## **Chairman's Report**

**Welcome!** This is my very first report since my election as Chair of our Parish Council. Even though Summer is a relatively quiet period, I have still been kept busy, as you will read further down the page.

Landscaping: The Parish Council has, after long deliberation and debate, decided to take over landscaping in our Parish from Milton Keynes Council, beginning in April 2020. This will include everything except management of trees and Parks Trust land. We believe that we can improve the quality and level of service to our residents. **The opening of Garthwaite Pavilion:** A great time was had by all! Now fully 'up and running', Garthwaite Pavilion is proving popular with local residents and groups alike! The Parish Council has received planning permission to develop an enclosed play area and to extend the existing terrace and to reconfigure the football pitches and these works are due to start in early September.

I was also privileged to be invited by Caroline Haslett Primary School, in Shenley Lodge, along with the Mayor and others, to give out 'Governor Awards' to some extremely excited children and their very proud parents and guardians.

A number of residents have raised concerns over the possibility of the withdrawal of bus route 24/25. I am in contact with MK Council to progress solutions for this - a small, but significant, number of residents use this bus service to access the shops in Westcroft and to attend some of the Parish Council's clubs and meetings!

I want to extend a warm welcome to our newest Councillor, Gary Mileham, who will have responsibility for the Shenley Brook End Estate.

I also want to welcome and introduce you to Lee Kay, who is our new Finance and Administration Officer. The Parish Council, like all Parish and Community Councils, has a responsibility to manage our finances transparently, responsibly and wisely. Lee comes to us with a wealth of knowledge and experience – and, what is more, lives in our Parish!





#### **Emerson Valley School**

We have reached the end of another successful year at Emerson Valley School. We would like to take this opportunity to share with you some of the memories and highlights from the past year:



Academically we have had a very successful year. 71% of our Year 6 children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths and for the fourth consecutive year we have exceeded national expectations!

On the sporting front we were nominated for the Primary School of the Year Award for Buckinghamshire, our swimmers achieved Bronze at the annual swimming gala and in the 'Ultra Schools' category of the Cross Country we again achieved third place; our highest ever finish!

In music our choir have been busy performing to the local community and have become popular regulars at Hungerford House!

Whole school council elections were held using real life ballot boxes. Our elected school council have done a fantastic job throughout the year.

Accelerated Reader has continued to drive a love for reading across the school. This year we were joined by author Grant Koper as well as Megan Rix. The children were inspired to draw more through the Knife and Packer workshop. Achieving the All Together Gold Status for the school's work in teaching the children about the harm caused by bullying and how to work together as a team. Our Learning Mentor Miss Durrant won a National Anti-Bullying award.

Emerson's Got Talent returned after a two-year absence. It was lovely to see so many children enter and showcase their skills.

Other notable events include:

Shakespeare week, where each year group learnt and performed a play in a day. The Remembrance Service, where parents were invited to join us for the first time. We were also privileged to be joined by Daniel Bingley, former corporal of the British Army.

A STEAM week, whereupon scientists and engineers were invited into the school to inspire the children.

The Harvest Festival led by the Year 4 children.

The introduction of a mathematician of the week.

Emerson Valley continues to offer pupils from all year groups a range of rewarding educational experiences to enhance their class based learning. This year pupils have visited the Harry Potter Studios, The Verulamium in St Albans, Bletchley Park, Holdenby House, Whipsnade Zoo and Milton Keynes theatre.

The day provided pupils with fantastic opportunities and experiences to celebrate our planet and learn how to take action to protect it. Being a Forest School, this is an important part of our learning at Merebook.

Pupils enthusiastically took part in community litter picks around the local area. They planted trees on the school ground and learnt how to nurture and look after them. The whole school worked together to build a 'bug hotel' to provide a home and shelter for the myriad of small creatures that help to pollinate flowers and control detrimental insects. Merebrook also welcomed a visitor from MK Recycling Centre for the day and took part in recycling workshops learning how and why we recycle.

The day was a great time for all of us to think about what we can do to make, protect and nurture our beautiful planet.





#### From Patient To Chaplain

How does one say thank you to an organisation that saved your life? How can you repay the medical skill and kindness, without which you wouldn't be here today? The answer? To become a volunteer!

On Friday 8th April 2016 my life was dramatically changed when I had an accident on my trike in north Milton Keynes. My injuries were so severe that Thames Valley Air Ambulance were called in to provide the expertise, the medication I required and the speed of transportation, in order to get me to the John Radcliff Hospital in Oxford. It became apparent at the scene of the incident that I may lose my right leg, such was the severity of the injury I had sustained not to mention losing a lot of blood at the scene and coming close to not making it to the hospital. However the surgeons at the John Radcliffe managed to rebuild my shattered leg in a long operation later



that day. But, the next day I was awoken to be told I had entered multi-organ failure, as the rebuilt leg was infected and was poisoning my body. They needed to remove my leg, through the knee, in order to save my life. That afternoon I awoke as an amputee. The following Tuesday I underwent a third operation to remove more of my leg, becoming an above-knee amputee, to prepare me for a prosthetic limb.

Three weeks in hospital and months of recovery through physiotherapy, adaptions to the house, and learning to use mobility equipment, gave me time to reflect on what had happened. It also gave me time to realise the importance and value of our Emergency Services, NHS and the Thames Valley Air Ambulance. So, I decided I wanted to give something back, and in 2017 I trained as a promotional speaker for Thames Valley Air Ambulance. Public speaking was something that came naturally to me as the Senior Pastor of Shenley Christian Fellowship (a role I continue with to this day) and, being a former patient, I felt I had an edge to the story that would be of interest to listeners.

Then in April 2019 I became the Chaplain to Thames Valley Air Ambulance, supporting the staff team, Paramedics, Doctors and Pilots. It's still very early days, and there is a lot to learn and a lot of people to get to know, but this fantastic opportunity affords me the privilege of being able to help those who helped me.

We currently have one helicopter (An Airbus H135) and four Critical Care Response Vehicles – which carry exactly the same equipment as the helicopter, but can access areas where landing sites for the helicopter are limited. Essentially, whether by helicopter or car, we bring the hospital to the roadside.

The helicopter and cars carry a paramedic and doctor team and because speed is imperative for survival with major trauma incidents, we can be anywhere within Berkshire, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire within 15 minutes. From our base at RAF Benson in South Oxfordshire, the helicopter can quickly be tasked to incidents across the Thames Valley.

Unlike road ambulances, we carry life-saving equipment on board, including ultra-sound machines, blood analysers, and the Lucas machine (an automatic chest-compression device to aid in CPR). We also carry blood and plasma which is essential for those whose needs are so critical that they need blood instantly.

In 2018 we became an Independent Care Provider and the charity grew rapidly in staff numbers and a new location for our headquarters in Stokenchurch, Oxfordshire. Staff are also located at the HEMS (Helicopter Emergency Medical Service) desk in Bicester – the place where 999 calls come into South Central Ambulance Service and a paramedic on the HEMS desk is tasked with analysing which calls are likely to require TVAA expertise.

What many people don't realise is that Thames Valley Air Ambulance is a Charity. That means we get no money from the government and are entirely dependent on the generosity of people to support us financially. ssafa, the Armed Forces charity, has been providing lifelong support to our Forces and their

#### **HOW WE HELP**

At SSAFA Milton Keynes, we have a team of trained volunteer caseworkers who provide personalised, face-to-face support to those in need within the local area. Our volunteers work with each person to find out exactly what they need. Once we've assessed what is required, we'll help the individual or family access the required assistance. They may just need someone to listen. More often than not, we put them in touch with the support services they need to help them get their lives back on track.
