HOST SYSTEM

As agreed at the AGM on 31st October, a Hosting System has been implemented on a trial basis and commenced on Friday 6th January.

This has proved to be a positive venture with a host at many of the three weekly bridge sessions. Although a host was not always needed and had to go home, on many occasions a successful partnership was arranged and a single player was able to enjoy an evening's bridge.

We are now looking for other bridge members to volunteer as hosts. A host does not pay for the bridge session although the downside may be that the host has to return home without playing.

Each member need only volunteer once or twice a year. This gives the opportunity for a single member to come to the club knowing that they can play. It also means that a visitor to the area can come to the club knowing that a partner is not needed.

The Host calendar is on the website so it is always clear when a host is available.

If you feel that you could volunteer to be a host, please approach one of the club committee members at a bridge session, or the director, or simply put your name down on the Host calendar.

It is important that we raise the profile of the club and encourage members to come to as many sessions as possible, as well as encouraging new members, if we want a successful club.

FIRE ALARM FAULT

On Monday 6th Feb, the fire alarm went off in error. This was not planned and was not a drill. Although all members did evacuate (despite the cold and rain) it was noted that some did not leave quickly or willingly and some went back for coats and personal items.

If the fire alarm does go off, it is essential to evacuate quickly and safely via the outside stairs and convene on or near the pitch

It was noted that the lighting was not sufficient and this is to be addressed with the Cricket Club (along with the reason for the fault !!!)

It was also disappointing that we had to contact the Fire Brigade who decided to send us back in the building to confirm there was no fire rather than coming themselves.

The chance of a drill (or need for one at least every two years) was discussed at our last committee meeting and a draft policy and guidance is being worked on and will be published soon.

EGM – RESTATED ACCOUNTS

On the 20th Feb17 CBC will hold an EGM before bridge at 7pm. This is just to issue the re-stated accounts and answer any questions you may have. The accounts had a few items recorded in the wrong year (mainly one large item causing the difference). This means that we made a small profit last season instead of a small loss.

MATCH REPORT FROM JANE GREEN

Lady Rose – The 2 CBC teams met in the quarter finals and Jane Green's team triumphed in a competitive match. Ian Lewis' team got the better of them on a number of boards but the result was never really in doubt – let's hope CBC go on to lift the Surrey trophy! Jane's team's reward is to meet last year's winners in the semi-final.

Bracknell League - Last year we had three teams in the league. The A team was relegated, unsurprisingly as their team suffered from players with health problems and one moved away. The Old B team has taken their place and is playing in the second division. The old C team was promoted and has become the new B team in the third division. Penny Moody, one of our Friday players) has formed a new C team and we wish them success as our new C team in division 4, current standings:

A Team – 4th averaging 9.13 points

B Team – 6th averaging 5.86 (but had a good win against a strong Ascot team)

C Team – 7th with 5.67 (but 2 convincing wins against local rivals YHBC)

BERYL DOUGHTY – A TRIBUTE BY NORMAN BENNETT

Most of you here will know that Beryl was a formidable bridge player. Wherever she played she was a winner.. In the days when most players used the Basic Acol system of bidding, she was the best Acol player in the area. Not surprisingly, this was recognised by the County selectors and several times they chose her to be a member of the Surrey team which competed in the Metropolitan League – a rare honour for players from our local clubs.

After Jim died, bridge became Beryl's life. She had already made a big impact on Camberley Bridge Club, which played only rubber bridge when she arrived. In those days they played in private houses and in a shed behind a local pub. Bobbi Turnbull was a member then, as were Alma Mann, John Warren, Barbara Warner, Andy Lewis, Nicky Croft and Jo Marchant and her mother. Bobbi tells me that Beryl was always good for a laugh and helpful to inexperienced players. Gwen and Mike Griffin were among the players she taught. But it was Beryl's proud boast that she soon had the Club playing duplicate bridge. When I retired in 1991, having played all my duplicate bridge in the London leagues, I joined the Club and was fortunate enough to be taken under Beryl's wing. We played together every Thursday for 22 years. But there was one exception. She already had a partner for the Club Championship – 10 sessions each year. Beryl won the club championship with Jim and with Mary Orr and later won it nearly every year with Marie Thomson. But she had many other successes. As recently as 2012, when she was 91 and with severely failing eyesight, the Club members were delighted when she and I won the Members Plate.

Beryl was a highly ranked player when she came here and joined all the clubs in the area. On Mondays and Tuesdays she played at Crowthorne, Wednesdays and Fridays at Yateley. When Camberley later played on Mondays as well as Thursdays, she played every week on Mondays with John Warren. She also found time to play in Marie-Helene Taylor's team in the teams of 8 at Mytchett and she went for occasional weekends away. I know that she went with Beryl Bartholemew and Patricia and David Pinder to earn coveted Green Points at weekend Congresses. And she loved her annual trips to Torquay with John Warren and Marie and Hugh Thomson, staying with two former members of Camberley. She always came home from Torquay with gift voucher prizes.

But it is probably at Yateley that Beryl will be best remembered. She was proud to be chosen as President of the club. And a trophy was named in her honour. She captained Yateley's successful team in the Bracknell league. Over the years her team-mates included John Warren, Colin Bailey, David Steele, the Thomsons, the Jewell brothers, Robin Duncan and myself. On club nights Beryl had many good results with Ross Lenman and Rod Barber. Alan Brown tells me that she would offer to play with new partners, and that, in fact, she often won the Rose Bowl – the trophy awarded to the player with the best results with several partners. Val Foster tells me that Beryl was very helpful with friendly advice when she and Keith were learning. In turn Beryl was very grateful to Val and Keith when they looked after her when she was first taken ill at the club. And to Val Cooper, who kindly did Beryl's shopping for several weeks afterwards. When she could no longer drive, Owen Lunt and Sandra Byers kindly chauffeured her and partnered her. Her eyes finally let her down. We both went to Specsavers, and the boss there, Lateef Iqbal, always asked me how Beryl was getting on. She was a favourite of his for many years.

Beryl liked bridge players to be dressed smartly. She set a good example and many times I heard her encourage others with compliments like, "That's a pretty shade of blue, Margaret". And she was a generous hostess. David Pinder tells me that, when she was at Iberian Way, she gave splendid dinner parties to her circle of bridge friends. And she enjoyed putting on her finery for Heidi and Max Baumann's charity bridge afternoons in their lovely house in the sticks, when even the men tried harder than usual to smarten up! Her nickname was "The Duchess". That is how I will like to remember her.
