Introduction

This booklet lists sources available within Sheffield Libraries Archives and Information for the study of the Kinder Trespass of 1932.

The Kinder Trespass of 24th April 1932 has taken on iconic status in the history of the struggle over rights of access to the countryside. Before 1949, only around 1% of moorland in the Peak District was publicly accessible and there were only 12 'legal' paths. Land was managed for grouse shooting, which only occurred a few days a year, but access was prevented year-round by gamekeepers. The 1920s and 30s also saw a growing number of working class ramblers, due to unemployment and the proximity of the industrial centres of Sheffield and Manchester to upland moors. In this context, the demand for a right to roam became linked to a left-wing politics that decried the class divisions evident in land ownership and access.

In 1900 G.H.B. Ward had founded the Sheffield Clarion Ramblers with an explicitly working class ethos, named from a Socialist newspaper and affiliated with the Labour Representation Committee, for which Ward also worked. As early as 1907, Ward had participated in a mass trespass on Bleaklow, and the Clarion Ramblers held another at Winnat's Pass in 1927. Some have suggested Ward's involvement in organising the Sheffield contingent to the 1932 trespass, though due to his work as a civil servant and a 10 year injunction banning him from trespassing this had to be kept quiet. He later founded the Hallamshire Footpaths Preservation Society.

The Kinder Trespass itself was organised by the British Worker's Sports Federation, largely constituting members and supporters of the Communist Party, with activist Benny Rothman playing a leading role. Folk singer Ewan McColl, then known as Jimmie Miller, claimed to have been the press officer for the operation. As well as the main Manchester contingent, several groups from Sheffield participated in the trespass. Around 400 ramblers met at Bowden Bridge Quarry and heard a speech by Rothman before beginning up the hill. After a confrontation with gamekeepers at William Clough, the main party came up to the plateau and met a group from Sheffield, and the trespass was declared a success.

Five men were later arrested at the village of Hayfield, including Rothman. Tried at the Derby Assizes for unlawful assembly and breach of the peace, the men were sentenced to between two to six months of jail-time. The severity of the sentences, served to shock more official rambling organisations, which had been opposed to the trespass, and united the campaign for greater access. An access rally in the Winnats Pass a few weeks after the demonstration attracted huge crowds of up to 10,000.

The chief legacy of the trespass is often seen as the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, which led to the creation of the Peak District National Park. However, the right to roam remained limited and dependent on access agreements until the end of the century, and the direct action of the Kinder Trespass inspired continued access campaigns from groups such as SCAM, the Sheffield Campaign for Access to Moorland which formed out of the 50th anniversary commemorations in 1982. It was not until the Countryside and Rights of Way Act in 2000, that the law provided a 'right of public access on foot to areas of open land comprising mountain, moor, heath and down'.
