend Francis Chichester. The Hasler Trophy was presented by Lloyds Underwriters to commemorate the raid of the so-called 'Cockleshell Heroes' and has been competed for since 1957. Major Hasler died in 1987 and Bill Sparks died on 30th November 2002, only ten days short of the sixtieth anniversary of the raid. In 2003 the Marathon Committee decided to inaugurate a new trophy named in honour of Bill Sparks, which goes to the highest placed veteran K2 in the highest division at the Hasler Final.

SELECTION POLICY FOR GREAT BRITAIN REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

Objectives

- 1 To win medals at World, European Championships and World Cup events.
- 2 To maintain a position as a top nation in international competition.
- 3 To ensure the long-term athlete development required for international success.

This policy may be amended or supplemented by the British Canoeing Marathon Racing Committee at its discretion in order to achieve the above objectives to cover exceptional circumstances. Every effort will be made to ensure as much notice as possible is given to all persons affected by any change.

Process of Selection

- Each year, the ICF publish an International Calendar from which a programme of International Events to be attended is selected. Due regard is given to the Objectives and to budgets. Some events may be designated "Development". The programme is specified in the Racing Handbook.
- 2) The basic team composition for each event will be detailed in the Racing Handbook. Changes may be necessary to suit all the factors affecting team size and budgets.
- 3) The selection of Great Britain teams for all main internationals will be made on a continuous assessment, open-to-all basis. The composition of the team for each event will depend entirely on paddlers being, and proving that they are, of sufficiently high standard.

(The system of **continuous assessment** as opposed to one of 'first past the post' at a nominated selection event has been in operation for several years and has operated very well. It allows the selectors to consider an athlete who has underperformed in any one race. This could be due to illness or equipment failure. It also means that consideration can be given to improving athletes who may not be winning but show potential for the future.)

Teams will be selected from the results of assessment races and current season internationals, as detailed in the Racing Handbook, on the basis of their ability to fulfil the Objectives above. All assessment race and international race results from the current season, up to the date of selection for a given international event, will be taken into account by the selectors in making their decisions.

In exceptional circumstances, the Selection Committee may consider international results from previous seasons even where the athlete has no assessment race or international results from the current season.

4) All athletes seeking selection should race in the Assessment class corresponding to the category for which they are seeking international selection unless otherwise instructed by the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee reserve the right to disregard results gained by athletes racing in the wrong class.

- 5) Athletes wishing to be considered for International Events must comply with the following conditions:
 - a) They must be Comprehensive (from 2018, "On The Water") British Canoeing members throughout the year.
 - b) They must meet age and nationality criteria for international competition as defined by the Eligibility Policy.
 - c) Having due regard to their availability for selection and their preferred programme, they should apply by completing the Availability Form and returning it by the dates specified in the Racing Handbook.
 - d) They should be prepared to meet all assembly costs and pay a contribution towards subsistence costs, as detailed in the Racing Handbook.
 - e) They should be prepared to travel and be accommodated in the best interest of the team.
 - f) They must be prepared to accept the Team Manager's and Team Coach's direction with regard to training and racing while abroad.
 - g) They must be prepared to dress and conduct themselves in a manner befitting a British Team representative, and promote the good name of British canoeing both at home and abroad.
 - h) They should be prepared to give support to UK Sport, Sport England and the Lottery in promotional aspects, in return for the Grant Aid received.
 - They should wear the GB tracksuit and team clothing provided, on all suitable occasions and as directed by the Team Manager
 - j) They should compete in the appropriate Assessment events.
 - k) They must sign, and abide by, the British Canoeing Code of Conduct
- 6) British Canoeing Marathon Racing Selection Committee shall consist of the following:
 - The Chairman of Selectors, appointed by British Canoeing Marathon Racing Committee, who will Chair all selection meetings.
 - b) Up to 5 other members nominated by British Canoeing MRC, of which at least three must be present to form a quorum.
 - c) The Marathon Team Manager(s) for the event(s) is invited to attend the selection meetings as a voting member.

Selectors are required to make every effort to attend all Domestic Assessment events, to ensure that a true and accurate assessment of current abilities can be made.

- 7) Selection Meetings will happen on the dates specified on page G24, usually immediately following any assessment races taking place on that date. The announcement of teams for international events will take place within five days of the corresponding selection meeting, via the MRC website at canoeracing.org.uk/marathon. The Selection Committee reserves the right to announce the team immediately following the corresponding meeting, or to defer for up to five days to clarify organisational details.
- 8) British Canoeing reserve the right to withdraw the selection of any athlete found guilty of a disciplinary offence under BC/ICF rules.

APPEALS

If there is dissatisfaction with a decision of the Selection Committee (this process applies to all British Canoeing selections) this two stage process will apply:

1. REVIEW

- 1.1 A written request for a formal review is submitted in the first instance to the Chair of the Selection Panel who will carry out a review with the Selection Panel.
- 1.2 This must be done within 48 hours of the selection being announced.
- 1.3 Within 24 hours the Chair of the Selection Panel will advise in writing the outcome of the review and the Selection Panel decision.

2. APPEAL

2.1 If, following the review, the athlete wishes to formally appeal the decision then a written notice of appeal must be submitted to British Canoeing Head of Governance within 48 hours of receiving the outcome of the review.

3. NOTICE OF APPEAL

3.1 The Notice of Appeal will set out the ground of the appeal and will include full details of the basis of the appeal including the precise manner in which the appellant alleges the selection criteria have not been followed. The Notice of Appeal should be as full as possible as it will form the basis of the remainder of this procedure.

4. GROUND OF APPEAL

- **4.1** The sole grounds of appeal against the decision of any selection panel will be that there has been a failure to follow the applicable selection criteria or that the selection panel reached a decision on the basis of an error of fact. This Appeals process is provided on these limited grounds only and must not be seen as an opportunity to dispute the opinion of the selection panel where they have followed the proper procedure.
- **4.2** There are no appeals allowed against the content of the published selection criteria and therefore against the actions of the selection panel, provided they follow the selection criteria.

5. APPEAL PANEL

- **5.1** The Head of Governance and Compliance will convene a three-person Panel to determine the appeal.
- 5.2 The Appeal Panel shall contact the Chairman of the Selection Panel to inform him of the Appeal, provide him with a copy of the Notice of Appeal and request that the Chairman provides any response which he wishes to make on behalf of the Selection Panel within 24 hours of receiving the notification.
- 5.3 The Appeal Panel will determine based on the written submissions of the athlete and the Selection Panel/Committee without a hearing or the calling of witnesses or the giving of oral evidence. It will seek to reach its conclusion within 5 working days of receipt of the Notice, and will inform all interested parties in writing.
- 5.4 The Appeal Panel will be entitled to rescind the decision of the Selection Panel and confirm the selection of the Athlete only in clear cases where the Selection Policy has not been followed and it is plain that had it been followed the Athlete would have been selected.

- 5.5 The Appeal Panel shall be entitled to confirm the decision of the Selection panel and reject the Appeal.
- **5.6** The Appeal Panel may also quash the selection decision and remit the matter back to the Selection Panel identifying the errors they have identified in the conduct of the Selection process and requesting that a new decision is made within one week.
- 5.7 At its discretion the Appeal Panel may also make an award for appeal costs up to a maximum of £200

6. FINAL AND BINDING

- **6.1** This is intended to be an accelerated process to enable any challenge to be resolved as quickly as is reasonably possible. Due to the nature of selection for events, decisions often need to be taken shortly before the events to which the selection relates. Furthermore, there is a considerable potential for 'knock on' to athlete preparation related to the outcome of the appeal.
- **6.2** The aim of this process is to return a decision on appeal in a timely manner. If the athlete fails to adhere to the time limits set out in this process he or she will have lost their right of appeal under this procedure, save in wholly exceptional circumstances which will be judged by the CEO of British Canoeing in their absolute discretion.
- **6.3** Further this process is intended to be conclusive and therefore any athlete who enters into this appeal process accepts that the decision will be final and binding.

2018 INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

The Committee will provide as full a programme as possible in 2018, but this is subject to the funding we receive. The intended programme for the year is set out below, but it must be understood that the events supported and the sizes of the teams may change depending upon funding.

The main events for the year, for both Seniors and Juniors, are : -

European Championships Metkovic, Croatia 5-8 July

World Championships Prado Vila Verde, Portugal 6-9 September

In addition to the 2 main events, we plan to send Development teams to the German National Championships, and to the World Cup in Viano do Castelo, Portugal.

Additionally a team may be sent to the Spanish International K4 Series depending on the assistance we receive from the Organisers.

A junior Development team will also be sent to the French National Championships.

We will also support other events, where the Organisers provide total finance.

Marathon Committee Support

The Marathon Committee will assist all potential team members in seeking personal sponsorship or grants, by providing letters of support.

Availability Forms

There is now a single form for Seniors and Juniors. This is available on the MRC website where it can be completed and submitted on-line.

Where an athlete submits an eligibility form, then subsequently wishes to amend their eligibility, another form will be completed. The Selection Committee will only consider **the latest** of any eligibility forms submitted by an athlete. The deadline for submission of an availability form for any given international is 48 hours prior to the date of the corresponding selection meeting. The Selection Committee reserve the right to disregard the availability of any athlete failing to submit an availability form by these deadlines.

For clarity, the latest dates for submission of availability forms are: -

Before 23 March for the German National Championships
Before 4 May for World Cup 1.
Before 8 June for the European Championships and International K4 Cup.
Before 19 July for the World Championships.

2018 Athlete Contribution

A sum of £150 will be charged for all international events.

ADDITIONAL EVENTS

The MRC receives, from time to time, invitations to additional international events. Teams will be selected for these events, providing the event organisers meet all funding. Selection for these events will be made after an Assessment event.

PRIVATE ENTRIES COMPETING ABROAD

Any competitor wishing to compete abroad outside the British team **must** notify the Governing Body, British Canoeing (**ICF ruling**). No athlete is permitted to present themselves as a Great Britain team member for an international event of any sort, without the consent of the Selection Committee.

The exception to this rule is for Masters events at championships organised by the ICF, where the current practice by race organisers is to accredit entries by individuals and clubs under international colours. This practice does not constitute acknowledgement of Great Britain team status, or any responsibility or liability whatsoever by British Canoeing.

For practical purposes these notifications must be emailed to gemma.wiggs@britishcanoeing.org.uk, copying marathon.secretary@britishcanoeing.org.uk no later than formal support by British Canoeing for the race entry, or acknowledgement of the athlete's competence to take part in the event in question.

The applicant will be liable for any costs incurred, e.g. entry fees (even if he / she does not subsequently compete). It is regretted that the Marathon Committee can make no private travel or accommodation arrangements.
