"New Trees" are good candidates for planting in California now. All trees selected for this collection come from warmer climates that resemble the future predicted for our state. They are largely native to California, the deserts of the Southwestern United States and Mexico, or Australia. Each tree was chosen because of its suitability for the future. Some are native to our interior regions, but will also perform well along the warming coast. Others can better tolerate summer-irrigated landscapes because they come from warm/arid climates with summer rainfall. These tried-and-true species will survive with little or no human input - the kind of tree you might see thriving at an abandoned home site despite receiving no care for a generation. We encourage you to consider these New Trees and their suitability for your projects.

All of our recommended trees are in production at Devil Mountain Wholesale Nursery, where we utilize an air root pruning production system that results in an incredibly well developed and efficient root system, free of circling and girdling roots. 
Acacia cognata | Bower Wattle, River Wattle

An evergreen tree with a graceful, weeping habit. Lush-looking, narrow, bright green leaves cover the branches. Bright yellow, ball-like flower clusters bloom in winter.

Angophora costata | Smooth Barked Apple

Native to Australia, this evergreen tree has an upright and spreading habit. Gray bark exfoliates to reveal rusty-red layers underneath. Leaves are lanceolate, and lustrous dark green. Small white flowers in summer.

Brachychiton discolor | Queensland Lacebark

Semi-deciduous tree with a stout trunk and conical habit. Leaves are palmately lobed and deep bluish-green with pale green felty undersides. Showy, deep pink or red bell-shaped flowers are followed by fruits.

A fast growing evergreen tree with long, feathery, needle-like leaves. Bark is grayish-brown and scaly. Leaves cascade from drooping branches. Native to Australia.

An evergreen tree with a tall, narrow trunk that graduates to an open-branching crown. Bark is smooth and whitish in color. Leaves are lemon-scented, lance-shaped, and yellowish-green. Inconspicuous white flowers. Native to Australia.

Eucalyptus cinerea | Silver Dollar Tree, Argyle Apple

An evergreen tree with an open-branching crown. Bark is brown and exfoliating. Young leaves are silvery green, coin shaped, and are often used in floral arrangements. Mature leaves are medium green and lance shaped. Inconspicuous white flowers. Native to Australia, tolerates coastal exposure.

Eucalyptus erythrocorys | Red-Cap Gum

A fast growing small tree with a broad, low branching canopy. Leaves are long and sickle-shaped, and a smooth white trunk is spotted with patches of rough brown bark. Showy yellow flowers pop out of red-capped buds in fall & spring.

Eucalyptus neglecta | Omeo Gum

A fast growing and large evergreen tree. Juvenile leaves are broad, rounded, and deep bluish green. Mature, elongated leaves emerge after ten to fifteen years of growth. Cut foliage is often used in flower arrangements.

Evergreen tree with a dense and spreading form. Bluish-green leaves are oval in shape, bark is smooth and light brown in color and later matures to gray. Abundant, creamy white flowers are available in spring and summer. Attracts birds & pollinators.

An evergreen Australian native tree with gracefully arching, slender trunks lined with smooth red bark that exfoliates to reveal white underneath. Shiny, grayish green leaves are linear & held at branch tips. Creamy golden yellow flowers in summer, followed by fruits. Highly salt tolerant.

A large, semi-evergreen tree with smooth dark brown bark & light green, simple, ovate leaves. Historically recognized as a sacred tree & often found in religious sites, as hinted to by the species name.

Tropical evergreen tree with an upright, rounded form & rough gray bark. Emerald green sickle-shaped leaves crowd branch tips. Small creamy white flowers are available in summer, followed by edible plum-like fruits. Fruits are often used in jams or jellies.

Lyonothamnus floribundus ssp. aspleniifolius | Fernleaf Catalina Ironwood, Santa Cruz Island Ironwood

An evergreen tree with a narrow, conical crown & deep green palmate leaves. Foliage is divided into scallop-edged leaflets. Clusters of white flowers form in summer. Bark is fibrous, reddish brown, and shedding. Native to California's Channel Islands.

Olea europaea 'Swan Hill' | Swan Hill Olives® Tree

A slow-growing evergreen tree with single or multiple trunks that are light gray and become gnarled with age. Branches form a rounded crown. Gray-green foliage is long, narrowly elliptic and silvery underneath. Certified fruitless variety is grafted onto disease-resistant rootstock. Rarely produces pollen or fruit.

An attractive deciduous tree with divided leaflets that first emerge red, mature to deep green, then turn yellow, orange, and red again in fall. Found to be semi-evergreen in milder climates, like Southern California.

Platanus racemosa 'Roberts' | Roberts' Western Sycamore

A large California-native, deciduous tree with rough, green, multilobed leaves. Attractive shedding bark with patches of brown, gray, and cream. Ball-shaped, fuzzy seed clusters persist through winter. Often develops multiple twisting trunks. Foliage is more deeply cut & bark is more variegated than the species.

A semi-evergreen tree with a broad, spreading, arching habit. Bark becomes furrowed and gray-brown with age. Dark green leaves are leathery and lance-shaped with shallow, pointed lobes. Inconspicuous female flowers and male catkins yield acorns.

A large deciduous tree with a broad, variable canopy and spreading, contorted, arching branches. Bark becomes furrowed and darker gray with age. Leathery, dark green leaves are thick and egg shaped with sharply toothed, rolled under edges. Yields large acorns.

Quercus engelmannii | Engelmann Oak, Mesa Oak

A moderately fast growing evergreen tree with a rounded, spreading form. Light grayish-brown bark is furrowed and scaly, the trunk becomes more gnarled & twisted with age. Leaves are oblong to ovate, bluish-green, and leathery. Insignificant spring flowers are followed by mid-sized acorns.

Deciduous tree native to Western US. Characteristic, rough light grayish-brown bark. Leaves are deep green with whitish, hairy undersides. Wonderful fall color palette of golden yellow, orange, and red. One inch, egg shaped acorns appear in late summer to early fall.

Foliage turns ornamental gold and red in fall. Inconspicuous female flowers & male catkins yield acorns. Native to Texas.

A small evergreen oak tree with a rounded crown of leathery, lance-shaped leaves. Foliage is light green with striking, silvery-white undersides. Golden-brown acorns are present during spring and provide a source of food for local wildlife.

A rare Mediterranean native tree, with a sweeping, graceful habit and grayish-brown furrowed bark. Leaves are oval shaped, with lightly serrated edges. Good fall color palette. Spring flowers yield medium sized acorns in fall.

Quercus oblongifolia | Mexican Blue Oak

Evergreen oak tree common in open woodlands, foothills, and canyons of Southwest US. Deep grayish blue leaves are leathery, and populate a broad and open canopy. Bark is deeply fissured and grayish brown. Inconspicuous flowers bloom in May, followed by acorns.

Quercus rugosa | Netleaf Oak

An evergreen tree with a broad, columnar form. Obovate leaves emerge brilliant scarlet then age to leathery, lustrous dark green. Leaf undersides are heavily tomentose with prominent veining, which gives the tree its common name. Scaly acorns emerge in fall. Bark is silvery brown & exfoliates with age. Extremely cold hardy. Native to Mexico.

An evergreen tree with a variable form, depending on location. Bark becomes scaly and darker grayish-brown with age. Shiny, dark green leaves are oval shaped with prominent venation and toothed, rolled under edges. Inconspicuous female and male catkins yield acorns. Native to the Channel Islands of California. Thrives in moist conditions.

Quercus virginiana 'Sky Climber' | Sky Climber Live Oak

An evergreen tree with a dense pyramidal crown of glossy, dark green leaves with yellowish undersides. Inconspicuous blooms are followed by medium-sized acorns in fall. Consistent upright growth makes this tree ideal for use as a street tree planting, or it can be planted en masse. Attracts birds and wildlife.

Intricate, star-shaped greenish white flowers bloom in abundance at branch tips from late spring to mid-summer, followed by pinwheel shaped fruits. Attracts beneficial insects.
