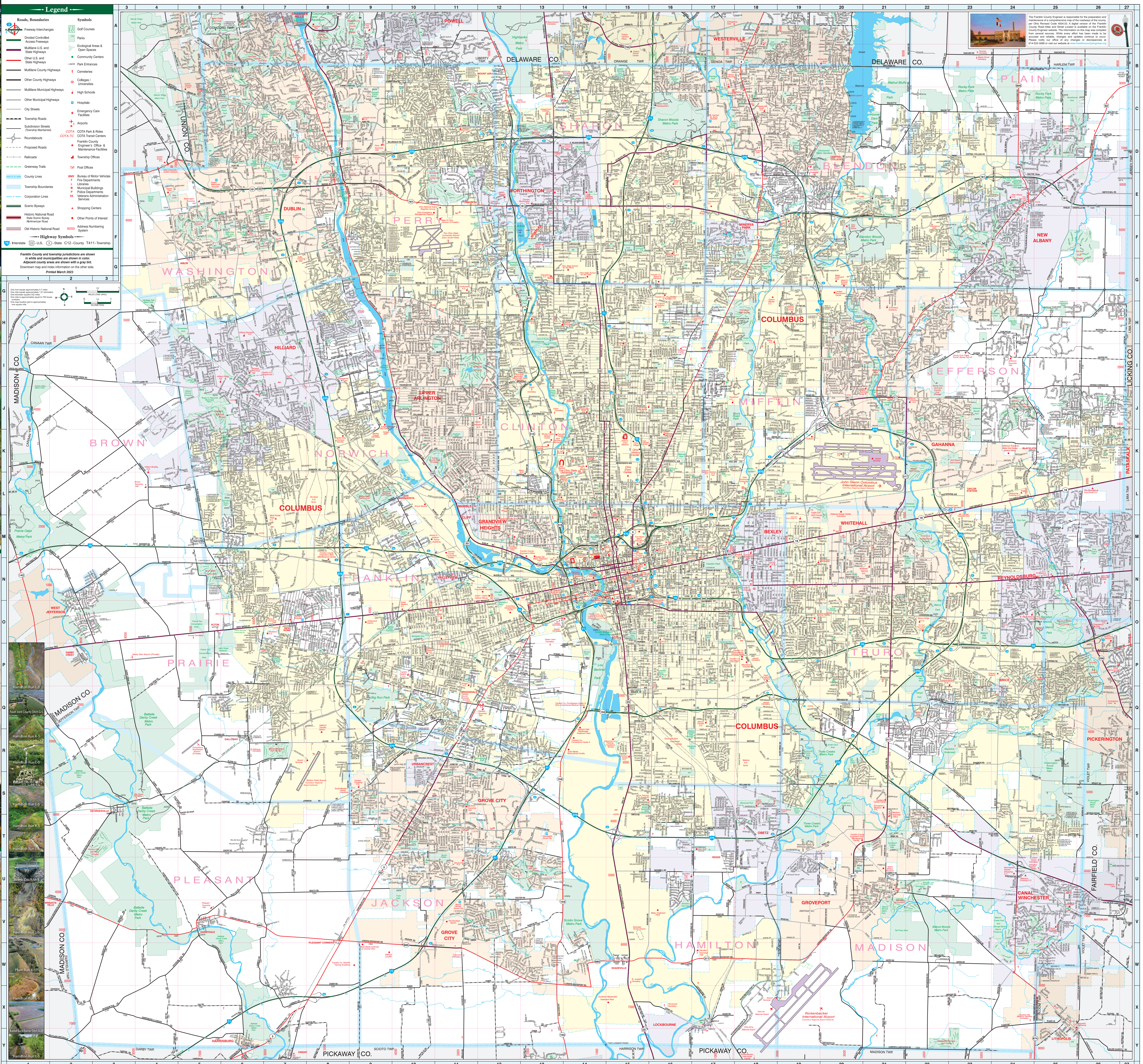
### Drainage

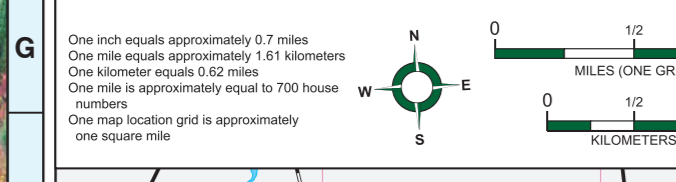

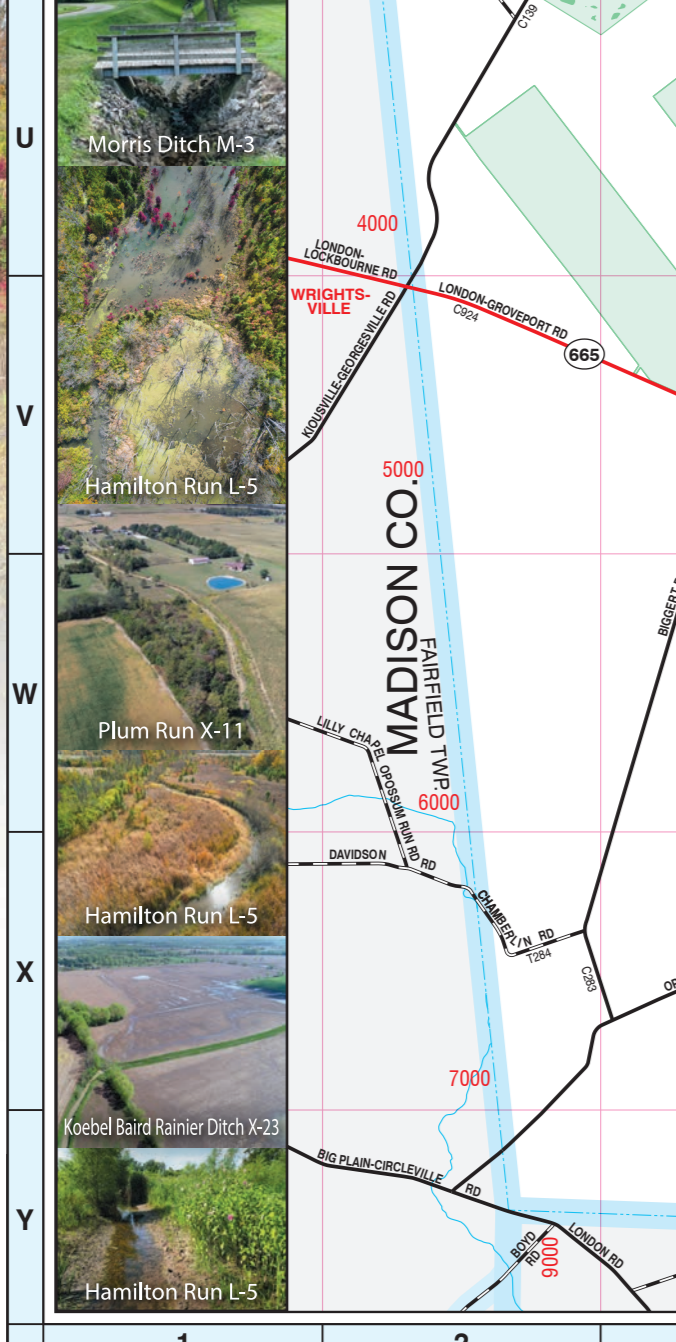
