Brimsdown is a brand new ward, carved from the previous wards of Enfield Highway and Ponders End. It is situated in the north-east of the Borough, bordered by the wards of Enfield Lock, Bullsmoor, Carterhatch and Ponders End.

It is covered by postal district of EN3.

Brimsdown falls within the parliamentary constituency of Enfield North.




Population

Based on the ONS Mid-Year Estimate 2020, the ward population is estimated to be 17,015.



The proportions of males and females in the ward are 48.8% and 51.2% respectively. Males outnumber females in all age bands up to 24 years – see chart above right.


Socio-Economic Factors

Key features:

- The ward has lower than average numbers of economically active adults
- Average Household incomes are £30-35K per annum below the borough and London averages. A relatively high number of households are on low incomes.
- Unemployment is higher than the borough average and 37% of households are on Universal Credit
- Deprivation Indices: the ward has relatively high deprivation. All of its neighbourhood areas are among the most deprived 50% in England
- Proportions of households in fuel poverty are relatively high (19%, compared with 16% for the borough)
- Crime is relatively high.
- Higher than average numbers of households live in the Social Rented sector.

Occupational Classification

Occupational groups are taken from the Census. As we will have no 2021 Census Outputs, is aggregated Output Area data from the 2011 Census.



Low Income Households

Data from CACI Ltd indicate that – at 2021 – households in the ward have an average (median) household income of £30-35K per annum, which is lower than the borough and London averages.

- 29.2% of households have a household income of less than £20,000 per annum the borough average is 25.1%
- 18.1% of households have an income below £15,000 per annum the borough average is 15.4%


Statistics from the Department for Work and Pensions indicate that, at 2020:

- 1,150 children¹ in the ward (22% of the total) were living in families with Relative low income (the borough average was 20.2%),
- 917 (17.6%) were in families of Absolute low income² (the borough average was16%)

¹ Aged up to 19 years (includes 16-19 year-olds who are in training or non-advanced education – ie categories for which Child Benefit would be payable assuming no other disqualifying factors)

² Relative low income: equivalised household income is less than 60% of the UK median for that year. Absolute low income: equivalised household income is less than 60% of the UK median for the period 2010-2011.

Benefit Claims

- As at October 2021, the unemployment claimant count³ in the ward was 930, representing 8.6% of the local working-age population (the borough average was 7.5%)
- At August 2021, 2,283 households (including working families) were claiming Universal Credit (36.7% of all households in the ward). This compares with a borough average of 28.6% on Universal Credit.

Economically active people

The estimated proportion of people in work or looking for work (the economically active) was lower than the borough average in 2011, at 65.3%.


Deprivation score

The Indices of Deprivation 2019 – published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government⁴ measure **relative** deprivation in neighbourhood areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas). These are ranked and sorted into deciles of relative deprivation.


The map below illustrates how deprived the neighbourhood areas of the ward are, compared with all such areas in England. Darker shading indicates higher relative deprivation levels.

5% of Enfield's neighbourhood areas are among the 10% most deprived in the country, with a further 25% within the 20% most deprived. The chart below shows how the neighbourhood areas of the ward compares with this, and with the distribution in England.




Fuel Poverty

Best-fit geographic analysis of government statistics⁵ reveal that, as at 2019, 19.2% of households in the ward were in fuel poverty. This proportion was higher than the borough, regional and national averages (16.4%, 15.2% and 13.4% respectively).

Crime

Metropolitan Police data for the period November 2020 to October 2021 indicate that:

- There were 1,447 notifiable offences in the ward a fall of 14% on the previous year.
- The crime rate was 85.0 offences per 1,000 population higher than the borough and London averages
- The most numerous offences Violence Against the Person and Vehicle offences.




Health





Housing





The term 'Higher level' refers to qualifications of levels 4 and above (i.e. first degrees, higher degrees, NVQ levels 4 and 5, HND, HNC and certain professional qualifications).


