Description

A common <u>species</u> 200-450 mm high with a hairy leaf 80-150 mm long by 5-15 mm wide and up to three pale red, white and yellow flowers 60-120 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the often co-occurring King Spider Orchid (Caladenia pectinata) by its longer, often drooping <u>petals</u> and longer, narrower clubs on the <u>sepals</u>.
