# Pedro is new Arsenal manager

Pedro Martinez Losa has been appointed Arsenal Ladies first team manager, the club has confirmed.

The Spanish coach joins the Gunners from from USA National Women's Soccer League side Western New York Flash, where he has been assistant coach since 2012. Losa takes over from John Bayer, who has been in charge in a caretaker capacity following Shelley Kerr's resignation in May 2014.

Prior to his time in America, the 38-year-old spent five years as head coach of Rayo Vallecano Femenino in Spain. He led Rayo Vallecano to the Spanish Cup in 2008 - the first major trophy in the their history - and to league titles in 2009 and 2010. In Europe, he also took the team to the last sixteen of the UEFA Women's Champions League in 2010-11.

Losa said of his appointment: "Joining Arsenal Ladies is a very special moment for me. The team has a great history and I will do my best to add to it during my time in charge."

The new coach will take up his position with Arsenal on 15th September and first game in charge will be away to Bristol Academy in the FA Women's Super League on 20th September. Captain and assistant coach Kelly Smith will take charge of the team until then.

Arsenal Ladies General Manager Clare Wheatley added: "We are excited to welcome Pedro to the club.

"He is a fantastic coach, with experience of working at the top of the women's game in both the United States and Spain and we look forward to him getting underway."

The previous manager, Shelley Kerr, left the post following the club's 2-0 victory over Everton in the F.A.Women's Cup Final. Kelly Smith's first match in temporary charge ended in a notable 2-1 win away to Birmingham City which has taken them to the fringes of the title race and, following another vital league match against leaders Chelsea, the Gunners take on Notts County in the semi finals of the Continental Cup this Sunday.

# The FA WSL

Chelsea are three points clear at the top of FA WSL 1 following a dramatic 3-2 victory away to Arsenal on Thursday night.

After the Gunners had taken the lead through Danielle Carter, Casev

Stoney missed a penalty and Yuki Ogimi levelled the scores from the spot at the other end. Jackie Groenen then put Chelsea ahead for the first time before Arsenal levelled ahead of the break with a fine goal from Leah Williamson. The game looked

to be heading for a draw until Ji So-Yun grabbed a late winning goal to keep Chelsea on course for a first title Birmingham City now look to be their main challengers after they bounced back from a 2-1 defeat to Arsenal on Sunday to win 3-1 at

Bristol Academy. Rebecca Spencer saved a first minute penalty from Natalia Pablos Sanchon after the first half finished goalless, Birmingham stunned the home side with a threegoal blitz after the break. Chelsea Weston drilled in

superb left foot shot from 25 yards, Jo Potter finished off a good move from Kirsty Linnett's cross and Karen Carney scored from an inswinging free kick. Angharad James pulled one back for Academy but Birmingham safely negotiated the late stages for three precious points.

**Liverpool**'s hopes of retaining the title hang in the balance following a 2-2 local derby draw with Everton. Danielle Turner opened the scoring direct from a corner for Everton on the half hour but the Reds hit back with goals either side of half time from Natasha Dowie and Kate Longhurst, Nikita Parris restored parity once again and although the England Under-20 striker was later sent off, Everton held out for an important point in their survival battle.

On Wednesday night, Notts County and Manchester City fought out a 1-1 draw at Meadow Lane. County did take the lead through Jess Clarke but just three minutes later. Toni Duggan hit back to earn City a point.

Sunderland have had a great week in FA WSL 2, following up a weekend win over Aston Villa by beating Durham Women 2-0, thanks to goals from Beth Mead and Keira Ramshaw. Doncaster Rovers Belles meanwhile surrendered their unbeaten record as they lost 4-0 to third placed **Reading FC Women**, including a Fran Kirby hat-trick.

The Belles bounced back quickly on Thursday night though and it was Villa who caught the backlash, Mille Bright scoring twice along with Sue Smith, Jess Sigsworth, Courtney Sweetman-Kirk and Beth England in a 6-1 victory.

Reading meanwhile continued their good form by winning 3-2 away to Yeovil Town. Sarah Wiltshire - who had scored a weekend hat-trick herself - gave Yeovil the lead before Lauren Bruton equalised with a penalty and Kirby once again found the net to put Reading in front. Natalie Haigh equalised for the home side but Bruton settled matters after ther break with her second goal.

There was late drama in the other games - Millwall Lionesses breaking their winless run by beating Watford 1-0, courtesy of an injury time penalty from captain Naomi Cole.

Oxford Utd meanwhile looked on course for their second win of the season when Laura Low gave them a third minute lead against London Bees but Rebecca Anderson salvaged a point for the improving Bees, again in injury time. Holly Pickett had a goal disallowed for Oxford shortly afterwards as the gap of three points remains between the two teams

# F.A.Women's Premier League

PREMIER LEAGUE

**Sheffield FC** began their defence of the Premier League Cup with a 5-1 victory away to **Rotherham Utd** in the Determining Round. Ellie Gilliatt opened the scoring for Sheffield just before the half hour and Suzanne Davies added the second from the penalty spot ahead of the interval. In the second half, Jodie Michalska bagged a brace and Lynn Goodman also found the net to wrap up the scoring.

**Cardiff City Ladies**, beaten finalists last season, also had a safe passage through as they scored six without reply past **St Nicholas**. Kelly Aldridge netted twice for the South Wales side and she was joined on the scoresheet by Cori Williams, Zoe Atkins, Lauren Townsend and Kelly Isaac.

The won the title by beating AFC Preston in a Championship Play-off after the teams had finished level on points and they rounded off a great campaign by also winning the League Cup with a 4-2 victory over Hunmanby in the Final.

They duly won promotion to the Southern Division of the North East League and after finishing fourth in their first campaign, they bettered it last season with a third place finish. They also reached the Final of the East Riding County Cup where they were narrowly defeated 5-4 by Hull City.

The team is managed by Andy Warvill with Steve Tanser as Coach and Ellie Tanser as captain, and they got off to a good start to the new season last Sunday by winning their first match, 5-1 against Dearne & District.

### SAWBRIDGEWORTH TOWN v STEVENAGE LADIES

The origins of Sawbridgeworth Town Women's Football Club started back in 1986 when a ladies' five-a-side league was formed in Harlow by Helen Offord who was employed by Harlow Council as a sports development officer. One of the original teams that was formed was Harlow Bears. Towards the end of the 1989 league a group of girls/women asked if it was possible to form an eleven-a-side team. After selection trials over a six week period a group of 22 players formed Harlow Town Ladies Football Club.

Over the years Harlow Town had always been there or there about when it came to trophies as for the first six seasons they were involved in one or other of the League Cup competitions. Winning the League Cup in the 1991-92 season and the Lisa Slater Memorial Shield in the 1993-94 season and the biggest prize to date, winning the Essex County Cup in the 1995-96 season. As with all ladies clubs it seems that it is inevitable that players move on and during the close season of 95-96 Harlow saw its fair share of movement out of the club of many good players for one reason or another.

Although Harlow Town F.C. had shown great interest to continue the set up with the unaffiliated Ladies team of the same name they were not forthcoming with regard to a closer relationship. Bishop's Stortford FC became aware of the situation and the then general manager of BSFC (John Radford ex-Arsenal) approached the management of the ladies club and offered the chance to become the ladies section of BSFC, after discussions the management of the ladies club felt that it would be in the best interests of the club as a whole that Harlow Town Ladies Football Club change its name and become as a whole Bishop's Stortford Ladies Football Club.

This lasted until 2001 when Sawbridgeworth Town FC approached the club, who were now playing home matches at their ground, and after discussions a decision was made to accept their offer. At the start of the 2001-02 season, Sawbridgeworth Town Women's Football Club was the new name of the club. Promotion to the Premier Division was narrowly missed in 2005-06 but during this period, they enjoyed greater success in the League Plate, reaching the Final three years in a row. After two narrow defeats on the first two occasions, they lifted the trophy in 2007 after beating Stevenage Borough on a penalty shootout.

In 2012 they finally won promotion to the top division but unfortunately could not sustain their status and were relegated back to Division One South at the start of this season.

The team is managed by John Day and long serving member Jackie Stott is club secretary.

Stevenage Borough Ladies were formed in 1998 and have always played their football in the Eastern Region League, establishing themselves in that league over the years. They were in the lower divisions for much of the early years before finishing as runners-up in Division One in 2006-07, also reaching the League Plate Final in the same season. They were also runners-up in Division One South the following season, winning promotion to the Premier Division where they remained ever since.

# England Wembley ticket details announced

Ticket details have been released for England's historic match at Wembley Stadium connected by EE in November.

England will take on Germany on Sunday 23 November and the match will kick off at 3pm. Tickets will go on sale on Thursday 4th September at midday and are priced from £10 for adults and £1 for children.

Early bird adult tickets, priced £10, are available throughout September. From Wednesday 1 October, adult tickets will be priced at £15.

The match marks the first time that the England Women have played at the new Wembley and will form part of the team's preparations for next summer's FIFA Women's World Cup.

England qualified for the 2015 tournament, which will be staged in Canada, after winning nine out of nine of their Group Six qualifiers and conceding only one goal. They finish their qualifying campaign away in Montenegro later this month.

Head coach Mark Sampson said: "After securing qualification for the World Cup, the Germany announcement has created huge excitement within the women's football community.

"Just looking at the history of England v Germany matches at Wembley such as in 1966, 1996 and the last match at the old Wembley, it sends a shiver down your spine to think that we have the opportunity now to add to that history and with a women's game.

"I know The FA is working very hard to support the match and get as many supporters to the game as possible, and I really hope the whole of the football community comes out in force to support the team."

England and Manchester City midfielder Jill Scott added: "Since the match was announced, I've been speaking with a lot of the team and everyone's really excited for the game. To get another chance to play at Wembley after the Olympics will be an amazing experience for all the players.

"There's definitely a real buzz around the match so hopefully we'll get a great crowd for it. Germany will be tough opposition but it's ideal preparation for us ahead of next summer's World Cup."

## Prestigious award for Nadine Kessler

Wolfsburg's Champions League winning captain, Nadine Kessler was crowned the UEFA Women's Best Player in Europe in Monaco yesterday afternoon.

The women's award, now in its second year, pitted Kessler against her two club team mates, Sweden's Nilla Fischer and German attacker Martina Muller, but it was 26-year-old midfielder Kessler who won the vote of the women's football press jury to lift the coveted prize.

Last year Kessler was fourth in this award but this season found herself in the shortlist of three after a magnificent campaign where she captained Wolfsburg to their second successive UEFA Women's Champions League and Frauen Bundesliga titles. Her famous dribble to set up team mate Muller for the winner in the Champions League final against Tyreso was described by the goalscorer as "50% Nadine and 50% me."

On winning the award, a delighted Kessler said: "It is something really special. To be honest I didn't even dream about it. It is a surprise for me. I had some great competitors with me, or better said, team mates. But I am simply over the moon.

"It is an award that gives me a confirmation that I have done everything right, that I worked really hard. It shows I was on the right track. In the end of course it is only possible with good teammates around you in order to develop in such a way."

The win for Kessler means that the award stays with Germany as international team mate and German number one goalkeeper Nadine Angerer lifted the prize last year.

The winner of the male award was Cristiano Ronaldo of Real Madrid. (by Laura Montgomery)
