HEALING PARISH COUNCILNOTES FOR MARCH 2022

The Council meeting for February held in the existing Village Hall and saw members of the public attending to raise issues and also observe for interest. It is hoped to hold the March meeting in the new Village Hall meeting room, even though the Hall won't be open officially to hirers at that point.

Highways and Footpaths

A quarterly highways meeting with the Parish Council and NELC will be held in the next month or so—four meetings a year are usually held.

Planning Applications

The planning applications considered at the meeting for February were as follows:

Planning Application Reference: DM/1196/21/FUL

Proposal: Erect one dwelling with associated landscaping, boundary treatments and car parking bay (Amended Plans received 4th January 2022)

Location: Land At Orchard Fields Healing

Objections – the Parish Council objected to this development pre-amendment and would reiterate its objections to the proposal. The amendments do not impact upon the view that this dwelling is not appropriate at this location and represents overintensification of this site. The property is being shoe-horned into a small space which would be better left as general amenity space to improve the residential aspects of the site. Another property is unacceptable at this location.

Planning Application Reference: DM/1211/21/FUL Proposal: Erect 8 dwellings to include garages, landscaping and access

Location: Land At Buddleia Close Healing

Objections – whilst the Parish Council recognises that development will take place on this site, and has no objections to that in principle, it does support several neighbour's concerns with regard to the proposed landscaping which threatens to overshadow neighbouring gardens and dwellings. The members also had concerns on possible intrusion from the proposed balcony on the larger end dwelling. The Parish Council would ask for amended plans to be submitted addressing the landscaping issues.

Police Matters

The Parish Council continues to receive its monthly police report, which is published in the News each month. The Members were slightly alarmed at the increase in the number of incidents and so has asked a member of the policing team to be present at the next meeting in March if possible.

Village Hall Project

The build is now complete apart from minor snagging works and the completion of a footpath to the door, which are all in the process of being completed. Security measures are then being fitted at the building and then flooring will also be completed. The Council needs to vacate the existing building by the end of March 2022 and it seems that this will be the moving date to move all the hirers over. An official opening event is still being planned. All current hirers have been kept appraised of progress and many have visited the Hall to look round.

Parks and other sites

The new play equipment for Fords Avenue Park should be installed by the time this Newsletter is delivered. Many thanks to Your Place for donating the equipment to us and to Hodson and Kauss for organising its relocation for us.

Finance

As previously reported in the December/January edition, the budget and precept requirement have been set and these were published in full in that edition of the Newsletter.

POLICE REPORT

Wolds Ward Healing Update February 2022

Crime

There were twenty seven reported crimes across the Wolds Ward during January, of which thirteen have occurred in Healing.

There have been four reports of cars being entered. Overnight 14th & 15th January a car parked on Clematis Avenue was entered. Despite being searched, nothing was stolen.

During the early hours of 15th January property was stolen from an insecure vehicle parked on Bluebell Court.

Between 14th & 17th February a secure car parked on Wisteria Drive was entered by unknown means. Property was stolen.

During the early hours of 16th January, another car parked on Bluebell Court was entered. CDs were amongst the property stolen.

During the afternoon of 30th January eggs were thrown at windows and through the letterbox of a property on Larkspur Avenue.

Damage was caused at a factory on EuroParc by a known employee.

Other offences include:

A runner was bitten on his leg and hand by a Jack Russell dog on Marsh Lane on the afternoon of 26th January.

One minor public order offence.

One report of stalking (as previously reported).

Two reports of sending malicious communications.

Into February, there have been seven crimes reported so far (8th Jan) in the Wolds Ward. Two assaults and sending inappropriate images over mobile phones.

There have been two reports of ASB.

Youths causing issues in the grounds of the British Legion Club. One neighbour dispute.

With a fantastic group of volunteers alongside ECB accredited coaches, one of whom was recently awarded Coach of the Year, the focus is fun in a safe environment whilst developing confidence, skills, fitness and teamwork. We have been lucky enough to receive some additional funding for equipment, so everything is provided at minimal cost to ensure everyone can participate.

Healing Community Junior Cricket Club has rapidly grown over the last few years from where Tim, Steve and Chris all saw the urgent need for youngsters to be brought into the game for its future. It's good to talk and be heard

NELC is holding some 'listening' events which it is encouraging residents to attend. Cabinet Members from NELC will be present and these events are an opportunity for residents to raise issues directly.

These are drop-in sessions and no appointments are necessary.

The next sessions are as follows:

Grimsby Town Hall between 5pm and 7pm on Monday, 7 March.

Immingham Civic Centre between 5.30pm and 7.30pm on Thursday, 10 March.

Council Leader, Philip Jackson, said he and Cabinet colleagues were looking forward to hearing more about issues facing communities where they live.

"This was something we pledged to do when we were elected back in 2019. We managed to hold some before COVID-19 called a halt to all face-to-face contact and so we are really pleased to be able to bring them back," he said.

He recalled how, after the first successful sessions, issues were raised that have now been dealt with such as cleaning up the River Freshney and being a key part of resolving the closure of the Suggitt's Lane crossing, with a new footbridge opening shortly.

"As with the first sessions, this won't be any sort of decision-making forum, but we're keen to make sure we're accessible to the public and we hope people will take the opportunity to come and discuss some of the key things either already going on or planned for the area."

Cllr Jackson also emphasised the events would not replace or impact on ward surgeries currently held by councillors from across all the area's political parties.

View from the Pew

Where would we be without words? They are essential for meaningful every-day living! Some people find crosswords enrich their daily lives, or word games like wordle or scrabble. I have a friend who has had to move into a care home due to poor health, and when she was telling me about it, the highlight was that she had beaten the resident expert at scrabble and was now queen of the home as far as scrabble was concerned!

In this month of March the word Lent is part of the life. The meaning is quite different from the ordinary verb to lend, which means that the use of something is given to someone on the understanding that it will be given back. Lent with a capital originates in an old English word, Lenten, which means spring. Lent is marked by the church during the six weeks before Easter. It commemorates the time Jesus spent in the desert working out how God wanted Him to conduct His ministry of love. Easter marks the death and resurrection of Jesus the word Easter is thought to originate from the goddess Eastre, who was associated with spring.

So Christians in Lent are invited to spend time in tune with the time Jesus spent in the desert, praying and fasting, working out God's will for His ministry. I was interested to read that the practice of mirroring Jesus's time of deliberation and fasting only began in the ninth century. I wonder how many people nowadays actually take the challenge seriously? The joke about giving up chocolate for Lent seems to be more in tune with the reality nowadays!

So maybe during the weeks before Easter we can pause in our busy and covid-confusing lives to consider what the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ can mean for us in our inward being. It is the key to the integral inward spiritual part of us, which our faith teaches survives death, just as Jesus did on Easter Day.

New Village Hall Project Update

The new village hall has now had all the building works completed and we are just waiting for the flooring to be laid in line with the necessary safety requirements.

Other works being carried out whilst we wait for the flooring have included fitting cabinet locks in the kitchen for various village groups who use the Hall on a regular basis, sorting out storage with existing Hall users, fitting a baby change station, ordering blinds for the large windows, doors to the hatch from the kitchen into the main hall and doing some tidying up of boxing in etc.

There has also been a new field gate and pedestrian gate fitted up at the Park as the old gates and posts were rotten, and a new path has now been laid to meet the ramp put in by the building contractors. The ramp and path etc. were required by building control. Edging to the path and a safety balustrade at the entrance to the Hall have now also been fitted.

There will be further works to the outside of the project, with the land where it has been disturbed by building works, being cultivated and then when its slightly warmer, there will be new grass sown.

The Council will be moving out of the old Hall by the end of March and most of our existing hirers have now been and visited the new facility and are thrilled with the result. An official open event will be held to allow residents to come up and have a look around.
