Another team of volunteers is responsible for setting-up the café in the hall where volunteers serve food, snacks, tea and coffee. Since January 2018 the Drop-in Centre has opened on Saturdays from 2pm - 4.30pm when soup and sandwiches are available. At all sessions digital access is available and training and assistance can be provided to those requiring help with completion of forms, updating CVs, and email access.
