

The Community Council decided to fund the running costs of keeping the library open for a six month period to November on existing hours so as to enable time for a discussion on the long term future of the building and to include a public consultation which is the purpose of the communication. It also will enable its current state of repair to be assessed and will prevent it being closed and deteriorating which could make any long term plan more difficult.

There is a financial implication for local residents by way of the Council tax. If expenditure were to be increased by £12000 then the Band D Council Tax would rise by £8 a year or by approximately £1 for every £1500. The Community Council also gives financial assistance towards the running costs of the Bagillt Community Centre in the High Street and the Bagillt Bowling Club for green maintenance and these will need to be reviewed for the future if expenditure on the library is to continue.
